Pies must be dropped off at the Wabeno Area Players Pie Booth (located on the courthouse square) accompanied by a registration form and recipe between the hours of 9 and 11 a.m. on Saturday, September 16 (no late entries accepted). Judges will not know names of the bakers, and the entries will be judged on overall appearance, flavor of the crust and filling, and creativity.

There will be awards for first and second place in each category and one for Best in Show. Judging will be conducted with a whole lot of fun by the Wabeno Area Players commencing at noon. Prizes will be announced and awarded immediately following the 1:00 p.m. performance.

On Saturday, September 2nd the Lumberjack Steam Train began the first run of Fall Festival. The 1916 Vulcan steamer picked up the passengers at the vintage depot on Hwy 8, just west of Laona, Wisconsin. The passengers rode in vintage passenger cars and cabooses to the old logging camp.

While there, they enjoyed one of the finest logging museums in the Midwest, with displays inside and outside, plus a working blacksmith shop. Kids and adults enjoy the Petting Zoo, and if you have an appetite, the Choo Choo Hut Restaurant is always open. Visitors to the Camp 5 Museum Complex both enjoy and learn from the Green Treasure Forest Tour. A trip in open cars through a working sustainable forest with a narrator explaining the forestry involved gives insight into how we have the forest resources available to society.

Have a sense of adventure? The Corn Maze is waiting for you to explore. Visitors enjoy finding their way back to the starting point, and drone enthusiasts are encouraged to take aerial photos and share them with us.

Starting September 15th, the Haunted Slaughterhouse will get you in the mood for Halloween. Spooky!

On Saturday, September 30th, the Cowboys will be once again "robbing" the Lumberjack Steam Train. On August 31, a ceremonial ribbon-cutting was held in the parking lot of Laona Machine Supply, in Crandon. It meant that Phase I of the Valley Trail was completed. The trail will handle ATV and snowmobile traffic coming from the west into Crandon. Phase I ends at County S, with Phase II in the future, that will end at May's Bar.


One of the problems in constructing the trail occurred on the top of West Hill, where Rosa Road hits Hwy 8. MSA Associates worked out the engineering with the DOT, and eventually this phase was completed. It was a long haul, with the first talk of building the trail in 2010. The total cost of the trail was \$202,312 for 2.02 miles of trail. The Forest County Hwy Dept. constructed the trail.

Phase II will be about 5 miles in length, from County S to May's Bar. The grant for phase II is \$224,770.

Dave Ziolkowski held the left side of the ribbon and Don LeMaster the right side, with Bill Chaney doing the cutting. Ziolkowski wrote all of the grants for the trail, worked with the MSA Associates closely, and LeMaster and Chaney put in considerable time in guiding the project to completion. Other notable in the crowd included Assemblyman Jeff Mursau, Engineer Jamie Anderson, a number of county board members, and Bill May.







The path to this year's PRO 4 championship has been a father-son dog fight since the first race. Coming into the weekend, only 10-points separated CJ Greaves and his father Johnny atop the year-end points standings. While both Chad Hord and Ross Hoek looked to shake up the pecking order early in the PRO 4 final, it eventually turned into

another Greaves duel that went down to the final turn. From the green, it was Johnny getting the early jump and plenty of open track to do what he does best...lay down some wicked fast lap times. In fact, Johnny led every lap, except the one that mattered most. CJ Greaves didn't have the best of starts, collecting plenty of roost within the cab as he watched Hoek and Hord battle for position ahead of him. But it was their back and forth intensity that eventually opened the door for CJ to pass both and set his sights on his father.

As the laps wound down, CJ closed the gap to within a truck length. It was a flashback moment for both drivers to this past spring's Crandon race where CJ was leading until Johnny tagged and spun his son out for the win. This time, the tables were turned and

> CJ brought the heat into the second to last turn, shoved the nose of his truck under Johnny's, and made an inside pass for the win.

> "I guess I had that one coming," said Johnny, referring to the contact and subsequent spin that gave CJ the win. "He ran me down and passed me...and that's the way I raised him."

#### **ANDREW CARLSON GRABS HOLESHOT AND WIN IN PRO 2**

Labor Day weekend at Crandon not only brings out the best in a racer, it brings out the best racers too. Both PRO 2 and PRO Light saw the biggest fields of the 2017 season, and in the mix were past champions, top racers from the West Coast, and even an NHRA Top Fuel drag racer. But full starting grids and a mud-laden track didn't slow Andrew Carlson, who burst from the land rush start, held it on through a slick turn one, and never looked back.

Throughout the 9-lap final, only Brad Lovell had anything for Carlson. Lovell attempted to keep Carlson honest and show him a fender early after the competition caution, but that was as close as he ever got.
