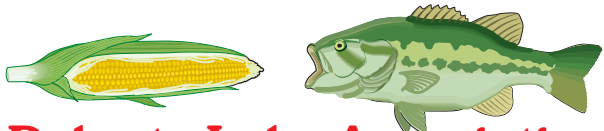

Bryan Van Stippen Candidate for 12 Senate District

My name is Bryan Van Stippen and I am running to be your next State Senator. I am challenging current Senator Tom Tiffany this November.

Bio: I was raised on a dairy farm in Darboy, Wisconsin. Upon graduating from high school, I attended Mid-State Technical College in 1999 before pursuing my Bachelor's degree at Tarleton State University in Texas. Since then, I obtained my law degree from the University of North Dakota, graduating in 2008. In 2014, I graduated from the University of Arizona's, James E. Rogers College of Law with a Doctorate in Law.

Professionally, I currently serve as a Legislative Attorney for the Ho-Chunk Nation of Wisconsin, a position I have held since 2010. I also am a small business owner in Stevens Point and have been involved in several successful business ventures over the years. I have also worked for the United States Senate Committee on Indian Affairs.

My Campaign: I chose to run for this race because I feel that the people of Northern Wisconsin are not being heard or represented by our current elected officials in Madison. Too often we have seen the people of the 12th Senate District be sold out to the highest bidder. This needs to end. We need Senators and Representatives that listen to their constituents, not the voices of wealthy special interest donors outside of Wisconsin. I promise to be that voice for you if elected to this office.

I am focusing on three key issue area's for this election. I believe that we need to support local control and bring it back to our county and town boards. Without local control, so many of our waterways can now be over-developed, over-fished, and over-populated. Such loss of control will lead to a degradation of our natural resources and damage our economy, which relies on having clean lakes and rivers to attract tourists.

Secondly, our rural public schools have been neglected and what funds are being allocated to education in recent budgets are being sent to support private voucher schools which are predominant in the southern portion of the state. In order to keep their lights on and doors open, we have seen several school districts here in the 12th District propose referendums to raise property taxes. If our elected officials were willing to invest in our public institutions, such drastic measures would not need to be taken and that is something that I will address if elected to the state legislature.

Lastly, our infrastructure, including roads and broadband services, have been neglected for too long. According to recent studies, we have the third worst roads in America. Our industries, especially the logging industry here in the 12th District need maintained roads in order to

& REFERRAL PROCEDURES**

Any person aware of a child between the ages of birth and 21 who may be experiencing physical, mental, emotional or learning problems may contact the Special Education teachers at the School District of Laona, 5216 Forest Avenue, Suite A, Laona, WI 54541, phone (715) 674-2143 to initiate screening services that will determine if a referral for special education is appropriate.

Referral Procedure

The school district shall solicit and receive referrals of students with suspected educational needs from all persons who have responsible cause to believe that such needs exist. Specific state criteria shall be adhered to in determining eligibility for specific handicapping conditions. Referrals of suspected children with disability shall be referred to either of the people listed above.

IEP - Team Evaluation

Whenever a child is referred who is suspected of having an exceptional educational need, the school district shall establish an IEP Team. An appointment of this team shall be the responsibility of the Program Support Teacher. The Program Support Teacher shall approve the evaluation process and may request additional information.

Procedural safeguards for evaluation including the following:

The notice of intent to evaluate shall be sent to the parents that will include:

A full explanation of the due process/procedural safeguards;

A description of the evaluation proposed, an explanation of why the evaluation is proposed, any options that were considered, and the reasons why those options were rejected;

A description of each evaluation procedure used as a basis for the evaluation;

The type of professionals conducting the evaluation;

A description of any other relevant factors. Written parental consent shall be obtained when a child is being evaluated for the first time within the district. This consent form shall include:

A statement documenting that the parent understands the content of the notice;

Information on the general areas to be evaluated;

Information on the general types of procedures to be used.

The McKinney-Vento Act defines children and youth who are homeless (twenty-one years of age and younger) as:

* Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are

- Sharing the housing of other persons due to lack of housing, economic hardship or a similar reason (sometimes referred to as a double-up);

- Living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations;

- Living in emergency or transitional shelters;

- Abandoned in hospitals;

- Awaiting foster care placement;

* Children and youth who have primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.

* Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public places, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings

* Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children who may qualify according to the above criteria, the School District of Laona provides the following assurances to parents and homeless children:

* There shall be immediate enrollment and school participation, even if educational and medical records and proof of residency are not available.

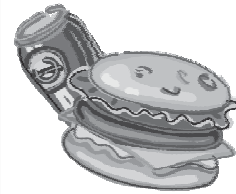
* Enrollment and transportation rights, including transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" is defined as the school the child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled.

* Meaningful opportunities for parents to participate in the education of their children. These shall include: special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.

Johnson statement on Obamacare premium jump

Senator Ron Johnson (R-Wis.) said this in response to proposed Obamacare premium increases for Wisconsin posted this week by federal officials:

"This week we learned that carriers in Wisconsin's individual market are requesting a 15 percent average premium increase for Obamacare-compliant plans for next year. Looking at the filings, we find that some could face premium increases as high as 59.96 percent. This isn't what the people of Wisconsin were promised.

"We already know from the Manhattan Institute that premiums have increased dramatically. In Wisconsin, the pre-Obamacare cost of the five most affordable health plans available in each county for a 64-year-old woman averaged \$354 a month in 2013. That average has since increased 85 percent, to \$655. Young people have fared worse. The pre-Obamacare average for 27-year-old man was \$92 a month for the lowest cost plans. That has since increased 148 percent, to \$228 this year.

"We'll hear from Obamacare's supporters that broken promises are somehow OK because taxpayer-funded subsidies are available to help cover these rising costs. But the reality is premiums aren't going down as promised—they're going up, increasing government dependence, and leaving consumers and taxpayers stuck with the tab."

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF CRANDON NOTICE OF SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This notice serves to inform parents and guardians of students with disabilities that the State of Wisconsin has established the Special Needs Scholarship Program. Under this scholarship program and as further specified in state law, a child with a disability who has been denied the opportunity to attend a nonresident school district under the full-time open enrollment program may be eligible to receive a scholarship from the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) that allows the child to attend an eligible private school that is participating in the Special Needs Scholarship Program.

This is a state-administered program. A parent or guardian who is interested in the Special Needs Scholarship Program should independently verify the participating private schools and the specific terms, eligibility criteria, and application procedures of the scholarship program with the DPI.

The Special Needs Scholarship Program is further defined under section 115.7915 of the state statutes. However, special eligibility requirements not found in that statute exist for program scholarships that are awarded for private school attendance that initially begins in the 2016-2017 school year. SCHOOL DISTRICT OF CRANDON ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Crandon is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. 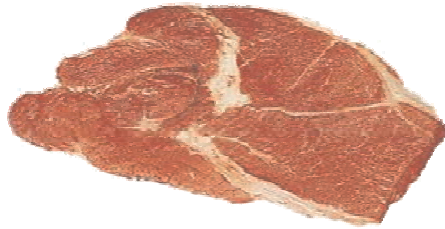

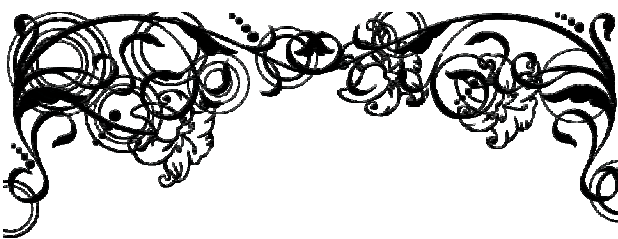

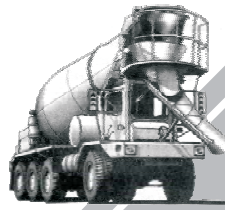

4 Ways to Raise Good Cholesterol

Healthy high-density lipoprotein (HDL) cholesterol can help strengthen your heart. The good news? You may be able to raise it with practical lifestyle habits.

- Exercise more. Cardio exercise is best for boosting HDL. Aim for five 30-minute sessions of moderate-intensity activity per week, such as brisk walking. Or do three 25-minute segments of vigorous - intensity activity, such as aerobics. Any activity that raises your heart rate is beneficial.

- Lose excess weight. Losing 5% to 10% of your current weight can raise HDL and improve your blood pressure and blood sugar levels.

- If you smoke, quit. This will raise your HDL levels and help your heart significantly. Your health care provider can help you decide if cessation aids are best for you.

- Avoid trans fats. These artificial fats lower HDL and are in processed foods and fried fast foods. Unsaturated fats in vegetable oils as well as foods containing omega-3 fatty acids (such as salmon) are heart friendly.

If you don't know your HDL level, ask your provider for a baseline cholesterol test.

A poor HDL level for men is below 40 mg/dL, a better HDL level is 40-49 mg/dL and the best for men is 60 mg/dL and above. For women, a poor HDL level is below 50 mg/dL, a better level is 50-59 mg/dL and the best is 60 mg/dL and above.
