Several homes in the Laona, Wabeno, Freedom and Blackwell area have been selected to join this survey in August and September 2011. The Forest County Health Department supports this project and is encouraging Forest County residents to take part. Participants have a choice to join this project and the personal information is given to this survey is confidential.

This project will collect information about the health of people in Wisconsin. SHOW studies how the neighborhoods and communities that we live in impact our health. Researchers will record information about things like neighborhood parks, conditions of sidewalks, safety for biking, and healthy food availability. The SHOW also offers some free health tests.

The information that SHOW collects will be made available as a public use databank for researchers, policy makers, health officials, and other stakeholders, to use as a tool to identify and address the public health needs of state residents. This information will help us to build healthier communities.

The Forest County Health Department is interested in the information that SHOW is gathering in this survey. We look forward to learning more about the health of the people of Forest County and Wisconsin.



TEPP Program Making a Difference

Have you ever struggled to hear on regular telephone? It happens all the time to people who are experiencing age-related hearing loss or hearing loss related to prolonged exposure to loud sounds. Communication is such an important aspect to our lives that this situation should not be ignored. Fortunately, the state of Wisconsin operates the Telephone Equipment Purchase Program (TEPP) and it's making a difference for thousands of people across the state for decades.

TEPP is a Wisconsin state program that provides free vouchers to residents with hearing loss so they can obtain amplified phones and improve their utilization of basic telephone services. TEPP is administered through the Public Service Commission and funded by a Wisconsin telephone user fee known as the Universal Service Fund. Most people have probably noted the "USF" charge on their phone bill but never knew its purpose. In effect, this is a "pre-paid program" that people are allowed to access if they struggle to communicate on a normal telephone.

The TEPP program will provide free vouchers for telephone equipment given that the following applicant requirements are met:

Wisconsin residency.

A voluntary declaration of hearing loss.

No receipt of TEPP funding within the last three years.

There are no age or income restrictions.

The telephones offered are rich in features that enable those with hearing loss to communicate over the phone. These features include hearing aid compatibility, amplified volume, enriched tone controls, extra large numbered keypads, loud ringer volume choices, caller ID

enabled, and unique speed-dialing features.

People who apply for the TEPP program can expect to receive their equipment in approximately 4-6 weeks. No additional charges will ever appear on the individuals' phone bill and amplified phone becomes their property. In several years time, TEPP participants may reapply in order to receive technologically advanced equipment to deal with additional needs.

Taking advantage of TEPP voucher program is a privilege afforded to all Wisconsin citizens. If you have any questions or would like to apply for the program, pleas call Paul Klocko at ElderCom for assistance. The number is: (715) 241-6940.



Food Service Program School Dist. of Wabeno Area

Children need healthy food to learn. Because of this fact, it has been a long-standing tradition for the School District of Wabeno Area to provide free breakfast and hot

lunch to all of our students. We also provide a free milk break to students in grades 4K to 5

The school district is committed to continuing to provide free breakfast and free lunch for all students. To help us get the most revenue possible through meal reimbursement, there are two new practices we will be implementing for the start of the 2011-2012 school year.

Free and Reduced Meal Application

At the beginning of each school year, we will be requiring families to complete and return an application for free and reduced meals. (This is standard practice for most school districts in the state.) These eligibility figures are very important because they dictate the amount of reimbursement that the district can claim for our breakfast and lunch programs. Families will be receiving these applications in the mail during the first week in August. Applications can also be picked up a the district office.

Finger Image Scanning and Automated System

Collecting income data on an annual basis also allows us to use a computerized, automated system for our meal counting. This will ultimately give us a better, more accurate reimbursement for school meals. To count each staff member and student coming through the food service line, we will be using a finger image scanner. (It is called a finger image because it is NOT a true, complete fingerprint.) Students and staff members must have their finger image scanned and entered into the computer system. Prior to school starting, we would like to get as many students and staff entered into the system as possible. Therefore, starting August 16, we will be scanning finger images of students who are at school for summer school or athletics. We will also have the finger image scanner set up at the Open House.

vertical. The best agricultural land was found in the valleys between the mountains, not on the side of the mountain. Northeast Kentucky was also lawless and dangerous in the decades following the Civil War. Families divided over whether to support the Union or the Confederacy, and many people used this as an excuse to rob and pillage their neighbors, who had been on the "wrong" side back in the Civil War.

Most of our early Kentucky ancestors came just before or just after 1900. Many came with horse and wagon, a few made the journey by train. They took advantage of the available land offered through the Homestead Act or the selling of cutover lands by lumber companies, both affordable.

The Kentuckians, as the early newspapers called them, were often considered a lower class of people by many of the Yankee businessmen who followed the sawmills into the Midwest to take advantage of boom times. Articles in the papers were quick to report any transgressions by the Appalachian folk, and I think, a little slower to report on the shenanigans of the merchant class.

In 1921, the big Fish Lumber Co. sawmill that had drawn in the New Englanders and New Yorkers, burned to the ground, and many headed elsewhere. Our Kentucks. who by this time had also entered into some local business ventures, were the ones who stayed and kept things going.

Sawmilling and logging became a smaller industry after the Fish Lumber fire, but fortunately, the federal government opened a new market that our Kentucks excelled at. That was the making of whiskey.

Whiskey had been a thriving venture back in Kentucky, because markets for corn were distant from the mountainous cornfields tilled by our ancestors. The logical way to market this corn, and other grains, was in a bottle, after being skillfully distilled. Those cases of whiskey hauled down to market represented a great many bushels of corn.

In 1919, the Congress outlawed liquor, and the door was open for enterprising individuals to fill the market gap. Whiskey was made all over the nation, but our Kentucks enjoyed a reputation as making some of the best whiskey available. It was marketed all over the Midwest, in places like St. Louis, Minneapolis, Chicago, Milwaukee and all places in between. The illegal trade put a lot of people to work, including the government agents that tried to stop it. By 1933, booze was legalized, and the demand for home-made whiskey shrunk, but not completely, as it took the legal whiskey makers some time to gear back up, and it was still preferable to buy tax-free whiskey.

So come to Crandon's Kentuck Day celebration this Saturday and enjoy the food, the music, the vendors, the special deals in the stores and the heritage of our community. And don't forget the Kentuck Klassic Car Show, which takes place at the same time.



Imprelis Indicated in Damage to Trees

Imprelis is a new herbicide from DuPont registered for broadleaf weed control in turfgrasses. Aminocyclopyrachlor, the active ingredient in Imprelis, is thought to accumulate in growing regions of plants and have a strong, lengthy impact on plant growth. Due to the nature of this chemical, the signs of damage from Imprelis are fairly distinctive.

At this time. DuPont is recommending that Imprelis not be used on properties with Norway Spruce or White Pine; there have been many reports that the chemical can also be harmful to other conifers, as well as some deciduous trees. If Imprelis damage is suspected on a property, the property owner should refrain from planting new trees during the season that the soil was treated with Imprelis.

Signs of possible Imprelis damage on conifers include yellowing and browning of needles, twisting of branch tips, and needle drop (usually the newest growth). On deciduous trees and shrubs, the damage may result in twisted, cupped leaves, yellowing and marginal browning of the leaves, and shrunken or misshapen form of leaves.

If you believe you are seeing these signs and Imprelis has been used on your property or your neighbor's, please contact your lawn care provider, the Plant Disease Diagnostic Clinic (pddc.wisc.edu), the Turfgrass Diagnostic Lab (www.tdl.wisc.edu), or your local UW-Extension office (715 365-2750). 
