#### **Guest Editorial**

#### Comments on the long-eared bat and the effects on the logging industry by Dick Krawze

As I was driving to my office this morning, I thought about some of the problems facing this Great Forest Products Industry. I could not help but think about the number of battles that a lot of us have fought over the years, and especially with those issues where we need to work with congressman, senators and agencies at the federal level.

Environmental battles that should never have reached the degree of destruction that the final decisions leveled on this nation. In most cases, these decisions were made based on ignorance of the facts and facts that were wrong and spoon-fed to decision makers and Congress by those who were after personal or financial gain for their respective group.

This brings up the current issue of the northern long-eared bat, and on a somewhat smaller scale, the wood turtle. Both of these species are being used, and will continue to be used, by some of the same environmental groups to again tap into the federal funds they have been so successful at acquiring in the past. It is my firm belief that the Endangered Species Act and National Environmental Policy Act were never intended to be used by these economic terrorists for the financial gain they have prospered by for their lawyers and their own pockets.

We are all aware of the spotted owl, the red and gray wolf and numerous other ESA issues that have cost billions to the taxpayers of this nation and also have and continue to destroy families, businesses, schools, and in some cases, entire counties with severe impact on states as well.

The environmental groups have used several means to get their claws on taxpayer dollars, and in most cases, trying to track the amount they and their lawyers have received has been an effort in futility.

In any case, by use of the Judgement Fund and the Equal Access to Justice Act (EAJA), and coupling this with a feathered or furry animal, bird, or in this most recent assault, a bat and a turtle, they will again satisfy the financial needs of their lawyers and group bank accounts.

I believe that these various groups have no interest in the well-being of a specie or species, but only their financial greed.

I also believe that the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) is, and has been, a participant in the flawed process and has no or very little interest in the economic impact their decisions have placed on this nation.

My experience has also shown that it is impossible to try and work with these groups and any so-called compromise is another step backwards and leaves more boot marks on our backs.

In conclusion, it is my belief that the forest industry by its associations and in joint effort by other affected stakeholders educates our decision makers based on fact, and not the desire to fill the coffers of the respective environmental groups and their lawyers.

Now that the northern long-eared bat has been listed as threatened, and this will take interim effect May 4, 2015, we can add another nail in the coffin of the industry, communities, schools, and the forests themselves.

The forest products industry has no negative impact on the bat, and the fact that we could be severely punished for something we have not caused is very troublesome and should be of great concern to everyone.

Public has one more chance to comment on Anterless Deer Harvest Quota

The public has one more opportunity to provide comments on the antierless deer harvest quota recommendation for Forest County.

The local County Deer Advisory Council will hold its final spring meeting on April 22 at 7:00 p.m. at the Forest County Board Room. At this meeting, the council will hear additional public comments prior to developing final quota and permit recommendations.

The council's preliminary recommendation, formed during its March meeting, suggested a quota of zero deer on private land and zero deer on public land. Councils considered scientific data and public opinion when developing their preliminary quota recommendations.

To develop its final recommendation, the council will consider online input and other public comments along with professional assessments from Department of Natural Resources wildlife biologists, foresters and law enforcement. The public may also comment at any time before April 27 by contacting CDAC chair Alan Harrison at (PHONE 715-473-3921) or by emailing.

Forest County's final quota and permit level recommendations will be presented to the DNR following the April meeting, and will then advance to the Natural Resources Board for approval in May. Once approved, the antlerless quota will take effect for the 2015 deer hunting





#### Medicare coverage of new colon cancer screening tool

Colon cancer, also known as colorectal cancer, is ost common cancer in the world and second leading cause of cancer-related deaths in the United States. Like most forms of cancer, early detection is correlated with a greater chance of survival. The customary testing mechanism for colon cancer is a colonoscopy. A colonoscopy must be peformed at a doctor's office and involves bowel prep of 1-2 days before the procedure is performed. However, now an alternative method is on the market for screening colorectal cancer.

#### What is Cologuard?

Cologuard is a home test that is able to detect the presence of colorectal cancer. It was approved by the Food and Drug Administration in August 2014. It uses DNA technology to look for abnormalities in a stool sample. Cancerous or precancerous cells present in the colon will be picked up by the stool as it passes through the colon.

Once Coloquard is prescribed by a physician, a collection kit is shipped directly to the patient who then collects a stool sample and sends it to the lab in the mailer provided in the kit. Patients are informed by their doctors of the results in approximately 2 weeks. If the results are a positive, a patient will have to undergo a colonoscopy to verify the results.

In a study of 10,000 people of average risk for colon cancer, Cologuard found 92% of cancer.

**Medicare coverage of Cologuard** Medicare Part B will cover use of this test once

every three years for beneficiaries who meet the following criteria:

- · Age 50 to 85 years old
- Asymptomatic (no signs or symptoms of colorectal disease including but not limited to lower gastrointestinal pain, blood in stool, postive guaiac fecal occcult blood test or fecal immunochemical test)
- · At average risk of developing colorectal cancer (no personal history of adenomatous polyps, colorectal cancer or inflammatory bowel disease including Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis; no family history of colorectal cancers or adenomatous polyps, familial adenomatous polyposis or hereditary nonpolyposis colorectal cancer).

Conversely, Medicare will not cover use of this test if an individual:

- · Has symptoms a doctor thinks may be related to colon cancer.
- Previously had a positive colonoscopy that found polyps or cancer. • Is determined by a doctor to be at high-risk due to a

family history of colon cancer. Cologuard must be ordered by a doctor and cannot

To the People of Forest County:

The Pioneer Express of April 13 included a letter from a Mr. Jason Headson who argued for termination of efforts by Forest County elected officials to foist unto the Public the building of a 10,000-acre park for off-roaders. He said that there were a number of officials who were acting in a conflict of interest and that the public interest was being "trumped" by those conflicting interests. And, he called for others to join him, speak out and become active.

Mr. Headson is right. The Forest County Public has tolerated the threat of having to support this ill conceived and unpopular plan for long enough. I will join him and would expect others to do the same. Together, I believe that we can take two important steps to protect our way of life in this County and to restore trust in our County Government.

First, we should address the issue of whether a conflict of interest exists for any of our elected officials who have been acting with regard to this proposed park development. The general perception is that some of our officials do have conflicts. Citizen belief or acceptance that their elected officials may have a conflict of interest is very destructive of public trust in government. In fact, it is a crime for an elected official to act on an issue with regard to which he or she has a conflict of interest. We have a system of laws to address criminal conduct. So, it is necessary for purposes of public trust that that matter be resolved one way or another in a process overseen by our Courts. I am willing to lend assistance to see that that process occurs.

Second, while the next scheduled election for county supervisors is still a year away, we are free to petition for a recall election for the position of supervisor in our individual supervisory districts. By doing so, the citizens might exercise their right to replace those supervisors whom they sense have been acting contrary to the will of the People. I would also be willing to provide guidance to those wanting to explore this option in their districts but who need help with the forms and procedures.

There has been something of a lull in activity by the County with regard to this park proposal. Rumor would have it that park proponents have gone on to other counties with their plans and have even found an interested private investor for some part of the costs. I believe that no county will be receptive to the idea of paying for such a park and that without county funding no private investment will materialize. Also, the Forestry Committee of the County Board is pursuing amendments to the County Forestry Plan to accommodate the desires of the promoters. Therefore, we have not yet seen the end of this issue in Forest County. To regain control of our Government, we should all join in on this effort.

#### Senator Tom Tiffany supports Reach Out and Read Program



Rhinelander, Wis. (April 8, 2015) – Pediatricians and other clinicians at Ministry Medical Group (MMG) Rhinelander pediatrics are sending families home from

checkups with free books and a very important prescription—"read aloud with your children." On Monday, April 6, State Sen. Tom Tiffany visited the healthcare facility, not only to cheer them on, but to practice what doctors preach by reading to a group of young patients.

Ministry Medical Group Rhinelander pediatrics participates in Reach Out and Read, a program that prepares America's youngest children to succeed in school by partnering with doctors to prescribe books and encourage families to read together. Medical professionals incorporate Reach Out and Read's evidence-based model into regular pediatric checkups, by advising parents about the importance of reading aloud and giving developmentally-appropriate books to children. Through Reach Out and Read, each child starts kindergarten with a home library of up to 10 books. The program begins at the 6-month checkup and continues through age 5, with a special emphasis on children growing up in low-income communities.

by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Academy of Family Physicians, and has one of the strongest records of research support of any psychosocial intervention in primary care pediatrics.

"I support the importance of reading during early childhood development," said State Sen. Tiffany. "Reading to my three children has been a personal family interest of my wife and mine with the goal of maximizing our children's potential, appreciation for literature, and contribution to society. I gladly support the opportunity for other children to do the same."



# Antlerless harvest quota and permit level recommendations will be finalized at April County Deer Advisory Council meetings

MADISON - County Deer Advisory Councils are set to prepare final antlerless quota and permit recommendations during the last round of spring meetings from April 20-23, and a public comment period open through April 15 will provide an opportunity to submit feedback.

April CDAC meetings will provide an additional opportunity to provide feedback as councils finalize their recommendations. A meeting schedule and other information can be found at dnr.wi.gov, keyword "CDAC." In addition to attending council meetings, the public can submit comments directly to their county's CDAC chair or via email to DNRCDACWebMail@wisconsin.gov before the review period ends April 27.

Each council will consider online public input form responses and other public comments, along with assessments from Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources biologists, foresters and law enforcement staff as they develop final recommendations.

Following the April meetings, final antlerless quota recommendations will be presented to the department before they are sent to the Natural Resources Board for approval in May. Approved recommendations will be implemented during the 2015 deer hunting seasons.
