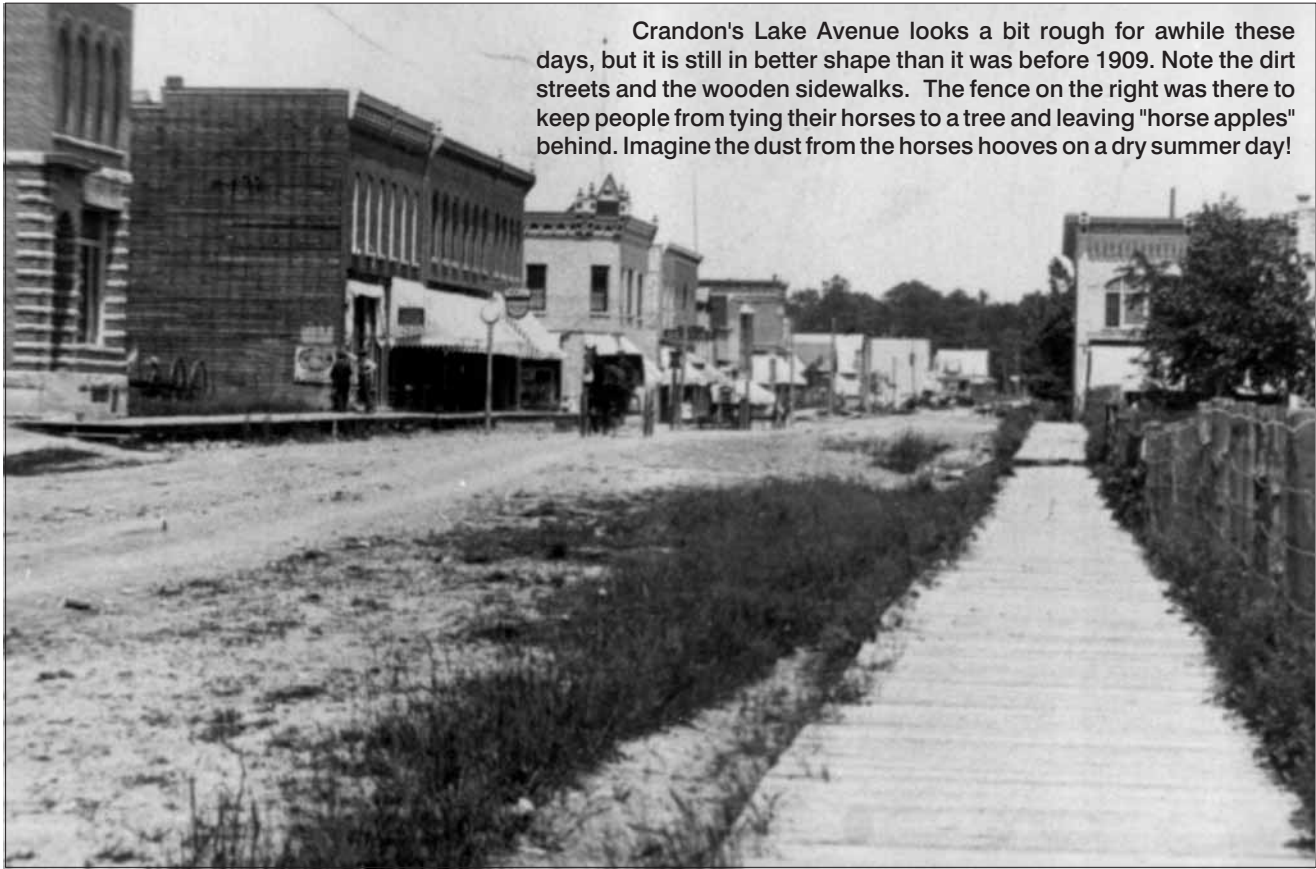
If your feet are still willing, you can dance the night away to The New Generation Polka Band of Pulaski, from 6 p.m. till 11 p.m.

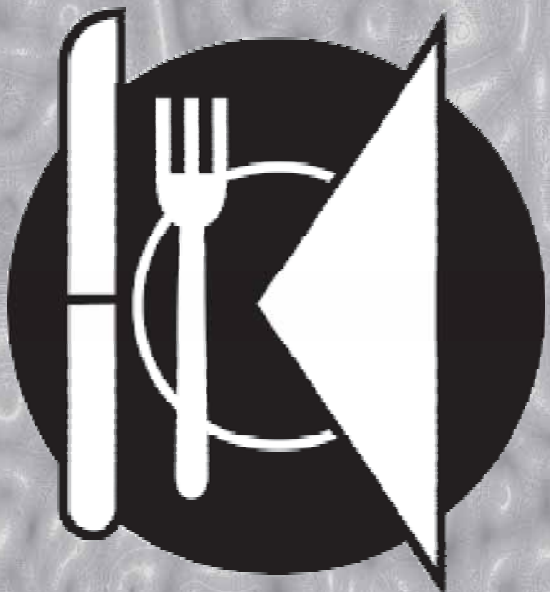

Wisconsin Top Ten Consumer Complaints of 2017

The Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade, and Consumer Protection (DATCP) recently released the top 10 consumer complaints of 2017. Telemarketing remained at the top of the annual list. In 2017, DATCP received 4,147 telemarketing complaints, which was 12% more than in 2016 and 62% more than in 2015. According to Michelle Reinen, Director of the Bureau of Consumer Protection, “DATCP follows up on every telemarketing complaint we receive and attempts to identify the caller. We also use the complaint information to identify trends, warn the public, and help our federal partners build nationwide cases against the scammers behind the calls.”

Many of the 2017 telemarketing complaints were about phone calls asking individuals if they wanted to lower their credit card interest rates or renew extended vehicle warranty service contracts. Imposter scams in which scammers falsely claimed to represent government agencies, like the Internal Revenue Service, or utility companies were also a big issue. The goal of these scams is to trick consumers into sharing their personal information.

There were also two new complaint categories in the 2017 top ten list. There were 195 complaints in the Medical Services category, which includes complaints related to clinics, hospitals, and medical professional services. Most of the complaints in this category were about billing disputes, misrepresentations, and unauthorized charges.

In addition, there were 113 complaints in the Fuel Quality category in 2017. This was an increase of 33 from 2016. Most of the complaints were about the quality of fuel at gas stations.

DATCP received a total of 10,756 complaints to the Bureau of Consumer Protection and another 456 to the Bureau of Weights & Measures. In addition, the agency returned almost \$2.7 million to Wisconsin, most of it going to consumers in the form of refunds, negotiated settlements, or restitution ordered by a court.

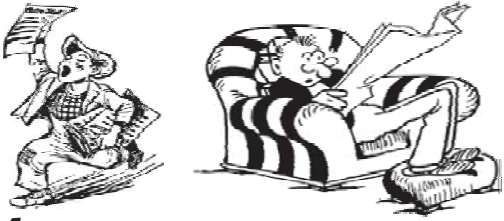

Mursau announces recent School Safety Grant recipients

Madison ... Representative Jeff Mursau (R-Crivitz) was happy to attend the School Safety Grant presentation in Wausau today alongside local school officials and law enforcement personnel as well as other members of the Wisconsin Legislature. During the presentation, Attorney General Brad Schimel announced the most recent recipients of School Safety grants, and among the grants announced were four to school districts serving the 36th Assembly District:

Oconto Falls Public School District - \$122,496

Wabeno Area School District - \$39,477

Suring Public School District - \$38,502

Menominee Indian Tribe of Wisconsin - \$20,000

"I am glad I was able to participate in today's event," said Mursau. "Four other schools in the 36th Assembly District have received grants already, and I am so glad to see four more added to that list."

The School Safety Grant Program was created by last session's bill, 2017 Act 143. The program administered by the Office of School Safety at the DOJ is set to award a total of \$100 million in grant funds to Wisconsin schools to enhance school safety and preparedness. Already, more than \$26 million has been awarded to school districts statewide, with more being awarded in the near future.

"I am proud to have supported this bill when it was on the Assembly floor this session," expressed Mursau. "It's great to think about the impact these grant funds will have on our schools. It will certainly be a great step towards making them safer for our students, teachers and staff."

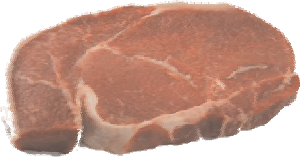

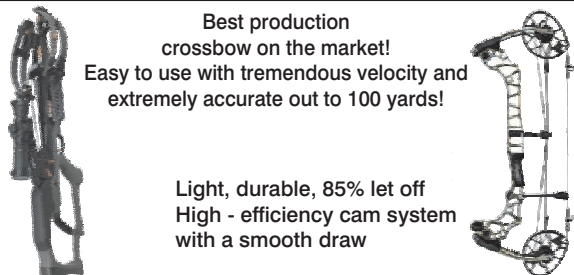

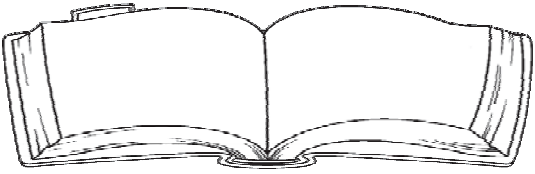

Application forms are being sent to all homes with a notice to parents or guardians. To apply for free or reduced price meals or free milk, households must fill out the application and return it to the school (unless notified at the start of the school year that children are eligible through direct certification). Additional copies are available at the office in each school. The information provided on the application will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by agency or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

To obtain free or reduced price meals or free milk for children in a household where one or more household members receive FoodShare, FDIPIR, or Wisconsin Works (W-2) cash benefits, list the FoodShare, FDIPIR or W-2 case number, list the names of all school children, sign the application, and return it to the school office.

For the school officials to determine eligibility for free or reduced price meals or free milk of households not receiving FoodShare, FDIPIR or W-2 cash benefits, the household must provide the following information requested on the application: names of all household members, total number of household members, and the adult signing the application form must also list the last four digits of his or her Social Security Number or mark the box to the right of "Check if no SSN". Also, the income received by each household member must be provided by amount and source (wages, welfare, child support, etc.).

Under the provisions of the free and reduced price meal and free milk policy the High School Secretary will review applications and determine eligibility. If a parent or guardian is dissatisfied with the ruling of the official, he/she may wish to discuss the decision with the determining official on an informal basis. If the parent/guardian wishes to make a formal appeal, he/she may make a request either orally or in writing to: Samantha Hoffman, School Board Clerk, 5216 Forest Ave., Ste. A, Laona, WI 54541 or call 715-674-3801 Ext. 2.

If a hearing is needed to appeal the decision, the policy contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

If a household member becomes unemployed or if the household size changes, the family should contact the school. Such changes may make the household eligible for reduced price meals or free meals or free milk if the household income falls at or below the levels shown above, and they may reapply at that time.

Children formally placed in foster care are also eligible for free meal benefits. Foster children may be certified as eligible without a household application. Households with foster children and non-foster children may choose to include the foster child as a household member, as well as any personal income available to the foster child, on the same application that includes their non-foster children.

The information provided by the household on the application is confidential. Public Law 103-448 limits the release of student free and reduced price school meal eligibility status to persons directly connected with the administration and enforcement of federal or state educational programs. Consent of the parent/guardian is needed for other purposes such as waiver of text book fees.
