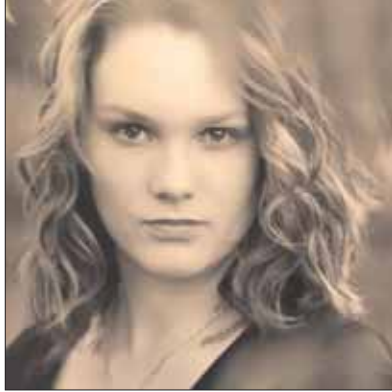

Crandon Fire Dept. adds a truck

The Crandon Fire Department has added a new truck to their line-up. This one-ton Chevrolet, purchased from Parson's of Antigo, will fill a gap in the service. This 4-wheel drive will work perfectly for brush and grass fires when needed, and will also serve as a backup to nearby fire departments who may need assistance. This means that the bigger units can stay in the firehouse should they be needed in the Crandon area.

It is equipped with a 250-gallon tank with a self-powered pump, and the unit can be slid in or out. This was purchased from Mark Pomasl. A winch that can be mounted on front or back will be able to get the truck out of a bad spot if needed.

This truck replaces a 1975 van that has seen better days. The cost was about \$80,000. Relax taxpayers! The cost of this new equipment was covered by the Fire Department by various fundraising activities such as the 4th of July celebrations, working the races at the Crandon International Offroad Raceway and raffling the UTV.

This 4th of July will be different. The celebration will be at the race track, and after the parade, the department will go to the track to park cars. There will be no auction, but 100% of the parking fees go to the Fire Department. Fireworks will be at the track this year.

FATHER'S DAY IS COMING UP!

Academy Award-nominated foreign film Kon Tiki June 15 at Nicolet



Thor Heyerdahl couldn't swim and didn't know how to sail a boat. But that didn't stop the driven Norwegian adventurer from building a rudimentary raft and sailing, with his crew of five, an astounding 4,300 miles across the open Pacific Ocean.

The gutsy expedition is the subject of the foreign film Kon Tiki, a modern-day, action-packed adaptation of the journey that will be shown in the Nicolet College Theatre at 7:30 p.m., Thursday, June 15. Admission is free.

"It was nothing short of an insane voyage. Just crazy," said Steven Schreier, a Rhinelander film aficionado who will present the film with Tom Jerow.

"Nobody could have been less prepared to make the journey than Thor Heyerdahl. He made it by sheer will and determination, despite the odds."

And it's that exact spirit that attracted Schreier and Jerow to select the Academy Award-nominated film for the last of three foreign films they curated for the college's 2016-17 Nicolet Live! series.

Produced in 2012, Kon Tiki tells the tale of Heyerdahl and his crew who in 1947 set off to prove that people from South America could have settled the Polynesian Islands, more than 4,000 miles away. They built a raft out of balsa logs using pre-Columbian technology identical to what South Americans would have used at the beginning of the second millennia.

"It's a classic tale of Man vs. Nature in the African Queen genre of storytelling," Schreier explained. "It harkens back to films popular in the 1950s and early 1960s where people went on these grand adventures in exotic locales."

The film that will be shown at Nicolet is not the documentary produced in the 1950s.

Along with presenting the film, Schreier and Jerow will also lead a discussion with the audience about the piece and answer questions.

Earlier in the Nicolet Live! season, the two presented two other foreign films, The Host and The Fairy.

"People have this idea that foreign films aren't that accessible, on a personal level," Schreier explained. "We wanted to bring these films to the Northwoods to give people the opportunity to expand and broaden their idea of cinema. The whole world makes films and some of them are very, very good."

Drop-in Center Opens in July

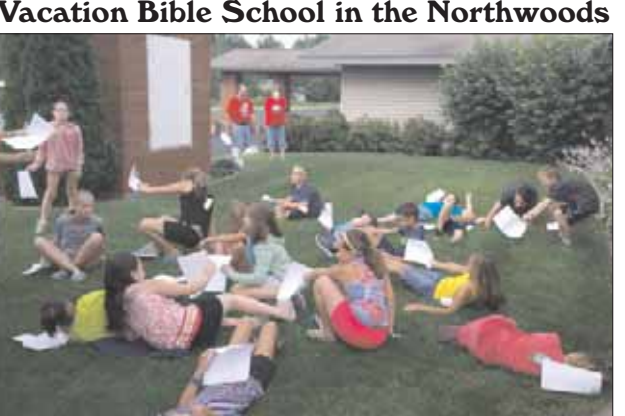

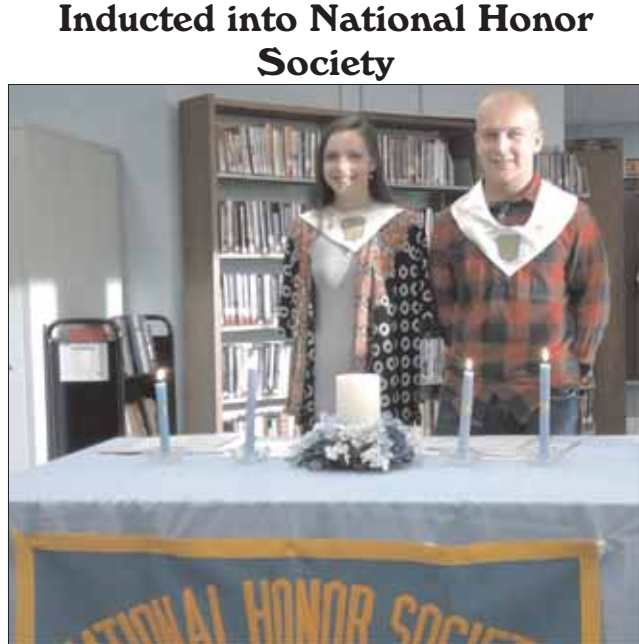

USDA seeks applications for Community Development Grants

STEVENS POINT, Wis, June 1, 2017 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is inviting applications for two grants to support economic development and Community Facilities technical assistance in rural communities.

USDA is making grants available under the Rural Community Development Initiative (RCDI) program to strengthen the rural economy. Qualified intermediary organizations receiving RCDI grants will provide technical assistance and training to help nonprofit organizations and communities develop their capacity to undertake housing, community facilities or economic development projects. Applicants must have capacity-building experience for these types of projects and must provide matching funds at least equal to the RCDI grant. Grants range from \$50,000 to \$250,000. Eligible recipients are nonprofit organizations, low-income rural communities or federally recognized tribes. RCDI grants are not provided directly to businesses or individuals. For more information on how to apply, see page 24281 of the May 26 Federal Register. The deadline to submit paper applications is July 25, 2017.

Another grant is being provided through the Community Facilities Technical Assistance and Training Grant Program. Congress authorized this new program in the 2014 Farm Bill to help rural communities develop their applications for Community Facilities loans and grants. Communities can use the grants to hire specialized personnel, pay for feasibility studies, retain consultants to prepare financial assistance applications and identify and plan for long-term community facility needs. Public bodies, non-profit organizations and Federally-recognized Tribes are eligible to apply for this funding. The maximum grant is \$150,000. Hot weather increases chances for pavement buckling

Hot weather in the forecast in some areas of north central Wisconsin this week could create conditions for pavement buckling. Motorists are asked to take extra caution.

Pavement buckles are most common when the weather quickly goes from cool to very hot, causing pavement to expand. This can cause concrete slabs of pavement to push against each other, and if the pressure becomes great enough the pavement can buckle. While it's difficult to predict if or where buckling may occur, WisDOT offers the following tips for motorists:

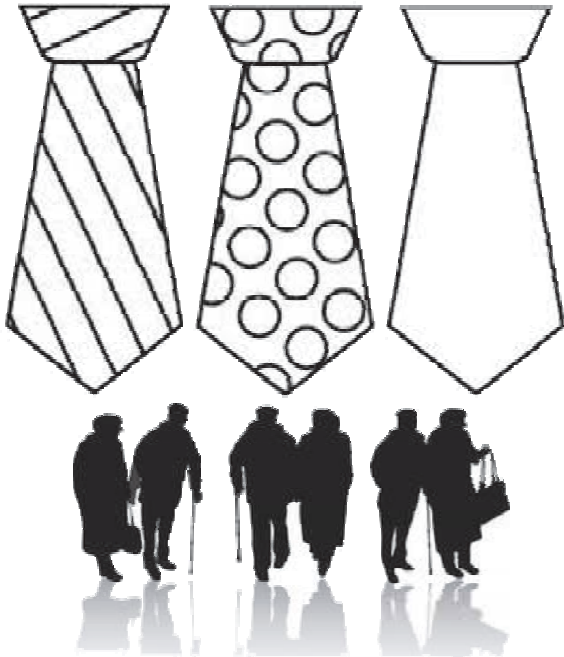

County Deer Advisory Council application period open until July 1

MADISON - Qualified applicants are encouraged to apply for County Deer Advisory Council seats before the application period closes for all counties July 1, 2017.

Council members meet annually to review deer management data, gather public input from citizens and provide recommendations to the Department of Natural Resources and the Natural Resources Board regarding deer management decisions in their county.

Councils include representatives in the following areas of expertise: agriculture, forestry, tourism, transportation, hunting, land management and local government. Both hunters and non-hunters are encouraged to apply for vacancies, but applicants must have experience or involvement with at least one of these seven stakeholder categories. A majority of council members have expressed satisfaction with their overall CDAC experience.

"We are making all council seats available to new applicants," said Kevin Wallenfang, DNR deer and elk ecologist. "Many people who sat in those seats for the past few years are reapplying, but we're giving other interested folks the opportunity to compete for any seat. Those selected will serve for three years and during that time will have a great deal of responsibility in helping manage deer in their county."

Councils were established in 2014 and have successfully incorporated public input into recommendations on county-specific deer population objectives and herd management strategies. In doing so, council members review and consider a variety of metrics on deer herd trends, impacts to habitat and various human-deer interactions.

Wisconsin ruffed grouse survey results indicate an increase in breeding grouse

MADISON - Roadside ruffed grouse surveys completed in spring 2017 showed statewide drumming activity increased 17 percent from 2016, based on data collected to monitor breeding grouse activity.

"An increase in breeding grouse activity hopefully will mean an increase in grouse nesting and brood rearing, which could mean more grouse for hunters to pursue this fall," said Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources Wildlife Survey Coordinator Brian Dhuey. "Ruffed grouse populations are known to rise and fall over a nine to 11-year cycle, and the last peak in Wisconsin's cycle occurred in 2011 - survey results suggest that we have passed the low point in the population cycle and have started the increasing phase, which should continue the next few years as the grouse population moves toward the next peak."

Roadside surveys to monitor the number of breeding grouse have been conducted by staff from the department, U.S. Forest Service, tribal employees, and numerous grouse enthusiasts and volunteers since 1964.

The survey results showed a 17 percent increase from 2016 levels. The northern and southwest regions

showed increases, while the southeast and central regions remained stable or showed small declines. While increases in the southwest part of the state were the largest by percentage, this area is not within the primary range for grouse. The increase in activity in southwestern Wisconsin follows near historic lows, and likely would not significantly add to grouse abundance in the state.

Results from the 2017 survey show that grouse populations in both the southwest and southeast region remain well below historic levels. According to Mark Witecha, a DNR upland wildlife ecologist, maturation of southern Wisconsin's forest community and the resulting loss of dense, brushy areas that grouse need for cover has resulted in lower numbers of regional grouse in recent decades.

"Ruffed grouse rely on dense, young forest cover resulting from disturbances such as fire and logging," said Witecha. "Beyond actively managing state-owned lands, Wisconsin DNR is working to provide suitable grouse habitat through an extensive collaborative effort known as the Wisconsin Young Forest Partnership. The Partnership provides technical and financial assistance for young forest management on private lands, benefitting ruffed grouse and other wildlife species by helping maintain healthy and diverse forest communities."

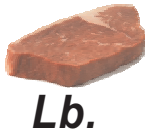

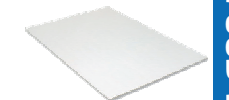

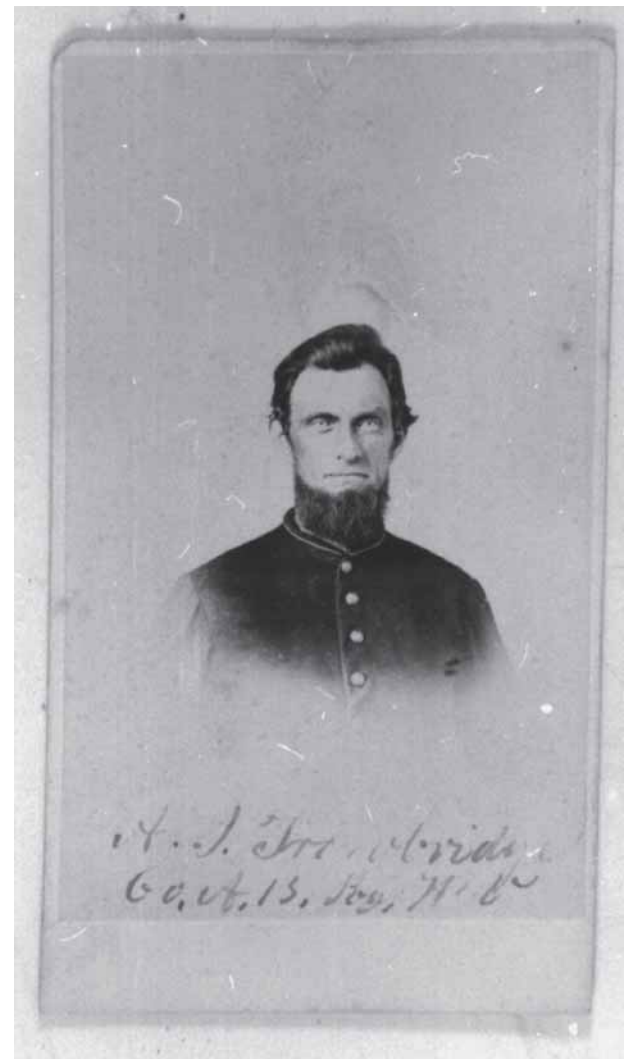

Senior Chatter

Spring Storm Damage Draws Transient Contractors

We are midway through the spring storm season, and flooding, hail and tornados have already impacted a wide range of the state. For homeowners, the sudden fury of these seasonal storms can lead to extensive structural and landscape damage, leaving them scrambling to hire help in getting their properties back in order.

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) asks homeowners affected by storm damage to seek trusted local contractors for home repair projects and to be on the lookout for transient contractors (or "storm chasers").

"Already our agency is hearing from homeowners and law enforcement who have had contacts with out-of-state work crews canvassing neighborhoods in the aftermath of the recent storms," said Frank Frassetto, Division Administrator for Trade and Consumer Protection. "Use caution in your interactions with these groups, never let them into your home, and don't give in to their high-pressure pitches."

"These workers move quickly from town to town, leaving you with little or no recourse if you are ripped off, if they damage your property, or if there is a problem with a repair they make on your home," said Frassetto.

A good first step with a storm repair project should be to research trusted local contractors. Ask for references from friends, family members, and co-workers, and contact DATCP's Consumer Protection Hotline (800-422-7128) to find out about complaints against particular businesses.

Wisconsin's "Storm Chaser Law" gives DATCP enforcement tools to protect consumers and honest businesses alike by helping prevent insurance fraud. Highlights of the law include:

- Contractors cannot promise to pay all or some of a property insurance deductible.
 - Contractors cannot represent or negotiate with the customer's insurer on behalf of the customer. The contractor can, with the consent of the customer, discuss damages and costs associated with the repairs with the insurer.
 - Before entering into a contract with a customer, the contractor must give the customer a questionnaire to determine whether the work requested is related to an insurance claim.
 - Customers have a right to cancel the contract within three business days of being notified that their insurer has denied all or any part of the claim for work. Contractors must notify customers of this right.
- Here are additional Consumer Protection tips for homeowners with storm damage:
- Ask contractors if they are subcontracting your job. If they are, find out who the subcontractor will be and check them out as well.
 - Get lien waivers from anyone you pay for home

repairs. Lien waivers protect you if the person collecting the money does not pay the suppliers or workers.

- Get a written contract with a start and completion date and warranty information. Also, make certain that the contract states exactly what work is to be done and what materials are to be used. Never rely on a verbal commitment.

- Have someone watch the work being done. Check with your local building inspector to see if the work requires a permit. Make sure an inspector visits the job site before you make a final payment.

- Request a copy of the contractor's certificate of liability insurance.

Local door-to-door solicitation rules vary by municipality, and there are legitimate businesses that may knock on your door with a sales pitch. A good practice to follow is to request a business representative's permit to operate if your municipality has a door-to-door sales ordinance.
