At this time, there is some high level "engineering" going on, trying to figure out how to get the shack out of the ice. This too could be interesting!



# Forest County Deer Advisory Council meets January 10 to discuss CWD in deer herd

The Forest County Deer Advisory Council will hold a special meeting on January 10, 2017, at 6:30, at the County Court House Board Room to discuss recommendations for preventing the spread and responding to other chronic wasting disease issues on both a statewide and local level.

Unlike the annual spring CDAC meetings during which quota and permit level recommendations are determined, the January meeting will focus specifically on CWD in Wisconsin's white-tailed deer herd. The council will review information on CWD in the county and region and discuss the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' 15-year Chronic Wasting Disease Response Plan. The CWD Response Plan guides the DNR's approach to addressing CWD in Wisconsin's wild deer herd.

The Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources will consider current CWD data, recommendations from the stakeholder-based CWD Response Plan Review Committee input and online public feedback on the response plan when developing action item recommendations. Action items in the plan cover topics such as CWD surveillance and monitoring, hunting season tools, captive deer regulations, safety, research, and public involvement.

Public comments on CWD-related agenda topics will be accepted at the meeting, and members of the public may also comment through a public survey that will be made available starting in late December on the CDAC web page at dnr.wi.gov, keyword "CDAC".

Council response plan recommendations will be presented to the statewide CWD Response Plan Review Committee in January and then the Natural Resources Board in March 2017.

# Lakes Country Public Library changing hours for 2017



The scale of early logging is staggering. How many strokes of crosscut saws were required to fill the mill yard at Jones Lumber, in Wabeno, back in 1912? That pretty little trout stream flowing through town now certainly looked different back then! The mill hot pond had a purpose. It washed the logs off so dirt didn't dull the head saw, and it made it easy to push a floating log to the bull chain so it could be carried into the mill.


# Hauling logs to the Rogers mill in Nashville






# Hauling logs to the Rogers mill in Nashville




Most of the towns in our area either started or grew immensely with the addition of a large sawmill and the many jobs it provided in the woods and the sawmill. There were no roads when this began, and there weren't any trucks either. Logging railroads brought the logs in from the camps and the lumber to market.

This is the Rogers Lumber Co. engine loaded with logs bound for the mill in the village of Nashville that was founded to support the mill. Nashville is now a township, and the village has faded away. The sawmill burned in 1914, and the Rogers family didn't think there was enough standing timber left to warrant rebuilding it. It must have been exciting while it lasted!



Laona's looks changed dramatically when the old Gordon Hotel was razed. A pretty little park took its place. When the hotel was built there was travel by train, workers who moved to town and no doubt some fishermen and hunters who had need of a room and a bed. Times change.

The building to the left was the Laona State Bank, but is now the headquarters for Nicolet Hardwoods.



It took courage and hard work to carve a farm out of the wilderness, but many folks tried it when the logging camps sold their cutover lands at bargain prices.

We don't know who the stalwart people are in this picture, and we aren't 100% sure it is in the Armstrong Creek area, but that is where the clues point. We also don't know if this rough start grew into one of the nice farms in that area or if the people wore out and the forest took the land back, but their efforts are admired.

# North Crandon's Main Street


