### Reduced water levels for Little Rice Flowage

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources will be temporarily lowering water levels on the Little Rice flowage this fall to improve the health of the over-winter fishery. The flowage is located on Little Rice State Wildlife Area in the Town of Crandon, Forest County. The target water level is within a foot of the bottom of the outlet structure, bringing water levels down to the channel of the Wolf River. Similar draw-downs occurred in 1988, 1989, 1993, and most recently in 1995. Recent fall and winter weather patterns, including flooding and frequent melting, have raised over-winter water levels, which may have resulted in some fish mortality.

It may seem that higher water levels would improve fish survival, but this is not always the case. The more water we have in the flowage, the more aquatic plants we will have in the water under the ice. As that plant matter decomposes, it releases carbon dioxide. The result is reduced oxygen levels, or hypo-oxygenation. Reduced oxygen levels can result in fish kills, especially in species like large-mouthed bass and bluegills. Lowering water levels before ice forms significantly reduces this problem. Vegetation will decompose on dry land, where carbon dioxide is released into the atmosphere. An added benefit to this drawdown is freezing and killing of some plant species, which reduces plant matter in the basin for a number of years.

The Little Rice flowage is a State Wildlife Area, managed primarily for waterfowl and wild rice. During the summer, water levels are kept high in order to accommodate boaters. Many other factors, including safety at the structure and downstream, rainfall patterns, and allowing the Wolf River to continue flowing, affect the water levels. Each fall, the water levels are lowered two to three feet below the top of the structure to allow us to safely manage run-off in the spring. Occasionally, additional water is removed in order to benefit the fishery. This winter's draw-down water level will be approximately 2 feet lower than the usual over-winter target. We plan to restore water levels to normal in the spring.

### **Does Forest County really want** a Humane Society?

For those residents of Forest County that are unfamiliar with the history of the Humane Society I will provide a brief history. The Forest County Humane Society initially opened their doors to the abandoned, neglected and abused animals in the year 2000. This event was made possible through the herculean efforts of Dave and Cora Campbell along with a multitude of other volunteers. Ever since then the Humane Society has been a home for the abused, neglected and abandoned animals of Forest County.

Just as was the case in the early days of the society volunteers was and continue to be an integral part. As the years moved on the number of volunteers diminished. In the 2012-13 year the number of volunteers have decreased to nearly zero. The current by-laws of the Humane Society calls for 9-15 volunteer positions on the Board of Directors. However the actual number of volunteers on the board is four. Because of the lack of volunteers from the residents of Forest County the daily operation of the Humane Society has been very difficult. If volunteers were available then they would be used in a multitude of tasks to make the lives of our animals friends better.

I initially ask the simple question of whether Forest County really wants a humane society. Since 1999 the State of Wisconsin has directed that the townships of each county is responsible for the well beings of stray animals. From our initial start in 2000 until early 2013 the humane society provided this service to the townships free of charge. Many people may not know it but in March 2013 the township leaders in Forest County were told that effective this year the townships would be required to pay for this service.

The Humane Society could no longer financially provide free service. This notification immediately upset many of the townships.

Forest County currently has a total of fourteen townships and the City of Crandon. WI Statute Chapter

Mick Ashbeck, Wabeno's K-9 Officer, had a few friends stop by this week. The event was hosted by the Townsend and Wabeno Police Departments, Friends of Wabeno, the Wabeno Chamber, Cellcom/Storage of Townsend, Forest Sawmill of Wabeno and the Padus Nicolet Gun Club.

K-9 units from all over the state came to take advantage of the information and training offered, with over 100 working dogs present.

Different scenarios were setup in different locations, with the units traveling to the different training situations. The dogs brushed up on their skills in finding drugs in vehicles, buildings, and in the woods, as well as finding a suspect hiding in the brush. This includes tracking the suspect as well as holding him for the arresting officer.

It gives the dogs and the officers training in highrisk traffic stops. The training also gives officers a chance to compare notes and experiences in law enforcement and dog training techniques.

On Tuesday, a number of the officers and their K-9 friends visited the Nu-Roc Nursing Home and received a lot of attention and affection from the residents. The German Shepherds enjoyed meeting the people and having their ears scratched and the petting.

Part of the training was conducted at the Padus Nicolet Gun Club, with dogs searching for a perpetrator hiding in the woods and bringing him to justice, as well as finding drug caches buried in the ground and hidden in the







have put a major emphasis on supporting projects such as this one to promote essential habitat for ruffed grouse and woodcock in Wisconsin. To date, the Society has provided nearly close to 1 million dollars to support habitat management efforts on over 145,000 acres of public land projects in the state."

Working closely with the Society, the Forest Forestry and Parks Department has already conducted timber harvests in the management area to develop future habitat for ruffed grouse and woodcock. These species favor the security provided by the dense cover from newly regenerated aspen and alder habitats.

Dedication ceremonies for the new management area will take place at a parking lot off Keith Siding Road, approximately 1 mile west of the intersection of Keith Siding Road and County Highway W at 1 PM. To reach the site, take Highway 8 east of Crandon approximately 1 mile to County W. Turn right (south) for about 4 miles to Keith Siding Road. Turn right (west) on Keith Siding Road and travel one mile to the dedication site.

Established in 1961, the Ruffed Grouse Society is the premier wildlife conservation organization dedicated to promoting conditions suitable for ruffed grouse, American woodcock and related wildlife to sustain our hunting tradition and outdoor heritage. 173 states that a township can support the Humane Society or similar animal organizations or they can establish their own. As of this date the townships of Lincoln; Crandon; Caswell; Argonne; Hiles and the City of Crandon have all signed long-term contracts for services with the Forest County Humane Society. The remainder of the townships have either done nothing or established their own operations. The township of Nashville has reportedly decided to transport their stray dogs to either the Langlade County shelter or to the Humane Society of Shawano County rather than to the Forest County Humane The townships of Wabeno, Blackwell and Freedom have chosen to establish a temporary holding facility in which they are currently placing neglected animals found in their townships. When the services were free we received animals from all fourteen townships and the City of Crandon.

Since 2012, the last full year of data available the Forest County Humane Society provided services to over 180+ stray and injured dogs with an adoption or return rate of nearly 90-95%. The numbers of cats are also in the hundreds with similar adoption rates. If the shelter did not exist then these animals would be left to fend for themselves or maybe have to rely on the same individuals that abused and neglected them originally.

Finally if the residents of Forest County wants the Humane Society to survive I encourage everyone to attend the annual membership meeting at the Crandon City Hall on October 16th, 2013 at 6:30 p.m.





## **FALL EQUINOX**

The autumnal equinox falls on different dates each year, usually Sept. 22, like this year, or Sept. 23: but in 1931, the equinox happened on Sept. 24. The reason: The Gregorian calendar doesn't match up perfectly with the position of Earth in its orbit around the sun.

As Earth orbits the sun, it revolves around its axis at a 23.5-degree angle so that it is pointed directly toward the sun at the summer solstice, directly away from the sun during the winter solstice, and at a right angle with the sun on the equinoxes; that right angle means the sun shines about equal amounts of light across the Northern Hemisphere on the equinoxes. If this trek around the sun took exactly 365 days, Earth would be in its autumn equinox position on the same day each year. Since Earth takes 365.25 days to make a complete journey around the sun, the date is slightly different each year. The fall equinox won't happen again on Sept. 24 until 2303.
