RC Havok-Indoor RC Raceway & Hobby Store

Craig and Courtney Kircher have recently opened a race track in Crandon. Not a big outdoor facility, but an indoor course for radio controlled (RC) vehicles where race "drivers" can run their 1/10 scale vehicles, usually trucks, over an indoor clay track that is about 45 feet by 80 feet. There is about 320 linear feet of racing in that space, and a time of 16 seconds is pretty good. The course has plenty of curves and jumps to make the racing exciting. The drivers run their RC trucks from an elevated 24-foot long driver's stand so they can see what their vehicle is doing.

In addition, the Kirchers are operating an RC hobby store with a big selection of cars, trucks and the parts to keep them going. RC Havok also has pit benches where drivers can repair their vehicles and charge batteries. In addition, anything that is wanted for this hobby can be ordered here.

Don't have an RC vehicle? RC Havok does rentals. Try out the hobby before you invest. The course can also be rented for parties, special events and a league racing competition that will begin on Wednesday, October 17 and run 12 weeks.



Family Fun Night Racing is tentatively scheduled for Friday nights featuring family rates for the race course. RC Havok is currently open five days a week, Wednesday through Sunday, at noon until 10:00 p.m., and Sundays from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.






Twins Get Big Bucks in Youth Hunt


building each 10 feet wide for machinery and a 10 \times 10 garage door on the west side for the town's pickup truck. The garage will have a mezzanine for storage space. There will be a steel roof over the whole building and the garage will have steel siding.

The town hall will have an office space, meeting room and a fireproof records room. The town records have been stored at residents private homes because there is not enough space in the current building. The new building will have more then enough space for all of the town's records to be in one spot. There will be a meeting room for all town meetings and there will be enough space to seat a larger crowd at the bigger meetings. There will also be a private office in this space.

The community center will be about 1,500 square feet. This is a room that will hold 100 people comfortably. The community center will not need a sprinkler system. This will save the town about \$80,000. All of the windows in the building will be high energy efficient. This will help with the heating costs. The heating system is broken into three circuits. The garage will be heated separately. The meeting rooms and offices will be heated on their own circuit and the community center will be heated on its own circuit. This will allow a space that is not being used to be at a lower temperature than the rest of the building and saving money on heating costs. There will also be a warming room in the community center. There will be a microwave, stove and refrigerator. A person could not cook a big meal in the warming room, but a private party could have Nescos of food plugged in and kept warm. Flooring will be a mix of vinyl, carpet and ceramic tile.

The outside of the town hall will be fiber cement board and stone wainscot. Digging started Wednesday, October 10th and completion of the structure will be early next year. The green metal shed that was behind the current building was moved up to the landfill. It will still be used for storage by the town.

The next meeting is Tuesday October 16, at 5 p.m. at the town hall. Samples of the roof and siding will be there for public viewing.

Choose My Plate 10 Tips To A Great Plate

Making food choices for a healthy lifestyle can be as simple as using these 10 tips. Use the ideas in this list to balance your calories, to choose foods to eat more often, and to cut back on foods to eat less often.

- 1.) Balance Calories: Find out how many calories YOU need for a day as a first step in managing your wright. Go to www.ChooseMyPlate.gov to find your calorie level. Being physically active also helps you balance calories.
- 2.) Enjoy Your Food, But Eat Less: Take the time to fully enjoy your food as you eat it. Eating too fast or when your attention is elsewhere may lead to eating too many calories. Pay attention to hunger and fullness cues before, during and after meals. Use them to recognize when to eat and when you've had enough.
- 3.) Avoid Oversized Portions: Use a smaller plate, bowl and glass. Portion out foods before you eat. When eating out, choose a smaller size option, share a dish, or take home part of your meal.
- 4.) Foods To Eat More Often: Eat more vegetables, fruits, whole grains, and fat-free or 1% milk and dairy products. These foods have the nutrients you need for health - including potassium, calcium, vitamin D, and fiber. make them the basis for meals and snacks.
- 5.) Make Half Your Plate Fruit and Vegetables: Choose red, orange, and dark-green vegetables like tomatoes, sweet potatoes, and broccoli, along with other vegetables for your meals. Add fruit to meals as part of main or sides dishes or as dessert.
- 6.) Switch To Fat-Free or Low-Fat (1%) Milk: They have the same amount of calcium and other essential nutrients as whole milk, but fewer calories and less saturated fat.
- 7.) Make Half Your Grains Whole Grains: To eat more whole grains, substitute a whole-grain product for a refined product - such as eating whole-wheat bread instead of white bread or brown rice instead of white rice.
- 8.) Foods To Eat Less Often: Cut back on foods high in solid fats, added sugars, and salt. They include cakes, cookies, ice cream, candies, sweetened drinks, pizza and fatty meats like ribs, sausages, bacon and hot dogs. use these foods as occasional treats, not everyday foods.
- 9.) Compare Sodium In Foods: Use the Nutrition Facts label to choose lower sodium versions of foods like soup, bread, and frozen meals. Select canned foods labeled "low sodium," "reduced sodium," or "no salt added.'
- 10.) Drink Water Instead of Sugary Drinks: Cut calories by drinking water or unsweetened beverages. Soda, energy drinks, and sports drinks are a major source of added sugar, and calories, in American diets.





WHEAP assistance is a one-time payment during the heating season (October 1 - May 15). The funding pays a portion of the heating costs. *IT IS NOT INTENDED TO COVER* THE ENTIRE ANNUAL COSTS OF YOUR HOME HEATING. The amount of the heating

assistance benefit varies depending on a variety of factors, including the household's size, income and heating costs. In most cases the heating assistance benefit is paid directly to the household energy supplier.


