Torpee Creek to run through concrete, not culverts

Governor Scott Walker recently signed a \$710,000 contract to replace the Torpee Creek structure on WIS 32 south of Wabeno in Forest County. Construction is scheduled to begin early August.

Radtko Contractors, Inc. is the prime contractor for the project. Crews will replace the deteriorating culverts with a concrete structure, which will improve the habitat for the native brook trout.

Construction is scheduled for completion by the end of October 2011.

During construction, crews will reduce traffic on WIS 32 at the structure to one lane using temporary signals.

One hundred percent of the project will be paid with federal transportation funds.

Forest County Potawatomi Announce \$50,000 Grant to Town of Argonne

Crandon, Wis: The Forest County Potawatomi Community announced a \$50,000 grant commitment to the Town of Argonne to offset the cost of a new fire truck. The new truck, now in use, serves the Town of Argonne and other communities in Forest County through mutual aid.

"The Tribe is pleased to contribute to the Town of Argonne's purchase of a new fire truck to improve the fire service for our area residents," said Forest County Potawatomi Chairman Gus Frank.

The chassis, tank and equipment were purchased separately and volunteers assembled the new fire truck themselves, saving the town well over \$100,000. The \$50,000 grant commitment from the Potawatomi, to be spread out in five yearly installments, brings the term of the Town's loan down from ten years to less than five years.

A new truck was sorely needed as the 27-member all volunteer fire department previously used an old milk hauler and an old septic truck.

"The new fire truck greatly improves the service our firefighters are able to provide, both to the 500-plus citizens of Argonne and the surrounding areas," said Dan Samz, Argonne Chairman.

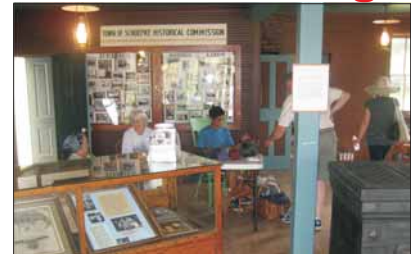
The grant to Argonne follows previously announced grant awards the school districts of Crandon, Laona and Wabeno, the Community Coalition of Forest County, the Forest County Aging & Disability Resource Center, Forest County Commission on Aging, the Wabeno Sanitary District and the Town of Laona.

The Tribe is the largest employer in Forest County, providing approximately 800 jobs to area residents through tribal government, the Tribe's health center, its Carter hotel and casino, and other businesses.

New email scam

My department has been made aware of a new Internet email scam, in which the recipient gets an email that appears to have been sent by a friend or family member and seems to be legitimate. The email advises the recipient that the sender is either in London or Africa and has been robbed of all their money. The email asks the recipient to wire money to them via Western Union (or it may specify another company). The email accounts used thus far have been Hotmail. Although these emails may appear to have come from a known friend or family member, they are likely a scam.

If you receive an email that seems suspicious to you in any way (especially one requesting money), DO NOT respond to it. Instead, contact your local law enforcement agency to advise them and also contact Microsoft.com. to report these emails.

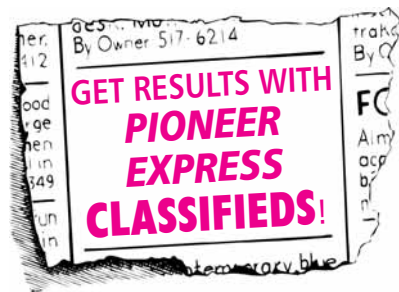

Won't vote for Simac

This is in response to Senate Candidate Kim Simac's open letter to the Seniors of the 12th District. Ms. Simac has been contradictory in several issues that are facing our state, but none more than issues affecting Senior Citizens.

The Medicare, Medicaid, and Badger Care have been hit hard in Wisconsin. "I will go on record now, and say I do not support such drastic cuts," she said in her letter.

She also said in that interview, when talking about entitlement programs, "My state of Wisconsin is, um, awful legislative wise you could call it the socialist state of Wisconsin."

In a recent radio debate between Ms. Simac and her Republican opponent, Robert Lussow, Ms. Simac was asked if she would have been in Madison, would she have voted on the budget.

"Yes, I would have voted for the budget. I think it is a good budget for the state of Wisconsin," Simac said. This budget is full of budget cuts for the elderly, the poor and disabled. I feel that I am confused by Ms. Simac when she says, "I will go on record now and say I do not support such drastic cuts," after she has already said she would have voted on the budget that made these cuts. Ms. Simac, this is the age of the internet, and it is easy to find your views on issues. I cannot trust your words Ms. Simac, and I have my Social Security and future Medicare to think about, so I cannot and will not vote for you on August 16.

To the Editor:

We were out of the country during the whole "Madison episode" earlier this year. We watched from afar with amazement. We saw names and faces of people we knew personally line up on both sides of an issue that had been brewing for years. When we got back in May we tried to talk to people and get a sense for what was driving the emotion. What would make our friends and neighbors so contentious amongst one another? We heard passionate arguments on both sides.

We're at a point in history where we all need to reexamine our core principles and the things that really matter. We also need to assume that people with whom we disagree are doing the same.

I've known Jim Holperin for over 50 years. We grew up together. His wife Kathy and my sister were good friends growing up. My dad built the family home his mother lives in to this day. While our political philosophies have differed over the years, I've always known Jim to be a good man. When Jim and the other democrats made the decision to leave for Illinois and not participate in the process they violated some of my core principles.

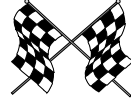

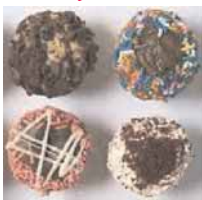

exercising. Follow the American College of Sports Medicine guidelines for fluid intake before and during physical activity. These guidelines recommend that people drink about 17 ounces of fluid about two hours before exercise. During exercise, they recommend that people start drinking fluids early, and drink them at regular intervals to replace fluids lost by sweating.

4. Water Helps Keep Skin Looking Good.

Your skin contains plenty of water, and functions as a protective barrier to prevent excess fluid loss. But don't expect over-hydration to erase wrinkles or fine lines, says Atlanta dermatologist Kenneth Ellner, MD. You can also help "lock" moisture into your skin by using moisturizer, which creates a physical barrier to keep moisture in.

5. Water Helps Your Kidneys. Body fluids transport waste products in and out of cells. The main toxin in the body is blood urea nitrogen, a water-soluble waste that is able to pass through the kidneys to be excreted in the urine, explains Guest.

When you're getting enough fluids, urine flows freely, is light in color and free of odor. When your body is not getting enough fluids, urine concentration, color, and odor increases because the kidneys trap extra fluid for bodily functions.

If you chronically drink too little, you may be at higher risk for kidney stones, especially in warm climates, Guest warns.

6. Water Helps Maintain Normal Bowel Function. Adequate hydration keeps things flowing along your gastrointestinal tract and prevents constipation. When you don't get enough fluid, the colon pulls water from stools to maintain hydration -- and the result is constipation

6 Reasons to Drink Water

Americans seem to carry bottled water everywhere they go these days. In fact, it has become the second most popular drink (behind soft drinks). But water lovers got a jolt recently when we heard that a new report had found that the benefits of drinking water may have been oversold. Apparently, the old suggestion to drink eight glasses a day was nothing more than a guideline, not based on scientific evidence.

But don't put your water bottle or glass down just yet. While we may not need eight glasses, there are plenty of reasons to drink water. In fact, drinking water (either plain or in the form of other fluids or foods) is essential to your health.

"Think of water as a nutrient your body needs that is present in liquids, plain water, and foods. All of these are essential daily to replace the large amounts of water lost each day," says Joan Koelmay, RD, dietitian for the Beverage Institute, an industry group.

Kaiser Permanente nephrologist Steven Guest, MD, agrees: "Fluid losses occur continuously, from skin evaporation, breathing, urine, and stool, and these losses must be replaced daily for good health," he says.

When your water intake does not equal your output, you can become dehydrated. Fluid losses are accentuated in warmer climates, during strenuous exercise, in high altitudes, and in older adults, whose sense of thirst may not be as sharp.

Here are a few reasons to make sure you're drinking enough water or other fluids every day:

1. Drinking Water Helps Maintain the Balance of Body Fluids. Your body is composed of about 60% water. The functions of these bodily fluids include digestion, absorption, circulation, creation of saliva, transportation of nutrients, and maintenance of body temperature.

2. Water Can Help Control Calories. For years, dieters have been drinking lots of water as a weight loss strategy. While water doesn't have any magical effect on weight loss, substituting it for higher calorie beverages can certainly help.

3. Water Helps Energize Muscles. Cells that don't maintain their balance of fluids and electrolytes shrivel, which can result in muscle fatigue.

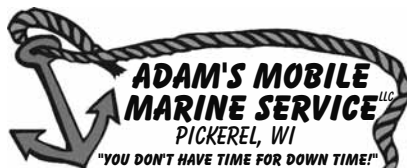

New tick disease Just what we needed!

When spending time outdoors in the Northwoods, you should always be on the lookout for ticks. But those pesky parasites have one more weapon to their name: the Powassan virus (POW). Deer ticks in Minnesota are known to carry this virus, with six cases reported from 2008-2010. Symptoms of the POW virus can include fever, headache, vomiting, weakness, confusion, loss of coordination, speech difficulties, and memory loss; symptoms occur within one to five weeks of an infected tick's bite. The virus can cause encephalitis and meningitis.

Deer ticks are already known carriers of Lyme Disease, which can present symptoms of muscle soreness, fatigue, chills, joint pains, and a bull's-eye or

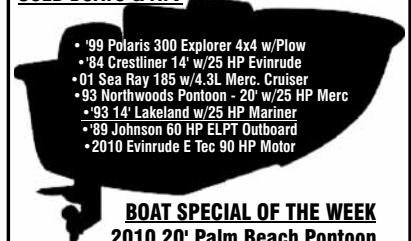

solid red rash, usually expanding around the tick bite. These early signs usually appear within a month of the bite. For more information on telling deer ticks apart from wood ticks, Lyme Disease, and tick prevention, visit the DNR website: <http://dnr.wi.gov/org/caer/ce/ee/critter/insect/ticked.htm>. Always call your doctor if you see symptoms of tick-borne diseases.

When you're enjoying the outdoors, remember that using tick-repellent bug sprays, tucking pants into hiking boots/tennis, wearing light-colored clothing (making ticks easier to spot), and checking for ticks after being outdoors for any length of time can protect you from ticks and the diseases they can carry. A good way to make sure you've gotten all the ticks off is to throw your clothes in the dryer on high heat for five minutes; ticks will get stuck in the lint trap.

The first annual Weiner Fest North was held on Saturday, July 30th, at the Lakewood Town Hall and Community Center.

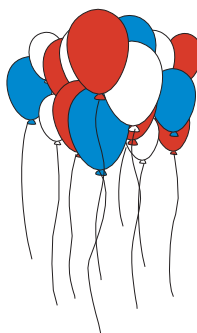
