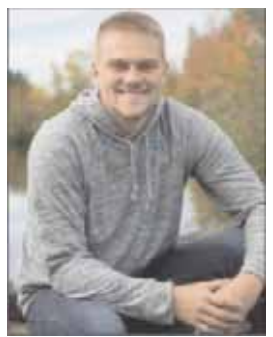
On top of completing her high school courses with a 3.95 GPA, Danielle has earned 15 college credits from Nicolet College through the Course Options and Youth Options programs.

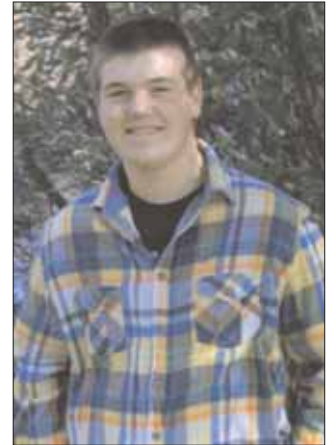













Crandon Postmaster offers tips for mailbox maintenance

With summer just a month away, the U.S. Postal Service is asking all area homeowners to inspect and repair their mailboxes.

"Repairing suburban and rural mailboxes improves the appearance of our community and makes delivering and receiving mail safer for our carriers and customers," says Crandon Postmaster Jackie Aszman.

The Postal Service makes this annual request because of the wear and tear that occurs to mailboxes every year. "This is especially important after the effects of last winter."

Some of the typical activities that may need to be done include:

- Replacing loose hinges on a mailbox door.
- Repainting a mailbox that may have rusted or started peeling.
- Remounting a mailbox post if loosened.
- Replacing or adding house numbers.

"If a homeowner plans to install a new mailbox or replace a worn one, he or she must use only Postal Service-approved traditional, contemporary or locking full/limited service mailboxes," said Aszman. "Customers should be careful when purchasing curbside mail receptacles because the use of unapproved boxes is prohibited. Customers may use a custom-built mailbox, but they must consult with my office to ensure it conforms to guidelines applying to flag, size, strength, and quality of construction."

Nicolet College Robotics Camp to focus on building STEM skills

Creative and high-tech engineering will take center stage at the upcoming Robotics Camp at Nicolet College.

Open to students entering 9th through 11th grades in the fall, participants will expand their talents in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM) as they build a sophisticated robot.

The four-day camp will run from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday through Thursday, June 26 to 29, in Northwoods Center 207 on the Nicolet campus.

Cost is \$30 and includes lunch each day. The camp is subsidized by a grant from the AMN-NW Gold Collar Careers and Collaborative Efforts in Manufacturing

initiative in conjunction with the Wisconsin Technical College System.

Seating is limited with students admitted on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration deadline is Friday, June 9.

"During camp students will learn all aspects of building a working robot," said Mike Wojtusik, camp instructor, Rhinelander School District technology education teacher, and advisor to the Rhinelander Robotics Club.

"This includes designing, programming, building, and operating the sophisticated robot. This camp is perfect for students who love to tinker, love programming or design, or simply have an imaginative mind and like to explore new things."

Students will also be introduced to drone aircraft operation and have the opportunity to fly a quadcopter, Wojtusik added.

The skills participants will learn in the camp are the basis for some of the most rapidly growing careers in the nation, said Nicolet College Career Coach Joe Haferman.

"There's a very significant shortage today for workers with solid STEM skills," Haferman explained. "And demand for people with these skills is expected to

stay strong well into the foreseeable future. These are high-quality, high-paying jobs."

Fishing used to be pretty good on Little Rice Lake in the town of Crandon. But a couple of tough winters and changes in the way the lake water levels are managed have created challenges with fishing and access for property owners, according to Chris Dockry, a property owner on the lake.

There will be a meeting at 6 p.m., June 10, at Mays Bar, 11696 Old Highway 8 Road. All lake property owners and others interested in helping or learning more about Little Rice Lake are welcome. At the meeting, there will be discussion of creating a lake association and raising funds to create a lake management plan. A grant for the creation of a lake management plan has been obtained.

Little Rice Lake is a flowage on the Wolf River and water levels are controlled by a dam along Old 8 Road. Dockry said through the years he has owned property on the lake there have been occasional fish kills during harsh winters including in 2006.

But Dockry said in consecutive winters of 2012-13 and 2013-14, the winter fish kills were about 98 percent,

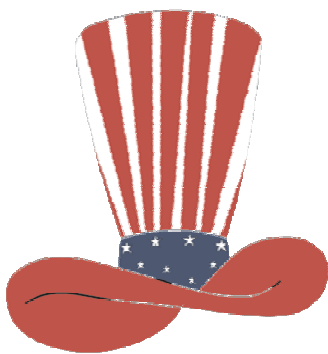

leaving the lake with almost no fish in the spring of 2014. Dockry said the lake levels, which are normally lowered in the fall, were not handled well.

Part of the cause was an old leaky dam that has since been replaced. In addition, the winters were cold and snowy.

Dockry said about three years ago, there was a complaint that lake levels were not being maintained according to a 1985 order that had set the levels. Over the years, water levels had usually been higher than the 1985 order.

So the DNR began managing the dam so lake levels meet the 1985 order. The result, according to Dockry, has been a proliferation of weeds and wild rice. He said it has limited access to the lake for some property owners.

A meeting was held with the DNR in July 2015. It was well attended and allowed the 84 property owners as well as other interested parties to provide some feedback to the DNR.

Dockry said the DNR told everyone that no action could be taken unless a lake management plan was created. Little Rice Lake does not have a lake association so Dockry took \$800 out of his own pocket to hire Flambeau Engineering of Park Falls to help write a lake planning grant.

The grant application was initially denied, in part because there was no lake association. But funds became available and the next step is to raise \$7,000 in private funds for creation of a lake management plan. Dockry said that is one-third of the cost for a lake management plan. It is possible that some of the private investment could include in-kind donations, such as helping to collect water samples, measure water clarity and compile data from surveys.

To get this done, Dockry said creation of a lake association is the next likely step. To get involved, people are encouraged to attend the meeting at 6 p.m., June 10, at Mays Bar, 11696 Old Highway 8 Road. There will be two additional meetings as the lake management plan progresses.

When You Can't Afford a Funeral

Diabetes is a disease in which blood glucose levels are above normal. When you have diabetes, your body either doesn't make enough insulin or doesn't use its own insulin as well as it should. This causes sugar to build up in your blood. As a result, individuals with diabetes may have high blood sugar levels. Diabetes can contribute to serious health complications, including heart disease, blindness, kidney failure and lower-extremity amputations.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services website provides the following facts and figures to highlight diabetes in Wisconsin:

- Approximately 8% of Wisconsin adults have diabetes.
- Approximately 3% of Wisconsin adults have diabetes and don't know it.
- Nearly 40% of Wisconsin adults have pre-diabetes.
- The direct (medical care) and indirect (lost productivity costs) of diabetes in Wisconsin total an estimated \$3.9 billion annually.
- Diabetes is the seventh leading cause of death in Wisconsin.

The American Diabetes Association states that individuals can prevent or delay type-2 diabetes by remaining at a healthy weight, eating well, and remaining active. It is believed that even modest lifestyle changes can greatly impact one's health as it relates to type-2 diabetes. In fact, the National Institute of Diabetes and

Digestive and Kidney Diseases (NIDDK) suggests small changes to maintain a healthy weight. For example, the NIDDK suggests that people drink a glass of water before meals, eat off smaller plates and use whole grain bread. Each of these small actions can help you maintain a healthy weight and positively impact your health.

If you believe you may be at risk for developing type-2 diabetes, speak to your healthcare provider. Medicare may cover a diabetes screening. Generally, Medicare Part B covers diabetes screenings if you have any of the following: hypertension, a history of abnormal cholesterol and triglyceride levels, or a history of high blood sugar. Additionally, Medicare may cover your diabetes screening if you are obese. Part B may also cover these tests if you meet two or more of the following criteria: you are at least 65 years old, you are overweight, or you have a family history of diabetes or gestational diabetes.

Senator Baldwin supports legislation that takes action on student debt crisis

Student loan debt has swelled to \$1.4 trillion, surpassing total amount of credit card debt

WASHINGTON, D.C. – U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin joined Senator Elizabeth Warren (D-MA) and 36 of their Senate colleagues in introducing the Bank on Students Emergency Loan Refinancing Act. The legislation would allow those with outstanding student loan debt to refinance at the interest rates offered to new federal borrowers in the 2016-2017 school year. A previous version of the bill was voted on in the 113th Congress, and every Senate Democrat and three Senate Republicans voted to move the bill forward, falling just short of breaking a Republican filibuster.

Since the original bill was introduced, student loan debt has grown by about \$200 billion. In 2015, 70% of college seniors graduated with debt. And this year, more than one in four borrowers are in delinquency or in default on their student loans. According to a recent analysis, a quarter of borrowers default over the life of their loans. It is clear that the student loan debt crisis is getting increasingly worse, with no signs of slowing down. It is a crisis that threatens our economy, and the futures of young people all across America. With interest rates scheduled to rise again this summer, the urgency for Congress to address the student debt crisis and to allow borrowers to access today's lower rates is stronger than ever.

"A college education should be a path to prosperity not a path to indebtedness, but student loan debt is holding back an entire generation and creating a drag on economic growth for our country," said Senator Baldwin. "This legislation will help address the student loan debt crisis by providing relief to Wisconsin students and families. It is past time for Washington to act with legislation that will help give Wisconsin students a fair shot at getting ahead and building a stronger future for themselves."

Rep. Mursau-Working to Protect the Sustainability of Wisconsin's Forest Industry

There is a great deal of discussion circulating around the Forestry Mill Tax, which recently has been nicknamed, "the Statewide Property Tax". Governor Walker has proposed eliminating this tax and instead shifts funding from GPR (income and sales tax revenues) to support forestry efforts. I've been vocal in my opposition to the Governor's proposal because forestry is one of the top five employers in my district (first or second in 3 counties). I'm not willing to gamble away a secure funding source and put the people I represent at risk.

After the budget was introduced, I sent a survey to my district asking for input on budget priorities. I also asked if they support keeping the Forestry Mill Tax or the Governor's provision to remove it from the property tax bill. Over 80% of respondents are in favor of keeping the Forestry Mill Tax. They understand how the funding source equates to having healthy and sustainable forests and job security for their families.

I have supported every budget the Governor has introduced and he's always been a strong supporter of our forestry industry. On this particular issue however, I disagree with him and I'm not alone. The Governor's Council of Forestry, which advises him on forestry issues, voted today to oppose the Governor's proposal.

I believe we can reduce property taxes and support forestry at the same time. I've proposed, and the Governor's Council of Forestry supports, an audit of the Forestry Account by the independent Audit Bureau. Let's make sure the funds are being used appropriately before we make hasty decisions we can't take back. If the audit shows we're collecting more than we need or the funds are being mismanaged, we can adjust the mill tax accordingly and save property taxpayers some money.

The forest product industry employs more than 64,000 people and is the number one employer in several Wisconsin counties. Our printing industry employs an additional 29,000 workers and Wisconsin is the number one paper-producer in the United States. Our forestry industry has an output of \$24.7 billion. If we don't ensure that we have a healthy and sustainable crop, we put all of this in jeopardy.

If we fund forestry efforts with GPR than forestry will be forced to compete in future budgets with transportation, education, and health care for adequate funding. I am certain that forestry will always lose because it isn't a statewide priority. This means our forests suffer, my constituents will be out of work, and we'll no longer be the envy of other states that currently can't compete with our timber quality and production.

Lastly, we get quite a lot for our annual \$27 investment. This includes supporting our local volunteer fire departments when wildfires occur and just last week the Governor declared a State of Emergency in response to elevated wildfire conditions in the state. We don't want to experience what the state of Kansas did this year when almost 700,000 acres were destroyed by fires. Similar to rural Wisconsin, most of the fire departments in Kansas are volunteer and they weren't equipped to handle that type of fire and the state didn't have additional resources in place to help the local towns. They lost so many trees and families lost their homes.

I believe an audit of the forestry account is a reasonable compromise. We keep our industry intact, establish integrity of the forestry account, and offer tax relief to property owners.
