Crandon International Labor Day weekend schedule for 47th Off-Road World Championships®

-- Expanded Format Offers Two Days of TORC PRO/Sportsman Racing --

- -- Sunday To Feature New Crandon World Cup PRO Event ---- 7th Annual AMSOIL Cup Finale Provides Sport's Richest Race --

After nearly a year of preparation and cooperation, today legendary Crandon International Raceway released its official, action-packed Labor Day weekend schedule that offers an expanded format and four days of on-track action.

Known for hosting the oldest and most prestigious stadium-style off-road races in the world, Crandon International's 47th annual Off-Road World Championship will be unlike any in the track's colorful history. From the new Crandon World Cup/TORC PRO Open Testing on Thursday, September 1st to two packed days of TORC PRO and Sportsman racing to Sunday afternoon's dramatic 7th annual AMSOIL Cup finale - the sport's richest race - the 2016 Crandon World Championship promises to be something special for fans, drivers and teams.

Wisconsin DMV reaching out to confirm process for obtaining voter ID

DMV is reaching out to the public to confirm the process for obtaining an identification card for voting purposes.

If you will be at least 18 years old by the next election, if you are a U.S. citizen, and you are eligible to vote in Wisconsin, you may apply for a free ID card for voting purposes. Here are the steps to be followed to receive a document that can be used for

1. Make one trip to any DMV location and bring proof of residence (example: a utility bill), your social security number (if available), and proof of name and date of birth (example: a birth

2. Fill out the identification card application. If you have the necessary documents, you will receive your identification card within 10 business days via US Mail.

3. If you do not have proof of name and date of birth, proof of U.S. citizenship, or proof of a legal name change, DMV will assist you by initiating the petition process. You must fill out the DMV Petition Administrator application (in addition to the identification card application). Once you enter the process, you will receive a receipt that may be used to vote. Simply present the receipt at the polls when you vote, and you will have produced the required identification to vote.

4. The receipt is good for 60 days and will be automatically renewed as long as your petition is pending.
5. You will receive your receipt via US Mail within 6 working days,

so please make sure you apply far enough in advance of the November elections to make sure you receive your receipt or identification card in time for the election.

She remembers that there were indoor toilets and running water in Hartford, but that wasn't necessarily so in post-war Argonne. She learned to bake, surprising Thornton with her home-baked bread. She learned to garden and to can food. Thornton tried to teach her to drive a car, but gave up when she drove up a guy wire on a light pole.

This blind date lasted 65 years and nine months. Of course, some family has been added! The union produced 14 grandchildren and 20 great grandchildren with another on the way.

She says she learned to love the Northwoods. At age 100, the pace is a little slower. She is a NASCAR fan and watches sports on TV.

Helen's advice is this: "Don't think of the past. Think of the future. Never go to bed angry. Tell him you love him before you go to sleep."

Maybe if we follow this advice, we will reach 100! Happy Birthday Helen!

Townsend Walking Warriors





SCHOOL DISTRICT OF CRANDON ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Crandon is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. The McKinney-Vento Act defines children and youth who are homeless (twenty-one years of age and younger) as:

- Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:
- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason (sometimes referred to as double-up);
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
 - living emergency or transitional shelters;
 - abandoned in hospitals; or
 - awaiting foster care placement.
- Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.
- Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children who may qualify according to the above criteria, the School District of Crandon provides the following assurances to parents of homeless children:

- The local district staff person (liaison) for homeless children is Heather Ostrowski, Pupil Services Administrator, 715-478-6181 and ostrohea@sdofcrandon.com.
- There shall be immediate enrollment and school participation, even if educational and medical records and proof of residency are not available.
- All educational opportunities and related opportunities for homeless students (preschool to age 21), including unaccompanied youth, shall be the same as for the general student population.
- Enrollment and transportation rights, including transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" is defined as the school the child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled.
- Written explanation of a child or youth's school placement, other than school of origin or the school requested by the parent, with the right to appeal within the local dispute resolution process.
- Meaningful opportunities for parents to participate in the education of their children. These shall include: special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.

SCHOOL DISTRICT OF CRANDON NOTICE OF SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This notice serves to inform parents and guardians of students with disabilities that the State of Wisconsin has established the Special Needs Scholarship Program. Under this scholarship program and as further specified in state law, a child with a disability who has been denied the opportunity to attend a nonresident school district under the full-time open enrollment program may be eligible to receive a scholarship from the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) that allows the child to attend an eligible private school that is participating in the Special Needs Scholarship Program.

This is a state-administered program. A parent or guardian who is interested in the Special Needs Scholarship Program should independently verify the participating private schools and the specific terms, eligibility criteria, and application procedures of the scholarship program with the DPI.

The Special Needs Scholarship Program is further defined under section 115.7915 of the state statutes. However, special eligibility requirements not found in that statute exist for program scholarships that are awarded for private school attendance that initially begins in the 2016-2017 school year. The best carbs come from high-fiber, unprocessed foods such as legumes, vegetables, fruit and whole grains. Unprocessed whole grains such as brown rice, quinoa (keen-wa) and oats have more fiber and nutrients than refined white rice and white flour.

Fiber-rich carbs are vital because fiber helps sustain normal cholesterol levels. Plus, fiber slows the rate at which the small intestine absorbs carbohydrates. This prevents major highs and lows in your blood sugar levels, and helps reduce your risk for type 2 diabetes.

Choose Less:

Yes, foods made from refined sugars and grains taste good, but they contain carbs that are less filling than their fiber-rich cousins. The body absorbs refined carbs relatively quickly, increasing blood sugar and triggering a release of insulin. An hour or 2 after eating, hunger returns and you crave more carbs. It's a vicious cycle.

Good to know: Overeating refined carbs can lead to weight gain - a precursor to heart disease, diabetes and some types of cancer. So, swap your apple juice for a whole apple, skip the soft drinks and opt for whole grains most
