While at the veterinarians office the blood and pus from her badly infected neck was dripping onto the floor. The vet explained to me that she was in a lot of pain; he felt she had been in this condition for about three weeks. While waiting in the room with me; she laid patiently at my feet gently taking treats from my hand. We sedated her and I helped the vet take the collar out of her neck. The chain had to be cut three times with wire cutters. I couldn't help thinking that wire cutters need to be in a garage not a vet office Time and Time again I go on these calls expecting the animals to be mean and frightened when in a situation like this, 99 percent of the time they are the most loving animals you could ever meet. With the help of antibiotics and the great care given to by our caregivers "Anna" is

Choosing a Sleep Aid

More than 50 million Americans suffer from some sort of treatable sleep disorder. If you're running short on zzz's seek help from your health care provider. Ongoing sleep deprivation contributes to poor health and reduces your quality of life. What can you do to improve your sleep? Relax before bedtime, limit caffeine, alcohol and naps. Exercise regularly and, most important, follow the same sleep schedule.

When self-care measures fail, ask your provider about treatment. Following is a brief summary of current drug options.

Over-the-counter options:

Antihistamines: Diphenhydramine and doxylamine are antihistamine-based medicines that may aid sleep for a short time, but are not recommended to aid sleep for more than a few weeks. They can cause drowsiness, impaired performance and driving, and urinary retention. **Valerian:** This herbal supplement may help improve

sleep, but the long-term safety and best dose are

Melatonin: This hormone supplement may aid some patients with insomnia, but the long-term safety is unknown

Prescription Medications

Prescription sleeping pills can be helpful for occasional, short-term use, such as during bereavement or brief periods of high stress. However, these medicines can have adverse side effects and may interact with other drugs. Wake-time sedation, decreased alertness, and

motor impairment can occur; never take them with alcohol or sedatives

Bottom line: Use prescription and OTC sleep medications cautiously - and always with your provider's guidance



Letter to the Editor:

The upcoming special session of the Wisconsin legislature will include several transportation-related reforms to increase the competitiveness of our agriculture, manufacturing, and shipping industries. These proposals include various changes to laws that regulate the size and weight of trucks on Wisconsin highways.

regulate the size and weight on truchs on wisconsininghways.

Changes to truck size and weight laws should be made only after careful consideration of their impact not only on the trucking industry, but also on highway safety and the condition of our infrastructure. Recognizing this fact, the legislature passed a law in 2007 requiring the Department of Transportation to complete a comprehensive technical study of our current truck size and weight laws, and how they could be improved. The "Wisconsin Truck Size and Weight Study" was completed in 2009.

in 2009.

Two of the bills proposed in the current special session are a direct outgrowth of that study. Those bills will allow, under certain circumstances, an increase in maximum truck weight from 80,000 to 90,000 pounds. While it may seem that heavier trucks automatically mean more road damage and less safe travel, that isn't the case. By also requiring an extra axle to distribute the additional weight and increase braking ability, these heavier trucks. By also requiring an extra axie to distribute the additional weight and increase braking ability, these heavier trucks can operate without greater degradation of our infrastructure or reduced highway safety. This carefully considered increase in truck weights means less trucks on the highway, lower cost for shippers, and a competitive advantage for Wisconsin's agriculture and manufacturing industries.

Other proposals in the package of reforms will make regulatory changes that bring Wisconsin's truck permitting laws into closer conformity with our neighboring states. By doing so, we decrease the regulatory burden on interstate shippers and reduce the cost of transporting the freight that moves our economy. A careful, evidence-based reform of our truck size and weight laws will help improve the economic environment for job creators by making our transportation system operate more efficiently, without compromising safety or the condition of our highways. That's a wise move all

The project, headed by forester Al Murray, was to get ahead of the possible spread of the emerald ash borer by identifying those ash trees that were in the vicinity of homes and buildings on the reservation. This also included the sites where future projects are planned. Murray did the grant work for this project. According to Al Murray, Scott Cleereman did much of the site work, identifying ash trees that should be removed or trimmed to bring back to good health. About 1200 trees were identified, with 287 trees removed. The Potawatomi are the first tribal unit of government to win this award.

In commemoration of the award, there was a planting of cedar trees in a space near the Cultural Center. Those attending braved the rains and mist to be there for the planting seen in the photo below. Lawsuit Dismissed in 3rd District Court

MADISON (AP) -- A state appeals court says the families of six people killed by a rogue police officer in Crandon can't challenge the county's decision to hire him. The families contended in a lawsuit that Forest County Sheriff's Deputy Tyler Peterson suffered from mental disorders that left him prone to violence. They argue the county should have conducted psychological tests on him before he was hired, wrongly gave him an assault rifle and let him carry it off-duty.

A circuit judge dismissed the claims, saying the county is immune from such claims.

The 3rd District Court of Appeals agreed, noting the state Supreme Court has repeatedly stated that Wisconsin law protects government subdivisions from lawsuits challenging discretionary acts such as hiring. The families' attorney didn't immediately return a




