Former Wabeno Teacher Returns to Gift Wabeno Library with Abraham Lincoln Project

Lew Mallow, a former teacher at Wabeno High School, returned recently for a family matter, and presented the library with a complete set of his lecture series, "The Life and Times of Abraham Lincoln." He is a noted speaker and writer about Civil War history and the life of Lincoln. The thirteen titles cover a number of noted battles of the Civil War, and other information regarding historical figures such as Robert E. Lee and Mary Todd Lincoln as well as others. Mallow and his wife Helen, have traveled around the region and the country with their jointly produced lecture programs. Several of the titles below are two part segments of his talks. The videos were originally produced for airing on local community-access television channels in the Eau Claire area.

Mr. Mallow and his shop class created the wooden sign for the Wabeno Library, which still hangs at the front of the log cabin building housing the library The Mallows generously donated the entire collection to the library at no cost.

The titles include the following: "The Battle of Fredericksburg," "The Making of a President," "The Life of Mary Todd Lincoln," "The Assassination of Lincoln and the Aftermath," "Andersonville: The Prison and The Cemetery," "Freemasons at Gettysburg," "Gettysburg: the Battle and the Speech," "Jefferson Davis," "Colonel Elmer E. Ellsworth: Citizen Soldier and National Hero," "Thomas 'Stonewall' Jackson"

These DVD's are in the process of being catalogued and added to the collection, and will be available for check-out after November 1, 2013.

Also, for those interested in the Civil War, the Wisconsin Historical Society has launched a website to commemorate the 150th anniversary of the War, and focuses primarily on Wisconsin contributions to the war, which were substantial and significant. The feared and admired Iron Brigade was comprised of primarily Wisconsin regular soldiers. Harvey Hospital in Madison was created after the efforts of Cordelia Harvey succeeded in creating the first Veterans' Hospital in the North. These are only a few of the Wisconsin contributions to the war and the preservation of the Union.

Off-Road Park presents info around Forest County and at Wisconsin State Capitol

Crandon, WI-The Wisconsin Off-Road Vehicle Park, Incorporated (WORVPI) continued barnstorming the county in order to provide information about the proposed off-road park for Forest County. Presentations in Wabeno, Crandon, and Laona were targeted toward the existing business community, a group that will become immediate economic benefactors for the park. An additional presentation is scheduled for Armstrong Creek in early October.

These presentations are a continuation of a series of planned meetings to share information and details regarding the 10,000 Acre Forest County Off-Road Park. WORVPI recently presented information to the major motorized trail recreation user groups, as well as invited Tribal and County officials to a meeting where the details of the plan were unveiled.

WORVPI President John Schnorr and Forest County Economic Development Partnership's (FCEDP) Jim Schuessler collaborated on a detailed presentation at the FCEDP meeting, which was a dress rehearsal for the presentation in Madison.

The Madison presentation was attended by Senator Tom Tiffany and Representatives Rob Swearingen and Jeff Mursau. Lead executives from Wisconsin's Department of Tourism and the Wisconsin Economic Development Corporation attended, as well as representatives from the Governor's office and DNR. Following the presentation they offered technical support and acknowledged the park's potential to be a huge





While the federal government shutdown has closed federal properties in Wisconsin, such as the Apostle Islands National Lakeshore, the Chequamegon and Nicolet National Forests and some national wildlife refuges, all state, county and local recreational areas remain open in Wisconsin.

"Fall is one of the best times of the year to get out and enjoy the 1.5 million acres of state owned land in Wisconsin," says Department of Natural Resources Secretary Cathy Stepp. "We welcome visitors to our state parks and forests...climb one of our observation towers and take in the beautiful fall colors, bike or hike our state trails, and hunt or fish on our many state wildlife and fisheries areas."

The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has closed the national refuge portion of Horicon Marsh, but the Horicon Marsh State Wildlife Area and Horicon Marsh Visitors Center remain open and the center has numerous events planned that will go ahead as scheduled.

The only cancellations to date are scheduled work days on the Ice Age National Scenic Trail because this program is a state, federal and nonprofit partnership and the National Park Service runs the volunteer program that helps protect volunteers in the case of injury or damages while working on projects.





catalyst for Northern Wisconsin's economy. Representing Forest County were executives from county government, tourism, chamber, and economic development.

Each attendee was provided with copies of the WORVPI Business Plan and the WORVPI Feasibility Report.

WORVPI President John Schnorr stated "As policy makers and land managers it is vital to provide these entities with factual, accurate information to allow them to better understand the off-road project. WORVPI's goal was to provide information on how exactly our Park will positively improve the use of the regional land base, assure the highest of environmental standards, increase local tax revenue, strengthen existing county businesses, improve the quality of life in Forest County."

Looking forward, WORVPI will be refining phase two of the park project along with state officials. Follow-up meetings are also anticipated with the Governor's office and the Secretary of the DNR.







Understanding Vitamin D

There is growing evidence that many Americans are not getting enough Vitamin D to meet their nutritional needs.

What causes this deficiency?

- · Vitamin D is referred to as the sunshine vitamin because it can be made by human skin from cholesterol but only if the skin is exposed to sufficient ultraviolet light.
- However, Americans are making less vitamin D because they are spending less time in the sun.
- Those who go in the sun are now more likely to wear strong sunscreens which block the ultraviolet rays needed by the skin to make vitamin D. Note: Avoiding excessive ultraviolet radiation and sunburn is good advice, but a small amount of ultraviolet radiation is needed to make vitamin D.

How much sun do you need?

You need only 10-15 minutes of direct sun on your arms and legs several times a week to make enough vitamin D to meed your body's requirement.

People living in our region of the country will have a hard time making enough vitamin D for at least several months each year. Why? Because the sun's rays are too weak in the winter to penetrate even pale skin deep enough to trigger vitamin D synthesis. The problem is even worse for those with darker skin because melanin (like sunscreens) keeps the ultraviolet rays from penetrating the skin.

Can you get enough vitamin D from food?

Vitamin D can be absorbed from food or as supplements, but there are challenges to this. Except for fatty fish, fortified dairy products and orange juice, there are few reliable sources of vitamin D.

How much do I need?

Older adults need 2-3 times as much vitamin D as do younger people. In addition, their skin is much less able to make vitamin D when exposed to the sun. Some experts believe older adults need 1,000-2,000 IU of vitamin D per day. The Institute of Medicine recommends that adults over 70 need 800 IU of vitamin D daily. They also indicate that the safe upper limit of vitamin D is 4,000 IU.

What happens when you don't get enough vitamin D?

- · Reduced calcium absorption and impaired bone remodeling, increasing the risk of broken bones.
- · Osteomalacia, which can weaken muscles and cause bones to ache.
- · Increased risk of colon, breast and prostate cancers, hypertension and heart failure.

Steps to make sure you are getting enough vitamin D when sun is not an option:

- 1. Get 2 servings of vitamin D-fortified nonfat milk, soy milk or orange juice daily.
- 2. Consume fatty fish such as salmon, mackerel or sardines (about 12 ounces per week).
- 3. Talk to your health care provider about a daily supplement of 400 IU of D3 or more, depending on your sun exposure and dietary intake.



The clock is ticking for over 100,000 commercial driver license holders Drivers have until January 30 to tell DMV where they drive commercially or lose their CDLs.

If you are a commercial driver license (CDL) holder, the federal government now requires that you let the state Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) know two things:

Whether you operate interstate or intrastate,

· And whether you are required to carry a Medical Examiner Certificate, commonly referred to as a Fed Med Card. Drivers who are required to carry a Fed Med Card must now keep a current copy of that card on record with the DMV.

"DMV is concerned that some drivers either haven't yet heard about this new requirement or, if they have, that they might need more clarification," notes DMV Driver Qualification Chief Alison Lebwohl. "We don't want anyone surprised on January 30. We want drivers driving and on the road, so we've worked to make it easier for them to tell us where they operate and, if needed, submit a Fed Med Card."

CDL holders who have not yet told the DMV where they operate with their CDL, and, if needed, uploaded their Fed Med Card, should do it now. Those who don't do it by January 30, 2014, will lose their commercial driver license. The fastest, easiest and cheapest way to do this is to go online to the WisDOT web site at www.cdl.wi.gov. The process takes about five to ten minutes. The online application is designed for mobile devices as well, and can be completed with a smart phone. The application requires:

· Driver license number

Product number (11 digit number on the back upper corner

· The last four digits of the CDL holder's Social Security number

CDL holders may choose one of four tiers, a process called certification. The tier they choose will determine where they are allowed to drive. DMV recommends choosing Tier 1 because it is the most flexible choice and covers all commercial driving circumstances. Those choosing Tier 1 will also have to provide DMV with a copy of their Fed Med Card. Lebwohl stresses that this is most simply done with WisDOT's online application at www.cdl.wi.gov. She notes, "We even have an online instructional video for those who want to see a demonstration of how to certify and upload their Fed Med Card. We've tried to make it easy for drivers." Employers may also use the same online application, or they may choose to use our employer notification system - Public Abstract Record System (PARS). PARS can also be found at www.cdl.wi.gov.

Those who prefer not to use the online application may print out a form called the MV3230 which can also be found at www.cdl.wi.gov (type MV3230 in the search box). Print it, fill it out and either:

· Fax to: (608) 261-8201 or

- Mail to: WisDOT; Attn: CDL Certification, PO Box 7995, Madison, WI 53707-7995

Lebwohl notes that "drivers who have not yet done this receive a letter from us with an MV3230 form, but going online is faster, and available right now 24/7, so don't wait until the last minute."
