New panfish regulations may change your fish fries

From the DNR website

Between 2011 and 2014, fisheries biologists with the Department of Natural Resources solicited public input on all aspects of panfish management. They found that although anglers are not interested in sweeping changes to statewide panfish regulations, they are interested in addressing specific lakes with overharvest issues. With this in mind, the Department developed a regulation package to increase panfish size on 94 selected lakes where harvest appears to be a problem. The regulation package was supported at the 2015 spring hearings and will go into effect in 2016.

A thorough evaluation will be conducted in 2021 and the findings shared with the public to decide what to do next.

What we know

1) The size of panfish has decreased over time, particularly on certain lakes.

2) Many lakes in WI have great panfishing, yet many are full of small fish. **Continued on page 17**



collection of 20 stories written by student veterans, most of them from northern and central Wisconsin.

"For many veterans, they're much more comfortable writing about their experiences than they are talking about them," Chrisinger explained. "What I've tried to do is give veterans a platform to do this, to express themselves and to let civilians know what their military experience was like.

The Dining with Veterans event April 27 will start with dinner prepared by Nicolet Culinary Arts students at 6 p.m. followed by a presentation at 7 p.m. in Northwoods Center

Students from both the Nicolet and UW-Stevens Point veterans clubs will be on hand. Following an introduction by Chrisinger, students who contributed stories to See Me For Who I Am will read selections from the book. A question and answer session and discussion will follow.

Chrisinger, a UW-Stevens Point graduate, also teaches graduate students at the Bloomberg School of Public Health at Johns Hopkins University and serves as a senior communications specialist at the U.S. Government Accountability Office.

He also started the popular website Stronger at Broken Places for student veterans to write about and share their military experiences.

The Dining with Veterans event is free and open to the public.

To register by April 25, visit nicoletcollege.edu and click on the Dining with Veterans story to access the online registration link.

Nicolet's Dining with Veterans continues a long history of welcoming veterans to campus. This goes back to the college's earliest days when it served veterans in multiple

ways returning from the Viet Nam War.

"Wisconsin's John Muir" explores Muir's youth in Wisconsin, his advocacy for national parks and his views on environmental issues such as logging, hunting and climate change. The curated exhibit shares facsimiles of images and manuscripts from the Society's library and archives alongside Muir quotes and interpretive texts. It will be on display at the Crandon Public Library from the evening of Tuesday, April 26th until Monday, May 9th.

The public is invited to join us on Tuesday, March 29 at 7:00 p.m.in the library's meeting room for an illustrated lecture about the exhibit's subject John Muir, one of the nation's most important environmental activists and writers. Michael Edmonds, Director of Programs and Outreach, of the Wisconsin Historical Society, will offer the discussion focusing on Muir's youth in Wisconsin, his conservation work, and the influence he had on later Wisconsin environmentalists such as Aldo Leopold, Sigurd Olson, and Gaylord Nelson.

Muir (1838-1914) led the movement for national parks in the late 19th century, co-founded the Sierra Club, and inspired three generations of Americans to value and preserve wild places.

In addition to the state-wide traveling exhibit, the Crandon Public Library also received 20 free copies of Muir's memoir The Story of My Boyhood and Youth. along with an anthology of primary sources to help put the memoir in context titled Wisconsin's Environmental Tradition: A Reader. Illegal Tobacco Sales Enforced by Wisconsin Wins Program

Wisconsin Wins is a science-based tobacco control program sponsored by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services. This program strives to prevent youth access to tobacco through compliance checks, local outreach and free training for tobacco retailers. Through this program and Wisconsin State Statute 134.66, both owners and clerks who sell tobacco to minors are subject to fines up to \$1,000 and even the loss of their tobacco license.

Retailers also have to refuse the sale of "other tobacco products" such as chewing tobacco, snus, cigars, little cigars, cigarillos, electronic cigarettes and hookah products to minors. These products come in a variety of flavors such as cherry, chocolate, cotton candy and gummy bear. Unfortunately, the use of these products is increasing among youth, and that is why it is crucial clerks are trained on them as well.

If any tobacco retailer is in need of training on the laws that govern Wisconsin tobacco sales and the consequences of selling tobacco to minors NWTFC recommends using this FREE training tool: www.SmokeCheck.org. When employees are finished, they'll be able to print the necessary, state-approved training certificate. Wisconsin State Patrol Law of the Month: April 2016

If you ride a motorcycle, you need a motorcycle endorsement on your driver license

As motorcyclists get their bikes and protective gear ready for the road, they also need to make sure they are ready to ride legally.

"Having a regular Class D license allows you to drive a car or light truck. However, you need a motorcycle endorsement on your Class D license to legally operate a motorcycle in Wisconsin," says Wisconsin State Patrol Captain Steve G. Krueger of the North Central Region-Wausau post.

A violation for operating a motorcycle without the proper endorsement costs \$200.50 along with three demerit points on a driver license.

To obtain a motorcycle endorsement on your driver license, you must demonstrate competency in operating a motorcycle. This can be done in two ways:

• Passing a Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) administered motorcycle driving skills test. For the WisDOT driving skills test, the applicant must provide a motorcycle in good working order and wear eye protection and an approved helmet. Skills tests are conducted by appointment at DMV service centers



- · Apps and wearable devices can help you monitor your physical activity.

Step 2: Warm Up and Stretch

- As you begin walking, do a 5-minute warm-up walk using your largest muscles repeatedly (such as arm swings and back rotations) prior to brisk walking.
- Stretch right after your walk while your muscles are still warm. Never stretch a cold muscle.
- · Keep shoulders back, head up and chest lifted. ouch forward
- · Allow your arms to swing naturally. Don't clench your fists.

Step 3: Start Slowly

· If you're not used to exercising, don't expect too much right away. Start by walking at a moderate pace for just 10 minutes. Goal: Walk most days of the week, even if it's just for a few minutes.

· As you get used to walking, increase speed, distance and time, or carry hand weights. Try walking uphill or take a challenging nature hike.

Step 4: Stay Safe

- · Carry your smartphone for emergencies only (phone use while walking can distract you from potential hazards, such as traffic).
- · Know where you're going and stay aware of your surroundings. Walk with others. If walking at night, stay in well-lit, well-populated areas. Let family members know your route.

3) Studies in MN and WI show that reduced bag limits can increase the average size of bluegills, particularly in lakes with fast growth.

What we propose

A total of 94 lakes across the state were identified by biologists and anglers as underperforming - that is the mean length of bluegill and crappie is less than desirable but growth potential is good.

The goal is to determine the best regulation that will increase the average size of bluegill and crappie on the selected lakes. Ultimately, a single regulation will be chosen and used to address similar lakes not meeting panfish management goals.

Proposed regulations

An effective regulation has to be restrictive enough to affect harvest but still be socially acceptable.

Finding a regulation that strikes the balance between effectiveness and angler acceptance can be very challenging.

The following three options explore that tradeoff and will be applied to 94 lakes:

A total of 25 panfish but no more than 10 of any one species (25/10).

A total of 15 panfish but no more than 5 of any one species during May and June (15/5 seasonal) - 25 panfish in total the rest of the year.

A total of 15 panfish but no more than 5 of any one species (15/5). Between 2011 and 2014, fisheries biologists with

the Department of Natural Resources solicited public input on all aspects of panfish management. They found that although anglers are not interested in sweeping changes to statewide panfish regulations, they are interested in addressing specific lakes with overharvest issues. With this in mind, the Department developed a regulation package to increase panfish size on 94 selected lakes where harvest appears to be a problem. The regulation package was supported at the 2015 spring hearings and will go into effect in 2016. A thorough evaluation will be conducted in 2021 and the findings shared with the public to decide what to do next.


