"Are you a Conservationist?" People often confuse natural resource conservation with preservation. In my college years, "A Sand County Almanac" by Aldo Leopold was required reading. Aldo Leopold is often referred to as the father of modern conservation. Leopold's "Land Ethic" called for moral responsibility to the natural world. At the core of the idea of a land ethic is simply caring: about people, about land, and about strengthening the relationships between them. Leopold's vision grew out of a set of values that he developed from a lifetime of experiences in the outdoors. Leopold wrote that "we can only be ethical in relation to something we can see, understand, feel, love, or otherwise have faith in."

While I did further my education in a conservation" field, my ethical understanding of conservation was created long before that time, growing up fishing, hunting, and spending time in the forest with my family and later as part of my job. My father taught us early on, "You only shoot what you are going to eat". He also told us about the forest conditions from the past, the history of logging camps in the area, and how those conditions, and deer hunting changed through time. We grew up learning the forests and lowlands by using "swamp roads" and ridges as our guides and watching conversions of hardwood areas to clear-cuts and then plantations. We also had a firm understanding that logging in the forest created changes that were good for wildlife and also that logging is what kept us fed and our local businesses in operation. I am sure that many of the readers of this article learned "conservation" the same way as I, and they too are conservationist.

Many people view fishing and hunting as recreation, and we must all understand that fishing and hunting are truly and integral part of conservation. Hunting and fishing are the most common way for many people to spend time on the land and over the years remember conditions and how they change. Management of fish and game populations are the goal of bag limits set by the Department of Natural Resources. Hunters and fishermen carry out the management portion of that conservation

\$1.5 Million in Community Development grants awarded locally

Madison ... Representative Jeff Mursau (RCrivitz) congratulates three local communities that, together, received \$1.5 million in funds through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Public Facility and Planning Funds. Governor Walker announced late last week that almost \$15 million in grants were awarded to thirty three communities around the state, including three from the 36th Assembly District:

** City of Crandon - \$500,000 for infrastructure and street improvements, including sanitary sewer system improvements.

** Village of Suring - \$500,000 for water system improvements.

** Village of Wausaukee - \$500,000 for a new well.

"It was great to hear that not one, but three local communities were selected to receive these funds," expressed Mursau. "Funding these vital community projects will help maintain and improve the quality of life that our citizens have."

These grants go to communities around the state to help improve streets, community buildings, water systems and more as a way to help revitalize communities. The funds come from the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and are awarded annually by the Wisconsin Department of Administration through a rigorous application process.

According to Crandon's City Hall, these funds will be used to upgrade sewer and water infrastructure next year.

Crandon's sidewalk controversy

If you have been to downtown Crandon since the recent replacement of the sidewalks, you probably feel a little like a mountain goat in spots. The angle of the sidewalk, while not too much of a problem right now, doesn't bode well for winter ice and snow.

To understand the start of this problem, we have to back up to 2002, when the state came in, fixed Hwy 8 and decided that we needed new sidewalks, complete with the hated bump-outs. It was the state's concrete formula that was required to be used and not Flannery's concrete formula. In fact, they were told by Flannerys that it wasn't the correct formula for our winter weather and the necessary salt that has to be used by business owners, lest they be taken to court by somebody who has fallen on the ice


The sidewalk we had last time started to deteriorate in a short time. In addition, because the west side of the street is higher than the east, the road was always higher on the west side than the east, to match the elevation of the buildings. The engineer back in '02 wanted a level street, resulting in the step and the railing we all hated.

Unfortunately, somebody in Madison decided that we don't take care of our roads here in the backward North, and he refused to let the street be put back in the elevation it was in since the 1930's until 2002. Now we have no step, but the engineers weren't allowed to raise the west side of the street a few inches, so several of our businesses have a "ski slope" in front of their stores.

In addition, when the old sidewalks were removed, the rough edges of the old buildings were now exposed, and because a spacer was used against the buildings, business owners now have holes between the sidewalks and the buildings. It appears that filling the new gaps will be the responsibility of the business owner.





Bear cub rescued

Wonderful resources in the Northwoods are often taken for granted. Here two wonderful assets to our community joined to save a tiny bear cub.. The bear cub was found and reported to law enforcement by a utility worker, and the actions of help began. The two officers took extraordinary care to make sure the area was safe in the event of a mother bear and monitored the little cub. They also called for rescue of the tiny little guy. Wild Instincts sent a team to pick him up, and take him in for

Upon update on the little guy, he is currently in critical condition at the Wild Instincts Rehabilitation center. recovering from starvation, which leads to the belief he had been on his own for some time, he also is being treated for multiple respiratory issues. He can now stand and walk a little and eats "bear smoothies" to help him gain weight and recover. Although the initial thought was that he had been hit by a vehicle, which has not ruled out, the other factors have may have caused his collapse.

When this little guy pulls through and is strong enough, there are nine other cubs Wild Instinct is rehabilitating that he will be able to join and play with until ready for release.

This is just another way Law Enforcement goes above and beyond the call of duty in the Forest County joining with a wildlife rescue resource we are all lucky to have.. Donations can be made to Wild Instincts to help in the expenses of saving our injured wildlife.

Frank J. Parzatka

On July 30, 2018, Heaven gained a true hero Frank Joe Parzatka (Parzy), passed from this life peacefully in his sleep at the grand age of 101 years old.

He was born on April 10, 1917 to Albert Joe Parzatka (1884-1956) and Mary (Bedznar) Parzatka (1897-1922) in Chicago, Illinois. After Frank's mother passed away when he was 5 years old, his father remarried Frank's step-mother, Anna Barbara (1877-1958). Frank had one brother, Albert Paul Parzatka (1918-1999) and one sister-in-law, Ailie M. Parzatka (1916 - present).

Frank's family moved to Armstrong Creek from Chicago in 1923 when he was six years old. He attended Engelking School through 7th grade, and then began working on area farms. At age 18, he joined the "CCC Camp" (Civilian Conservation Corps) and worked there for 3 years placing telephone poles and planting trees for \$1/day. Frank then moved back to Chicago for a time, working for Illinois Tool Works where he got paid .55 cents/hr when most jobs nearer to Armstrong Creek were paying .28 cents per hour.

In 1942, he enlisted in the Army and had basic training at Fort Sill, OK. When the war began in 1942, Frank was a PFC in the 82nd infantry, and then was a member of the 101st Airborne. On June 6th, 1944 (D-Day), Frank was on the Susan B. Anthony when the ship struck a floating mine. The ship was destroyed and they lost most of their belongings and weapons. Miraculously, there were no casualties, and they were picked up by other destroyer ships They arrived on Omaha Beach, Normandy on D-Day + 1, where they scrounged for equipment and weapons from the already deceased. He was then sent to Holland, and on September 17th, they invaded Holland by gliders, which were made of only plywood and canvas. The gliders were nicknamed "flying coffins". Frank recalled there was 73 days of rain in Holland, during which time they had to sleep on the ground. After that, they were in constant combat including the Battle of the Bulge in Bastogne, Belgium. He was Honorably discharged on December 2, 1945.

For his heroic service and achievement, Frank was decorated with many medals and awards, including the Bronze Star, 4 Battle Stars for his involvement in 4 major battles during WWII, a Glider Badge, Good Conduct Medal, and a Presidential Citation.

After the war, he moved back to Armstrong Creek and worked at the Goodman Mill until 1947. He then went to Chicago again and worked for Zenith for a short time, and then back to Armstrong Creek and worked for the Soo Line railroad until he retired in 1979. To travel back and forth, he either hitchhiked or took a 7 hour train ride for \$6.

Frank's first vehicle was a Model T truck that he paid \$10 for. He also owned a '31 Model A and a '73 Mustang to name a few. He always wanted a Harley but never owned one.

Frank's simplicity and humbleness, along with his love of God and the bible, brought him happiness for many years. Anyone that knew him, knows that he lived simply. He lived in the same two room cabin his parents had bought, without any plumbing, running water or conveniences of any kind. He exercised or walked every day, as well as doing outdoor work daily. He lived there until 2007, when he moved into a new house on the property. His first home with a bathroom, running water, and "modern conveniences" as he called them. He learned how to use a washing machine (not a wringer washer!) and a microwave. The house has a beautiful view of the Armstrong Creek and wildlife. He would look out big window and say "This is as close to Heaven as I'm going to get, until I get there".

In 2011, after he was unable to drive any longer due to his declining eyesight, he decided to move into King Veterans Home in Waupaca, where he resided until his death. There he was described as "one of a kind", "a cool guy", "always cheerful", "a sweetheart", "always helpful" among many other accolades. He would push the people in their wheelchairs to the dining room, and help with setting tables, while being one of the oldest people there. I didn't have my facts correct, and I am truly sorry. Hopefully, we can work together in the future.



Grouse Hunting, Sporting Clays classes at Nicolet Outdoor Adventure program



Fall means grouse hunting for many in the Northwoods and Nicolet College's Outdoor Adventure program is offering two new classes to help hunters experience more success in the field.

How to Find and Hunt Grouse will be held from 10 a.m. to noon, Saturday, Aug. 25, in the Fieldside Center on the Nicolet Campus.

Topics in this introductory class will include the best places to find grouse, what to look for in grouse habitat, hunting with and without a dog, and staying safe in the woods. Gun handling; gun, shot, and choke selection; and shooting techniques will also be covered. Cost is \$20. This will be followed two weeks later with Introduction to Sporting Clays from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m., Saturday, Sept. 8, at the Harshaw Sport Club, 10047 Rocky Run Road, Harshaw

Participants will have the opportunity to dial in their aim in this class held one week prior to the opening of grouse hunting season.

Instructors will share shooting tips and work with participants one-on-one and in small groups. Here, instructors will take small groups of three to four students through the 11-station, 50-clay course where the clays fly all different directions and at varying speeds. Participants must have a semi-automatic, double-barrel, or pump shotgun. Participants also need to bring eye protection, ear plugs, and at least 75 shells to the start of class. Cost is \$50.

House passes Senator Baldwin's health bill


care workforce to safeguard and improve the quality of care for the growing number of patients with serious or life-threatening illnesses."

The Palliative Care and Hospice Education and Training Act would strengthen training for new and existing physicians, those who teach palliative care, and other providers who are part of the palliative care team to give patients and their families a voice in their care and treatment goals. It also boosts palliative care research and provides academic and career awards to incentivize the practice and study of palliative and hospice care.

This bill has strong support, including Alzheimer's Association, the American Cancer Society Cancer Action Network (ACS CAN), and the American Academy of Hospice and Palliative Medicine (AAHPM). Wisconsin groups supporting PCHETA include the Alzheimer's Association Wisconsin Chapters, Alzheimer's & Dementia Alliance of Wisconsin, Wisconsin Aging Advocacy Network and the Palliative Care Network of Wisconsin.

Palliative care and hospice care focus on relieving and preventing patients' suffering and improving their quality of life. This team-based approach focuses on the patients' needs, explains treatment options and gives patients and their families a voice in realizing their treatment goals.
