

## Brush Run Races next weekend!



The Forest County Historical & Genealogical Society did a bit of work this spring. The main rooms of the museum were emptied of artifacts and displays. The original hardwood floor was refinished and repairs and paint were applied to the walls. The result is a fresh look that adds to the ambience of the museum.

The next step was to re-install the furniture, artifacts and photos in a pleasing way to the restored rooms. In the photos above, the refinished walls and floor is shown shortly after it was finished.

The center photo is a view from the kitchen of the dining and living room that has been made ready for visitors. The photo on the right is a new use for the room off of the living room. This room is now being used for new displays that will be changed periodically. Currently, a visitor can learn something about early farming and the moonshine trade that this area was known for.







Through the department's continued working relationship with the Department of Natural Resources, the department was able to expand and upgrade its fleet with the acquisition of two surplus brush trucks. Both trucks are identical and replace a single older brush truck which was based out of the department's Town of Nashville fire station. This acquisition gives the department a pair of identical trucks with one each in its Town of Nashville fire station and its Town of Ainsworth fire station, greatly increasing the ease of training and decreasing response time to certain incidents in the western portion of its jurisdiction. Through the generosity of department member's donated time and cooperation with Schroeder's Auto of Pearson, Pickerel Autobody, and Forest Communications, the acquisition and initial outfitting of both trucks was done under budget, with both trucks being placed into service prior to spring forest fire season.

All money used in the purchase of the equipment was from donations and money raised from the department's fundraisers and would not be possible without the support of the community. The Holt & Balcom Logging Camp Museum is located on Highway F, a mile and a half east of Lakewood. As a bonus, those attending the event were able to keep the bowls in which they were served.







The TEPP Workshop will run from 11:00 a.m. to 12:00 a.m. and will be followed by a hot lunch. Participants will be able to ask questions, view available equipment, and apply for the program. There is no charge for residents who qualify for the program. The community building is located at 601 West Washington Street in Crandon.

#### Wabeno School District Completes Saving Challenge!

Thirty-five students participated in the Wabeno Savings Challenge this past year. It was part of a grant that Wabeno Area School District received to support students in financial literacy.

Through the grant cycle, Wabeno School District focused on two primary goals related to Personal Financial Literacy. Increasing overall awareness of personal financial literacy of 7th and 8th grade students was the first goal. To achieve this, a curriculum was implemented which was aligned to the Wisconsin Model Academic Standards for Personal Financial Literacy.

During the 2014-2015 school year, all 7th and 8th grade students attended a 9 week Financial Literacy survey class at Wabeno School District. Students learned about compounding interest, the purpose of financial services, setting short and long term financial goals, and choosing careers to meet their lifestyles, among others. The second goal involved the simple concept of saving money. This concept was covered extensively in the survey class, but students were also given the opportunity to apply what they are learning to their own lives.

In order to achieve this, Wabeno School District partnered with Laona State Bank and the Forest County Potawatomi to create the Wabeno School District Savings Challenge. From November through April, students deposited money into their bank accounts. Altogether, the 35 students deposited over \$11,500! The students with the largest deposits each month received prizes for showing their commitment to saving. April was Financial Awareness Month, so as a culminating activity, the student with the most deposited money from November through April received a grand prize of \$500. All participants were also part of a pizza party to celebrate their savings habits.

Wabeno School District would like to congratulate all of the students that participated and encourage them to keep saving. We appreciate the Laona State Bank and the Forest County Potawatomi for providing this opportunity to the 7th and 8th grade students!

### Helping people with intellectual disabilities at WI residential care facilities

MADISON - People with intellectual disabilities often have difficulty telling caregivers they're not feeling well. This poses a problem in Wisconsin's residential care facilities, where employees have not been trained to recognize residents' health problems as they grow older.

The state of Wisconsin now requires that residential care workers complete 15 hours of training annually, and the University of Wisconsin-Madison has developed a new online course to meet this need. The goal is to improve the quality of life for some of the state's most vulnerable citizens and their caregivers.

Supporting Older People with Intellectual Disabilities: A Course for Promoting Health was developed by UW-Madison experts in geriatrics: Barbara J. Bowers of the School of Nursing; Suzanna Waters Castillo of the Division of Continuing Studies; and Kim Nolet of the Center for Aging Research and Education. Participants will learn to recognize the normal changes that occur as people age, to partner with health-care providers, and to involve family members in health-care decisions.

"The course will help ensure that intellectually disabled people don't suffer from undiagnosed problems that can be treated successfully," says Bowers. "If staff identify these problems early, it could delay relocation to nursing homes and prevent hospitalizations and unnecessary suffering. As a result, it will provide a significant financial benefit to families and to the state of Wisconsin."

Supporting Older People with Intellectual Disabilities is a collaboration among the Division of Continuing Studies, the School of Nursing, and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services. Its self-paced instructional approach is accessible to all residential care workers, including those who speak English as a second language. The online delivery makes training possible for residential care facilities with small staffs and limited budgets.

"The course is an example of the Wisconsin Idea in action, making this coursework available throughout the state to staff who would have difficulty coming to UW-Madison," says Waters Castillo. "Owners of residential care facilities will benefit from employees who better understand health-related changes in elderly people with intellectual disabilities."

The partnership between the Wisconsin Department of Health Services and UW-Madison ensures that Supporting Older People with Intellectual Disabilities is based in state-of-the-art research.

"It's the latest example of how our UW-Madison nursing faculty translate their scientific and clinical expertise into knowledge for practice," says Katharyn May, dean of the School of Nursing. "They make it accessible and useful for those who practice in parts of our health-care system where the challenges are huge and resources are very, very thin."
