Remembering Sonny Wreczycki

The area lost a very good man on Tuesday, September 22nd. Edmund "Sonny" Wreczycki, an Ainsworth resident, passed on Thursday, September 22nd.

Sonny, as everybody called him, was a truly interesting man. I met him during the Crandon Mine controversy in the mid 1990's. As we came to know each other, a friendship formed, and eventually, he told me about his life. I was amazed, and I thought, with his passing, that I would share his life experiences with others.

Sonny was Polish, and like many Polish people, enjoyed "Polack" jokes, often telling them to me and others, but his early life wasn't humorous. His parents were farmers in Poland, and were caught up in World War II when the Nazis invaded Poland in 1939. The invaders, with an army to feed as they started their conquest of the world, snatched up his parents and moved them to Germany to be slave laborers on a work farm. Sonny's mother was with child, and Sonny was born in this Nazi labor camp in 1940.

Sonny's early memories included German soldiers watching them all of the time. As families were added, the number of kids grew, and Sonny said that one day they started rounding up kids and loading them in a truck. He hid under a bed. Shortly, he heard a machine gun go off, and said he never saw any of those kids again. Food was always scarce and wasn't top shelf. Everyone wore shabby clothes and worked hard.

He described to me a bright and sunny afternoon when gunfire erupted - lots of gunfire. Everybody that was in and around the rough, wooden barracks buildings hid under a bed. The shooting stopped, and people gradually came out of hiding. He remembered the sunlight streaming through the many bullet holes in walls of the building. When everyone went outdoors, there were no live German soldiers in sight, but the British Army was there smiling and handing out their extra food before they gave chase to the German Army. Sonny was age five, but his memory was crystal clear of that day.

Chequamegon-Nicolet and Nature Conservancy form new partnership

Minocqua, Wis.—Last week, The Nature Conservancy and the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) signed a Stewardship Agreement that will improve the health and long-term sustainability of the forest while expanding the National Forest's ability to provide timber to Wisconsin's forest products industry.

Granted permanently as part of the 2014 Farm Bill, Stewardship Authority allows national forests to enter into partnerships with non-profit organizations, state and local governments, educational institutions and tribal entities to sell timber and use the proceeds of those sales to carry out projects that improve forest stand health, water quality, soil productivity and wildlife and fish habitat.

"Our national forests provide multiple benefits from wood and other forest products to clean air and water, wildlife habitat and great places to walk, hunt, ski and enjoy the outdoors," said Matt Dallman, the Conservancy's Director of Conservation Programs. "Investing in activities that improve the health and sustainability of our forests and forest economy is a win for all of us."

"Stewardship agreements are a great tool to help us meet the goals and objectives in our Forest Plan," said Linda Riddle, Acting Forest Supervisor on the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. "We are very appreciative of The Nature Conservancy for helping us accomplish conservation initiatives and providing economic benefits to local communities."

Under the Stewardship Agreement, The Nature Conservancy will offer for sale approximately 1.9 million board feet of primarily red pine and mixed conifer timber on 380 acres of National Forest land in Forest County and oversee the harvest in partnership with the National Forest. The public offering of this timber should begin in November 2016. Also as part of this agreement, the Conservancy will set up the sale of an additional 180 acres of northern hardwoods in Forest County; this work will include a stand inventory, harvest prescription writing and timber marking.

Starting in 2017, the Conservancy will begin several restoration projects across the CNNF, including trout stream improvement on Hanson Creek in Forest County and stabilizing stream banks and improving fishing access on the Oconto River for anglers with disabilities. Additional projects may include restoration of pine-oak barrens habitat (one of the rarest forest types found in Wisconsin, supporting endangered species like the Kirtland's warbler) and the control of invasive species such as garlic mustard, buckthorn and honeysuckle.

"This Stewardship Agreement with the Chequamegon-Nicolet allows us to work toward two goals at the same time—protecting the many benefits that healthy forests provide while also supporting forestry jobs and the livelihoods of people in our rural communities," said Mary Jean Huston, who directs the Conservancy's work in Wisconsin.

Nicolet Promise tuition assistance now open to eligible 2017, 2016 high school grads

Nicolet College is now accepting applications for its popular Nicolet Promise program and looking to build on the success of the program's first year. This fall the program created the opportunity for 54 area 2016 high school graduates to attend Nicolet tuition-free.

"The Nicolet Promise put college within reach for many recent high school graduates in the Northwoods," said Nicolet President Richard Nelson. "We're excited to continue this program for eligible high school students graduating in 2017 who would like to attend Nicolet next fall. We're also keeping the program open to eligible 2016 high school graduates looking to attend Nicolet in the fall of 2017."

Under the program, the Nicolet College Foundation will pay the balance of tuition and fees for eligible students after federal and state grants have been applied. The Foundation will cover this cost for up to 15 credits per semester over four fall and spring semesters.

"Many people may feel that college is not an option for them because of cost," said Nicolet Director of Enrollment Erika Warning. "Others might be reluctant to enroll because they think they will be overwhelmed with student debt. The Nicolet Promise addresses both of those issues and removes barriers for many who may not

Chronic Wasting Disease testing in Forest, Vilas and Oneida Counties

In cooperation with local businesses, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources will collect deer heads for chronic wasting disease surveillance testing Oneida, Vilas and Forest counties during the 2016 archery and gun hunting seasons.

If you harvest an adult deer within these counties please consider submitting a sample from any harvested adult deer for CWD testing.

These efforts are in response to two deer harvested in an Oneida County hunting preserve testing positive for Chronic Wasting Disease in late 2015. The first step toward protecting the wild deer herd in this area of the state was the legislatively mandated enactment of a baiting and feeding ban in the three counties on Jan. 11, 2016 to reduce risk for disease transmission.

Steps that followed for this targeted area of the state included developing sampling strategies including car-killed deer, sick and injured deer reports, and deer harvested during regular hunting seasons and is a consistent response to new CWD detections in either wild or captive cervids.

Forest County releases results of 2016 WI Wins compliance checks

This past summer the Northwoods Tobacco-Free Coalition (NWTFC) conducted tobacco compliance checks throughout Forest County. A total of 17 random checks were completed for any retailer in the county that has a tobacco license and 4 of these establishments sold tobacco to a minor. The current illegal sale rate of 23.5% has increased 2.45% from last year's illegal sale rate of 21.05%.

Wisconsin Wins and the Forest County Health Department encourage all clerks selling tobacco to consistently card anyone who looks under the age of 27 and to refuse the sale of a tobacco product without proper verification of age. If your establishment would like more information on how to properly train employees to read IDs and avoid potential fines please visit www.smokecheck.org.

This site offers a free, online training program for tobacco retailers and their employees; it even helps clerks identify a quick and easy way to properly read identifications. By refusing tobacco sales to minors we can help improve the health of our youth and improve our community's future. The Lions Club is available to help in this situation if necessary.

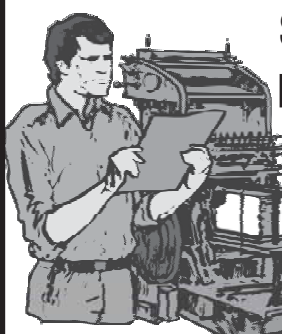

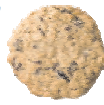

10 Tips for Healthy Eating

Eat a variety of foods. No single food provides all of the nutrients we need for good health. Don't eat the same foods all the time! Try to select foods from across all the food groups. Choose foods that are nutrient dense (they have a high nutrient to calorie ratio).

Enjoy plenty of whole grains, fruits and vegetables. These are examples of foods that are nutrient dense. They contain higher concentrations of fiber, vitamins and minerals.

Be physically active daily. This is just as important to your health as eating properly. Physical activity also aids in the digestion of food, and helps to relieve stress. Even small amounts of exercise count!

Keep portion sizes reasonable. Eating moderate portions helps you to eat what you want and maintain a healthy weight.

Don't skip meals. It is okay to snack between meals, but eating regular meals helps you remember good nutrition.

Don't eliminate your favorite foods. Just regulate how often you eat them. Eating should be both enjoyable and nutritious.

Balance your food choices over time. When eating a food high in fat, salt or sugar, select other foods that are low in these ingredients. If you miss out on any food group one day, make up for it the next. It's how your diet looks over time that matters.

Drink plenty of fluids. Thirsty? How about a big glass of water. Water cools you, keeps your mouth and joints lubricated, and carries nutrients to all your cells and organs. It is important to give your body the water it needs to carry out all these different jobs.

Figure fiber into your foods. Again, whole grains, fruits and vegetables are excellent sources. Nuts are also good fiber sources.

Get your calcium. We don't produce our own calcium, yet our bodies use it everyday. We need to re-supply ourselves through the foods we eat. Low-fat milk is the most affordable and available source of calcium.

made after the living quarters they shared in Europe. By this time, there was a brother and a sister added to the family.

Life was good, said Sonny, then the Mississippi flooded. The family was in town, and when they returned to the farm, their new "home" was floating away on a Mississippi flood. The chickens they were raising were riding the house as it floated down the river. He described his parents depression as being worse than the camps in Germany. Then, the family experienced a very American tradition. The townspeople, hearing of the disaster, showed up with clothing, kitchen utensils and extra furniture. His parents were amazed at what a rich country this was to be able to give away perfectly good frying pans and other household goods.

At about age 14, Sonny's father took a job in a Milwaukee foundry, and with the help of the farmer lending him the stake truck used on the farm, the family moved their possessions to a flat in the big city.

Sonny and the rest of the family had to overcome the language barriers, learning English and attending school without the start their classmates had in life, but they have done well.

Sonny worked a variety of jobs, and one of the jobs was selling cars at Humphrey Chevrolet. This was a lucky break indeed, because this is where he met the love of his life. He married the boss's daughter, Mimi, and life improved. Eventually he landed a great job with Reynolds Aluminum. In the meantime, they had started to visit the Northwoods and fell in love with Rollingstone Lake, where they built the home they eventually retired in.

Stress should have been behind Sonny. A beautiful home on a beautiful lake, a wife he loved and plenty of friends and neighbors to visit with, but then Exxon announced plans to build what was to be called the Crandon Mine.

Sonny became involved in the issue. Rollingstone Lake is downstream from the proposed mine, and he, along with almost every resident from that area was concerned about the loss of water quality. He told me back then that he thought the mine would be built, and had no problems with that, but had become involved to make sure the process was fair and the science wasn't compromised. In time, that attitude over the project changed.

He represented the Town of Ainsworth on the mining issue, educating himself on the issue, the mine construction plans and every facet of the project, which enable him to ask the right questions of both the mining people and the DNR. He worked closely with the Mole Lake environmental people, sharing information and learning from the experts they had hired. He made many trips to Madison, where the DNR held most of their technical meetings on the mine.

He never lost his temper, gave good speeches on the issues, and was respected by most of the people on both sides of the issue.

As we know, the Crandon Mine never could find the science to guarantee a pollution-free mine, and the project was scrapped by the mining company.

Sonny loved feeding birds and animals in his yard. He developed a passion for photography and most of the great wildlife photos you have seen in this publication came from his camera. He photographed the eagles so much they knew him and didn't fly off if he walked to the lake shore with a camera in his hand. They wouldn't sit still for me, but they did for Sonny. He sent in a picture of a cub sitting in his bird feeder that we published many years ago. Brutus, as Sonny named him, visited every spring, and is now big enough to tip the house over.
