

Cavour artist releases the beauty locked in the wood



Tom Gialdini turns a chalice from a piece of interesting wood. By Mike Monte


Artists don't always work with paint, plaster or stone. This Cavour artist works with wood, and he doesn't always get to make the final decision as to size, shape or color. He works with wood, and the wood often makes these final decisions regarding the work.

Tom Gialdini is a Cavour artist who does his artistry on a wood lathe. He makes bowls, cups, chalices and vases from local wood, usually the part that a logger cuts off and leaves to rot. His turnings are made from the burls on hardwood and cedar trees that grown in the nearby forests. He turns forest refuse into forest jewels, and they are very eye-catching and beautiful. The burl, as pointed out, makes the final decision on the finished work, and no two are alike.

Tom works from his shop, next to his home, at the corner of Highway 139 and Cemetery Road in the town of Cavour. He keeps an inventory of his work in the shop, but he will do custom turnings as well. Have an interesting piece of wood you would like turned into a vessel, bringing out the beauty of the wood, he is your guy. His work will make interesting gifts or an heirloom that can be passed through the generations of your family. Each piece is signed by the artist, and would make great centerpieces for any table or buffet.

If you would like to peruse the inventory Tom has in stock or order a custom piece, just call 715-219-4430 to set up a visit. He isn't always in the shop, but is often out gathering material.

Eurasian water milfoil has been confirmed as a new invasive species in Peshtigo Lake, Forest County. The Eurasian water milfoil was discovered at the boat landing by John Preuss, Lumberjack RC and D Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator and verified by UW Stevens Point Professor Dr. Robert Freckmann. Peshtigo Lake is a 147 acre drainage lake off of Peshtigo Road in Crandon and has a maximum depth of four feet and low water visibility. Fish in the lake include panfish, largemouth bass and northern pike.


"In an ideal year, the ground would freeze first before the first snow providing a sturdy base to trails that will not be damaged by use," said Mell.



Eurasian water milfoil is an aggressive aquatic plant that comes from Europe, Asia, and North Africa. It is quick growing and can form dense mats that can take over the lake. Once established it often makes fishing, boating and general recreation very difficult. This plant is very difficult to eradicate or manage once established in a lake. It only takes a two inch fragment of this plant to start in a new lake and often hitches a ride on someone's boat when they travel to a new waterbody.

To prevent spreading Eurasian water milfoil and other aquatic invasive species please follow these rules.

Remove all aquatic plants, animals and mud from trailers, and equipment before leaving the boat boats. landing.

Drain all water from your boat, motor, bilge, transom wells, and livewells before leaving the boat landing.

Do not move live fish away from a boat landing. A live fish is a fish still in water. Drain water from all containers containing your fish including pails, coolers, livewells, and bait buckets. Frozen water bottles or ice can be used in place of water to keep fish fresh.

Remember it is up to all of us to protect our lakes from aquatic invasive species.



Ministry prepared for next open enrollment for the Healthcare Insurance Exchange

Health Care leaders and staff are well prepared for the November 15, 2014 launch of open enrollment for healthcare coverage provided by the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Last year after some early setbacks with the online signup tool, millions of uninsured Americans found coverage through the Healthcare Marketplace. By the end of the extended enrollment period more than 7.3 million had signed up for coverage, exceeding estimates for the program's first year.

While there are still some concerns being raised, a number of positive things have occurred during the first year of the program including a reduction in the number of uninsured, coverage is generally more affordable, the online registration process is working well and expected to continue and with coverage in place, people are now more willing to seek care early as opposed to waiting until something becomes critical. Federal officials are estimating that upwards of 13 million Americans will have coverage this year.

Ministry Health Care launched an effort to enroll individuals in plans last year by identifying and training Certified Application Counselors (CAC) who combined enrolled 750 individuals in the ACA marketplace and BadgerCare across all of the regions served. Again this year, the CACs are prepared to offer assistance to anyone seeking coverage through the Affordable Care Act once the open enrollment period begins in mid-November.






ATV/UTV season is over... Snowmobiling just around the corner

Did you ever wonder how those ATV/UTV and snowmobile trails appear each year just in time for riding fun? Club volunteers spend countless hours working with landowners, putting up signs, brushing trails and getting grooming equipment ready. Trails are maintained by clubs across Wisconsin with partial funding provided by the registration fees paid each year for snowmobiles, ATVs and UTVs. Clubs supplement this funding with local fundraisers to meet the total cost of keeping the trails in the great condition riders expect.

All clubs are volunteer groups and are always looking for new members. You may ask why you should join a club. First off it is a lot of fun interacting with others who share your passion for motorized recreation. You also get to join your voice with the club and state organizations who work hard to keep trails open as anti-motorized groups push to achieve their goals. Representing the snowmobile sport here in Wisconsin is the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC) and on the ATV/UTV side there is the Wisconsin ATV/UTV Association (WATVA). Club of Marinette County also belongs to the Alliance as they have trails coming into the eastern side of Oconto County. These clubs spend nearly 10,000 volunteer hours each year preparing, brushing and grooming the 475 miles of trail in the county.

ATV/UTV Clubs in Oconto County include the Dusty Trails ATV Club in Mountain, Hidden Bear Trail ATV Club in the Lakewood/Riverview/Doty area, Crooked Trail Riders ATV Club in Crooked Lake and the Oconto Area ATV Club in Oconto. Red Arrow in Townsend and Gillett Snow & ATV riders in Gillett are year round clubs that have members who either snowmobile or ATV/UTV and some who enjoy both. These clubs are responsible for about 450 miles of interconnected summer trails and routes. Overall coordination of the county wide trail systems is the responsibility of the Oconto County Parks and Recreation Department.





Nicolet College law enforcement training enhances public safety, cuts costs for local agencies

It used to be local law enforcement agencies had to shell out big bucks to send staff for training that advanced overall public safety in the Northwoods.

The reason: typically the training was held hundreds of miles away. Lodging, travel, meals, and the high tuition cost of many of these multi-day professional development workshops were just too much for many agencies - especially the smaller ones - to handle.

"We wanted to change that," said Phil Schmidt, Criminal Justice instructor at Nicolet College.

"Budgets are tight across the board, so we figured if we could offer this training in the Northwoods at Nicolet, we would be able to make advanced and specialized training much more accessible for local departments."

In recent years Schmidt and others at the college have brought in hundreds of workshops. So far this year alone Nicolet has offered 32 law enforcement professional development classes attended by 562 participants.

"By offering this training locally, students don't have to travel as far and they can go home at night. That alone is a significant cost savings. Students also don't have to be away from their families for extended periods, which can be pretty disruptive for those with children, especially small children."

While most of those attending are from the Northwoods, others are not.

"We get a lot people from all across the state and even surrounding states," he added. "They are the ones that then need lodging, they need to buy meals and gas. All of this money goes directly into our local economy."

Nicolet is able to offer this training, and the specially-trained instructors, thanks to numerous grants, most of which come from the Wisconsin Department of Justice and local entities such as a recent grant received from the Wisconsin Public Service Foundation.

So far in 2014 the college has been awarded \$55,870 in grants. Much of this goes to pay for instructor specialists from local and state agencies, the FBI, and recognized national experts.

This year training topics have included how to investigate social networks, weapons training, evidence collection, legal updates, breathalyzer training, leadership and communication classes, and others.

Nicolet works closely with an advisory committee made up of local law enforcement leaders to hear their thoughts on the type of training that is needed. The result is that about half of the class topics are new every year to keep up with changing demand.

"This higher level of training for local law enforcement professionals translates directly into a higher level of public safety," he said. "And that benefits all of us."



ecologist for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. "To answer their questions, we first tell them to focus only on the area where they hunt. If they know their county and other basic information, they will have no problem learning this season's new rules."

The department has provided a number of useful resources to help hunters learn the new rules. All hunters are encouraged to review the 2014 deer hunting regulations [PDF] and FAQs, available at dnr.wi.gov, keyword "deer." The deer page also features regulations brochures, tag information and availability, and maps showing new management units and zones.

To ask specific questions before or during the hunt, hunters can also contact the DNR Call Center tollfree at 1-888-WDNRINFo (1-888-936-7463). Call center staff are on hand seven days per week from 7 a.m. to 10 p.m. Spanish- and Hmong-speaking representatives are also available.

Hunters interested in receiving email updates regarding new regulations can sign up to receive occasional email reminders about season dates, license and tag types, and other important information. Visit dnr.wi.gov and click on the email icon near the bottom of the page for "subscribe for updates for DNR topics," then follow the prompts and select a list of your choice.

Wallenfang encourages all hunters to take some extra time to review the new rules before heading into the field this weekend.

"It will help prevent confusion and frustration so hunters can focus on enjoying this exciting week with family and friends, and hopefully bringing home your deer," he said.

Improvements to USDA Beginning Farmer Loans

USDA recently announced several changes to Farm Service Agency (FSA) loan programs, changes designed to help more beginning farmers and ranchers. The new "interim final rule" will increase the Microloan limit from \$35,000 to \$50,000. This program provides a simplified application process and a seven year payback. Microloans can be used for approved operating expenses, such as seed, fertilizer, utilities, land rents, marketing, distribution, living expenses, livestock, equipment, hoop houses, tools, irrigation and delivery vehicles.

USDA is also changing the "experience" requirement for FSA Direct Farm Ownership loans. Previously, applicants had to prove they participated in the operations of a farm for at least three years. Beginning farmers across the country identified this restriction as a real barrier. It is not reflective of current realities in which new farmers enter agriculture.

The change will allow beginning farmers and ranchers to substitute one year of that three-year requirement with a formal farming apprenticeship, operation or management of a non-farm business, leadership or management experience while serving in any branch of the military, advanced education in an agricultural field, and significant experience in a farm-related agricultural career.

USDA also proposes changing the types of farming entities eligible to apply, potentially opening the door to non-majority investors who are not actively farming or managing the operation. We'll watch these changes closely. The deadline to submit public comments on these changes to the USDA is December 8, 2014. Contact Traci Bruckner, tracib@cfra.org, for more information.

Nearly half-million dollar federal grant to advance Nursing instruction at Nicolet

Two new opportunities may help Northwoods residents seeking Nursing degrees at Nicolet College. Qualified students will soon be able to move more quickly through the Nursing Assistant program, a prerequisite for the Nursing program, and those seeking a bachelor's degree in Nursing will be able to stay in the Northwoods while doing so.

The new options are the focus of a \$461,531 federal grant the college received from the U.S. Department of Labor.

"There's significant demand for nurses in the Northwoods," said Kenneth Urban, Nicolet College interim president. "Area health care providers anticipate this demand will grow even more in the future as Baby Boomers continue to retire from the field. This grant will help students meet Nursing program entry requirements more rapidly, allowing Nicolet to train the professionals necessary to deliver high quality health care."

One component of the grant targets individuals with some work experience in the field. For instance, Emergency Medical Responders, military medics, and corpsmen have extensive training in specific healthcare environments; some of those skills overlap with skills taught in the Nursing Assistant program. Nicolet will use part of its funds to set up a competency testing program so that these students will be able to test out of certain course requirements in the Nursing Assistant program, which is a required academic credential for entry into the Practical Nursing program. Students earn a Practical Nursing degree first on the way to becoming a Registered Nurse. Competency testing will begin in January.

The second component packages course work so students looking to earn a bachelor's degree in Nursing will be able to take the first three years of classes at Nicolet. During the first year students complete general education requirements and the Nursing Assistant program and follow that with two years of Nicolet Nursing courses. The fourth and final year involves nursing theory and leadership courses and is completed almost entirely online with classes from a partner four-year University of Wisconsin campus. General education classes will begin Fall Semester of 2015.

"The beauty of this is that Northwoods students will be able to earn a bachelor's degree in Nursing without having to move to a four-year university," said Lenore Blemke, dean of Health Occupations at Nicolet. "Most of the classes will be held on the Nicolet Campus. The remaining classes can be completed almost entirely online with only limited visits to a four-year campus."

The grant to Nicolet is part of the \$20 million the U.S. Department of Labor recently awarded to the Wisconsin Technical College System to advance job training in high-demand employment sectors.

The grant will also fund a success coach to help students with everything from enrolling in the program to finding employment after they graduate. Funds will also provide professional development guidance to educators and employers working with veterans and displaced workers.



Work of Nicolet College art instructor Nate Wilson featured in latest Nicolet Art Gallery exhibit



In the art world, you have to know the rules before you can break the rules.

That's one approach Nicolet College Art Instructor Nate Wilson likes to take when he puts brush and pencil to paper to make his intriguing works of art.

"I like people to be challenged when they look at certain pieces but I also want it to be inviting to them," said Wilson, who currently has more than 70 pieces on display in the latest exhibit in the Nicolet College Art Gallery.

Stroll through the gallery and it's easy to see that Wilson has a unique view. Take a few of the pieces where his subjects appear to be floating lightly on their toes in almost a dream-like world.

"I've always had this interest in what I call unbalance in the composition," said Wilson, who has a master's of fine art from Laguna College of Art and Design. "I just don't want to create anything that's boring."

Wilson also taught art at Laguna College of Art and Design and for seven year interned under famed New York City Illustrator Brad Holland, whose work regularly appears in such publications as Time, Vanity Fair, The New Yorker, Rolling Stone, and The New York Times.

Along with his interpretive work, the exhibit also features 19 portraits that Wilson painted of Nicolet staff members – an endeavor that, surprisingly for him, proved physically challenging.

While also teaching a full load of courses, he'd have people come between or after classes to sit for the portraits. Each session took about two hours and he'd commonly have two or more sessions in a day in addition to teaching several classes.

"Honestly, I don't think I ever do it that way again," he said. "There were times when I literally felt like I was going to fall down."

In addition to his figurative and portrait work, the exhibit also includes a few pieces from a new genre for Wilson: landscapes and animals.

"That's really the result of moving to northern Wisconsin," said Wilson, who left California three years ago to join the Nicolet faculty. "Landscapes and animals are a big part of the area here. This is the first place I've ever lived where you ask yourself 'Is there a bear outside?" or 'Is that a wolf I hear?' It's just part of life here."

Wilson will have his work on display through December 6. Admission to the exhibit is free.

The gallery is open from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Fridays and Saturdays. The gallery will be closed for Thanksgiving November 27 and 28.





Health Advocates Promote Resources for Lung Cancer Awareness Month

November is Lung Cancer Awareness Month—an opportunity to reflect on the terrible toll that lung cancer takes on Wisconsin families every year. To honor those taken by lung cancer and to prevent future deaths, the Northwood's Tobacco Free Coalition is reminding tobacco users that free resources are available to help them quit.

Lung cancer is now the number-one cause of cancer death for both men and women, according to the 2014 Surgeon General's Report on Smoking and Health. The report also shows that almost nine out of 10 lung cancers are caused by smoking. Another startling finding from the report is that smokers today are more likely to develop lung cancer than those of 50 years ago.

According to the Wisconsin Interactive Statistics on Health, 24 Forest County residents have died from lung cancer from 2010-2012.

While addiction can take a powerful hold on tobacco users, it can be beaten with the help of free resources. The Northwood's Tobacco Free Coalition encourages individuals who smoke or use other tobacco products to call the Wisconsin Tobacco Quit Line at 1-800-QUIT NOW for free assistance. In addition to receiving personal coaching, Quit Line callers can also receive a starter pack of quit smoking medications.

Evidence shows that the combination of quit smoking counseling and FDA-approved medications like nicotine gum, patches, and lozenges is the most effective way to successfully quit. Both counseling and medications are available through the quit line.


