#### Good Neighbor Authority will provide timber sales on the Chequamegon/Nicolet

A discussion was held at the Forest County Courthouse last Tuesday afternoon by the Federal Sustainable Forestry Committee. One of the topics of discussion was the Good Neighbor Authority (GNA), which gives the DNR authority and recompense for implementation of timber sales on national forest lands.

Under GNA, the state can contract this work to county forestry departments in those counties that have county forests. The work is paid for upon completion of the actual forestry work. This is a program that is new to the Forest Service, and Wisconsin is the first state that will implement the procedure.

In recent times, the Forest Service has been more responsive to the needs of those counties that have a large amount of their land base in national forest. For decades, the Forest Service has reduced the amount of timber that reaches market. Local loggers have spent time traveling to available timber farther from home. In addition, local sawmills have had to haul logs and box bolts from further afield, adding trucking expense. In addition, the the 25% fund will be part of the timber sales.

The 25% fund was set up to compensate those areas where national forest had ownership of the land base, eliminating things like property taxes that support local government. Currently, the 25% fund will be paid to school districts. With more timber sales, local school districts will receive periodic checks from the federal government that will help keep local schools operating.

Of course, having a nearby supply of sawtimber will make local sawmillers smile, and in addition, keep jobs in the county.

While our county forestry crew has a full slate with both county forest sales and recreational duties, contract foresters can be put temporarily on staff, which also adds to the job base. Counties will receive recompense for other duties that are performed by existing staff, which can add to the revenue of county forestry departments.

There have been local people and others in the timber industry that have worked for decades to get more timber to the market place. They have often been thwarted by the environmental community that think that the best use of a tree is to grow mature, fall down and rot. Through lawsuits, many timber sales that were ready to be bid were put on the back burner because of the decision made by a federal judge who may or may not have any idea of sound forestry, local economies, or even the original reason for having national forests, which was to provide lumber and fiber to the nation.

Things have changed. The last lawsuits were won by the Forest Service.

Unfortunately, the Forest Service has had budget problems. Fires in the western states have drained budgets and manpower from local Forest Service districts. With this new way to get the work done in setting up a timber sale, local governments gain, local businesses gain, and the nation gains as well.

It will take cooperation by county government to get this ball rolling, as well as advancing funds, that will be reimbursed, to hire the personnel to get the job done.



#### Diet for Heart Health

For maximum heart health, you need to eat a wellbalanced diet. But what does that really mean? "Try a diet low in saturated fat and high in fiber," recommends Lisa R. Young, PhD, RD, adjunct professor in the department of nutrition, food studies, and public health at New York University. Here's how to put such a diet in place.

Diet for Heart Health: Get Plenty of Fiber

Fiber can help lower cholesterol levels and reduce the risk of diabetes (a risk factor for heart disease) and certain types of cancer. "We recommend about 25

grams of fiber a day, for men a bit more. It's based on your weight," Young says. "Most Americans eat much, much less than that. If you follow a good diet, you'll get enough, but so many of us don't."

The best way to include fiber in your diet is to eat a variety of whole grains and a mixture of fruits and veggies that have both soluble and insoluble fiber. Soluble fiber helps clear out cholesterol from your bloodstream. Good sources of soluble fiber include oatmeal, barley, dried beans, and peas; insoluble fiber is found in vegetables like beets and brussels sprouts, as well as whole-grain bread.

Diet for Heart Health: The Role of Carbohydrates

Carbohydrates should be 50 to 60 percent of your diet. In addition to fresh fruits and vegetables, get your carbohydrates from legumes, whole-grain breads and pastas, and brown rice. Carbohydrates from these sources are considered good because they offer you nutrients, vitamins, and fiber, in addition to the calories.

However, Young explains that carbohydrates are often vehicles for saturated fats like butter, sour cream, cream cheese, and dips and spreads. That's not good news because saturated fats increases your LDL, or "bad" cholesterol. So you want to watch what you put on your carbs, and how much of them you eat.

• Eat the right carbs and the right fats. While too much LDL cholesterol is bad news, replacing all the fat in your diet with carbohydrates is not the answer either.

"A diet too high in cars and too low in fats will decrease the HDL cholesterol," says Young. The HDL cholesterol, found in certain good (non-saturated) fats, is actually good for your heart.

 Understand the role of triglycerides. Fruits and vegetables contain carbohydrates and are jam-packed with nutrients that your body needs. Other simple carbohydrates, like breads, cakes and cookies made from white, refined flour, have less nutritional value. After we eat, our bodies turn carbohydrates, fats, and protein into triglycerides, the chemical that our cells use to give us energy. We need some triglycerides to fuel us throughout the day. But too much of this chemical has been found to increase the risk of heart disease. "It depends on the type of carb," Young says. "White bread, for instance, elevates the triglycerides."

Diet for Heart Health: Vitamins for the Heart

While many people swear by vitamins and supplements, there's not much evidence to support the idea that any particular vitamin is good for the heart. "There was a lot of talk about vitamin E, and it didn't really pan out," Young says, "and the folates, B-6, B-12 -- these vitamins didn't pan out either."

"As they say, there are no quick fixes and no miracles," Young adds. Most of us can get all the nutrients our hearts need from a well-balanced diet -- full of resh fruits, vegetables and whole grains.

Anything with at least three grams of fiber is a good source of the nutrient; most people should aim to get about 25 to 40 grams a day.
- Keeps You Slim One component of an apple's peel (which also has most of the fiber) is something called ursolic acid, which was linked to a lower risk of obesity in a recent study in mice. That's because it boosts calorie burn and increases muscle and brown fat, HuffPost UK reported.
- Prevent Breathing Problems Five or more apples a week (less than an apple a day!) has been linked with better lung function. Health magazine reported, most likely because of an antioxidant called quercetin found in the skin of apples (as well as in onions and tomatoes), the BBC reported. And the breath benefits of apples extend even further: A 2007 study found that women who eat plenty of the fruit are less likely to have children with asthma.
- Fight Colds While they don't quite rival oranges, apples are considered a good source of immune system-boosting vitamin C, with over 8 milligrams per medium-sized fruit, which amounts to roughly 14 percent of your daily recommended intake.
- May Fight Cancer In 2004, French research found that a chemical in apples helped prevent colon cancer, WebMD reported. And in 2007, a study from Cornell found additional compounds, called triterpenoids, which seem to fight against liver, colon and breast cancers.
- Decrease Diabetes Risk A 2012 study published in the American Journal of Clinical Nutrition found that apples, as well as pears and blueberries, were linked with a lower risk of developing type 2 diabetes because of a class of antioxidants, anthocyanins, that are also responsible for red, purple and blue colors in fruits and veggies.
- Boost Brain Power This fruit has been linked to an uptick in acetylcholine production, Good Housekeeping reported, which communicates between nerve cells, so apples may help your memory and lower your chances of developing Alzheimer's.

A diet rich in antioxidants may have similar effects, so apples, since they are particularly rich in quercetin, are a good bet, according to 2004 research.

The controversy over the Happy Tails Shop was discussed next. Dr. Boyd donated the building to the shelter. Elite Auto offered to purchase the building, give the building the upgrades it needs and give the shelter a 10 year, rent free, lease. They would then negotiate a new lease after 10 years. The board felt that this would only be a temporary fix and that they will seek other options for making money.

Animal health guidelines, as it relates to heartworm, lyme, feline leukemia, and spay and neuter guidelines, was discussed. All animals will be checked for these diseases and will be spayed and neutered. No animal will be adopted if they suffer from any of these illnesses as they are deadly and the shelter does not want the new pet to die shortly after adoption.

The euthanasia guidelines were stated. Any animal that is incurable or is a threat to itself and is not treatable, will be put down after at least 4 board members have voted in favor. This topic will not be taken lightly and will not be a solution to over crowding in the shelter. It will be used as a means for an animal that is suffering and cannot be cured.

Cats, feral and non, were the final topic. The shelter needs a solution and is willing to listen to all ideas. The City of Crandon has a lot of cats and something needs to be done. An idea for feral cats was to send them to farms as barn cats. If anybody has any solutions to help the cats, please let the Humane Society know.


