### Real estate taxpayers: your lottery credit is still available

The Forest County Treasurer's office is dedicating the week of May 11th to help all real property owners, who were eligible, receive the lottery credit on their 2014 tax bill. If the property owner did not receive the credit and meets the eligibility requirements, the Treasurer's Office will help you complete the paperwork and file forms with the Department of Revenue to receive the late lottery credit and ensure that the credit is applied to the 2015 bill.

To qualify for the lottery and gaming credit, an owner must be a Wisconsin resident, the owner of the dwelling, and use the dwelling as their primary residence as of the certification date of January 1, 2014. If temporarily absent, typically for a period no longer than six months (hospital, vacation, incarcerated, etc.) it is the home to which the owner returns. Principal dwelling means any dwelling used by the owner of the dwelling as his/her primary residence. The lottery and gaming credit cannot be claimed on business property, rental units, vacant land, garages, or other property that is not the primary residence of the owner. Sec. 79.10(1)(dm),(9)(bm), Wis., Stats.

To verify if you received the lottery credit, visit the Forest County website, <a href="www.co.forest.wi.gov">www.co.forest.wi.gov</a>, and click on Land Records Data. If you did not receive the credit and you qualify to receive it, contact the Treasurer's Office at 715-478-2412 and they will assist you in completing the necessary paperwork to receive the lottery credit for this year and future years. The lottery credit can only be obtained by having a signed application on file.

### Lake Metonga Association to chemically treat for milfoil

The Lake Metonga Association (the Association) proposes to chemically treat approximately 21.6 acres of Lake Metonga to control excessive growth of the exotic invasive aquatic plant, Eurasian Water Milfoil ("EWM").

Clean Lakes, Inc. will conduct an application of the aquatic herbicides DMA 4 IVM (liquid 2,4-D), and Aquathol K (liquid endothall) to infestations of EWM. It is anticipated that the treatment will occur sometime in spring, 2015 and will proceed only after the Association obtains a permit for the treatment from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.

The water use restrictions for aquatic herbicides are as follows: There are no swimming or fishing restrictions. Do not use water from treated areas for irrigation purposes for 21 days after treatment, or until an approved assay indicates the 2,4-D concentration is 100 ppb or less.

The Association will hold a public informational meeting on the proposed treatments if five or more individuals, organizations, special units of government, or local units of government request one in writing. The person or entity requesting the meeting shall state a specific agenda of topics including problems and alternatives to be discussed. Back in 1958, the students at the Goodman/Armstrong Creek High School planted red pines right behind the school. That red pine forest has been thinned through the years, and the time had come to give it another select cutting.

The timber was marked, Mark Huempfner, the owner of Wild Rivers Logging from Wausaukee was the logger performing the cut. Huempfner, however, wasn't making any money on this job. After deducting the stumpage paid to the school and some fuel and other expenses, the lion's share from the sale will be donated to Log-A-Load For Kids.

Log-A-Load For Kids is an organization that raises money for the Children's Miracle Network. This organization provides medical treatment through those hospitals in the network, and no kid is left out due to lack of funds. The money raised by the cut at Goodman will help needy families who have children with medical problems they cannot afford to pay for.

This event was also a great opportunity to teach school kids something about sustainable logging and other forest facts and activities.



The students who planted these trees could never imagine that they would be harvested some day without chain saws and horses. But technology marches on in the forest and all aspects of our lives.

Schools in attendance included Niagra, Florence, Laona, Wabeno, Crandon, and, of course, Goodman/Armstrong Creek.

Students were taught a variety of things about forests, the Children's Miracle Network, the work of the Ruffed Grouse Society, logging with modern equipment, how a sawmill works and a host of other subjects.

In addition, a tree was planted in remembrance of Vern Hollister, who had taught at G/A and covered events at the school for the Forest Republican.

It is interesting that the legacy left by former students planting trees, who were probably just glad to get out of the classroom, is paying dividends, and not only education for future generations, but in supplying revenue to the school district. It is another example of the benefits of forest lands.



### The Mystery of Edwin Drood musical brings special challenges, rewards for lead actor Tony Jones

Lead actors in plays have to memorize hundreds of lines. That's a feat in itself.

But when the play is a musical, the challenge is multiplied, said Tony Jones, a member of the Nicolet Players.

With a musical, you are actually doing three performances," Jones said. "You're singing, dancing, and acting all at the same time. It's a challenge to bring in those other elements, but when you nail it, it's just all that much more fun!'

In order to pull off the complexity of a musical, many cast members have taken it upon themselves to put in extra hours rehearsing on top of an already demanding schedule.

Preparation for a traditional play typically entails three hours of rehearsal just about every weeknight for about 10 weeks.

"For Drood, we have people showing up early and getting together on Sundays to run through their scenes," said Jones, who's performed in about half a dozen different Nicolet Players productions over the years. "We're all motivated to put on the very best performance that we possibly can."

So why does he and his castmates make such a significant commitment in time and effort?

"We just love doing it," Jones said matter-offactly. "We start on day one with a blank slate and all work together to make something magical. It's very rewarding to see everything come together, to watch the stage set develop over time, and then rehearse in these amazing costumes when they are ready. And when it comes time to hit the stage and perform in front of an audience and hear all the laughs, that's what really makes it all worth it."

He had special kudos for Nicolet Theatre Director Jim Nuttall.

"When you think about it, here he takes this group of strangers and in a relatively short period of time molds them into a highly entertaining acting troupe. He's always in 100 percent and just to be around his energy and enthusiasm makes it a lot of fun. It's a real treasure to have him."

For Jones, the last performance is always bittersweet. It's when all the laughs and good times become just a memory.

SeniorCare is a prescription drug assistance program for Wisconsin residents who are 65 years of age or older who meet the enrollment rules. The program is designed to help seniors with their prescription drug costs. Those interested may apply at any time. However, your application will not be accepted if you apply earlier than the calendar month before your 65th birthday.

To enroll in SeniorCare:

- You must be a Wisconsin resident.
- You must be a U.S. citizen or qualifying immigrant.
- You must be 65 years of age or older.
- You must pay a \$30 annual enrollment fee per person.
- Your assets, such as bank accounts, insurance policies, home property, etc. are not counted.
  - Your annual income determines the level of coverage.

In addition, members are subject to certain annual out-of-pocket expense requirements depending on their annual income. Drug coverage may vary by level. For more information about covered drugs, see the SeniorCare Covered Drugs fact sheet at dhs.wisconsin.gov/seniorcare/information.htm, call your pharmacy or the SeniorCare Customer Service Hotline at 1-800-657-2038.

Individuals with prescription drug coverage under other health plans are eligible to enroll in SeniorCare. If you already have a health insurance plan, SeniorCare will coordinate benefit coverage with your plan. Individuals enrolled in Medicaid will not be eligible for SeniorCare.


