We at A.R.F. are so pleased that many Forest County animals are now protected against life threatening diseases. My only regret; and I have berated myself for it I failed to stress in our ad for the event that you must always bring in your pet's vet record in order to receive the 3yr vaccine if he has already had the 1 year.

So this regrettably, prevented some animals from receiving that vaccine.

I am now set up for sales at our weekly (Wednesdays) Flea Market at the Nashville Town Hall. We also have our annual antique/rummage sale planned for Saturday, June 16. If you have nice things that you'd like to see converted into help for area animals, please keep our annual sale in mind. Anyone who has patronized our sale in the past knows pretty much what we put in that sale. Also, keep our sale in mind to come do some shopping with us! Every cent goes directly for animals in our area.

Our cost on this last clinic we held was \$1,900.00, so in addition to all the other services we provide for this community, it keeps us very busy earning the money to keep up.

For our spay/neuter programs, we will be considering a different method. We are desperately trying to reach those pets that are part of families who are experiencing real financial difficulty providing this care. If we go that route, we would be issuing certificates instead of having the free clinics open to everyone. We do that to a certain extent now, when we are made aware of a situation that needs a hand-up. A weighing of the pros and cons of this venture will be discussed at our next Board meeting, and decisions will be made.

### Laona High School to offer screening of "Written Off"

The Community Coalition of Forest County is partnering with the Human Service Center of Forest, Oneida and Vilas Counties to offer Forest County residents numerous opportunities to view a free screening of the documentary "Written Off. "Written Off" chronicles the life of Matthew Edwards, a Crandon High School graduate, whose addiction to opioids began at age 15, after being prescribed pain medicine for a minor surgery. His grippingly honest writing reveals the secrets he tried so hard to conceal throughout a decade long struggle to escape addiction. Matthew's mother, Jane Funk, currently a teacher at Crandon High School, published the book "What I Couldn't Tell you : one Man's Struggle with Opioid Addiction" in June of 2017 and worked with filmmakers Molly Hermann and Rob Lyall on the "Written Off" documentary.

The documentary film will be shown beginning at 5:30 p.m. on Wednesday, May 23rd at the Laona High School. The screening is recommended for ages 14 and up. Admission is free and no registration is required.

In addition to the film, parents, grandparents and caregivers are encouraged to tour Forest County Health Department's "Hidden in Plain Sight" mock teen bedroom which will be setup at the school. The interactive room is a simultaneously amusing and horrifying scavenger hunt which helps adults spot the signs of substance abuse or addiction which may be hiding in a teen bedroom.





# Tips for Remembering By the GWAAR Legal Services Team

We all forget or misplace things. It may not be Alzheimer's, dementia, or signs of old age. It's probably not even a "senior moment." Instead, you may just need some tips for remembering everyday things!

- To remember something you need to take with you: Take the thing that needs to leave the house and stick in it a plastic bag or tote, then hang that bag right from the inside doorknob of the door you usually walk out of.
- To remember where you parked: As soon as you park, look to see what section you're in. Create a mental snapshot. If you're in section 3D, imagine three dogs chasing each other around your car. Or, take an actual snapshot with your camera phone! You may also, without fail, park under a light post.
- To keep from forgetting something you're carrying around: If you're in the habit of leaving your umbrella or scarf behind, put it on top of something that will move when you get up to go, such as your chair or your
- To remember the things you always leave the house with: Make up a mantra composed of three items that you typically misplace. For example, you could hum (in your head) "phone, keys, purse" to the tune of "Mary Had a Little Lamb," or another simple song.
- To remember where you place your wallet/keys every time: The next time you put something down somewhere, pause a moment to notice where you've placed it, and then in your mind blow it up. Literally. Blow it up in your head. If you visualize the explosion in enough detail, you won't forget where you put it.
- To remember to turn something off: Most of the time you probably do turn off the stove, the coffeepot, and the iron. But if you find yourself frequently guessing or sometimes truly forgetting, make an effort to be mindful of the critical moment when you flip the switch. Say out loud, "Oven is off." "Iron is unplugged."
- To remember everything on your grocery list: Make up a story using the items you need - the more absurd and dramatic, the better. "A chicken was eating cornflakes when a car burst through the wall. A monkey was driving, throwing oranges out the window; he honked wildly as he drove off a cliff into a lake filled with milk..." The narrative will take you from item to item until you reach the end of your list.

generations of WHS students to the classics of American literature such as "Of Mice and Men", "To Kill a Mockingbird", and "Grapes of Wrath." The third aspect of Nancy's passion for teaching English was speech and communication. She spent numerous summers and long nights after school making the 100 mile trek to Stevens Point to earn her Masters Degree in communication She mentored hundreds of students as the Wabeno High School forensics coach, many who remember the trips to the state competition in Madison where they were able to get to know Mrs. Volk in a more relaxed, laid back setting.

Nancy's most lasting professional impact, and her greatest passion, is likely the development and nurturing of the Wabeno drama program. As director of the annual Wabeno High School musical, Mrs. Volk treated the community to classics like "Bye, Bye Birdie", "Guys and Dolls", "Finian's Rainbow", and "Damn Yankees."

Nancy brought the arts and drama to the wider community by helping found her "baby", the Wabeno Area Players. This group did one summer show each year. Now they are a 501c3 non-profit organization with nemerous productions each year, a free theater camp for grades 4-8 and adult workshops as well. Her impact will continue to be felt for generations as the Wabeno Area Players will be sponsoring an annual scholarship in Nancy's memory with over \$8,000 raised thus far.

Nancy's impact in the community could also be felt in her participation numerous organizations and causes. She was always quick to lend sound unbiased advice and ideas. 
