#### Wisconsin's Johnny Greaves wins the Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup final at Crandon!



CRANDON, Wis. (July 1, 2013) – The final race of the Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run Races at Crandon International Off-Road Raceway, the one with the \$20,000-plus cash-swollen prize purse - the 20th annual Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup – went to Wisconsin local PRO 4x4 racer Johnny Greaves (Monster Energy/Toyota/Maxxis), who came from behind in the staggered start and caught PRO 2WD's Jeff Kincaid from Crandon and cruised the big dollar victory.

"I can't think of a better way to wrap up a thrilling

"I can't think of a better way to wrap up a thrilling weekend of racing at Crandon than to get the win in the Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup," said Greaves. "And to top that off by getting to do so in front of our hometown fans, and to be joined by my son CJ on the podium ... what a great finish to yet another great event at Crandon."

In a show of their usual generosity, Forest County Potawatomi Community members upped the ante by \$5,000 on Friday to make things even more interesting. The result was a packed gate for the Community Cup – one that saw the PRO 2WD trucks take off down Crandon's famous "Land Rush" start with a 12-second lead over Johnny Greaves and the rest of the PRO 4x4 field.

With his site set on race leader Jeff Kincaid, Johnny Greaves had to first work his way past his son, CJ, in his ultra-fast Monster Energy/Toyota/Maxxis PRO 2WD ride. Greaves fire-breathing No. 22 Toyota was up to the task as he methodically picked off the racers ahead of him – something that the other PRO 4x4 trucks were having difficulty accomplishing.

In the end Johnny Greaves would distance

In the end Johnny Greaves would distance himself from the rest of the field of top PRO 4x4 and 2WD racers, hoisting the Community Cup aloft while flanked by Kincaid (2nd) and son CJ (3rd).

"The Forest County Potawatomi Tribe is honored to be involved with such a great event at Crandon," said Gus Frank, Forest County Potawatomi chairman. "We first got involved with off-road racing through Jeff Kincaid and Johnny Greaves. So it's a great honor to again be involved with such an exciting event as it enters its 20th year summer."

# Dollar-A-Day Boys! A Musical Tribute to the Civilian Conservation Corps

Upper Peninsula based author/songwriter Bill Jamerson will present a music and storytelling program about the Civilian Conservation Corps at the Crandon Historical Museum on Wednesday evening, July 17 at 7pm. Jamerson will present from the porch of the museum. People are invited to bring lawn chairs and blankets to sit on. The event will be moved inside to the library in case of inclement weather. The program is sponsored by the Forest County Historical and Genealogical Society and is free and open to the public.

Jamerson will tell stories, read excerpts from his books and sing original songs with his guitar. He has performed at CCC reunions around the country and at dozens of CCC built national and state parks. His presentation is as entertaining as it is important; as honest as it is fun. It's about people both ordinary and extraordinary, with stories of wit, charm and strength.

The Civilian Conservation Corps was a federal works program created by President Franklin Roosevelt in the heart of The Great Depression. During its nine year run beginning in 1933, ninety two thousand young men worked in Wisconsin camps. There was an average of 46 camps in operation for each year. The enrollees were paid \$1 a day with \$25 sent home to their families each month. The money kept many families from starving.

#### Solar Cooking

Kids can cook up a plate of 'smores using just the sun. The easiest way is to paint the outside of an empty, metal coffee can with black paint. Kids can put together their 'smores and lace it inside the can, leaving it in the sun. This is a fun way to learn about the power of the sun and cook a sweat treat without fire. Older kids may want to try more advanced solar cooking with a pizza box solar oven.

#### **Treasure Hunt**

Parents can join in this outdoor activity and be part of the fun. Hide a piece of treasure somewhere in the yard. Small toys work best, though parents can be creative and use whatever they have on hand. The parents can then draw out a simple map for the kids to follow to the treasure.

This is a great way for kids to understand maps, learn cooperation, and have an afternoon adventure

#### Make a Sundial

Kids can make a simple sundial in the backyard using a large stick and a few rocks. With parental help, kids can bury a long stick in the ground leaving 7 to 12 inches sticking out of the ground. Kids can then mark each hour with a large rock or stone on the ground as the stick's

Health-based violations remain low, with 96 percent of systems having no violations

MADISON – Wisconsin public water supply system operators reduced by one-third their violations of monitoring or reporting requirements for drinking water and continued their stellar record of serving water that met all health-based standards in 2012, a recently released report shows.

Also, a record 30 communities received low interest loans or grants from the Department of Natural Resources to help upgrade water treatment plants, pipes and other infrastructure to improve drinking water safety.

"We're pleased with continued exemplary performance by Wisconsin water system operators and by the important progress many systems made to assure safe water into the future," says Jill Jonas, who directs the DNR Drinking and Groundwater Bureau.

Ninety-six percent, or 10,999 of 11,409 public water systems, met all health-based standards. These systems had no water samples exceeding health-based standards for regulated contaminants, according to the 2012 Annual Drinking Water Report.

DNR's increased emphasis on working to

improve the safety of drinking water provided by smaller, non-municipally owned water systems is paying off – in 2012, monitoring and reporting violations dropped to 493 from 630 in 2011. Rural mobile home parks, apartment buildings and condominium complexes are among the non-municipal systems DNR has focused on because such water suppliers have tended to have more monitoring and reporting violations.

The department contracts with the Wisconsin Rural Water Association to provide technical help to these water suppliers, called OTM or "other-than-municipal" water systems.

"These systems are doing a much better job of collecting samples within the required time frame and reporting the results, providing more assurance that they are providing their customers with safe drinking water," says Jonas.

Violations for health-based standards remained low; the number of all public water systems with water samples testing high for one or more contaminants was 3.7 percent, or 418 systems. Of these, the smallest public water systems, the transient non-community system category that includes motels, restaurants, parks, taverns, churches and campgrounds had the highest number of violations, accounting for about 70 percent of health-based violations. Bacterial violations again ranked as the most common health-based violation, followed by violations for nitrates and radioactivity.

A violation of a health-based standard does not mean that people who drank the water experienced adverse health effects; it means users were exposed to what the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has determined to be an unreasonable risk of illness, or that the system failed to treat its water to the extent judged necessary.

#### To keep our treasured waters clean and healthy, don't pick up any aquatic hitchhikers this summer

Please don't pick up hitchhikers this summer, and I'm not talking about the ones you mom warned you to never stop for along highways. Theese hitchhikers are found on boats and trailers and in live wells and the bucket where you may keep the day's catch.

These hitchhikers -- aquatic invasive species (AIS) -- are non-native plants and animals that can harm or treasured Wisconsin waters and recreation and which are primarily spread when we are boating or fishing.

But by being alert and taking a few easy steps, you can curb the spread, and we can help in a host of

Have you encountered AIS like Eurasian watermilfoil, zebra mussels or rusty crayfish in your favorite lake? Do you have questions on AIS "no transport" laws aimed at boaters and anglers? Are you aware of the numerous prevention, monitoring and control efforts taking place in Wisconsin?

Ever wonder who those folks with the blue shirts are out at the boat landing? Do you know local group/governments can apply for AIS grants through our DNR AIS Grants Program?

Or are you interested in joining the hundreds of volunteers working to monitor and prevent the spread of AIS?

Preventing the spread of aquatic invasive species takes effort from everyone who enjoys our state's waterways. Our surveys show that more than 90 percent of boaters know what they need to do to prevent the spread of AIS. We continue to educate boaters about AIS and we have also started to enforce the AIS laws in Wisconsin

Please go to the DNR searchable website and type in "invasive species" for more on how we can all help keep Wisconsin lakes and fish healthy. The best place to start is by removing organic material from boats, trailers, and live wells.

In Wisconsin, The CCC planted 265 million trees, built 483 bridges, erected over 4,000 miles of telephone poles, constructed 4,300 miles of truck trails, stocked half a billion fish, fought forest fires, and built several state parks including Rib Mountain, Interstate, Devil's Lake, Peninsula Park, Copper Falls and Wyalusing. The camps not only revitalized Wisconsin's natural resources but also turned the boys into men by giving them discipline and teaching them work skills. In June of 1933 Camp #649 outside of Crandon opened. There were also camps in Goodman, Dunbar, Laona, Antigo and other communities. For more information on camp locations visit CCCLegacy.org.

Jamerson's book, BIG SHOULDERS is a historical novel that follows a year in the life of a seventeen-year-old youth from Detroit who enlisted in the CCC in 1937. The enrollee joins two hundred other young men at Camp Raco, a work camp in Michigan's Upper Peninsula run by reserve army officers. It is a coming-ofage story of an angry teenager who faces the rigors of hard work, learning to cope with a difficult sergeant and fending

offa bully.

Some of the songs Jamerson performs with his guitar include Franklin D., written by an appreciative CCC Boy., Chowtime, a fun look at the camp food, City Slicker, which tells of the mischief the boys find in the woods, and Tree Plantin', Fire Fightin' Blues that tells of the hardships of work out in the woods. The folk songs range from heartwarming ballads to foot stomping jigs.

Jamerson was called "...the Upper Peninsula's troubadour," by the Ontonagon Herald. He performs "History Through Song" programs on ski jumpers, iron miners, lumberjacks and more. Along with a novel and CD's of songs. Jamerson produced the PBS film, Camp Forgotten, which aired on Wisconsin Public Television in 1994. He has also authored several articles on the corps. In his talk, Bill will talk about some of the interesting enrollees he has met over the years and CCC projects he has visited. #### Keep Your Sight, **Know the Dangers of Fireworks**

As we close in on the annual Independence Day celebration, we look forward to taking in a fireworks show. And when it comes to safety, having trained professionals set off those pyrotechnics is the only way one should enjoy fireworks. The potential risk of setting off fireworks vourself is too great. Prevent Blindness America reminds us during National Fireworks Safety Month that injuries from fireworks accidents can affect us for the rest of our

Children are especially prone to fireworks accidents. There is a great temptation for them to tag along with the rest of the neighborhood kids and set off firecrackers, smoke bombs, sparkling geysers and more. It's not just the person lighting the fireworks who are risking injury but bystanders as well.

According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, there were an estimated 8,700 consumers treated in U.S. hospital emergency rooms for fireworksrelated injuries in 2012 and of those injuries 600 hundred were to the eyes. The CPSC's annual report says 60 percent of all fireworks injuries occur during the 30 days surrounding the July 4th holiday.

Most injuries were associated with fireworks that malfunctioned or were used improperly. Fireworks that malfunction travel in an unexpected flight path and drop dangerous debris. Improper use includes lighting a firework too close to someone or lighting fireworks while holding them and playing with lit or used fireworks.

As for those fireworks that are frequently considered 'safe' for children, like bottle rockets and sparklers? They aren't safe at all. The CPSC report shows that about 1,000 reported injuries in 2012 involved bottle rockets and sparklers. According to the CPSC's report, sparklers and bottle rockets combined caused 24 percent of fireworks-related injuries and 23 percent were caused

Prevent Blindness America offers a number of tips to prevent fireworks-related injuries. First on the list is to not purchase, use or store fireworks of any type. Also be aware that sparklers are dangerous and cause 50% of fireworks injuries in children 14 and younger. They recommend attending only authorized public fireworks displays which are conducted by licensed operators. But they warn that injuries can still occur at those types of







# Civil War buffs Cont. from pg. 1

You may be aware that this is the 150th Anniversary of the Civil War battle that took place in Gettysburg, Pennsylvania is now, during our 4th of July celebration 150 years ago. There are two young men in northern Oconto County who could easily be labeled Civil War "nuts." but the correct word would probably be "historian.'

These two fellows have been interested in Civil War history since they were kids, and they used to have their own re-enactments at Beverly Scheuerman's campground. She is the one who called us and thought we might like to feature these two historians in the

They made the trip to our office and subjected themselves to an interview about their passion for history and especially Civil War history. Jake Kroll, the Confederate in the photo above, is 16 years of age, and Patrick Kroll, age 17, is dressed in Union garb. They have participated in a re-enactment at Heritage Hill in Green Bay, and re-enact historical battles on their own in the woods around Townsend and Lakewood and at Beverly's campground. They put on a historical performance at the Upper Room Family Church in Townsend, and will be in the parade this Thursday at the Townsend July 4th Festival.

The two cousins will switch sides during their Civil War historical sessions, and both have an extensive knowledge of battles, generals and the politics of the war that

defined the country we live in today.

During our conversation, we talked the Battle of Gettysburg and some of the major figures in that defining battle. It was the farthest north that the Confederate would get during the war. Their defeat signaled the beginning of the end for the war that would drag out for almost two more years. The northern victory gave an impetus for the complete removal of slavery from the country and gave Lincoln a better chance to win the election in

The Civil War vets explained that on the first day of the battle, which was on July 1st, 1863, Union forces entered the village of Gettysburg, but they didn't get to stay there. Parts of the 1st and 11th Corps ran into the Confederates coming into the village, and they had a street fight backing out of town into the surrounding countryside, where a battle took

place on McPherson's Ridge. Confederate General Archer was captured.

They talked of the 2nd day of the battle when the fight for Little Round Top and Culp's Hill took place. Patrick, sliding back into time, said we participated in the fight for Culp's Hill, meaning the Iron Brigade, and the uniform he is wearing in the photo above is Iron Brigade, part of which were units from Wisconsin. In this battle, unlike many others in the Civil War, the Union forces held the high ground at Cemetery Ridge, Culp's Hill, Little Round Top, the Peach Orchard, and the Wheatfield. It was up to the rebel army to dislodge the federal troops, and it was more than they could accomplish.

Jake Kroll, who was representing the 14th Virginia last Tuesday, talked of being in Pickett's Charge on the 3rd day of the battle. He said he made it to the Emmittsburg Pike, and like many others found it suicide to try to climb the rail fence to continue the charge. From his vantage point he could see Lo Armistead lead his North Carolina troops to the angle, which was a corner in a stone fence. This was the farthest extent of the charge, with tremendous losses to the Confederate army.

Armistead was killed, as were many of his men. Patrick said the Iron Brigade was not actively engaged on this last fight of the Gettysburg battle, but watched the fight in

These two young men are walking history books, as many of the Civil War reenactors are, but most don't get this involved until later in life. We commend them for helping bringing this important conflict back to the prominence it deserves in our nation's history.

Many of us have ancestors who fought in this war. For many people in the Crandon, Elton, or White Lake area, we have veterans in our family tree from both armies, and many of us with Kentucky ancestry had people who were in the 14th Virginia

I lost a relative who was shot dead at the Emmitsburg Pike. My wife's great grandfather served with the 26th Wisconsin, and he was one of the Union soldiers who fought their way out of the village at Gettysburg when the Confederate Army came in. It wasn't really that long ago, and Jake and Patrick are helping keep that history alive. They are also looking for anybody else who would like to participate in re-enacting.

- Never allow children to handle firecrackers.
- Keep a container of water close by to pour on firecrackers that malfunction.
   Never try to relight malfunctioning firecrackers.
- Pop firecrackers in a clear, open, outdoor space.
  Keep kids out of the range of firecrackers.
- Never ignite bunches of firecrackers at one time.
- Don't ignite fireworks in containers.

Sun Safety for Independence Day
Overexposure to the sun can increase kids' risks of skin cancer, glaucoma, and cataracts during adulthood. According to the American Academy of Dermatology, people get most of their sun exposure before the age of 18, so sun protection during childhood is vital. Here are some tips to protect young children from too much sun on the Fourth of July:
• Dress kids in light colored, long sleeve shirts and pants.
• Apply a kid-formulated sunblock with an SPF of 15 or higher to exposed areas of the skin.

- Keep infants under six months out of direct sunlight.
  Keep kids out of the sun between 10am and 3pm when the sun's rays are the most
- Cover each child's head with a wide brimmed hat to protect the head and neck from the
- Provide kids with wraparound sunglasses that block at least 99 percent of the sun's ultraviolet rays.

#### Fourth of July Swimming Pool Safety for Kids

It doesn't take long for a child to disappear underwater and drown. Drowning is the second leading cause of accidental death in young kids. Children who are fortunate enough to survive being submerged underwater can suffer irreversible neurological damage. So in addition to requiring youngsters to wear life vests in the water, the United States Consumer Product Safety Commission offers these tips to keep kids safe in the swimming pool:

- If a child is missing, look in the pool first.
  Don't use flotation devices as a substitute for supervision.
- Keep rescue equipment and a telephone near the pool. Learn CPR.
   Install a self-closing, self-latching fence around the pool. Gates should be at least four-
- Use alarms on doors that lead to the pool.
- Use a motor-powered barrier over the water to prevent access by young children.
   Remove steps and ladders on above ground swimming pools when they are not in use.

When parents are diligent about sun, swimming pool, and firework safety, kids can showcase their patriotism without the risk of injury when celebrating Independence Day.

safety is also of major importance. No act or event will sour a young fisherman faster than a near death experience such as falling in the river or getting hooked with a barbed hook. Regardless of the type of fishing make sure that the child or children have the proper equipment for the occasion including a properly sized life jacket, sun glasses, rain jacket, or other essential items. Additionally if your fishing adventures often take you into remote areas or miles off shore make sure that you are watching the weather forecast and avoid taking the kids out on a day when the forecast looks more like a hurricane warning than a sunny picnic day.

#### Get out there and Fish

Finally the number one rule with teaching anyone to do something as fun and exciting as fishing is to remember the golden rule and treat others as you would like to be treated. Children are especially sensitive to angry words and grumpy adults who have lost sight of the simple joys of being outdoors and fishing with a friend..

Put your catch on ice instead of in a bucket full of water.

To minimize the spread of these invasive species the law requires water to be drained from our live wells and bilges even if they contain your day's catch. To help preserve your Friday fish fry the DNR has been handing out thousands of ice packs to place onto the fish to preserve until filleting.

The outside and inside of the boat, trailer, live wells, bilges, and pumps should be disinfected

Wisconsin made significant progress in 2012 in efforts to prevent, contain, and control the damage done by AIS, capitalizing on increased federal funding and growing involvement by counties and volunteers.

With your help, we can continue to keep AIS in check. About 200 lakes were monitored this year as part of a five-year process to paint a more accurate picture of where aquatic invasive species are found across the state, and how fast they're spreading, and to evaluate the effectiveness of outreach and education efforts.

The number of counties actively partnering with the state to prevent and control the spread of aquatic invasive species is growing. Over the July 4 holiday, for instance, a record 53 counties will have volunteers and paid staff at boat launches to provide free boat inspections, hand out limited supplies of towels and ice pack, and help raise awareness of steps to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species.

Efforts to engage new partners in geographic areas where there were gaps in the past are paying off. We continue to partner with nearly 200 bait shops to help spread the word and this year, high school students from Siren will help raise awareness at boat launches in Burnett County over the July 4 holiday.

These partnerships helped spread the AIS prevention message to even more water users in 2012 with nearly 110,000 boats inspected and 233,000 people contacted.

The results are encouraging.. 70 percent of lakes with public access were free of Eurasian water-milfoil, despite that invader being here in Wisconsin for more than 50 years. And 82 percent of suitable lakes with public access are still clear of zebra mussels, present inland for more than 20 years.


Rapid response efforts have been successful at eliminating new infestations of species like hydrilla, red swamp crayfish, yellow floating heart, Vietnamese water celery, water chestnut, grass carp and several other invasive species in Wisconsin.

Research has led to new techniques that are providing alternative for the control of aquatic invasive species, early season treatment of Eurasian water-milfoil, innovative techniques to control rainbow smelt, development of products that have the potential to control zebra mussels, or deter Asian carp from moving upstream are all showing signs of success.

Other highlights include, Eurasian Water Milfoil found in 642 water bodies in the state (2012 data), Zebra mussels found in 149 water bodies in the state (2012 data). Over 180 AIS in Great Lakes, but no new invasive aquatic species are known to have been introduced through ballast water since changes in ballast water management regulations were implemented in 2006. Over 110,000 boats inspected for AIS in 2012. 


# Red Arrow Snowmobile Club is compiling their history
