





Laona students get lessons on logging



Laona High School environmental science class

On a cold day in February, the Laona High Environmental Science class took an exhilarating field trip into the wilderness north of Iron River, Michigan. The class had an amazing offer from Tom Cleereman, Sr., to take the trip and experience a modern logging operation.

After arriving on the site, Mr. Cleereman with the help of his grandson, Tommy, explained the specific species, qualities and sizes of wood they bought and sold for veneer facilities in the United States, Germany, Japan, Italy and China.

Steve Kircher, Laona science teacher, felt this was a great opportunity for the students to see how loggers practice sustainability and only harvest mature trees and provide cover and fertilizer for new seedlings. Dave Smith, the onsite logger, commented that later in the afternoon the deer come into the site to browse on the tops that remain after the logs are harvested.

When asked by Mr. Kircher, Tom Cleereman, Sr. was able to point out several 'Birdseye' maple trees on the site that are valued for their unique patterns. He mentioned that these trees are the most sought after species in the Northwoods. Mr. Bradley, Laona High principal, also accompanied the class and felt it was a unique hands-on learning opportunity.





Quick Bits

Break a sweat today, no hot flashes tomorrow!

If you suffer from hot flashes, getting sweaty on purpose seems like the last thing you want to do. But exercise could actually prevent the irksome episodes, says scientists at Penn State University. They found that women who walked or ran on a treadmill for 30 minutes had 23 percent fewer hot flashes the next day. Lead author Steriani Elavsky, Ph.D., explains that exercise triggers the release of feel-good neurotransmitters like serotonin and dopamine, which help reduce hot flash episodes.

Sweet way to quell a cough

Next time you have a tickle in your throat but no cough drops, grab a sugar packet. In a new study at Philadelphia's Monell Chemical Senses Center, volunteers inhaled capsaicin, a compound that's known to induce coughs, until they coughed three times. But when they rinsed their mouth with sugar water first, they needed about 45 percent more capsaicin to make them cough. Lead author Paul Wise, Ph.D., says sweet tastes trigger the release of cough-suppressing opioids, which could help explain why honey eases a cough. He also notes that sucking on candy can help.

Three cups of coffee a day wards off Alzheimer's

Enjoying an extra mug of joe in the A.M. may safeguard mental health, say researchers in the *Journal of Alzheimer's Disease*. They followed adults with mild cognitive impairment (MCI) for up to four years and found that those who drank three to four cups of coffee daily did not develop Alzheimer's. (Typically, 15 percent of adults with MCI develop the disease each year.) The scientists say caffeine inhibits the buildup of *amyloid beta*, a protein that triggers Alzheimer's, and works with other compounds in coffee to prevent the disease.

Fish oil dials down gum inflammation

Australian researchers have discovered that fish oil may protect teeth and gums. A review of eight studies show that talking up to 3,000 mg of fish oil and 75 to 81 mg of aspirin significantly improved periodontitis, a condition marked by gum inflammation and bone loss around the teeth. Scientists theorize that anti-inflammatory omega-3 fatty acids may help restore gum tissue and aspirin may guard against bone loss.

Easy tweak for tired eyes

Holding a magazine farther away may delay your need for reading glasses (or a stronger Rx), says scientists in the journal *Investigative Ophthalmology & Visual Science*. In an analysis of nine studies, they found that women were 21 percent more likely than men of the same age to need reading glasses. Researcher Adam Hickenbotham, Ph.D., says that since women's arms are shorter than men's, we tend to hold books and magazines closer. This affects our ability to focus on the page, which could lead to dry eye, fatigue and strain. The simple fix: holding reading material 16 inches away, a distance other studies suggest is optimal.







I'd like to give a few dates and facts concerning the history of Forest County Humane Society/Shelter.

We held our open house on Sunday, August 13, 2000, and opened our shelter for business the next morning, admitting "Willie", our first resident dog. Those were great days of celebration for those of us who had worked so hard!

This beautiful state-of the-art shelter was the culmination of thirty years of planning and dreaming.

We built that shelter without borrowing one cent, and the seven years that our group was in charge, there was never a cent owed against it, with every bill being paid upon receipt thereof.

When we resigned from the Humane Society in January of 2008, we were still debt-free, and we left the organization with a total of \$113,000.00 in the bank. We kept putting money aside, with the possibility of the resale shop not being available to us at some point.

I don't want anyone to think that we resigned because we thought the shelter was failing. We were alive and well and thriving, as the care at the shelter and our bank balance proved. Why we left is of little consequence now.

We started all over again from scratch, with Animal Resource Fund, and we are into our 5th year of successful operation, providing pet food for the needy, assisting with medical bills, vaccinating, etc.

We also do foster care in our homes and do adoptions, taking that first dog into foster care July 15, 2008. We have helped place shelter pets in the past, and taken cases that were referred to us by the shelter.

Hopefully, we have been a compliment to the

shelter.

Dear Editor,

Students enrolled in Forest County schools will continue to see an erosion of educational opportunities if the governor's proposed biennium budget moves forward. This comes after Wisconsin public schools faced historical reductions in the last biennial budget, reducing school revenues to levels comparable to the 2007-2008 school year. We are all are being asked to do more with less during difficult times, but when an antiquated school funding formula (created in 1993), an 8% reduction in revenues from the last biennium budget and only a 1% increase in revenue for the next two years is taken into consideration, the end result will be catastrophic to public education. This will be especially true for rural schools, like those serving students in Forest County. We receive minimal general state aid and nominal categorical aids for sparsity and high cost transportation, even though the aforementioned matters are evident in our schools.

The current funding formula solely calculates a district's ability to generate revenue on local property values, which in the case of Forest County schools is well above the state average. There is no consideration given to the fact that Forest County has a significantly higher poverty rate than nearly all counties in the state. As often said, we are "property rich," therefore the vast majority of our school revenues are from the local tax base. In addition, the return of your state income tax dollars paid to Wisconsin to create general state aids that fund public schools is minimal at best. As a matter of fact, a small percentage of your tax dollars already go to Milwaukee Public Schools (this is an actual line item in the formula used to calculate a district's state aid).

In addition, the governor's recent budget proposal includes a measure that will significantly increase funding for school choice through private vouchers, while proposing only a 1% increase for public schools. The proposed increases to private vouchers will be 9.4% for K-8 students, and a staggering 21.9% for high school age students. To put this into perspective, the last biennium budget reduced public school per pupil spending by \$550 per student, amounts which will remain frozen for the next two years under the governor's proposal. The proposed increase in per pupil voucher funding is \$608 per elementary pupil, and \$1,414 per high school pupil (Milwaukee Journal Sentinel, February 18, 2013). Under this proposal, your state income tax dollars paid will be diverted from public education to private vouchers for students to attend schools that are not held to the same measures of accountability as all Wisconsin public schools.

Your state income tax dollars are being returned in minimal amounts to Forest County schools because of a broken school funding formula. State Superintendent Dr. Tony Evers, and the Department of Public Instruction, have recommended a new funding formula, Fair Funding for Our Future, which is a step in the right direction to adequately and more equitably fund all public schools. It's not based solely on property valuation and does not ask for an increase in local tax dollars, but a more equitable distribution of general state aid dollars to those districts that receive minimal amounts.

If the Governor's budget moves forward with the included private voucher proposal increase, Forest County schools may see less state aid than they already receive, as any increase in a district's equalized value will only diminish state aid received, forcing schools to make up the difference by an increase to property taxes. This is not the choice of local school boards, but it is how the current funding formula works in figuring our local districts' revenue. This could be alleviated if your income tax dollars were distributed back to public schools in a more equitable way, instead of being used to expand a voucher system that has no accountability to the state in academic performance and that primarily benefits only southern, urban schools. The money used to increase and subsidize private vouchers comes directly from the pool of money that could be distributed to local schools in general and categorical aids. There is an option to increase school funding and to lower local property taxes...by putting more dollars into public school aids and less into the expansion of private school vouchers.

Governor Walker stated in his budget address, "In the end, our goal is simple...ensure that every child, regardless of where they are from or what their family income is, has access to a great education." I question the validity of this statement, as the governor's proposal will adversely affect the schools that serve Forest County students, and numerous other districts in rural Wisconsin. Dr. Tony Ever's Fair Funding for Our Future plan looks to find a better balance for rural schools, like ours, that have high property valuation with below average family incomes.

Your support of the schools serving the students of Forest County is appreciated. Please contact Governor Walker and your area legislators, Senator Tom Tiffany and Representative Jeff Mursau, to show your support for Fair Funding for Our Future to ensure that Forest County students will continue to have access to a great education.






