Is Rail Shipping gone for good or can it remain an option for local business?

Local Businesses Get a Chance to Offer Their Input Submitted by FCEDP

Will fuel costs be \$5 or \$6 per gallon in the near future? Are they likely to decline? These questions and the dramatic impact that they can have on shipping costs to and from local businesses make it hard to plan for the future. Nine Northern Wisconsin counties, including Forest County, have joined together to form the Northwoods Rail Transit Commission. The Commission believes rail service is crucial to maintaining and supporting future economic growth in the region. In order to quantify rail business demand, the Commission has been working with the Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) to develop a Rail Market Study to gather current and potential rail use data from our region's business community. The data from this survey will be shared with rail operators in our region in order to pursue options for more reliable, cost effective and secure rail service for all businesses in Northern Wisconsin

The Railroad User and Potential Railroad User Surveys will be mailed to businesses in November. These survevs will collect commodity, shipping mode, location and destination data as well as suggestions and comments. Survey responses will be collected by mail or online and should be completed by the end of November.

There is no better time than now to have a voice as to whether rail is a viable shipping option for our region in the future. The Forest County Board and the Forest County Economic Development Partnership encourage businesses who receive this survey to respond and return it to the WisDOT. Infinity Wood Floors is setting up for business in Crandon's industrial park

Infinity Wood Floors is setting up a flooring mill in Crandon's industrial park. The new manufacturing facility is being constructed in the former Lipco Gift building. The company will be turning out solid wood flooring, both finished and unfinished, from northern hardwoods grown in northern Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula.

Pat Tallier, a Wabeno resident, is the President and principal owner of Infinity Wood Floors. He says the operation has been in the planning stages for about six months. He looked for an existing building that would meet the needs of Infinity and found that site in Crandon's industrial park.

The building was of ample size and was connected to city water and sewer, plus has room for growth. Tallier currently has six employees, but plans on having about thirty employees in the next year, with a plan to employ about fifty people in approximately three years.

The flooring will be sold world-wide. There are plans to ship the flooring to distributors in Minneapolis, Milwaukee, New York, Chicago, Detroit, Colorado, Idaho, Kansas City, Canada and in South America.

When fully operational, about 25,000 board feet of hardwood will be turned into flooring a day, from kilndried lumber.

Tallier credits the City of Crandon for their cooperation in selling the building on good terms, Jim Scheussler and the Forest County Economic Development Partnership for their help, Chuck Bryce with UWGB for help with the business plan and the six employees who have faith in him and the company to hire

In the photo below, Tallier is helping place the machine that will turn out hardwood flooring at a high speed. He says they are very lucky to acquire this used, German-made piece of equipment that is one of a kind in the United States and known for turning out precision

Fall 2012 **Election Results**

Another election has come and gone. I am sure that we can all agree that we are ready for the ads and phone calls to be done. Wisconsin has voted democratically since 1984. It has come to be expected when it has been the same way all of a young persons life but lets break it down and see how the Northwoods voted.

The local elections were decided during the primary, In January, Lisa Kalata will be the County Clerk. Amy Krause will remain our County Treasurer, Paul Aschenbrenner was to remain as the Register of Deeds, but unfortunately, he passed away this Fall. Courtney Britton, has worked in the office with Paul and will officially become the Register of Deeds this January. Charles Simono was also re - elected as the District Attorney.

President Obama and Vice President Biden recieved the most votes in Forest County, they also won Wisconsin, They received 2,421 votes to Romney and Ryan receiving 2172.

Tammy Baldwin defeated Tommy Thompson for the United States Senate seat. Senator Herb Kohl is retiring after this term. In Forest County, Baldwin defeated Thompson 2285 - 2028.

Sean Duffy will retain his 7 Congressional District Seat. Duffy received 56 percent percent of the vote. His challenger, Patrick Kreitlow received 44 percent of the vote. Reid Ribble also took 56 percent of the vote in the 8th Congressional District. Jamie Wall earned 44 percent. Duffy carried Forest County with a 2,327 - 1,947 edge.

Tom Tiffany defeated Susan Sommer and Paul Ehlers for the 12th Senate District. The seat was empty with current Senator Jim Holperin retiring after this term. The 12 Senate District consists of parts of Forest, Vilas, Oneida, Florence, Lincoln, Marinette, Langlade, Menominee, Oconto and Shawano Counties. Tiffany received 56 percent of the votes, Sommer received 40 percent and Elhers received 3 percent.

The 36th Assembly District is a big portion of Northeast Wisconsin. It consists of a portion of Forest, Oconto, Menominee, and Marinette Counties. Dorothy Kegley defeated Jeff Mursau in Forest County. Kegley received 1,586 votes in Forest County to Mursau's 1,533. Mursau did however win the election with 59 percent of the total vote to Kegley's 41 percent. The 34th Assembly District has part of Forest County in it, Rob Swearingen defeated Martin Van Buren, Kevin Fitzpatrick and Todd Albino. Swearingen earned 57 percent of the vote to gain



Students Kayla Fraley, Sammi Wied, and Sierra Gage created a shadow image of the of the famous photo of the flag raising on Iwo Jima. Joe Rosenthal snapped the iconic image of five Marines and a Navy Corpsman raising the flag on Mount Suribachi. The photo appeared the next morning on the front pages of American newspapers replacing in people's minds the images of Pearl Harbor. It became the most reproduced photograph of World War Two and a symbol of American resolve.

Pictured with the artists are Forest County Veterans Billy Daniels and Ed Spencer. Mr. Daniels served in the Marine Corp from 1954 to 1955. He serves as Post 1 Chaplain at the Potawatomi Veterans Center and was recognized with the National Chaplain's Award. The award honors four WWII Chaplains who gave their lives to save others from drowning.



MADISON—State health officials today reminded Wisconsin residents to get their annual influenza vaccine because flu season has already started and is expected to worsen. Flu season for Wisconsin generally runs from late October to May, with peak activity around early February.

"Getting vaccinated is the most effective way to avoid getting the flu," said Dr. Henry Anderson, State Health Officer. Most health care providers are already offering flu vaccines, making this a good time to get immunized ahead of the expected increase in case numbers, he

Control and Prevention (CDC), influenza vaccine will continue to be shipped to Wisconsin throughout the flu season.

Influenza is a contagious respiratory disease caused by a virus. The flu vaccine helps prevent complications that can be caused by the flu, such as pneumonia or hospitalization. With few exceptions, officials recommend that individuals aged six months and older be immunized. Getting vaccinated against influenza is especially important for people aged 50 and older, and those with underlying health conditions. It is equally important for those who have frequent contact with young children to get vaccinated, as children are hospitalized or die from flu complications each year in the U.S.

Influenza can range from mild to severe, and in some cases can cause life-threatening complications. Symptoms can come on quickly and include fever, headache, dry cough, sore throat, nasal congestion, body aches and tiredness.

To protect yourself and those around you from getting the flu, officials suggest taking the following steps:

- · Wash your hands often with soap and water, or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Stay home when you are sick. Cover your cough or sneeze with your upper sleeve, and try to avoid touching your face with your hand. If you use a tissue, throw it away after one use.
- · Use your own drinking cups and straws. · Avoid being exposed to people who are sick with flu-like symptoms.
- · Eat nutritious meals, get plenty of rest and do not



WPS to Improve Electric Reliability in **Areas Most Prone to Outages**

Green Bay, WI - Wisconsin Public Service Corporation (WPS), a subsidiary of Integrys Energy Group (NYSE: TEG), today applied to the Public Service Commission of Wisconsin for a Certificate of Authority (CA) for a five-year project to modernize selected segments of its electric distribution system by burying or upgrading lines. If the project is approved, construction would begin in 2014. The WPS proposal involves electric lines that have the most challenging reliability issues - primarily in rural areas that are heavily forested.

"We're concerned about the areas where electric reliability is lower than state and national averages. We will target locations in which customers are repeatedly faced with the loss of power due to storms - sometimes for several days," said WPS Vice President of Energy Delivery Vern Peterson. "When the project is complete, these customers will see a level of reliability that the rest of the company already receives."

WPS proposes to address about 200-300 miles of electric distribution lines each year beginning in 2014.

"The lead time for actual conversion of the overhead lines is significant," said Peterson. "For the project to move forward we have to identify landowner support for the project and determine if there are any geographical or environmental obstacles, as well as to begin a preliminary design for the new underground system." Peterson added that another time-consuming aspect of the project is obtaining the necessary easements from landowners that allow WPS to bury the lines.

In the project, WPS will bury and upgrade electric lines that have proven to be poor performers in its system, and where improvements make sense financially. The company is conducting a comprehensive analysis of the electric distribution lines to determine where the improvements will be made. Not all lines in the affected areas will be upgraded. WPS will prioritize the lines to be upgraded or buried based on historical reliability performance data.

"We're still identifying the worst performing lines in the company," Peterson said. "Then we add in geography, soil conditions, and other factors that will influence the cost of converting the lines to underground or upgrading. We're aiming to improve reliability in situations where it can be done at a reasonable cost."

Peterson said that, while still analyzing the WPS system, the company has already selected segments to begin the project in the Minocqua, Eagle River, Rhinelander, Wabeno and Wausaukee areas. "Obviously, we can't do the entire areas," Peterson said. "Landowners that will be affected in 2014 have recently been contacted or are being contacted now." Additional Landowners will be contacted year by year as the project moves forward.

After being contacted initially, it could be several months before WPS contacts the property owner again because of the scope of working with 5,000 or more landowners.

In addition to the effort to place lines underground, WPS is analyzing options to improve reliability in areas where burying the lines is impractical and not cost effective. Among the options is Distribution Automation (DA), in which power can be automatically rerouted from adjacent circuits to serve customers experiencing outages. Locations that will be considered include where the soil is too rocky to install underground or other areas in which placing conductors underground is not cost effective.












Choose My Plate

10 tips to a great plate

Making food choices for a healthy lifestyle can be as simple as using these 10 tips. Use the ideas in this list to balance your calories, to choose foods to eat more often, and to cut back on foods to eat less often.

- 1.) Balance Calories Find out how many calories YOU need for a day as a first step in managing your weight. Go to www.ChooseMyPlate.gov to find your calorie level. Being physically active also helps you balance calories.
- 2.) Enjoy Your Food, But Eat Less Take the time to fully enjoy your food as you eat it. Eating too fast or when your attention is elsewhere may lead to eating too many calories. Pay attention to hunger and fullness cues before, during and after meals. Use them to recognize when to eat and when you've had enough.
- 3.) Avoid Oversized Portions Use a smaller plate, bowl, and glass. Portion out foods before you eat. When eating out, choose a smaller size option, share a dish, or take home part of your meal.
- 4.) Foods to Eat More Often Eat more vegetables, fruits, whole grains, and fat-free or 1% milk and dairy products. These foods have the nutrients you need for health - including potassium, calcium, vitamin D, and fiber. Make them the basis for meals and snacks.
- 5.) Make Half Your Plate Fruits and Vegetables - Choose red, orange and dark green vegetables like tomatoes, sweet potatoes, and broccoli, along with other vegetables for your meals. Add fruit to meals as part of main or side dishes or as dessert.

- 6.) Switch to Fat-Free or Low-Fat (1%) Milk -They have the same amount of calcium and other essential nutrients as whole milk, but fewer calories and less saturated fat.
- 7.) Make Half Your Grains Whole Grains To eat more whole grains, substitute a whole-grain product for a refined product - such as eating whole-wheat bread instead of white bread or brown rice instead of white rice.
- 8.) Foods to Eat Less Often Cut back on foods high in solid fats, added sugars, and salt. They include cakes, cookies, ice cream, candies, sweetened drinks, pizza and fatty meats like ribs, sausages, bacon and hot dogs. Use these foods as occasional treats, not everyday foods.
- 9.) Compare Sodium in Foods Use the Nutrition Facts label to choose lower sodium versions of foods like soup, bread and frozen meals. Select canned foods labeled "low sodium," "reduced sodium," or "no salt added."
- 10.) Drink Water Instead of Sugary Drinks -Cut calories by drinking water or unsweetened beverages. Soda, energy drinks and sports drinks are a major source of added sugar, and calories, in American diets.

Historical Society tours Hotel Crandon's basement and moonshine history

We have all heard the stories of the tunnels that are supposed to crisscross our downtown as leftovers from the moonshine days. But do they really exist? Thursday, November 1st, the Forest County Historical & Genealogical Society met at the Hotel Crandon for a dinner and tour of the lower level that, as the story goes, is part of the famous tunnel system. Our dinner was very of the basement but seems to be really enjoying the work. good as was the tour.

Current owner of the Hotel Crandon building, Mark Gatton has been working since he purchased the building to try to reconstruct the basement and collect stories about the Hotel Crandon. The current building was built in the late 1920's after fire destroyed most of the downtown area. But the basement dates back to the turn of the century. It is a labyrinth of small rooms and stairways that go nowhere. Mark has pieced together some of the story and has opened up the back entrance that he believes was used by cars on the bootleg run from Canada to Chicago during Prohibition. He has also identified two small rooms that were said to be used as sleeping rooms for the drivers. He has been told that as many as five cars could be parked under the Hotel while the drivers slept. He explained to us the difference between bootleggers (middlemen) and moonshiners (producers).


Wabeno Public Library, said "We are delighted to be able to bring Patty here. I was determined to bring a speaker to Wabeno for Native American Awareness month, and to the schools. The District Superintendent was very supportive of the idea."

Loew will discuss her Native Youth Media Project. The project brings PhD students from UW-Madison to northern Wisconsin reservations over summer months, where they teach middle school-aged students media skills, and show them how to produce documentaries about their environment and cultures.

She has been instrumental in educating residents of Wisconsin about the negative impact mining has on the environment and delicate ecosystems in northern Wisconsin.

About Patty Loew

Patty Loew is an Associate Professor in the Life Science Communications Dept. at UW-Madison. She is the host of "In Wisconsin", a statewide news program for Wisconsin Public Television. Loew has produced over a dozen award-winning documentaries about Native American issues, including "The Way of the Warrior", "Spring Of Discontent" and "Nation Within A Nation". Her book, "Indian Nations of Wisconsin, Histories of Endurance and Renewal," won the Wisconsin Library Association 2002 Outstanding Achievement Recognition Award. She is a respected panelist and public speaker at environmental events across the US, and a member of the Bad River Band of Lake Superior Chippewa.




