#### Memorial Tree planted in Vetetan's Memorial Park



#### Memorial Bench in courthouse square to honor an early pioneer and his family

A marble bench will be added to the courthouse square next Wednesday, August 7th. Eunice Jewell, a granddaughter of one of Forest County's early pioneer businessman and his family will be honored and remembered with the placement of the bench. Forest Granite is inscribing the bench with the name of Miles Standish Barker, the names of his descendants, and his accomplishments, and the list is long. Forest Granite is donating the inscription work and Ms. Jewell the cost of the bench.

Miles Standish Barker, was born in Maine, but lived most of his life in Crandon. He was one of the early pioneers who helped a fledgling community grow and prosper, and had the faith that the town would amount to something, and if it did, he would too.

Through the years, Barker would have his hand in numerous ventures. His general store/trading post that was located on Madison Street about where the Kennedy Law Office now stands was the community center for many years, starting around 1887. The store was supplied by stagecoach and wageon from Pelican Lake, where the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad brought in supplies needed by the Barker store.


#### Vets Pics Return to Lakewood Reunion

### Reporting deer observations helps biologists assess annual deer herd production

MADISON -- In an ongoing effort to include public input in deer management, and to effectively monitor and evaluate Wisconsin's deer herd, the Department of Natural Resources is continuing its annual citizen-science survey, Operation Deer Watch.

This unique collaboration of data from the public, along with deer observations collected by DNR staff, provides insight on the reproductive status of Wisconsin's deer herd in 2013. The number of does, bucks, and fawns seen are indicators of annual deer herd production.

"This is a fun and useful opportunity for the public to be the daily eyes and ears for the deer herd in their area." said Brian Dhuey, DNR surveys coordinator. "Citizens annually provide thousands of observations that the department utilizes in monitoring the herd."

To get involved, begin recording all bucks, does, and fawns seen between dawn and dusk during the period of Aug. 1 to Sept. 30. Daily observations can be tracked using a tally sheet that is available at dnr.wi.gov, search keywords "deer watch." Observations can be submitted at the same web site.

"This year, 14,000 deer hunters were selected at random and sent a letter inviting them to participate in Operation Deer Watch," said Dhuey. "However, if you were not one of the hunters selected to participate we still encourage your participation to help provide insight into Wisconsin's deer herd."

The picnic begins at 11 a.m. with a Mass before the Shrine to St. Hubert, Patron Saint of Hunters. At noon, following Mass, the serving lines will be open and remain so for the rest of the afternoon. To reach the Shrine from Highway 8, follow the Shrine Road, located just west of Goodman, north, for just over six miles. Part of it is paved, but soon the road becomes gravel and dirt. Signs along the way indicate how many miles remain before the site. Parking areas are available for ATV's as well as larger vehicles. Those who are familiar with the area, may discover other roads that lead to the Shrine.

Though the emphasis is on the food and the togetherness, the Shrine Club picnic also serves as a fundraiser.

"The proceeds," Ash said, "go to local needs." Victims of fire, for example, and those community members or organizations who could use some assistance.

Tickets for a raffle with the numbers drawn in late afternoon have been placed at area businesses and are being sold by Shrine Club members. 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

### Surveys show healthy duck populations

MADISON - With high continental total duck and wetland numbers, state waterfowl biologists expect a 60day duck season similar to recent years but with the possibility of bag limit changes for certain species.

This information comes after the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service released continental duck numbers in the Trends in Duck Breeding Populations report [PDF] [exit DNR] on

"This continental survey information is an essential piece in determining Wisconsin's waterfowl season frameworks," said Kent Van Horn, migratory game bird ecologist for the Department of Natural Resources. "The information we are seeing is promising for the upcoming season."

The 2013 North American total duck population estimate was 45.6 million, which is the second highest on record and 33 percent above the long-term average. The 2012 estimate was the highest estimate on record and 6 percent above 2013.

Wetland numbers across the survey area were up from last year and 35 percent above the long-term average.

Mallard numbers were estimated at 10.4 million, similar to last year and 36 percent above the long-term average. Most other species estimates were above or at the longterm average.

"With high mallard numbers and good wetland conditions, we are confident there will be a 60-day duck season," said Van Horn. "However, hunters should be aware of potential bag limit changes for canvasback and scaup.

"While canvasback and scaup make up a relatively small percentage of the overall Wisconsin harvest, these species are important to many duck hunters," said Van Horn. "We may see changes to their daily bag limits in 2013."

Breeding canvasbacks were estimated at 787,000, similar to 2012 counts and 37 percent above the long-term average. This may allow for an increase to a two canvasback daily bag.

Scaup estimates were at 4.2 million, which was 20 percent below 2012 and 17 percent below the longterm average. This is similar to most recent years. The scaup harvest strategy is expected to call for a return to a two bird daily bag limit from last year's four bird bag.

The Canada geese that breed in northern Ontario, and known as the Mississippi Valley Population, make up about 60 percent of Wisconsin's regular season goose harvest. These geese had a late start to the breeding season, but surveys indicated good production and low nest predation. Breeding estimates for 2013 were at 319,693. This is up 16 percent from last year but 10 percent below the long-term average after several prior years with lower recruitment.

Wisconsin DNR staff are currently in discussions at the Mississippi Flyway Council meeting and will have more information in time for the early August public waterfowl meetings and hearings [PDF]. For more information on waterfowl hunting, search the DNR website

Regular physical activity is also associated with decreased mortality and age-related morbidity in older adults. In addition, a study by the Journal of the American Geriatrics Society examined exercise in the elderly and found that exercise training led to improvement in functional reach, balance and fear of falling.

Often, frail elderly people are unable to tolerate aerobic exercise routines on a regular basis due to lake of endurance. But while age related changes in the cardiovascular system have significant effects on cardiac performance, it has been estimated that 50% of endurance loss can be related to decreased muscle mass.

The ideal exercise prescription for the elderly consists of three components: aerobic exercise, strength training, and balance and flexibility.

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
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
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#### Reporting deer observations helps assess annual deer herd production

MADISON -- In an ongoing effort to include public input in deer management, and to effectively monitor and evaluate Wisconsin's deer herd, the Department of Natural Resources is continuing its annual citizen-science survey, Operation Deer Watch.

This unique collaboration of data from the public, along with deer observations collected by DNR staff, provides insight on the reproductive status of Wisconsin's deer herd in 2013. The number of does, bucks, and fawns seen are indicators of annual deer herd production.

"This is a fun and useful opportunity for the public to be the daily eyes and ears for the deer herd in their area." said Brian Dhuey, DNR surveys coordinator. "Citizens annually provide thousands of observations that the department utilizes in monitoring the herd."

To get involved, begin recording all bucks, does, and fawns seen between dawn and dusk during the period of Aug. 1 to Sept. 30. Daily observations can be tracked using a tally sheet that is available at dnr.wi.gov, search keywords "deer watch." Observations can be submitted at

"This year, 14,000 deer hunters were selected at random and sent a letter inviting them to participate in Operation Deer Watch," said Dhuey. "However, if you were not one of the hunters selected to participate we still encourage your participation to help provide insight into Wisconsin's deer herd."



### Public hearings set on changes to statewide shoreland zoning

MADISON - Proposed changes to minimum statewide shoreland zoning standards aimed at providing more flexibility for property owners and making the standards easier for to implement are the topic of public hearings in August. People also may file comments electronically or by U.S. mail through Since Wisconsin revised the minimum statewide shoreland zoning standards in 2009, some counties expressed concerns that the revisions would be administratively difficult

to implement and enforce, according to Russ Rasmussen, deputy administrator for the Department of Natural Resources Water Division. To respond to those concerns, DNR convened a stakeholder group and developed proposed changes that answered the concerns while attempting to meet the standards'

original intent of preserving and restoring natural shoreline plants and limiting hard surfaces near the water to help protect water quality, provide fish and wildlife habitat, and provide natural scenic beautv. "We think the stakeholder group has helped us achieve a balance between answering the concerns of some counties and providing more flexibility for property owners while

continuing to protect clean water and habitat," Rasmussen said. Specifically, the changes propose greater flexibility for properties along developed shorelines. Under the current rules, properties within 300 feet of any lake, river or stream face limits on the amount of roofs, pavement, and other hard or "impervious" surfaces. Under DNR's proposed changes, base limits on impervious services would remain at 15 percent in most places statewide, but could be up to 40 percent for residences, and up to 60 percent for commercial, industrial or business land, within those urbanized areas where the shoreline is highly developed.

Property owners can seek a permit for projects that would add impervious surfaces to their land, or seek a variance. The proposed changes would raise the levels at which such permits or variances are required in urbanized areas and allow more flexibility for properties where the impervious surfaces are draining away from the lake or to a storm-water system designed to treat the runoff.

The proposed changes also allow for more expansion of homes built before the late 1960s, when the statewide minimum shoreland standards were originally set and established that structures needed to be set back 75 feet from the water's edge.

Under the proposed changes, property owners of existing structures closer to the water than the longtime state standards would be allowed to expand their structures beyond the 75 foot setback in any direction. The current rule limits people to expanding vertically in the same footprint.

There are three ways for people to weigh in on the proposed changes - testify at public hearings, file comments electronically, or provide them by U.S. mail.

Public hearings are set in five communities in August, with all hearings starting at 2 p.m. with a brief presentation and lasting until 6 p.m. Aug. 7, Greenville - Town of Greenville, W6860 Parkview Dr., Greenville.

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

The store also served as a post office. Mrs. Robert Purdy, sister of M.S. Barker, wrote about life in the store and post office. She describes how people came in the late afternoon to pick up their mail. When the stage was late, the waiting people turned the time into a social event, with story-telling, laughter and good times spent with neighbors in an early wilderness town.

The Barker family lived upstairs. Later on, Barker built a house on Lake Avenue and removed the partitions in his former home. The large room was called the "Hall," and used for community functions.

Native Americans used the Barker store as a place to trade their products for items like flour or corn meal, cloth, and other needs. They traded venison, deer skins, wild rice and other products that gathered from the woods and waters. Strong friendships were made between Barker and his Chippewa customers, and a respect for each other was formed, leading to Barker helping settle a tribal dispute. His judgement was trusted, and he was considered to be a fair man. The dispute was settled, and the Chippewa presented Barker a medal that

was awarded by President Monroe. The medal is thought to have been given by the government to the Potawatomi originally, and ending up in the hands of the Chippewa, possibly as a trade item.

The Barker store's business actually suffered when the C&NW ran a spur from Pelican Lake to Crandon. With the rail line came the big Page & Landeck sawmill on Clear Lake, and their modern brick department store, now the home of Subway, Group Therapy and She's All That, took many of Barker's customers away. The store was sold, and the new owner continued on for awhile, but the building was eventually destroyed by fire.

But Barker was an enterprising fellow. He had one of the first farms in the county, on the southwestern end of Lake Metonga. He served as a judge for number of years. He also had an ice business, harvesting ice from Metonga in the winter and storing it in an icehouse to sell to people for their iceboxes that were the early type of refrigeration. He traded for ginseng with tribal members and had one of the first, and maybe the biggest, ginseng farms in Wisconsin.

Miles Barker and his wife Hattie were very successful in their efforts. They helped settle a wilderness and raised ten kids doing it. Their son, George, took over the farming operation, called Lakeside Dairy Farm, and ran the business for years, raising produce and supplying fresh milk and cream to residents of Crandon.

An interesting note is that George Barker was in the second graduating class in Crandon, and that he was the only graduate. As a class of one, high school reunions must have been lightly attended!

Eunice Jewell remembered her grandmother as an industrious woman. Miles and Hattie moved to southern Wisconsin to live with her father George after he relocated to the southern end of the state to farm. Eunice said she always had fresh, fried cakes for family gatherings, kept the family in mittens using a special knitting pattern, used her beautiful handwriting to keep in touch with her children and grandchildren, and kept an open door to family and friends who wanted to visit.

Other endeavors by Miles Barker included being County Board Chair, operating a bakery, logging, and serving as an Indian Agent. As an Indian agent, Barker had a leg up on others interested in the job, as he was fluent in speaking the Chippewa language. Miles and Hattie exhibited little fear in taking on new careers and business ventures.

In time, the sons and daughters of Miles and Hattie married and there are many family branches, including these families: Mountain, Steagall, Marvin, Knuth, Stevens, Derickson, Cronce, Scorey, Ewald, Boodry, and many more.

After Wednesday, you will be able to walk by the Senior Snoop Shop and take a little breather on the attractive bench being erected on Wednesday, and when you do take time to thank this pioneering family for all they contributed to Forest County and the City of Crandon.

Miles was born in 1857 and passed in 1941. Hattie was born in 1863 and laid to rest in 1951.
