# Snowmobilers required to have a Trail Pass for 2015

Submitted by Paul Bunyan Riders

Beginning July 1, 2015, snowmobile registrations will cost \$30 and last for three years. New for the winter of 2015, all snowmobiles will be required to display a Wisconsin Trail Pass sticker to operaton public trails and corridors. The annual trail passes are separate from registrations and will need to purchased each year. The cost

of a Trail Pass is \$30 for snowmobilers who are not members of a snowmobile club and the Association of Wisconsin Snowmobile Clubs (AWSC) and may be purchased through the DNR online or at any DNR license sales agent. A \$10 discounted trail pass will be available to those who currently belong to both a Wisconsin snowmobile club and the AWSC. The discounted pass will be available for each of your Wisconsin registered snowmobiles through the AWSC. All trail pass stickers will be delivered by U.S. Mail.

Trail pass fees for non-residents will increase from \$35 per year to \$50 per year and may be purchased through the DNR. There is no discounted option for non-resident trail passes.

Revenue generated from the sale of snowmobile registrations and trail passes goes into the segregated snowmobile account, which is used to maintain and develop the more than 22,000 miles of trails that make up Wisconsin's snowmobile trail system. Wisconsin snowmobile trails are made possible by snowmobile club volunteers who provide the labor to brush, sign and groom the trails, and the landowners who allow the trails to cross their property.

# ATV/UTV Contd from pg. 1

Yamaha Rhino, Kawasaki Mule and Polaris Ranger. A vehicle must meet all the legal UTV specifications as originally manufactured before it can be legally considered a UTV and registered. Vehicle owners who do not know if their vehicle meets the UTV specifications should contact the DNR Call Center at 1-888-936-7463.

What are the legal specifications? "Utility terrain vehicle" means any of the following: A motor-driven device that does not meet federal motor vehicle, safety standards; that is not a golf cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy, minitruck, or tracked vehicle; that is designed to be used primarily off of a highway; that has, and was originally manufactured with, all of the following:

- net weight less than 2,000 lbs
- four or more low pressure tires
- cargo box
- steering wheel
- tail light
- brake light
- two headlights
- max width of 65 inch
- non-straddled seats for at least 2 people
- seat belts for each occupant
- roll bar or similar structural system or device

The following devices do not meet the UTV or ATV definition and cannot be registered: "Golf cart" means a vehicle in which the speed attainable in one mile does not exceed 20 mph on a paved, level surface, and that is designed and intended to convey one or more persons and equipment to play the game of golf in an area designated as a golf course. "Low-speed vehicle" means a motor vehicle that conforms to the definition and requirements for low-speed vehicles as adopted in the federal motor vehicle safety standards for low-speed vehicles under 49 CFR 571.3 (b) and 571.500.

"Low-speed vehicle" does not include a golf cart. "Minitruck" means a motor truck, as defined in s. 340.01(34), having a top speed of not more than 60 mph, and that is all of the following:

- Powered by an internal combustion engine with a piston or rotor displacement of not less than 660 cubic centimeters.
- Not more than 60-inches wide.
- Not more than 1,600 lbs in dry, unloaded weight.
- Manufactured with a locking enclosed cab and a heated interior.

The other vehicles qualifying as UTVs are certain other non-standard vehicles have been allowed to meet

the UTV category. This includes vehicles that would otherwise meet the ATV definition, except that they exceed the 900 pound maximum. An example of this type of vehicle is the Polaris Big Boss 6 wheeler. This type of vehicle is defined as:

- Over 900 lbs.
- 50 inches or less width.
- Straddled seat.
- Three or more low pressure tires.

All UTVs and ATVs operating on a public ATV trail or corridor must permanently affix and display a valid Trail Pass forward of the operator in a highly visible location. UTVs and ATVs registered by Wisconsin DNR for public, municipal or commercial use and displaying decals and license plates are not required to have or display a trail pass

ATV Safety Education Certification is required for all UTV and ATV operators (residents and non-residents) who are at least 16 years of age and born on or after January 1, 1988. Safety certifications issued from another state or province of Canada will be honored. Operators must carry their certificates while operating.

It is illegal for a passenger to ride in or on any part of a UTV that is not originally designed or intended by the manufacturer to be used by passengers. It is not legal to operate with passengers in any aftermarket seating placed in the cargo area of a UTV. These laws apply statewide, the same as ATVs.

Firearms may not be transported in or on an ATV or UTV unless the firearm is unloaded, except that handguns may be loaded. Must be at least 18 years of age to possess a handgun. If the ATV or UTV is stationary, a loaded firearm may be placed against or on top of the exterior parts of the vehicle, but not inside any part of the vehicle. It is not legal to shoot from an ATV or UTV unless authorized under a Disable Hunting Permit. Bows may not have an arrow nocked. Crossbows must be unloaded and may not be cocked unless fully enclosed in a carrying case.

Nighttime operation adjacent to roadways on approved trails and routes, ATVs and UTVs must operate in the same direction as motor vehicle traffic in the nearest lane unless the trail or route is located at least 40 feet from the roadway or separated by a headlight barrier. During daylight hours, operation may be in either direction. If you are legally operating on a roadway, you must go the same direction of traffic in that lane at all times.

ATV/UTV operators may not have any alcohol in their system if they are under age 21. Operators age 21 or older may not be intoxicated. They are encouraged to practice "Zero Alcohol" and not consume alcoholic beverages until they are done operating all motorized vehicles for the day.

Remember to always buckle your seat belt and be safe!

To Whom it may Concern,

I am writing this letter with great sadness as on July 9, 2015 at around 4:30, I lost my very best friend and companion. I was walking from my driveway out to get my mail with my dog, Harper, when a pitbull ran out of its owners house and made a straight beeline for my dog. Harper did not stand a chance to this dog. She was only about 6 pounds versus a 80 pound pitbull.

That day was one of the saddest days of my life that I have encountered thus far and I never want to go through that again nor would I want anyone to endure such heartache and pain. Anyone who knows me or had seen me out and about in the past five years, had seen my beautiful yorkie named Harper.

When someone tells you they love their animal and knows this kind of friendship, you can't truly imagine the love that you have for that pet. A pets love is truly unconditional and they love you with all that they have. Harper knew when I was sad, sick, crabby or happy. She was my best friend, my shadow and well, my family. To have a pet pass away is an awful thing, but to have its life taken so fast by a vicious animal without being able to defend itself is another story altogether.

Are you aware of the laws of a pitbull? Are you aware of the laws if a dog intentionally kills your dog? Are you aware that this animal attacked and killed my dog, but because it bit me, there was a bite order imposed on the owner to have his dog quarantined, but NOT because it killed my dog?

Who protects our animals from other animals or their careless owners? In May of this year, this same dog attacked my other dog, Phoebe, and made bite marks on its neck and had it not been broken up, this dog too would not have survived. The owner, at this time, was warned not to let this dog loose and not to be seen nor our yard. Did the owner take this seriously you ask? No! The dog continued to badger Phoebe until she no longer wants to go outside on her own. The owner felt that his pitbull just wanted to play and sees the little dog's actions and just gets too rough and carried away. Correct, so carried away that it maliciously killed my dog and I used all my power to try to get this dog to leave Harper alone!

So you might be asking yourself why I am writing this letter. It's because I want others to be aware of these dogs. They are bred to fight and kill. It is in their bloodlines and continues on and on and on. These dogs need to be on a leash or inside a fence. Perhaps the owner needs to be fined every time this animal is not following regulations for these animals. How many times does this need to happen before we start to go after the owner and his negligence?

Please read the following Wisconsin Statute. Please note that I was informed by the attending officer that my dog, Harper, was considered property. In this situation, the dog is quarantined for 10 days and the owner states he will then put the dog down. What happens to the negligent neighbor?

Wisconsin Statutes section 174.02(1) provides that "the owner of a dog is liable for the full amount of damages caused by the dog injuring or causing injury to a person, domestic animal or property," and the statute allows for double damages if the owner of the dog "was notified or knew that the dog previously injured or caused injury to a person, domestic animal or property."

# Crandon History featured in new University of Wisconsin Press book

Last Wednesday evening at the Crandon Public Library a handful of residents were able to hear the voices and sounds of some of our early residents thanks to the efforts of Jim Leary, a co-founder of the Center for the Study of Upper Midwestern Cultures at the University of Wisconsin–Madison. Jim Leary and his colleagues have made accessible hundreds of original sound recordings found within the Archive of Folk Culture in the Library of Congress including materials collected at lumber camps and shanty's right here in Forest County.

The materials were originally collected by Sidney Robertson, an independent song catcher, who traveled the upper Midwest in the 30's and 40's frequenting "lumber camps, dance halls and chain gangs." During one of her travels she found herself in the Forest County welfare office in the company of Warde Ford, a caretaker at Crandon's funeral home. Through her relationship with Warde, Sidney Robertson was able to meet, interview and record a handful of Crandon residents including Robert Walker, Elizabeth Walker Ford, Jerome Ford, Charles Spencer, and Harry Fannin.

Sidney Robertson's field notes, currently located within the Library of Congress, revealed a song composed by Ed King of Crandon, and sung by Warde Ford, simply titledCrandon. A snippet of this song is printed with permission below:

There's a town in old Wisconsin and it isn't much for fame, But the boys and girls there love her, and Crandon is her name. All the people of our village are always sociable and gay, And they find that that's the only way, there is no other way.

Because that's the way we have of doing things in Crandon, We don't get our styles from Paris or from London. But we're jolly just the same and you bet we know the game, 'Cause that's the way we have of doing things in Crandon.

Now can you blame the girls of Crandon for staying out late on Sunday night With a bunch of happy fellers who can entertain them right?

Down by the shores of Lake Metonga we go to take a walk,

And we don't care if we don't get back 'til three or four o'clock.

The book and CD collection that contain this title and others is Folksongs of Another America: Field Recording from the Upper Midwest, 1937 – 1946 and is available for checkout at the Crandon Public Library.





### Public comment sought for guidance related to motorized road access on department-owned lands

MADISON - The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources owns and maintains thousands of miles of roads, and as a result of Wisconsin State Statute 23.116, will be required to inventory and map all roads located on department property.

Each map will designate which roads are open to the public for the use of motorized vehicles and will determine when each road is open or closed for such use. To provide for public recreational access and management activities conducted by department staff and in response to continued public interest and feedback, the department will create a comprehensive road inventory system for department roads.

The department is currently seeking feedback regarding general considerations that will be used to evaluate motorized road access - to provide feedback, visit the department website, dnr.wi.gov, and search keywords "proposed DNR program guidance."

When program guidance has been approved, additional public input opportunities will gather feedback for each property where motorized access is evaluated. The public will play an important role in evaluating which roads are open for motorized use.

In addition to feedback received from the public, a number of considerations will be used to evaluate properties, including visitor requests for access, operational feasibility, natural resource impacts based on anticipated level of use, and economic benefits.

Upon completion, the department's Public Access Lands atlas will provide standardized property maps with the following information:

- --roads open for public motorized use;
- --seasonality of open roads;
- --planned development level of open roads; and
- --types of motorized vehicles allowed on open roads.

Those interested in receiving email updates regarding the motorized access planning project can sign up to receive email messages regarding property info and other information. Visit dnr.wi.gov, select the email icon near the bottom of the page for "subscribe for updates for DNR topics," then follow the prompts and select "motorized road access planning," found within the property master planning list.




