



Natural Resources Board approves 2016 deer harvest quotas and season structure

MADISON - The Wisconsin Natural Resources Board approved deer hunting season framework and antlerless deer quotas for 2016 at its May 25 meeting in Madison.

Final season framework reflects recommendations from County Deer Advisory Councils - 2016 marks the second year these councils have played a key role in Wisconsin's deer management efforts. In addition to direct feedback from councils, 5,574 questionnaires were received during a public input process.

Ten deer management units will not have an antlerless quota (each within the Northern and Central Forest zones), while the rest of Wisconsin will have a quota of 256,775 antlerless deer (compared to 224,735 in 2015). A decrease in buck-only counties compared to the last two years (19 in 2014 and 12 in 2015) is a good indication that councils are seeing herds rebound in Northern Forest Zone counties.

The issuance of bonus deer hunting permits, in addition to farmland zone permits included with each deer hunting license, will include 22,775 permits valid on public access lands (compared to 18,450 in 2015) and 136,875 permits valid on private lands (compared to 125,375 in 2015). As a reminder, bonus antlerless permit sales for the Forest zones begin Monday, Aug.15 at 10 a.m. Central Farmland Zone permits will go on sale Aug. 16, and Southern Farmland Zone bonus permits will be made available Aug. 17.


A Holiday Hunt will be held in 13 counties and provide for an additional antlerless-only opportunity for firearm hunters from Dec. 24 to Jan.1. In addition, junior license holders in Ashland, Sawyer and Forest counties will not be allowed to harvest antlerless deer - these councils exercised their right to submit this recommendation in an effort to encourage increased herd growth.

The department's deer hunting webpage will be updated within the coming weeks with a number of helpful resources regarding hunting 2016 quotas and season framework. For more information, including an updated carcass tagging FAQ, search keyword "deer."

Let's build on this strength by utilizing the physical environment to become healthier!

Our trails challenge starts now and continues through the summer months. We are asking you to visit 5 of our local walking/biking trails and mark the dates on a tracking log. Strong Bones program for middle-aged & older offered in June at Crandon Library

The Crandon Public Library, Forest County Health Department, and UW-Extension of Forest County will be offering the Strong Bones Program, an exercise program for middle-aged and older adults. Classes are held twice weekly (Mondays and Wednesdays) and each class includes progressive weight training, flexibility, balance activities. All instructors have been trained in the Strong Bones program and have had personal successes participating and leading strength training.

The Strong Bones Program was developed by Miriam Nelson, Ph.D., an associate professor at the Gerald J. and Dorothy R. Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy at Tufts University. The Strong Bones Program is based upon years of research on how strength training and proper nutrition improve the health of all ages. "Strength is a critical factor in living healthier, more active lives. Our research shows that a program of strength training not only improves bone density but reduces falls, improves arthritis symptoms, and increases flexibility and strength," states Dr. Nelson. The program is appropriate for both sedentary and active adults.




For Old Time's Sake

Of course, the name was later changed to North Crandon, and in 1921, it was changed to Argonne, but it was not Argonne when the picture was snapped!

The VanZile Hotel sat where the old bank is now, and there are numerous businesses on the street that runs parallel to the railroad tracks where the ball diamond and town park is today. The Hill family owned the hotel in later years, but it burned down one day when Mrs. Hill was making pies in the wood-fired kitchen stove. This is according to the late Russell Samz.

The year was probably some time not too long after 1887, as the Soo Line came through in that year, and started calling VanZile North Crandon.

This photo was sent to us by this lady's granddaughter, Christine Chartraw. Those growing up in Argonne back in the 50's and early 60's knew her as Grandma Holler.

Grandma Holler ran the New Argonne Inn, just across the side street to the east from the round-roofed garage. There were a number of hotels in the railroad town of Argonne in those days. People riding the Soo Line who had to spend the night in Argonne used the hotels, as did the loggers who came in from the camps on the weekend.

In her old age, she lived in a small house next to the Catholic Church. She was bent way over from the waist, but still moved around her garden and flower beds and never hesitated to straighten out kids who weren't behaving


Students from Goodman-Armstrong Creek High School enjoyed another successful year competing in forensics, a speech event hosted by the Wisconsin High






Senator Johnson on VA Secretary McDonald comparing wait lists for Vets to lines at Disney World

Chairman Johnson votes to reject Fiduciary Rule

WASHINGTON — On Tuesday Sen. Ron Johnson (R-Wis.), chairman of the Senate Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs Committee, voted to reject the Labor Department's fiduciary rule. Chairman Johnson released a report in February detailing the Labor Department's flawed process in handing down the rule that hurts investors saving for retirement.

Johnson had this to say after his vote, which was in favor of H.J. Res. 88, a resolution of disapproval of the

This rule will likely increase compliance costs for advisers, driving up the price of their services and decreasing access to advice for low- and middleincome investors. Specific Considerations

Phytochemicals

- · Phytochemicals ('phyto' means plant) are naturally occurring plant chemicals
- · Phytochemicals are not yet classified as nutrients. Nutrients are substances necessary for sustaining life. Phytochemicals have been identified as containing properties that aid in disease prevention
- In the human body, some phytochemicals act as antioxidants, some protect and regenerate essential nutrients, while others work to deactivate cancer-causing substances
- · Thousands of phytochemicals have been identified in the plant foods we eat
- One serving of fruit or vegetables may contain different phytochemicals. Some are available when the vegetable is raw, and other when the vegetable is cooked. It is important to eat a mix of raw and cooked vegetables to gain the most benefit from phytochemicals.
- · Cooking method matters; steaming helps retain water soluble vitamins like B vitamins and vitamin C rather than boiling
- · High cooking temperature and long cooking times also destroy heat sensitive nutrients such as B vitamins, vitamin C, and folate, so keep cooking times

Antioxidants

The most well known phytochemicals are the antioxidants.
