Potawatomi Museum & Cultural Center has a facelift



On September 22nd, the Forest County Potawatomi Museum, east of Crandon on Highway 8, held an open house unveiling of their museum restoration and updating

The Potawatomi Museum has always been a great place to visit and learn about Native American culture and the history of one of the prominent segments of the Forest County community. According to museum curator Mike Alloway, the museum was planned for a refit and update every five years when the idea of a museum and cultural center was conceived.

There was certainly nothing wrong with the last museum design, and this one is also exceptional. There are old photos, of course, reproduced in a copper color versus black and white. There are more video and interactive displays, but the highlight for most is a display of Chief Simon's ceremonial clothes and many of his

Chief Simon died in 1930, in Wabeno. He was descended from a long line of Potawatomi Chiefs. He worked as a timber cruiser, worked as an interpreter for the Tribe, and worked with the State Historical Society with Potawatomi history and culture.

When he passed, he bequeathed some of his possessions to the State Historical Society. The good news is that Chief Simon's artifacts are now on indeterminate loan to the Potawatomi Museum, and can be viewed by one and all.

John Toth with the Triad Creative Group, from Brookfield designed the refit in conjunction with Alloway. Toth said all of the graphics are updated with brighter colors, and all of the interactive displays are now highdefinition and touch screen. The project has taken a year, and it is definitely worth the wait.

In addition to Chief Simon's artifacts, there are early artifacts that date back to the tragic march from Chicago to Kansas, the "Trail of Blood." The entire display is a feast for the eye, and it is well worth a visit



Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum **Restoration Continues**

The Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum Restoration Committee reports that the next phase of restoration is underway. The Museum was closed this summer, but the staff managed to squeeze in six school tours in early May. Area fourth graders thoroughly enjoyed their visits as part of their study of Wisconsin history and their lumberjack heritage.

A lot of work preceded this long-anticipated phase of replacing the log walls. In mid-May, the "Boys from Blackwell " Job Corps helped to empty the museum. All artifacts were stored in a nearby aircraft hanger. Then Duane Harris Tree Service removed a nearby hundredfoot hemlock that turned out to be rotten inside. Next Jim Kmecheck & Sons raised the building, one side at a time, after which Frank Erler Masonry installed the footings and block wall. When the masonry was cured, Kevin Marshall Excavating cleaned up the site and installed drain tile/gravel around the perimeter of the building.

Since summer is a very busy time for the adjoining McCauslin Golf Course, the project was put on hold until after Labor Day when Kmacheck and the Blackwell Job Corps labor crew returned. They teamed up to fill and level the huge dirt-holes in both the cookshack and the bunkhouse

Astro Log Homes owner Jerry DeWane and his sidekick Bob are currently at work replacing the outside log walls. To save travel time and expense, Kathleen and Jon Marsh are providing housing for Jerry and his work crew at their "overflow" cottage in Townsend. Jerry promises to work as long as weather permits, but it appears more and more likely that we will need another year to get the entire job done.

"The job is turning out to be much more involved than we ever anticipated," says Restoration Committee Fundraising chair Kathleen Marsh. "Chris Goetz passed away in June, leaving us without his much needed expertise. Due to health issues, Norb Langer and his wife Vivian have moved to Green Bay, so Norb has been unable to help as much as we had anticipated. He has turned over the main responsibility to me, with Bob Brown and Ron Viaene to assist. "

She went on: Thus far, the restoration project has been more than challenging with cost overruns that will require renewed efforts to procure additional funding. I have been out to the jobsite every day, finding that no visit is complete unless a new, and the thornier, the more likely, problem arises. I am learning though, and when Jerry or Ron or Jim says, 'we'll get it done,' it restores my selfconfidence. Bar none, these are some of the finest guys I have ever worked with.

One Strike...You're Out! Holperin Warns **BadgerCare Plus Basic Participants**

Wisconsin's Department of Health Services (DHS) has instituted a "no exceptions" rule which ends participation in the state's BadgerCare Plus Basic Plan for anyone who is late sending in their monthly premium, State Senator Jim Holperin (D-Eagle River) warned constituents this wee


"I've been contacted by several individuals who made premium payments that were late by a couple of days, and in every case their BadgerCare Plus Basic policies were cancelled outright...no questions asked. and no exceptions allowed," he said.

"There are grace periods for Wisconsinites receiving BadgerCare for children and families, but those policies are subsidized by the state," Holperin explained. "The BadgerCare Plus Basic Plan is supported only by participant premiums and so it is essential that enrollees send in their premium payment by the 5th of every month to continue receiving health insurance."

"I've tried to intervene in several cases where payments were inadvertently late or where there were other mix-ups, but the Department has made it clear there will be no exceptions made for individuals who do not pay on time. Plus Basic enrollees who do not pay on time will be dropped from the Plan at the end of the month they last paid for and will not be able to re-enroll," Holperin added.

The 12th district legislator noted that the BadgerCare Plus Basic Plan stopped accepting new applicants in March and is being phased out over time. Those currently enrolled in the program will continue to receive coverage so long as they pay on time, but the program is basically closed." Holperin explained. "The one strike and you're out policy is obviously designed to end the program as soon as possible," he said.

In August, the Basic Plan premium increased from \$200 per month to \$250 per month.



MADISON Governor Scott Walker and Wisconsin Department of Workforce Development (DWD) Secretary Scott Baumbach today urged veterans seeking new employment opportunities, to call the DWD Job Center Toll Free Number, 1 - 888 - 258 -9966, to establish a direct link with DWD specialists who can help them find work

"Our veterans are American heroes to whom we owe an enormous debt of gratitude," said Governor Scott Walker. "When they are finished answering the call of service, we encourage them to call our Job Center Hotline so we can help them find employment Employers who have job openings and want to hire veterans should call the number, too, and we'll work to help them find the veterans with the necessary job skills. Our service men and women have outstanding work and leadership abilities that would be an asset to many

To help employers and job seekers connect, DWD has joined with its partners in sponsoring job fairs throughout the year, including 14 for veterans in particular. More than 35 employers with 700 jobs to fill are registered for a job fair today at the Zablocki Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Milwaukee.

"Since the September 11 terrorist attacks on our nation a decade ago, many brave men and women from Wisconsin answered the call to protect our nation," Secretary Baumbach said. "At the Department of Workforce Development, we are ready to answer the

calls of those returning from service in search of work. We are ready to assist all veterans."

Veterans who call the toll free number and identify themselves as veterans will be connected promptly or referred to the appropriate employment services, including to the DWD Veterans Services staff. These employees, all disabled veterans, provide employment and training services to veterans, including about 8,800 last year alone. The call center, operated by DWD's Job Service Bureau, is also available to help employers and other jobseekers throughout Wisconsin.

"Since Governor Walker took office, Wisconsin's business climate has improved, Secretary Baumbach said. "Wisconsin has added 28,700 private sector jobs so far this year. The manufacturing sector alone has added 15,000 jobs, the largest year - to - date gain

· Have your health-care provider review all of your medications, including those sold over the counter.

He was taken from us that tragic day four years ago. It feels just like yesterday, a day we'll never forget.



Food security

Madison, Wis.--A newly released report from the U.S. Department of Agriculture shows that 11.8 percent of Wisconsin households were food insecure--or lacking assured access to enough food for a healthy and active life--during 2008-2010. The number represents a nearly three-percentage-point increase over the previous threeyear period, when the rate was 9 percent.

While Wisconsin continues to fare better than the nation as a whole, food insecurity has increased as fast in Wisconsin as it has nationwide--more than 30 percent since 2005-2007

The rise in food insecurity is consistent with other trends in the state. Wisconsin's poverty and unemployment rates, and the share of residents participating in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly known as Food Stamps) have all increased substantially in the past several years. All of these indicators point to an increase in economic hardship affecting Wisconsin families.

"Federally funded food and nutrition programs,

such as SNAP and school meals, play a tremendously important role in helping food insecure families, and in keeping food insecurity rates from being even higher than they are now," says Judi Bartfeld, food security research and policy specialist with UW-Extension and director of the Institute for Research on Poverty's RIDGE Center for National Food and Nutrition Assistance Research

According to Bartfeld, participation in the SNAP program has increased throughout the state in recent rears, from around 10 percent in 2005 to 17 percent in 2010. While SNAP does not meet all of people's food needs, it is an important buffer against hunger.

Both in Wisconsin and nationwide, certain households are more at risk for food insecurity. Groups at higher risk include the poor and low-income; households with children; single-parent households; minorities; and households of people with disabilities, Bartfeld says.

Precise data on how food insecurity varies around the state are not available, but food insecurity is strongly linked to poverty. In general, poverty--and thus food insecurity--is more prevalent in Milwaukee, as well as broadly in the more northern parts of the state.

While income is important, other factors matter

as well. Research has found that food insecurity is more common when prevailing rent in an area is higher; when there is very low proximity to supermarkets; and when unemployment is more widespread.

Effective strategies to combat hunger take multiple forms, including working to create jobs and increase wages; enhancing access to affordable and healthy foods in the community; and strengthening the public and private safety nets, according to Amber Canto, UW-Extension poverty and food security specialist.

At least 25 counties in Wisconsin have local coalitions working to address hunger in the community. says Canto. "Local anti-hunger coalitions address food insecurity and poverty through efforts that include community awareness and education, connecting families to local resources, working to increase food at emergency food outlets, helping families access fresh fruits and vegetables through local farmers' markets and community gardens, and strengthening community infrastructure and capacity," she says.

Storing **Apples**

With fall here it's time to pick apples. And all of us are guilty of picking more than we can possibly eat quickly. Here are some storing tips to lengthen the life of apples.

Inspect all apples for

- bruises, cuts and soft spots Only perfect fruit is suitable for storage.
- ·Sort the apples by size: small, medium and large. Since large apples don't store as well, this will make it easy to ensure that they get eaten first.
- Place the sorted apples in perforated plastic bags or in boxes lined with perforated plastic (to allow for air circulation).
- Store in a cool basement, garage, fruit cellar or refrigerator. The ideal storage temperature is 30-32°F with 90% humidity. Apples are likely to suffer freeze damage if the temperature dips below 30° and will ripen quickly, if the temperature rises above 40°, so do your best to match these conditions.
- ·Check regularly for signs of spoilage, and remove any damaged fruit.

Tips:

- Pick apples when they are ripe. Over or under-ripened fruit will not store well.
- ·Store apples as soon after picking as possible.
- Avoid storing your apples near onion or potatoes. They'll readily absorb the flavor of other foods.
- Don't mix apple varieties. Different varieties ripen at different rates.
- Expect your apples to last up to five months in storage depending on variety and


