Rail historian, author Jeff Terry to visit Lumberjack Steam Train



Author of The Story of the Lumberjack Steam Train to visit July 7

In real life, Jeff Terry works as a real railroad man, making his living as a locomotive engineer for the Canadian Pacific Railroad. Even on his days off, Terry is never far from the rails as a rail historian, author and all-around railway buff.

Terry writes the preservation column for Railfan and Railroad Magazine. He's visited Laona four times, resulting in two published articles and photographs on the Lumberjack Steam Train.

"The '4 Spot' is the last remaining logging steam train operating within the state of Wisconsin," says Terry. Number 4 is also one of only 11 'Prairie' type (2-6-2) locomotives still running in the United States."

Terry will be taking a "railman's holiday" and making a return visit to the Lumberjack Steam Train and riding the rails out to Camp Five.

"The railway is still going strong in Laona," according to Terry. "The opportunity to ride a real steam locomotive is very limited. Thanks to Camp Five and the Laona & Northern, the logging and railroad boom times can still be celebrated with a trip aboard an authentic coal-fired steam train."

Terry will be riding the 11 a.m. train out to Camp Five on July 7, where he will be available to meet fans and sign copies of his book, The Story of the Lumberjack Steam Train. Copies of the book will be available for pur

The Lumberjack Steam Train is located in Laona, Wis., within convenient driving distance of Chicago, the Twin Cities and all points in the state. Tickets on the Lumberjack Steam Train include the round-trip ride and admission into the Wisconsin Forestry Museum Complex of historic and natural attractions, including the Logging Museum and Blacksmith Shop, Green Treasure Forest Tour, Animal Barn and Corral, the Nature Center, Cracker Barrel Store, Francis Weiner Diesel Static Display and Choo Choo Hut Restaurant & Picnic Area.


Crandon Lions donate to Yankees

- Watermelon -Fruit or Vegetable?

Watermelon is a fruit: Watermelon is the fruit of a plant originally from a vine of Southern Africa. The watermelon fruit, loosely considered a type of melon (although not in the genus Cucumis), has a smooth exterior rind and a juicy, sweet, usually red interior flesh. The species description Citrullus vulgaris is sometimes, synonymously, used to refer to this plant (vulgaris meaning "common" - Shosteck, 1974).

Like the pepper, tomato, and pumpkin, watermelon is botanically a fruit. According to Webster's dictionary and Wikipedia, a fruit is the ripened ovary of a seed plant and it's contents and a watermelon is a large oblong roundish fruit (2004-2006). Consumers use watermelon primarily as a fruit because of its sweet flavor and refreshing qualities.

Watermelon is also a Vegetable: According to Webster's dictionary a vegetable is anything made or obtained from plants (2004). Watermelon is a member of the cucurbitaceae plant family of gourds (classified as Citrullus Lantus), related to the cucumber, squash and pumpkin (Maynard, 2001). It is planted from seeds or seedlings, harvested and then cleared from the field like other vegetables. Since watermelon is grown as a vegetable crop using vegetable production systems, watermelon is considered a vegetable (Wolford, 2004).

How Watermelon is used as a fruit or a vegetable: Watermelon is popularly used as a fruit, to be a sweet enhancer or fun accompaniment to our everyday meals. The watermelon is often cut into bite sized squares or balled, or very often simply sliced and enjoyed. It's also used in the types or recipes that are created using fruit.

However, the whole watermelon is edible, even the rind. In places like China, the watermelon is stir fried. stewed and often pickled. In this case, the watermelon is being used as a vegetable. Pickled watermelon rind is also widespread in Russia. (Wikipedia, 2006).

Scientifically Speaking: The scientific name of watermelon is Citrullus lanatus. It is a member of the cucurbitaceae family. Life: Embryophyta (plants): Angiospermae (flowering plants) Order: Cucurbitales (pumpkin and melon family): Family: Cucurbitaceae.

There are about 120 genera and 735 species of

Cucurbitaceae worldwide, with 18 genera and 76 species native to southern Africa. Some well known vegetables fall in this family such as watermelon, hubbard squash, butternut, pumpkin, sweet melons and cucumber.

All a Matter of Perspective: Depending on how

you want to classify it, a watermelon can be considered a fruit or a vegetable. No matter which way you slice it,

watermelon is fun to eat and very good for you!

Fourth annual Landing Blitz for aquatic invasive species doubles coverage

MADISON - Citizen volunteers and aquatic invasive species experts will be teaming up to educate boaters at more than 200 landings across Wisconsin over the week of the Fourth of July. This is the fourth annual "Landing Blitz," where participants will provide free boat inspection and remind boaters how to avoid spreading Eurasian water-milfoil. zebra mussels and other aquatic invasive species. The program has grown over the years, with the 200 landings staffed this year more than double last year's coverage of 90 landings staffed by boat inspectors.

Aquatic invasive species (AIS) can crowd out native species, disrupt lake ecosystems and interfere with boating, fishing and other recreation. They create extra costs and lost value to homeowners and to state industries such as utilities, real estate, manufacturing, shipping, tourism, fishing and recreation. Invasives and fish diseases (such as viral hemorrhagic septicemia or VHS) spread to new waters primarily aboard boating and fishing equipment, or when live fish or water moved from one water body to another.

This year's Landing Blitz runs from June 29 to July 9 and has drawn volunteers from 40 counties trained through Wisconsin's Clean Boats, Clean Waters program. These inspectors will demonstrate the required prevention steps boaters must take before they leave a landing, provide reminder stickers for trailers and talk about Wisconsin aquatic invasive species laws. Boaters found practicing good boat hygiene can be rewarded with a

"We know that most folks on the water are aware of the aquatic invasive species laws and are concerned and want to take the steps to clean their boats and equipment," says Bob Wakeman, Wisconsin's Statewide Aquatic Invasive Species coordinator. "But until we have 100 percent compliance, the week of July Fourth is a great time for us to be on the water spreading the word, as well as show our appreciation for the boaters and anglers who are taking care of their lakes.

For many citizens, keeping invasive species out of their favorite lakes and rivers has come to mean not just cleaning their own gear, but getting active in community

The level of support this year has been incredible. So has the diversity of participants. It's great to see people getting involved in protecting their lakes and rivers is on the rise," says Mike Putnam of DNR, Landing Blitz coordinator.

Oneida County has one such growing program. Aquatic invasive species staff and volunteers will cover 28 county lakes over the week, up from a total of 17 last year, with 23 of these staffed by lake association volunteers. Aquatic Invasive Species County Coordinator Michele Sadauskas says it's increased citizen involvement that's been getting the word out on invasive species prevention.

"Although we do put a lot of focus on the Landing Blitz, most lake associations will be out there anyway for the Clean Boats, Clean Waters program. We get great participation, explains Sadauskas. "For example, Three Lakes Waterfront Association has 800 members and a good volunteer base. This allows Oneida's AIS county staff to cover other areas. We're very grateful for their help.

Landing Blitz inspectors come from a diverse partnership that includes citizen volunteers, AIS county coordinators, UW-Extension interns, lake associations, resource conservation and development councils, nonprofit organizations, Boy Scout troops, the University of Wisconsin Sea Grant and DNR.

They'll be reminding boaters, anglers and others enjoying Wisconsin waters that they are required to:

INSPECT boats, trailers, and equipment; REMOVE all attached aquatic plants and animals;

DRAIN all water from boats, vehicles, and equipment; and

NEVER MOVE plants or live fish away from a water body (limited exceptions apply. Visit DNR's website and search keywords "bait laws").

An AED (Automated Electric Defibrillator) can mean the difference between life and death, and the Wabeno Pubic Library is now a local site for public access to one of the devices under the auspices of Project ADAM which originally brought AED's into public schools. Under the terms of the program public libraries are eligible for half f the cost of the device , on the contingency that matching funds be raised. The Wisconsin Masonic Foundation is one of the major charities working with Project ADAM, and granted \$800 towards the goal of a Project ADAM (Automated Defibrillators in Adam's

Memory)
Crandon Lodge 287 worked with the library to apply to the Masonic Medical Fund of Wisconsin to receive the match dollars needed to purchase a brand new defibrillator. Other major donors were the Wisconsin Dual Sport Riders, and the President of the Torke' Coffee Company, Ward Torke. Without these generous donors the device could never have been purchased.

southeastern Wisconsin. Many of these deaths appear due to ventricular fibrillation. After Adam Lemel, a 17-year-old. The device is exactly like those found in airports that are completely automatic" explained library director Carol Lee Saffioti-Hughes. "Absolutely no training is required, with voice instructions as soon as the device is opened. The members of the Library Board were extremely supportive once the project was described and proposed to them, and they unanimously supported our goal to have one in the library."

Under the terms of the program, the device is registered with the state, and with the Emergency Plan of the town of Wabeno, and is accessible from the street within three feet of the front entry of the building. Many larger cities are promoting the acquisition of these devices so that they are place in every tenth store or business, or within a three minute walk from one device to another. Many churches are also decided to acquire similar devices. The Library's AED is the first to be permanently installed in a public building in Wabeno other than the public schools, United Area Rescue Squad, and local law enforcement access.



Potato Pest Populations High

The Colorado Potato Beetle and Potato Leafhopper have arrived for the season, and their populations are at season highs. The Colorado Potato Beetle chews leaves to the vein on potato crops, and its numbers are currently high in Wisconsin. Each year, the beetle adults overwinter and lay eggs in May and June. Their young are beginning to mature, and will soon be causing damage to potato crops, especially those already weakened by high temperatures. It's very important for potato growers to control this first generation early; the second generation later in the summer will be even more disastrous to potato plants if early sightings are left

The Colorado Potato Beetle can be controlled with abamectin (Agri-Mek, Abba, Reaper, Athena, etc.), chlorantraniliprole (Voliam Xpress), novaluron (Rimon), rynaxypyr (Coragen), spinosad (Blackhawk, Entrust, SpinTor), or spinetoram (Radiant). In the coming week, we recommend that any of the former products be used as a series of two, successive foliar applications, spaced 7-10 days, but should not exceed the season total maximum active ingredient specified on the label.

Last year, Wisconsin's conservation warden service and local water patrols dedicated 1,684 hours and contacted 1,870 boaters during Operation Dry Water. There were 14 arrests of boating under the influence and 162 other boating citations issued along with 599 boating-

Operation Dry Water, a multi-agency, education and enforcement initiative launched by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators in 2009 in partnership with the U.S. Coast Guard, puts thousands of local, state and federal marine law enforcement officers on the water nationwide the last weekend in June to give operating while intoxicated enforcement high visibility during the peak boating season.

"Boaters who choose to operate while intoxicate will face the consequences of that decision," Zellmer said. "We want recreational boaters to enjoy themselves, but there will be zero tolerance for boating under the influence.

Operation Dry Water is a joint program of the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators and the U.S. Coast Guard. Intoxicated boaters will be watched with Operation Dry Water

Boaters will see Wisconsin's conservation wardens and local boat patrols on the water looking for impaired boat operators whose blood alcohol level is over the state limit of 0.08 percent as part of the national Operation Dry Water campaign slated for June 22 through

"We want to enhance everyone's safety by removing intoxicated boat operators from the water. We hope to educate as many boaters as possible about the hazards of operating while intoxicated," said Roy Zellmer, Department of Natural Resources boating law

A boat operator or passenger with a blood alcohol concentration above the legal limit runs a significantly increased risk of being involved in a boating accident. When impaired by alcohol, boating accidents are more likely and more deadly for both passengers and boat operators, many of whom capsize their vessel or simply fall overboard.

Operating while intoxicated is a primary contributing factor in nearly one in five boating fatalities nationwide, and Wisconsin's conservation wardens and boat patrols are committed to enforcing laws against this high-risk behavior to protect everyone on the water. Boaters found operating a recreational vessel with a blood alcohol concentration of 0.08 percent or higher will find their voyage terminated and they will be removed from the water for everyone's safety.





No fireworks allowed on the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest

Rhinelander, Wis. (June 27, 2012) Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest National Forest Supervisor, Paul Strong is reminding visitors and campers that the use of all fireworks is prohibited on all national forests and national grasslands.

Fireworks and other pyrotechnic devices are prohibited on national grassland and national forest lands year-round, regardless of weather conditions or holidays. Regulations are enforced, and violation is punishable as a misdemeanor by a fine of not more than \$5,000 or imprisonment of not more than six months, or both.

Forest visitors are also reminded to ensure that all fires are extinguished and cold to the touch before leaving them.

The mission of the U.S. Forest Service is to sustain the health, diversity, and productivity of the nation's forests and grasslands to meet the needs of present and future generations. 

Nicolet College cuts \$500,000 from 2012-13 budget;

\$1.1 million over past two years

The Nicolet College Board of Trustees recently passed a new budget that cuts \$500,000 from operational expenses for 2012-13 and adheres to the operational tax levy freeze which is in place for all state technical colleges.

"Everyone at Nicolet realizes that these are challenging economic times and that it is vital that we reduce operational expenses as much as possible," said Nicolet College President Elizabeth Burmaster. "The challenge is to make cuts and still move the college forward, maintain educational quality, and meet the changing needs of residents and businesses in the Northwoods. This budget does that."

The most recent budget reduction comes on top of the \$600,000 the board cut from the operational budget last year for a total of a \$1.1 million budget reduction over the past two years.

Much of these savings were realized through staff reductions and improved operational efficiencies. Starting July 1, the beginning of the new fiscal year, Nicolet will have the equivalent of 11 fewer full-time staff. All of these position cuts came from the administrative, support staff, and non-teaching ranks. Burmaster stressed that there were no cuts made to the number of instructor positions.

"It is critically important to maintain instructor positions in order to maintain a high level of educational quality and respond to workforce development needs," she explained.

Last year Nicolet cut the equivalent of 9.8 fulltime positions. This makes for a total reduction of 20.8 employee FTEs over the past two years.

Even with significant reductions in the past two budgets, Burmaster noted the college has prioritized new academic programs in an effort to expand career opportunities for residents and meet the workforce needs of Northwoods businesses. These new programs include manufacturing industrial maintenance, dental hygiene, architectural technology, geographic information systems, and two new certificates in information technology.

The 2012-13 budget is based on a 4 percent decline in equalized property value and a little more than a 2 percent increase in the total tax levy for the Nicolet District. Exact figures won't be known until fall when the state releases official equalized property values and the Board of Trustees determines the mill rate.

The mill rate is projected to be 1.22, resulting in the tax on a \$100.000 home to increase by \$7.24.

"Nicolet provides a quality education that prepares our students for the world of work and further education," Burmaster said. "We are committed to educational excellence which will be key to bringing economic prosperity back to the Northwoods."

Wisconsin's gray wolf population grew in 2012

PARK FALLS, Wis. — Wisconsin's gray wolf population at the close of the 2011-2012 winter was estimated to be 815-880, a roughly 4 percent increase over the 2010-2011 end-of-winter estimate. A total of 41-42 wolves were counted on Native American reservations and thus the total count of wolves outside of reservations was 774-838 wolves. A late winter population of 350 wolves outside reservations is the current state wolf population goal for Wisconsin.

Wolves in Wisconsin were removed from the federal endangered species list on January 27, 2012, and management authority was returned to the states and tribes for gray wolves living in the Western Great Lakes. Since 2004, the State of Wisconsin listed the gray wolf as a protected wild animal, and on April 2, 2012 it was designated a game species. The Department of Natural Resources is developing rules to allow a public wolf hunting and trapping season (PDF) starting October 15, 2012.

The annual winter wolf count relies on aerial tracking of radio-collared wolves, and snow track surveys by DNR and volunteer trackers. Also included are wolf sightings by members of the public and other agencies, including observations from trail cameras. The agency has conducted these counts since the winter of 1979-1980 when there were 25 wolves in the state.

A total of 213 wolf packs were detected in Wisconsin during the winter count consisting of at least two adult wolves each. Biologists found 51 packs distributed across central Wisconsin and 162 packs in northern Wisconsin. The largest pack in the state was Fort McCoy Pack in Monroe County with 10 wolves. At least 63 packs had five or more wolves in them.

It appeared the wolf population increased in 2012. With federal delisting and new status as a game species, controls will be applied to the wolf population to reduce conflicts, and reduce the population to more socially accepted levels, while maintaining a sustainable and healthy wolf population.

In 2010 the Wisconsin DNR initiated a Web notification of all wolf attacks on dogs for hunters and others concerned about wolf depredations. People can have their email address added to the notification list by searching for "wolf" on the DNR website and then clicking on the link for "dog depredations."

DNR continues to encourage volunteers in monitoring wolves

Wisconsin's wolf population estimate is based on data gathered by agency biologists and technicians, and more than 150 volunteers. DNR has conducted annual wolf surveys since winter 1979-1980, and volunteers have been involved in the surveys since 1995




