Our Wild Rivers Chapter of the Ruffed Grouse Society always does a great job holding the annual banquet, and this year was no exception. #### Volunteers needed at the Forest County Humane Society Shelter

This is a plea for all the animal loving, good-willed citizens of Forest County to give a few hours of your time each week. We the people of this great county, due to hard work and fortitude of a group of people, are very fortunate to have such a high caliber shelter to house our unwanted, abused, neglected or lost dogs and cats.

Any organization is only as good as its director and volunteer team. We have visited several shelters in this country, talking to directors and volunteers, taking notes and exchanging ideas. We have found that the more successful high-functioning shelters have large volunteer groups to perform specific functions.

If you should decide to become a part of this wonderful service to our community, the following is an idea of some of the daily tasks: for the dogs, walking, brushing, bathing, cleaning kennels, feeding and laundry. For the cats, cleaning cages and litter boxes, brushing. feeding and laundry.

The three daily shifts are 7:00 a.m., 2:00 p.m., and 7:00 p.m., seven days-a-week. Each shift involves two to three hours per person. It takes two people to walk dogs and one to two people to clean kennels and feed.

It takes one to two people in cat rooms to clean cages and litter boxes, brush, feed and laundry.

Please consider giving your shelter this much time every week. The animals of this county need you! There is nothing more gratifying at the end of a shift to know that the dog's and cat's needs have been met, and

#### Crandon joins Blue Line Community Coalition

The Crandon City Council approved a resolution that they hope will help preserve and eventually restore and enhance freight rail service to Crandon and Forest

County. The resolution was approved unanimously.

The resolution facilitated the City of Crandon joining the Blue Line Community Coalition. The coalition is an alliance formed with the purpose of working with other counties, towns and cities in Wisconsin to discuss enhanced local rail services and augmented rail infrastructure improvements by the Canadian National Railway (CN).

The resolution was drafted by the Forest County Economic Development Partnership's Executive Director, Jim Schuessler. "This is not a matter of just calling out CN," stated Schuessler, "but it is a matter of working with various groups and governments to establish the groundwork that, should the lines to be abandoned altogether, the groups can work together on what can be done to re-establish freight rail services. For example, as we expand our timber harvest we will have a great need for local rail.

Crandon Mayor Rob Jaeger acknowledged "there is certainly strength in numbers, and joining the Coalition can help us work on problems such as rail service with others that are facing a downgrade in service from CN." There will be no cost to the City of Crandon for joining the Blue Line Community Coalition.

"We are seeing expanded need for rail from both Forest County companies that are seeking to grow as well as those seeking to locate here," declared FCEDP President Jason Neilitz. "The next couple years will bring growth to our County and we must have the infrastructure to meet the demand.







#### For: Town of Lincoln Voters and Taxpayers

Town of Lincoln Chairwoman, Lynne Black, convened the most recent meeting of the Town Building Committee, which she also chairs, on March 20. It lasted just 70 minutes. About 60 concerned citizens attended. Most were unable to enter the meeting hall due to limited space. Those who could enter left with their concerns heightened by what they observed.

In a series of explanatory statements to the inquisitive citizens, she declared that the Building Committee intends to build a Town Building for the amount of \$750,000.00-\$800,000.00, that it will be built on the "Bear Road" site; will consist of 3500 to 4500 square feet, and will provide 1500 square feet of public meeting space. The other 2000-3000 square feet were not explained, but will undoubtedly contain offices, conference areas, kitchen, washrooms and storage.

In the face of skeptical citizens, the chairwoman showed a dogged determination to persist with her vision of what this town will build and where it will be built. She made it clear that the community center, for instance, will be of first priority over any needs for garage replacement. And, she made equally clear that there would be no further consideration of remodeling or rebuilding on the existing town hall site.

The first and only business for the building Committee was the approval of a RFP (request for proposal) for both design and construction management services for the building. The committee had not previously seen the documents, which had been hand carried there and distributed by Chairwoman Black. She, without explaining the contents or scope of the RFP to the public, declared that it would be sent to all local builders the following morning. Those in attendance welcomed this as a step in the right direction.

On later receiving a copy of the RFP, it was apparent that the documents defined the scope of work to include, not just building design, but much greatly expanded "construction management" duties. That means that the contractor is to oversee the hiring for the actual construction, and maintain, for instance their full-time personnel on the construction site for supervision of all the trades.

There are several things that are objectionable about this RFP:

<u>First</u>: The construction of a building not exceeding 4500 square feet requires some design work, but certainly does not require construction management. That size does not far exceed the size of a large home. We have good local builders who are trustworthy and competent to do the job satisfactorily. The required design work can be separately contracted for less than \$12,000.00 and perhaps as little as \$5000.00. The cost of contracting in accordance with the RFP is predicted to be almost \$130,000.00.

Second: Wayne Daul introduced a contractor, by the name of Keller, Inc, to this process, when the committee was formed. Keller, Inc. has had its people meet with the committee, for a small consulting fee, to help the committee begin their process. Of course, this relationship also gave Keller, Inc. something of an inside track in selling us this much larger contract for design/construction management. We are told that Keller, Inc. provided a fee quote to Chairwoman Black for 18.5% of the gross cost of any project constructed, if they are given the larger contract. That is a substantial amount. And, the services quoted are likely to be identical to those CONTINUED ABOVE RIGHT

now set forth in the RFP. Those services, as defined in the RFP, appear to freeze out any local competition and greatly discourage bidding from the entire marketplace. This would insure that fees of approximately \$115,000.00 would be needlessly added to the cost of the project.

Third: Chairwoman Black indicated to the building committee, as she introduced the RFP documents, that she had obtained them from Keller, Inc. For the Town Chairwoman to reach out to and grant this favored bidder the opportunity to design the RFP to be sent to other bidders is grossly unfair to other bidders and to the Taxpayers. Doing so is about the same as allowing that bidder to write its own contract, a contract that protects its own position, while rendering others unable or unwilling to compete. That is a disservice to the taxpayers, in that allowing one bidder to eliminate its competitors will drive the Town's costs higher.

Fourth: The Building Committee has been made aware of the potential cost of placing the whole project into the hands of a construction manager. And, it was made aware that the RFP had been received from Keller, Inc. Yet, not one member (Supervisor Larry Sommer being absent) raised any objection or even questioned the propriety or wisdom of allowing them to write the document. For those seven members to blindly give approval to such an action by the Chairwoman demonstrates the dangerous extent to which they follow her lead.





#### Smart Shopping for Veggies and Fruits 10 Tips for affordable vegetables and fruits.

- 1.) Celebrate the Season: Use fresh vegetables and fruits that are in season. They are easy to get, have more flavor, and are usually less expensive. Your local farmer's market is a great source of seasonal produce.
- 2.) Why pay full price? Check the local newspaper, online, and at the store for sales, coupons and specials that will cut food costs. Often, you can get more for less by visiting larger grocery stores (discount grocers if available)
- 3.) Stick to your list: Plan out your meals ahead of time and make a grocery list. You will save money by buying only what you need. Don't shop when you're hungry. Shopping after eating will make it easier to pass on the tempting snack foods. You'll have more of your food budget for vegetables and fruits.
- 4.) Try canned or frozen: Compare the price and the number of servings from fresh, canned and frozen forms of the same veggie or fruit. Canned and frozen items may be less expensive than fresh. For canned items, choose fruit canned in 100% fruit juice and vegetables with "low sodium" or "no salt added" on the label.
- 5.) Buy small amounts frequently: Some fresh vegetables and fruit don't last long. Buy small amounts more often to ensure you can eat the foods without throwing any away.
- 6.) Buy in bulk when items are on sale: For fresh vegetables or fruits you use often, a large size bag is the better buy. Canned or frozen fruits or vegetables can be bought in large quantities when they are on sale, since they last much longer.
- 7.) Store brands = Savings: Opt for store brands when possible. You will get the same or similar product for a cheaper price. If your grocery store has a membership card, sign up for even more savings.
- 8.) Keep it simple: Buy vegetables and fruits in their simplest form. Pre-cut, pre-washed, ready-to-eat, and processed foods are convenient but often cost much more than when purchased in their basic forms.





Laona Elementary Announces No School Dates

The School Board of the School District of Laona, at their November meeting, approved four additional days during the 2011-12 school year in which K-6 students will not have school. The last date is: Wednesday, May 2nd . This day will be used by the elementary staff to work on the District's "Response to Intervention" plan that must be submitted to the DPI by the end of this school year. RTI requires that staff provide alternative instruction to students who are not making adequate yearly progress. This alternative instruction must be provided prior to a student being considered for special education services.

This date will also be announced on the District website and reminder notices will be sent home prior to this date. 7-12 high school students will still have school on the above dates. State instructional guidelines allow for this type of scheduling as the yearly required minutes of instruction for elementary students are substantially less than for 7-12 students

#### 11th Annual National Touring Film Festival Coming to Three Lakes April 13, 2012


LUNAFEST®: Short Films By, For, About Women® with special guest, former Wisconsin Lt. Governor Barbara Lawton

LUNAFEST®, the fundraising film festival cated to promoting awareness about women's issues, highlighting women filmmakers, and bringing women together in their communities, will be hosted by the Northwoods Regional Solutions Network of Wisconsin Women Equal Prosperity (NRSN of WW=P) at the Three Lakes High School auditorium in Three Lakes on Friday, April 13, 2012. A silent auction begins at 6:30 PM followed by a 7:00 PM showing of LUNAFEST films.

This unique film festival highlights women as leaders in society, illustrated through nine short films by women filmmakers. The films range from animation to fictional drama, and cover topics such as women's health, motherhood, body image, aging, cultural diversity and breaking barriers.






