#### Robby Gordon's Stadium Super Trucks are coming to Crandon's World Championships!

600-hp, 2,800-lb mini stadium off-road race trucks are gonna give 'er a go at Crandon on Labor Day Weekend

Fans attending the Crandon International Off-Road Raceway on Labor Day Weekend are in for an added bonus as the dawn of a new era in short course off-road truck racing will make an exhibition debut during the World Championships, Sept. 1-2. Robby Gordon's Stadium Super Trucks (SST) will be unveiled for the first time east of the Mississippi - at Crandon just adding to the already packed weekend of racing with the Traxxas TORC Series, presented by AMSOIL, in town!

"Crandon is short course off-road racing's elite event. If you have one event all year that you can schedule, be it a driver or race fan, you'd better make it the World Championships at Crandon on Labor Day Weekend," said Gordon. "The weather's great in northern Wisconsin that time of year, the fans are awesome and the best racers in the world are going to show up and run our new Stadium Super Trucks."

Sanctioned by USAC (the same sanctioning body for TORC), Gordon says the 427cu/600-hp, 2,800-pound mini stadium racing trucks are capable of speeds up to 125 mph, while figuring they'll be faster than TORC's PRO Light trucks, and possibly able to put up lap times near what the TORC PRO 2WD trucks can run. "We don't quite know how these tiny little trucks are going to handle Crandon, but everyone involved sure can't wait to get there," he added.

SST will bring six race-ready trucks to Crandon for two all-star races as part of the TORC weekend and will feature Gordon and his business partner Justin Matney. Invitations to TORC drivers Ricky Johnson, Rob MacCachren, Andrew Caddell and Johnny Greaves have been put out to round out the field of drivers.

"Well it just keeps getting more and more interesting at Crandon as the summer winds down and we get closer to the World Championships, doesn't it?," beamed Crandon's Cliff Flannery. "We're thrilled to have Robby and his Stadium Super Trucks select Crandon as the first place outside of California that they've raced. We had a great time hosting the Ultra4 Series buggies at the Brush Run this past June and believe that the diehard fans at Crandon are going to get a big kick out of Robby's little stadium trucks here in a few weeks."

#### Early Canada goose season open Sept. 1

MADISON -The first fall hunting opportunities -the early Canada goose and mourning dove seasons are soon here and hunters are expected to find good numbers of both birds.

The early Canada goose season in Wisconsin runs Sept. 1-15 statewide. The dove season runs Sept. 1 - Nov. 9 statewide.

"The early season provides wonderful recreational opportunities for our goose hunters and directs harvest pressure toward these locally nesting geese," said Kent Van Horn, DNR migratory game bird ecologist. "With the early spring in 2012 we expect hunters will find good numbers of geese."

During the spring waterfowl survey, Wisconsin's resident breeding goose population estimate was 145,386, with field reports indicating above average production. The early Canada goose season is allowed by federal rules because of the growth of local giant Canada goose populations, Van Horn says. The harvest of Canada geese in the early season now amounts to onethird of the total annual Canada goose harvest in Wisconsin.


To increase their chance of success, hunters will want to remain mobile and watch movement patterns of the geese, Van Horn says. "Wisconsin's resident geese often change feeding and movement patterns this time of year," he says. "Hunters who scout prior to the hunt and stay mobile during the season give themselves the best chance for success."

More early Canada goose season details

he early season daily bag limit is five birds. In addition to the standard small game hunting license and state and federal waterfowl stamps, participation requires a \$3 early Canada goose permit and HIP certification. Registering for HIP, the federal Harvest Information Program, is free and can be done at any DNR Service Center, licensing sales agent or online.

There are no "zones" or "subzones" during the early season. The hunt is statewide regardless of what area hunters may hold a permit for during the regular goose season, Van Horn says.

#### Late Blight Confirmed On Wisconsin Tomatoes

It's doing very well this year, so growers need to continually be aware of the problem. We've now had confirmation of late blight on tomatoes in Adams County, and on potatoes almost everywhere in Wisconsin. Early blight has been particularly rampant in Oneida County this summer, and I've confirmed several cases in just the last two weeks. It's picking up steam and starting to become a major problem. #### Diets to Avoid

Fad diets are popular because they can produce quick - though temporary - weight loss, but some of them can be hazardous to your health, especially those involving:

Fasting/Detox: These are often starvation diets in disguise, and they can cause headaches, fatigue and stomach upset. If you consume little or no protein, your body starts breaking down muscle, resulting in a higher percentage of body fat. You can also lose electrolytes and risk life-threatening organ damage. This approach is different from the medically supervised liquid or very lowcalorie diets sometimes used for severe obesity.

Supplements/Injections: The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has banned supplements containing potentially dangerous ingredients, has not approved HCG (injection or homeopathic) and ADHD medications for weight loss, and has warned against substances such as aconite, bitter orange and country mallow.

High Protein/Low Carb: High-protein, high-fat diets may increase your risk of heart disease and stress your kidneys, leading to kidney failure. Complex carbohydrates (whole grains and produce) promote good health and should only be limited if medically advised.

One "Magic" Ingredient: Lemon juice, cabbage or vinegar aren't magical diet aids. Also, the "grapefruit diet" can be especially harmful for people taking certain medications for depression, hypertension and cholesterol. Avoid methods that severely restrict other foods.

Get the Skinny: Fad diets are often based on the above strategies. If a diet promises results too good to be true, just say "no" and focus on portion control, exercise and a healthy, balanced diet instead.



#### SCHOOL DISTRICT OF LAONA 2012-2013 SCHOOL YEAR ASBESTOS NOTIFICATION

As a result of recent federal legislation (Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act - AHERA), each primary and secondary school in the nation is required to complete a stringent new inspection for asbestos and to develop a plan of management for all asbestos-containing building materials. The School District of Laona has a goal to be in full compliance with this law and is following the spirit, as well as, the letter of the law. As a matter of policy, the District shall continue to maintain a safe and healthful environment for our community's youth and employees.

In keeping with this legislation, all buildings (including support buildings) owned by the school district were inspected by Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) accredited inspectors and samples were analyzed by an independent laboratory. Based on the inspection, the District prepared and the state approved a comprehensive management plan for handling asbestos safely and responsibly. Furthermore, the School District of Laona has completed its AHERA 3 - year Re-inspection requirement. Federal aw required a periodic walk-through (called "Surveillance") every six months. Also, the law requires for all buildings to be reinspected three years after a management plan is in effect.

The Asbestos Management Plan for the School District of Laona is located in the district administrator's office in the Laona High School. The plan is available for public inspection during regular business hours in the district administrator's office by appointment only, when such appointment is made with David Bardo at least one working day in advance. Any request to view the plan must be honored by the designated person within five (5) working days of the receipt of such a request. Copies of the document are available for 25 cents per page from the district office. Allow five (5) days after written request for compliance.

#### From The Forest County Sheriff's Department

The Forest County Sheriff's Department in a joint effort with the Langlade County Sheriff's Department, North Central Drug Enforcement Group and Wabeno Police Department have recently arrested seven individuals as part of a year long investigation into the sale and use of marijuana and prescription narcotics. #### **LAONA SCHOOL DIST.** STUDENT RECORDS

Student records are maintained to assist students, parents, guardians and the school in achieving the student's educational goals. Such records are accumulated, maintained, released, transferred and eventually destroyed by the building principal or his/her designee in accordance with state and federal law. Only those individuals or agencies specifically authorized by state and federal law shall be granted access to a student's records.

The school district does forward records to other schools that have requested the records and in which the student seeks or intends to enroll, or is already enrolled, as long as the disclosure is for purposes related to the student's enrollment or transfer.

An adult student or the parent/quardian of a minor student may inspect the student's records in accordance with administrative policy and established procedures and may challenge the content if he/she believes the records are inaccurate or misleading. Such a complaint would be filed with the building principal. If not satisfied with the decision, an appeal avenue is available through the Family Policy and Regulations Office of the U.S. Department of Education.

#### SCHOOL DISTRICT OF LAONA SPECIAL EDUCATION SCREENING & REFERRAL PROCEDURES

Any person aware of a child between the ages of birth and 21 who may be experiencing physical, mental, emotional or learning problems may contact Beth Calhoun or Sheryl Hendricks, Special Education teachers at the School District of Laona, 5216 Forest Avenue, Laona, WI 54541, phone (715) 674-2143 to initiate screening services that will determine if a referral for special education is appropriate.

#### **Referral Procedure**

The school district shall solicit and receive referrals of students with suspected educational needs from all persons who have responsible cause to believe that such needs exist. Specific state criteria shall be adhered to in determining eligibility for specific handicapping conditions. Referrals of suspected children with disability shall be referred to either of the people listed above.

#### **IEP - Team Evaluation**

Whenever a child is referred who is suspected of having an exceptional educational need, the school district shall establish an IEP Team. An appointment of this team shall be the responsibility of the Program Support Teacher. The Program Support Teacher shall approve the evaluation process and may request additional information.

Procedural safeguards for evaluation including the following:

The notice of intent to evaluate shall be sent to the parents that will include:

- •A full explanation of the due process/ procedural safeguards;
- A description of the evaluation proposed, an explanation of why the evaluation is proposed, any options that were considered, and the reasons why those options were rejected;
- A description of each evaluation procedure used as a basis for the evaluation;
- •The type of professionals conducting the evaluation:
- A description of any other relevant factors.
   Written parental consent shall be obtained when a child is being evaluated for the first time within the district.
   This consent form shall include:
- •A statement documenting that the parent understands the content of the notice;
- Information on the general areas to be evaluated;
- Information on the general types of procedures to be used.




#### Alpha Course at Forest Larger Parish

## Joyce Marshall Student Area open at Crandon







#### Updated info on new wetland, waterway law changes

MADISON - Updated information about recent waterway and wetland law changes, along with new permit application materials, are now available online on the Department of Natural Resources website, according to state natural resource officials.

Law changes affecting regulations for navigable waterways passed by the Legislature and signed by Gov. Scott Walker earlier this year went into effect Aug. 1. Some of the key changes include grandfathering for pre-existing piers, modified standards for new piers [PDF] an exemption for some grading projects, changes to certain boathouse repair and maintenance limitations, and modified procedures for all waterway general permits and individual permits. Technology improvements like electronic public notices and electronic permit tracking were also included in the legislation, according to Liesa Lehmann, waterway and wetland section chief

A new online water permit system is now available for some DNR water permits, with additional permits to be phased in over the next year. Applicants for waterway and wetland individual permits can now fill out their applications online, pay application fees online, and track the progress of their application online.

More information can be found by searching the DNR's website for "waterways."

Under a new state law, piers newly constructed after April 2012 must meet size limits to avoid needing a permit.

Wetland regulations also were recently changed by updated laws that went into effect July 1. These changes include a new authority for DNR to create general permits for smaller projects, new processes for wetland individual permits, and a new requirement for wetland mitigation to offset the impacts of permitted wetland fill. DNR is in the process of creating two new wetland related general permits, and is planning on creating more.

More information on wetland regulatory programs can be found on the DNR website.

Permit fees also were modified with the law change, Lehmann says. Lawmakers increased permit fees to more accurately reflect the agency costs to administer environmental regulations, and removed a single-highest fee provision so that each activity that requires a permit is charged a fee. Information explaining the new fees (PDF) is available on the DNR website.

#### Set those myths aside - recycling's a win-win for everyone

According to one of the myths that swirl around recycling, the contents of recycling bins don't really get recycled - they just end up in the landfill with the trash. I wish people who have heard this myth over and over again could see what the state Natural Resources Board, Department of Natural Resources staff and I saw earlier this month.

Our recent Natural Resources Board meeting took place in Germantown and included a tour of Waste Management, Inc.'s giant Material Recovery Facility or "MRF." No one who has seen this facility can have any remaining doubts about the vast quantities of paper and cardboard, plastic, metal and glass that are efficiently sorted and baled for shipment to buyers all over the United States and the world.

That's right: the plastic water bottle you drank from today might be headed to North Carolina tomorrow to be made into carpet; the cartons used to ship canned goods to your local grocery store might show up next week at a loading dock in Milwaukee, ready to be turned into cereal boxes.

Wisconsin has more than 85 MRFs and community recycling centers all over the state, sorting hundreds of thousands of tons of recyclables collected every year by local municipal crews and private hauling contractors. From humble roots just a few decades ago, today recycling has evolved into a major business sector—indeed, a growing business sector.

Companies work hard to line up steady supplies of the materials they need, and to make multi-milliondollar investments in machinery to maximize the efficiency with which recyclables are converted to new goods. Market prices for bales of recovered aluminum, plastic and paper are steady and strong.

means lower raw material cost for U.S. companies who use recycled material, more capital to reinvest in new technology, more supply assurance for manufacturers, lower prices for consumers and - very important these days - more jobs.

Conversely, every aluminum can that gets thrown in the trash instead of being recycled increases the cost of doing business for American manufacturers that use aluminum in their production lines.

Another myth we all hear that just won't go away: "What's good for business is bad for the environment." Wrong! Recycling wins on both counts, and it goes well beyond reducing landfill space, though that's important too. Recycling aluminum saves 95 percent of the energy that would have been needed to make new aluminum from ore. One aluminum can saves enough electricity to light a 100-watt bulb for three and a half hours. It takes 60 percent less energy to recycle steel than it does to make it from raw materials. Making recycled newspaper saves 40 percent. Recycled plastics save 70 percent and recycled glass 40 percent. Saving energy also reduces air and water pollution emissions.

Sadly, too many recyclable materials still end up in landfills. It's not because haulers take them there - it's because they never get placed in a recycling bin in the first place. In 2009, for example, Wisconsin residents and

More recycled material on the global market businesses threw out more than \$50 million worth of metal, plastic, glass and fiber. DNR staff are working with local governments and private businesses to divert more of that material to productive use, and to recover other valuable material like electronics, carpet, paint and wood.

> One final myth out there is that recycling is somehow controversial. In fact, our survey results show just the opposite! The vast majority of Wisconsinites support and participate in recycling. When you and I recycle, we don't necessarily have all the benefits in mind at that moment, but I think our intuition tells us we're doing the right thing.

> Recycling works for us all. While we can always improve our efforts, Wisconsinites have long valued thrift and efficiency, so it should be no surprise that recycling is part of the fabric of life here - it just makes good sense.

To further protect the fragile rice beds and to allow waterfowl an undisturbed period to feed, ricers can collect wild rice only during the day from 10 a.m. until sunset.

Cottage industries have developed over the years in communities adjoining the traditionally productive wild rice waters to process the freshly harvested wild rice and prepare it for cooking. Processing involves parching the grain to reduce its moisture content, and removing the sheath that encloses the grain. Moisture weight, leaving about four pounds of finished rice for every 10 pounds harvested.

The wild rice season typically runs from late August through mid-September. #### Leftover fall 2012 wild turkey permits go on sale August 25

MADISON - Remaining permits for the 2012 fall turkey hunting season will be sold on a first-come, firstserved basis starting at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Aug. 25 and can be purchased online, in person, or by telephone.

Postcard notifications are going out this week to all customers, including conservation patrons, who were awarded a permit through the drawing process; 37,721 permits are being issued to hunters who applied by the Aug. 1 application deadline. Hunters interested in determining whether or not they drew a permit sooner can check their permit status by going to dnr.wi.us and selecting Online License Center under the Quick Tasks header.

"If you haven't been out lately during the fall turkey season, 2012 is a great time to get back out there and we've got good numbers of leftover permits available for zones 1-5," says Scott Walter, Department of Natural Resources upland ecologist. "We had a wonderful spring for production warm and dry through the heart of the nesting and brood rearing period -- so those hunters who do get a leftover permit and go out will have a good chance to encounter birds."

Walter says that the fall turkey hunt is a chance to experience a portion of the turkey lifecycle. "There is something pretty mystical about being out in the fall turkey woods," he says.

A total of 96,700 permits were available for the fall 2012 turkey season and there were 37,721 permits issued to hunters who applied by the Aug. 1 application deadline, leaving 58,979 permits available after the drawing for over-P20 | the-counter sales.

Hunters interested in picking up leftover turkey permits should check the turkey zone map [PDF] to verify where they want to hunt and then check the leftover permit availability page to see if permits are available for the zone in which they wish to hunt.

Leftover turkey permit sales will continue until all permits are sold or the turkey season comes to an end. Hunters are limited to purchasing one leftover permit per day, although there is no limit on the total number of permits that an individual hunter can purchase.

All of the available leftover permits are for turkey management Zones 1-5; there were no leftover permits available for Zones 6 or 7 after the initial drawing.

The fee for leftover turkey permits is \$5 for 10- and 11-yearolds, \$10 for residents, and \$15 for non-residents. All permit buyers also will be required to purchase a fall turkey license and stamp unless they have previously purchased the license and stamp or are a 2012 Conservation Patron License holder. Residents and non-residents will have equal opportunity to purchase over-the-counter permits. Purchasing these permits will not affect preference point status for future spring or fall turkey permit drawings.

In addition to the Online Licensing Center, remaining fall turkey permits can be purchased through an authorized license agent, at DNR service centers (hours for service centers vary; check the DNR website for service center days and hours of operation), or by calling toll-free 1-877-LICENSE (1-877-945-4236).

## Wild rice gatherers will have to hunt for good rice beds this year

MADISON - As fall approaches, people who need to request permission from private land owners to access participate in the ageless annual harvest of wild rice or "manoomin" are readying canoes, paddles and baskets. Wild rice is typically found in northern Wisconsin in shallow portions of lakes, river beds, flowages and gently flowing waters.

The Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission annually assesses the wild rice crop using aerial surveys and says rice pickers are going to have to hunt for good rice beds this year.

"Wild rice abundance is influenced by a number of factors, which vary in effect from year to year," says Peter David, wildlife biologist for the Great Lakes Indian Fish and Wildlife Commission in Odanah. "An early, warm spring allowed for early germination, but heavy rain events appear to have had negative impacts at some sites. In addition, the broad distribution of poor beds suggests other factors may be involved as well. This year seems to fit the pattern that has been observed anecdotally of poor crops following mild winters."

While a few scattered beds look pretty good, the overall crop looks quite poor, especially in northwest Wisconsin, David says. "Interestingly, beds in east-central Minnesota are in even worse shape; rice pickers and waterfowl alike are going to have to hunt for good beds this year."

Rice crops on individual sites may also be harmed by high water levels due to deliberate water level manipulation or by beaver dams.

"Wild rice harvests can vary widely from year to year and from site to site," said Jason Fleener, Wisconsin's assistant wetland habitat specialist. "Rice gatherers are encouraged to inspect the waters they are interested in early to see if there will be appreciable harvest opportunities when rice is ripe."

Fleener says that ricers may also want to speak with local ricers, tribal officials, or DNR biologists to get a perspective on good rice waters for the season.

"For most people, however, just the ritual of rice collecting on Wisconsin's beautiful fall waters is worth the time and feeds the soul." he says.

Most rice waters across the state have public access sites for launching canoes. However, in some cases ricers may

certain sites.

#### The wild rice resource

Not only is wild rice culturally significant to Native American people and others, it is an important food source for migrating waterfowl and other migratory birds. Fleener noted that it is critical for private land owners, boaters and anglers to know how to identify wild rice and how to protect it from destruction. "It is also important that ricers harvest rice responsibly to ensure the sustainability of the resource," he

Wild rice is the seed of a family of aquatic grasses (including Zizania palustris and Zizania aquatica). The rice kernels are nutritious, delicious food for wildlife and people The grain grows on tall stalks in shallow lakes, streams and riverbeds throughout the upper Midwest and southern Canada. Seeds imbedded in lake bottoms for a year or more start to germinate in early spring and send a stem up to the surface of the water. Given suitable water conditions, the rice plants grow into thick beds from June through September. The seed heads normally start to fill out in mid to late August and mature over a 10- to 14-day period.

"However, in 2012 we may see a slightly earlier maturation of those beds that did survive the storms and high water this late spring and early summer," says Fleener.

#### Wild rice harvest is partly regulated in Wisconsin

In Wisconsin, most of the harvest comes from the northwestern part of the state in Burnett, Washburn and Polk counties and in Vilas, Oneida and Forest counties in northcentral Wisconsin. Additional beds are managed on waters on tribal lands.

On most rivers, flowages and some lakes, no formal seasons are established, and these can be harvested whenever ricers determine the rice is ripe, provided they find ripe rice before the ducks, songbirds and mammals that also crave the calorie-rich grains.

On some lakes, however, the season is dateregulated, and wild rice may only be harvested during the open season set cooperatively by DNR staff and tribal rice chiefs. Notice of season openings and closings are posted at lake landings and at common lake access points at least 24 hours in advance of season openings.

State and tribal authorities inspect the rice beds every two to three days on larger waters that typically have rice beds and are frequented by more harvesters. Smaller beds are inspected less frequently. Wild rice harvesters can find out when regulated waters are open for rice harvest in northwestern Wisconsin by calling the DNR Spooner Service Center at (715) 635-2101 and in north central Wisconsin waters by calling the DNR Woodruff Service Center at (715) 356-5211.

- 5. Corn is an age-old staple. Try: whole-grain cornbread or air-popped popcorn (minus the butter and


