# John Santy with the JJK Trio to perform at Nicolet College Feb. 1

Songwriter and guitarist John Santy will take center stage at Nicolet College Theatre on Sat., Feb. 1, to present acoustic solos from his repertoire of original folk tunes that speak to his life as a Northwoods native. The concert also includes a performance by the JJK Trio, a rock group comprised of John, his father, guitarist Jeff Santy, and percussion artist Jared Kropidlowski. The concert begins at 7:30 pm.

John Santy has shared the stage with classic rock bands such as BTO and ELO, and currently plays with a 10-piece jazz brass band that performs around the state. As a group, the JJK Trio has been playing together for two decades, honing their versatile upbeat style that embraces blues, folk, pop and rock, and delighting audiences throughout northern Wisconsin. Earlier this year they released their first album, a 10-track CD entitled John Santy with JJK Trio.

Santy's mellow lyrics and delivery style evokes the modern acoustic rock and folk art of Jack Johnson, Jason Morris and John Maher. Santy describes his writing as personal, deeply rooted in his experiences.

"My lyrics are in a 'feel-good' pop style that tell stories and paint a picture of what it's like to live in the Northwoods," Santy said. "The tunes are melodic, with hooks that will probably stick with you and you'll find yourself humming later. My desire as a songwriter is to make people happy, to make them smile, make them think about the good times in their life, and about their relationships with friends." Santy added, "I think of this concert as a night of insight into my mind as a songwriter.

# Informational meeting on the proposed ORV park to be held in Carter, Saturday, Jan. 25

There will be a meeting at the Potawatomi Carter Casino and Hotel on Saturday, January 25th, from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. According to the legal notice as posted on the door of the Forest County Courthouse, this is an informational workshop that is open to the public to discuss the Wisconsin Off-Road Vehicle Park. It is also noticed that this is subject to change.

This meeting/workshop started out as an invitation only meeting for public officials in Forest County and media leaders, but apparently the Wisconsin open meeting laws got in the way of having a quorum or quorums at a meeting closed to the public. The next option, as listed on the WORVPI website as of Tuesday, January 21st, was that the meeting was open, but those attending had to pay a fee of \$50 to get in the door. According to elected officials contacted about this, elected officials were not required to pay.

Again, this type of meeting did not hold up to legal standards, and it is now open to the public.

If you would like to know more about the proposed park, feel free to attend, and you don't have to pay.

# Public Hearing on proposed ORV Park-Laona

Once their work is done, information will be provided to both the County Board of Supervisors and the public, very likely in late summer of this year.



# 10 Brilliant uses for Salt

- 1.) Quickly clean your pet's stuffy nose. Achoo! It's cold season for cats and dogs, too. If your pet seems congested, help her breathe easier with saline nose drops. To do: Fill a dropper with a mixture of 1/2 tsp. of salt, 1/2 tsp. of baking soda and 1 cup of distilled water. Hold the dropper in one hand and tip her head back with the other, then place a drop or two in each nostril. The saline solution will thin and flush out mucus to relieve your pet's symptoms. Repeat twice a day until she's feeling
- 2.) De-puff tired eyes in the morning. The next time a late night leaves you with under-eye puff, try this quick a.m. trick: Add 1 tsp. of salt to a cup of warm water. Dip two cotton balls or pads into the solution, then lie back and place them over your closed eyes for 5 minutes. The warm water will open pores around the eyes so the salt can draw out the retained moisture that causes swelling. You'll look refreshed and rested - even if you don't feel it!
- 3.) Mildew-proof a shower curtain. Before you hang a new plastic shower curtain or liner, try this genius trick: fill your tub with 6 inches of water and 2 cups of salt and submerge the curtain for 1 hour, then hang without rinsing. The soak will impart an invisible coat of sodium crystals that will prevent mildew from forming on the plastic. Repeat up to four times a year.
- 4.) Keep dark jeans from fading. Score! You found a pair of jeans that flatters your every curve. To prevent the dark denim from fading or bleeding onto other clothing, wash the jeans by themselves twice, adding 1/4 cup of salt to the wash cycle each time. Salt helps set dye pigments, ensuring the color won't bleed. (After two treatments, wash the jeans as usual.)
- 5.) Mince garlic with ease. Chopping garlic can be a hassle when you constantly have to stop and wipe sticky pieces off the side of your knife. Next time, dampen your blade with water and sprinkle with salt before getting started. The abrasive granules will provide just enough friction to keep the garlic from clinging to the knife so you

can breeze through the task.

- 6.) Rescue a bitter cup of joe. Stuck with coffee that has too much bite but don't want extra creamer calories or chemicals? Just grab a salt packet and add a pinch to balance the java's acidity. The result: a delicious morning brew - with no salty taste.
- 7.) Ease a red wine oops. To save your tablecloth after a wine spill, blot with paper towels, then drape the fabric over a bowl, centering the stain inside the rim. Next, pour cool water over the affected area and sprinkle on a layer of salt to absorb the wine. Once the stain has turned pink, pour a few cups of boiling water over the spot and toss the tablecloth in the wash.
- 8.) Remove sticky iron residue. If you're worried that scorch marks on your iron's plate might get transferred to your clothes and damage the fabric, grab the saltshaker. Simply lay a sheet of wax paper on your ironing board, sprinkle a handful of salt on top and run the hot iron over the paper. The heat will soften the residue, allowing the coarse salt to scrub it off the metal plate. Then turn off the iron, let cool and wipe the plate with a damp cloth.
- 9.) Clear a clogged pipe for pennies. The only thing worse than a slow draining sink? The noxious smell of drain cleaner! Sidestep both problems with this all-natural fix: Mix 2 Tbs. of salt with 2 cups of seltzer and pour down the drain. Wait 1 minute, then run the hottest tap water for 10 seconds. The abrasive salt and seltzer will break down the blockage and the scalding water will
- 10.) Disinfect a wooden cutting board. Argh! Pomegranates, beets and other colorful foods always leave stains on your cutting board, but scrubbing with dish soap or cleaning spray can impart an unpleasant taste the next time you chop produce. The save: Sprinkle salt all over the board, wet a sponge with hot water and rub the salt in until the marks are gone, then wipe with a towel. The granules will scour away any lingering food particles, cutting stains, odors and the risk of bacterial

# Vet's Corner

#### Veteran Identifier on Wisconsin Driver's License "Verify – Then Apply"

2013 Wisconsin Act 17 includes a provision that allows veterans to request through the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV), a veteran identifier on their Wisconsin driver's license or state issued identification card. **HOW TO APPLY** 

First call Wisconsin Department of Veterans Affairs (WDVA)'s toll free number, 1-800-WIS-VETS 1-800-WIS-VETS FREE (947-8387) and select option 1 to verify your current eligibility status.

If you are told you are eligible:

Request the veteran identifier when you renew your drivers license or ID card. You can renew your drivers license or ID card up to one year prior to the expiration date on the card. If it is not yet time to renew your DL/ID, you can still get the veteran designation on your card by applying for a duplicate card. Starting in January, you can save yourself a trip and do it online at www.wisconsindmv.gov. Please see current renewal and duplicate product fees http://www.dot.wisconsin.gov/drivers/drivers/driver-fees.htm.

You will not need to take in any proof of eligibility as WDVA has verified your status with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation, Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV).

If the toll-free system indicates you are not currently eligible you have two options:

You can apply online through VetExpress (https://applications.dva.wisconsin.gov/VetExpress)

You can apply using WDVA form 2241 (http://dva.state.wi.us/WebForms/WDVA\_2241-Eligibility-Application-For-WisDOT-Veteran-Identifier.pdf).

Complete the form. Mail the form and a copy of your DD214/DD215 to the address listed at the top of

You will receive verification from WDVA when your eligibility has been determined.

If you are unsure of your eligibility status, prior to visiting the DMV, verify your current eligibility status by calling toll free, 1-800-WIS-VETS (947-8387), and choosing option 1. **ELIGIBILITY** 

To be eligible for the Veteran Identifier on your Wisconsin driver license or ID Card you must meet certain requirements related to your term and characterization of military service.

Character of Service: The Character of Service Field on your DD214/DD215 must show, Honorable, General under honorable conditions, or Honorable under General. (Other than Honorable conditions will not allow you to certify through this process.)

Length of Service: You must have at least one period of service that encompassed at least two continuous years of "active duty" or 90 days of "active duty" during a Statutorily-Designated Wartime Period, where the character of service meets the requirements above.\* For this purpose, "active duty" means active duty (other than active duty for training) military service in the armed forces of the United States or in forces incorporated as part of the armed forces of the United States. (Full-time National Guard duty does not qualify as "active duty" under federal law. Active federal military service performed by the National Guard members under Title 10 of the U.S. Code may qualify as "active duty." \* Exceptions to length of service are specified in Wisconsin Statutes, 45.01(12)(a-f).




