


The Hammes family built the place to make a home for their sawmill, and it lasted until the timber ran out. A collection of Padus pictures is in the Wabeno Logging Museum.

Crandon International Raceway opens 2018 camping & grandstand reservations New Year's Day



With two huge off-road race weekends coming to Wisconsin's scenic Northwoods next year, Crandon International Raceway is getting set to kick of the 2018 season for its 400-acre facility this New Year's day with the opening of camping and event reservations. On Monday, January 1st at precisely noon Central Standard Time (CST) race fans can begin their preparations for two traditional Crandon event weekends -- the Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run on June 22nd – 24th and the Crandon World Championship Off-Road Races ® held over Labor Day weekend August 30th - September 2nd.

For the first time in Crandon history full season camping reservations will open up in January instead of the traditional March kick-off to the season. The reservation system found at www.crandonoffroad.com that was first instituted in the fall of this year has undergone yet another upgrade designed to enhance both the ease of purchasing reservations packages and also improve the overall customer experience.

In September all 2,100-plus camping sites were reserved before the record-breaking Labor Day Crandon World Championship/World Cup weekend even began.

Throughout the month of January, Crandon race fans can purchase 2018 race season packages for camping, wristbands and grandstand seating. The "Gold" package costs \$350.00 and includes an electric camping site and two wristbands for both the Brush Run and World Championship weekends, while the "\$270.00 "Silver" package includes non-electric sites and two wristbands for both events. The packages represent a \$20.00 savings over individual race weekend packages, which go on sale to the public on Monday, February 5th at precisely noon CST at www.crandonoffroad.com.

Grandstand seats in the newly renovated Vision Wheel Hospitality Complex were also at a premium in 2017, but fans purchasing season packages also have the option

County Executive Committee meets-courthouse reno discussed

There was a lively exchange at the Executive Committee meeting of the Forest County Board last Thursday evening. The committee was upset over media coverage of the board, and they wanted to discuss a rebuttal. The meeting was precipitated by the recent letters to the *Pioneer* and the *Forest Republican* by Jim Odekirk on actions of the board both past and present, and, in particular, the upcoming courthouse project.

Mr. Odekirk was there to defend himself and argue the points of his letters.

The latest issue is the courthouse renovation, along with fixing the problems of the current jail. The executive committee is composed of Paul Millan, Bill Chaney, Cheri Collins, Terry Lukas and Supervisor Bill Connors.

Jill Zagar was there from the Forest Republican, and also in attendance was Jim Odekirk, Dave Tupper, Dan Bobbe and myself, representing the Pioneer Express. The discussion was spirited at times.

While we can commend the committee on thinking about better communications with the voting public, this follows a number of issues where the powersthat - be on the board didn't communicate with the public. The proposed off-road vehicle park and the recent issue over the fair grounds come to mind.

Their argument is that there is info on the website and that people don't attend meetings. Both papers were cited by the board for not attending a meeting on the courthouse project, but Zagar countered that the notices are not necessarily clear on the published agendas, making it difficult to determine what the meeting is actually about.

I did have the thought that if a large number of citizens attended committee meetings or board meetings, they would have to be held in a gymnasium and not much could be accomplished. That being said, there doubtless should be more citizens who attend meetings, and agendas should be more complete. There should also be citizens who run for county supervisor offices instead of complaining in bars and restaurants. A democracy requires citizen involvement.

The upcoming courthouse project is certain to be contentious. There will be a brochure distributed to the public. On that brochure, there are two options put in front of the public.

One option is for a cost of \$25.8 million. This involves saving and repairing the old landmark courthouse along with new offices for social services and the judicial branch, along with other building and renovations.

The other option, for \$22.8 million, will do all of the above, but will remove the old courthouse.

My question at the meeting was if there were other options. I was told there was. The next question was why those options weren't on the brochure, just the two most expensive. I didn't receive an answer. Others will be asking these questions in the months ahead.

Forest County Snowmobile Trails opened December 26



Forest County Snowmobile Trails will officially open at noon on Tuesday, December 26, 2017 for the snowmobiling season. Forest County has 405.79 miles of state funded trails maintained by five snowmobile clubs including the 100 Mile Snow Safari, Lumberjack Memorial Trails, Black Bear Sportsmen's Club Trails, Three Lakes Trails and the Tombstone-Pickerel Trails.

Snowmobile clubs have been panning the trails and have all trails cleared and signed.

New snowmobile maps are also available for the New Year thanks to sizeable donations by the Sugarbush Snowmowheelers and the Northwoods Snow Chasers. These donations have resulted in an awesome snowmobile trail map to guide snowmobilers throughout Forest County.


Please remember that the Nicolet State Trail and the Wolf River State Trail are the ONLY snowmobile trails in Forest County that are currently open for ATV and UTV use. The Forest County Snowmobile Trail Ordinance currently prohibits ATV, UTV use and motor vehicle use on all other snowmobile trails in Forest County. Snowmobile trails are "NOT" open for motor vehicle use or hunting. THOSE DRIVING TRUCKS ON TRAILS ARE SUBJECT TO FINES THROUGH THE COUNTY SNOWMOBILE TRAIL ORDINANCE.



A New Shingles Vaccine is On Its Way

Shingles is caused by the varicella zoster virus, which almost all older Americans harbor from getting childhood chickenpox. If you're over age 80, you stand a one-in-three to one-in-two chance of getting shingles. Shingles symptoms include a painful, itchy rash that developed on one side of the body, lasting for two to four weeks. The pain associated with shingles is often described as burning, shooting or stabbing. Lingering and debilitating nerve pain may occur after contracting singles, which is why preventing it is so important.

The currently available shingles vaccine, called Zostavax, prevents roughly half of shingles cases in people over age 60. The new vaccine, Shingrix – expected to be available by early 2018 – has been shown to prevent more than 90 percent of shingles cases, even at older ages. The new vaccine may also protect people with compromised immune systems, which is helpful for older individuals who may be undergoing chemotherapy or transplants, have HIV or take steroids. This is because the new shingles vaccine is a non-live vaccine; the old vaccine was made with a weakened live virus.

The old vaccine will remain on the market, but the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) will be making Shingrix its preferred vaccine and will recommend it for all adults over age 50 and younger individuals with compromised immune systems. Medicare and Medicaid will update its coverage of Shingrix as soon as the CDC publishes its recommendations.

Even if you've already received the old vaccine, it is recommended to also get the Shingrix vaccine because of how much more effective it is. Of course, as with any vaccine, talk with your healthcare provider about the pros and cons for your individuals health needs.

Dear Editor,

One of the most warranted topics of consideration before Forest County taxpayers surely is our aging courthouse. The most valid of concerns, specifically the safety and security of the publics' interest and our judicial system, are irrefutable. It is evident to any who have visited the courthouse through the decades that it has remained pretty much unchanged since its last major revision in 1978.

Last week's ad attempted to inform citizens of two proposed options, and to direct inquires to individual county board supervisors. We read that the county board desires public input, but two options for consideration have already been decided upon. Will public input, after options have already been decided, be effective? I openly ask the county board to consider the following:

Will the county board form a facility task force with representatives from various townships, in addition to those employed in the county offices, to provide channels for ideas and constructive criticism to then build consensus for proposed solutions?

A project of this magnitude and undertaking, one that will not be revisited for generations, should have ample time invested by county stakeholders to best address the needs of the county while balancing what's within the means of Forest County taxpayers. Although I did not see or hear of the process the county board took in putting out requests for proposals of construction and architectural services, the decision to utilize The Samuels Group has been made. The Samuels Group is a reputable company, yet they do not represent Forest County and shouldn't be expected to. Construction managers, such as The Samuels Group, are quite accustomed to facilitating a task force through such a process. If asked, The Samuels Group likely would be willing and able to provide their services to facilitate task force meetings as part of their pre-construction service agreement.

The utilization of a facility task force will likely take nearly a year's time to assess all the challenges, needs, desired "like to have's" and cost implications. A facility task force opens lines of communication for taxpayers




throughout the townships of Forest County to express input, and will ultimately only help our county board make better decisions when necessary as our elected representatives.

Upon a final consensus from the task force, a professionally compiled survey should then be distributed to all county stakeholders. This survey is twofold in its purpose:

- 1) the survey educates why the proposed options best meet the county's needs
- 2) the survey provides an opportunity for taxpayer feedback to see what is likely to be supported, or not, via a county wide referendum

I would hope the county board would give consideration to the above, and that as a county, we would be understanding of our county representatives should they decide to take a step back in this process. The end goal should be to provide needed services to its residents via a safe and efficient facility, while also being as fiscally conscious as possible.
