St. Leonard's Spaghetti Dinner, March 7th



Forestry Committee discusses proposed off-road vehicle park

The Forest County Forestry and Recreation Committee met Monday, February 23, with a full agenda.

Bids were opened for the building of the managers office at Veteran's Memorial Park. The forestry department will be contacting the bidders this week.

The committee passed two resolutions to the full county board. The first was a resolution supporting the continuation of the Knowles - Nelson Stewardship funding for county land acquisitions and a resolution to reestablish the County Forest Administrator Grant Program. Each resolution passed unanimously.

The next line on the agenda was to approve the amendments to the 15 year comprehensive land use plan that were concerning the proposed off road vehicle park. The forestry department received more information from WORVPI and the committee decided that they will review the responses given and make necessary changes to the amendments. The new amendments will be presented to the forestry committee at their next meeting and voted on. The amendments would then go to the full county board at their April meeting.

The proposed ORV Park on County G in Forest to come to fruition. The first are the amendments to the Forest County 15 year Forestry and Recreation Plan. Many meetings with WORVPI and Forest County's within please ask. subcommittees have taken place to draft specific language pertaining to allowing an MRA Park to exist on county owned forest land. But the final language to be acceptable by both parties has not happened. This is due to the inability of WORVPI to answer a few generic questions and produce needed information the committee desires.

The second cog in the Off Road Park Plan comes from one of the studies done for support of the park. In that study it is recommended some legislation has to be proposed and passed in Madison. Assembly bill AB 369 pertains to full size off-road trucks and the publicly owned lands they would want to run on. The other is Assembly Bill AB 700 that has a sentence that would allow private land owners under Managed Forest law to lease their lands, and possibly the roads and trails on them for off-road trucks.

The third and most important mountain for WORVPI to climb is money. Where is the funding coming from for an ORV Park? Past studies have recommended that WORVPI is to invest more than 6 million of it's own dollars, and says the State of Wisconsin needs to be a major player in the whole process. WORVPI has promised public meetings to explain their business

plan and answer questions. When and where are these meetings?

Bottom line: If the public can not have a referendum to voice their opinions because there is not enough information, and the Forest County Forestry Committee doesn't have enough information to change the 15 year forestry and recreation plan, then Wisconsin DNR does not have enough information to allow or disallow an MRA park on county forest land.

I see a pattern here. Please talk with your county supervisors and let them know how you feel.

Open letter to Vilas County Forest Committee, full Vilas County Board and residents

Partners in Forestry Cooperative, a 15-year old organization driven by the interests of landowners who wish to sustainably manage their forest lands, is publically opposed to Jerry Burkett's recent proposal to sell off over 1000 acres of County Forest land. This proposal of January 27, 2015 demonstrates ignorance on the valuable suite of economic, social and environmental benefits of the forest, and suggests a serious disregard for the spirit of the County Forest Law and the years of productive investment in developing well-managed forests.

Since its formation, Partners in Forestry has been invested in discussing and promoting the societal needs satisfied by healthy and productive forests, and presently the economic benefits of forest ownership and sustainable management have never been more promising. In recent years, land values throughout the region have declined, sometimes significantly, yet the high demand for forest products is sustaining record stumpage prices. The forest products economy is by far the bright spot in our local economy, and-coupled with tourism, which depends on healthy forests and public lands-is the very livelihood of many Northwoods residents.

Due to sound past management, Vilas County Enders April 18, 1942 in Milwaukee. He preceded her in Forest land is now producing revenue that effectively reduces property taxes needed from county residents. With loss of this land, those future timber sale revenues also will stop, leading to tax increases. Given these demonstrated benefits, I would argue that now is the time when the county forest should be expanded, not sacrificed.

Currently our Northwoods region is burdened with an overabundance of housing on fragmented forest land, many of these now for sale at well below replacement cost. The suggestion to further fragment and develop productive, revenue-generating forests disregards the realities of the present economic climate. The fact that this proposal is about our own County Forest, a common resource held by and directly benefitting Northwoods residents, is without

Our county forest boasts globally recognized certification through the Sustainable Forest Initiative, and demonstrates some of the best managed lands in the region. Through their responsible management, these forests also provide a future for our young people with future timber revenues as well as logging, trucking and processing jobs. If increased efforts were made by Mr. Burkett and the County Board to attract more non-polluting forest industry processing facilities to the county, we could add significant value to the resource before it leaves while offering meaningful employment to our young to keep them here.

The very thought of selling off any of our county forests, especially in this time of depressed land values, shows a blatant disregard for private land ownership in the area, by further depressing values. The suggestion that these lands be sold with a deed restriction to prevent a buver from entering in the Managed Forest Law suggests a desire to control another's private property rights and potential sources of income. This further indicates a poorly conceived proposal with high potential for adverse consequences for potential buyers and for conflicts with adjoining neighbors.

In closing, we respectfully ask Mr. Burkett to invest County is in a holding pattern waiting for a number of items his efforts into benefitting the common good of Vilas County citizens and refrain from jeopardizing our forestry jobs.
