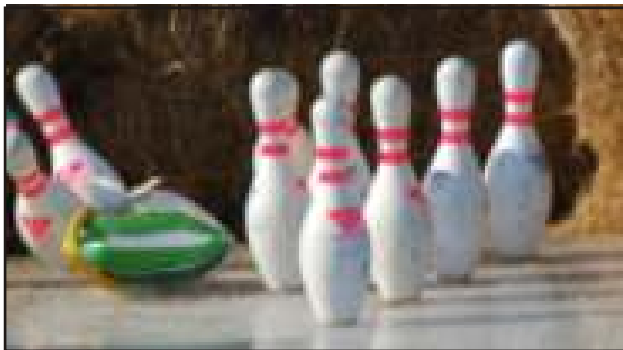

Goodman-Armstrong Creek Lions 4th Annual Coyote Hunt

Sight-in the varmint hunting firearms, the Goodman-Armstrong Creek Lions Club is sponsoring its fourth annual coyote hunt from March 2 to March 11. To become part of the hunt for cash prizes and to save deer, contact John Gorgol at 714 Witkowski Lane, Armstrong Creek, WI 54103. Gorgol's phone number is 715-336-2830 and his e-mail is JGORGOL@centurytel.net or Pete Osterberg at N20011 County H, Goodman, WI 54125. Osterberg's phone number is 715-336-2685.

The payout, the same amount of cash as last season but extended to five places, is as follows: First \$700, second \$400, third \$200, fourth \$50, fifth \$50. Slaying the largest coyote wins \$100.

Hunters have until March 1 to register at the lowest fee. Each hunter pays \$25 plus \$10 for the mandatory meal and kit collection at the Goodman Community Center March 2. The meal begins at 7:00 p.m. For those who have competed in past years, notice that the meal time is changed. After listening to hunters, some who had difficulty getting off work to arrive at five o'clock, Gorgol and Osterberg set dinner time two hours later.

Registration will be accepted at the meal site, but anyone registering after March 1 pays an additional \$10 late fee for a total of \$45. Again this year, George Buck of Buckaroo Barbecue Catering Services will prepare the meal. Served buffet style, Buck usually piles out turkey and pork (plain and barbecued), vegetables, potatoes (garlic red or mashed), gravy, stuffing, beans, and a couple surprise dishes, plus desserts. Plenty of food. Buck told Osterberg and Gorgol that he is considering a couple special dishes, as well, but he wouldn't announce them as he was still deciding what they'd be.

The hunt concludes March 11 at the Goodman Conservation Club, north on County H to Sportsman's Road. All hunters must arrive to have their critters weighed by 2:00 p.m. Food and refreshments will also be on sale at the Sportsman's Clubhouse. Osterberg and Gorgol and other Lions Club members will be there by noon or earlier to handle the first wave of weigh-ins.

Rules are simple. Attach the kit material according to instructions. No dogs or traps to keep the chase and hunt the same for Michiganders and Wisconsinites. Hunters may hunt singly and keep all the prize money or in two-person teams and split the winnings.

The hunt has grown with the extended time and with the raffles that are open only to competitors. Two rifles are part of the draw package, plus other donated prizes. These will be awarded at the Friday dinner. The G-AC Lions Club hunt has grown in the number of participants and in the number of kills. According to Osterberg, so has the number of coyotes. He said they are never eradicated because they multiply rapidly.

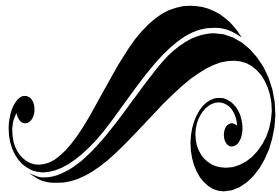

- Talk to your doctor about taking aspirin every day if you are a man over the age of 45, or a woman past menopause.
- Manage stress.

Likes the last Lincoln Building Plan Best

As we continue to follow the building plans to update the town of Lincoln's facilities, we applaud supervisors and the Building Committee for the patient, thoughtful decision-making approach they are taking. A building/remodeling project of this magnitude involves a gamut of decisions: determining actual needs, building costs, location site, ongoing maintenance costs, and consequently taxation of residents.

According to an article in the January 16, 2012, *Pioneer Express*, the most recent proposal from the consultant firm, Keller Construction, was \$1,444,000 for new facilities to be built on Bear Road.

We believe that plan contains excesses that make it too expensive not only to build, but to maintain. We also disagree with the Bear Road location. The present site of the town's facilities is perfect-- centrally located, easy to access, and not a target for vandalism.

Gary Mueller presented a plan at the January meeting to remodel the existing building and garage with the high-end cost being \$625,000. That's \$819,000 less than the Bear Road/Keller Construction proposal, and it keeps the facility where it belongs visible, easily accessible, and safer than an in-the-woods location.

Do you want to pay \$1,444,000 to build a facility on Bear Road AND continue to pay huge fees to maintain it? Isn't a remodeling project at the present Highway W site (including an updated, much-needed garage) with a price tag that's \$819,000 less a better plan?

New Medicare 5-Star Special Enrollment Period

New Medicare 5-Star Enrollment period to enroll in a PDP, Advantage Plan or Cost Plan with a Plan Performance rating of five (5) stars.

To enroll in a Medicare Part D drug plan or a Medicare Advantage plan, a Medicare beneficiary must be entitled to an enrollment period. In other words, a Medicare beneficiary cannot enroll or disenroll from a Medicare Part D plan or Advantage plan at will. He or she must be entitled to an enrollment period which allows him or her to enroll or disenroll. Every year Medicare has an Annual Enrollment Period. During this time all Medicare beneficiaries have the opportunity to get into a Part D or Advantage plan, switch from a Part D or Advantage plan into a different Part D or Advantage or disenroll from a Part D or Advantage plan they are enrolled in. The Annual Enrollment Period runs from October 15 to December 7 of each year.

Now that it is January 2012, does that mean that you have to wait until October 15, 2012 to obtain drug and/or health coverage if you missed your chance to enroll during the Annual Enrollment Period?

Not necessarily! The Annual Enrollment Period is not the only enrollment period that is available to Medicare beneficiaries. There are many different enrollment periods, some of which are available to all Medicare beneficiaries, some of which are only available to particular Medicare beneficiaries meeting certain conditions. If you are interested in enrolling in a Part D or Advantage plan prior to October 15, 2012, you should contact your local elderly benefit specialist. Depending on your circumstances, you may be eligible for an enrollment period that will allow you to get into a new Part D or Advantage plan.

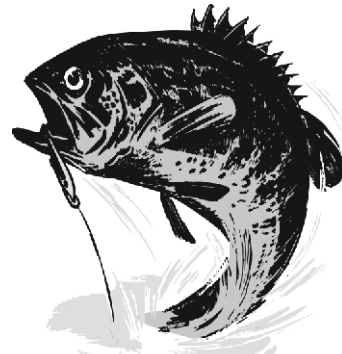
There is one new Medicare Enrollment Period available for the first time in 2012. This is the 5-Star Special Enrollment Period to Enroll in an PDP, Advantage Plan or Cost Plan with a Plan Performance Rating of Five (5) Stars.

Starting with 2012, each year Medicare releases a list of the best performing Part D and Advantage plans. These are plans that have done a good enough job for their enrollees (Medicare beneficiaries like you) that they have been awarded a 5 Star rating (the highest rating) by Medicare.

State instructional guidelines allow for this type of scheduling as the yearly required minutes of instruction for elementary students are substantially less than for 7-12 students.
