
Crandon School Board learns outcome of investigation of District Administrator

The Crandon School District held a meeting on Tuesday, August 29 at 6:00 p.m. in the auditorium. The purpose of the meeting was to hear from the Forest County District Attorney Chuck Simono on the investigation of the District Administrator, Dr. Doug Kryder, review the school safety grant, discuss the 2018 - 2019 social media contract. In the closed session they would discuss 2018-2019 nursing services contract, 2018-2019 vacancies, the National Honor Society Advisor, part-time Middle School Special Education Paraprofessional, grade 2 teacher, discussion of current District Administrator and potential litigation and discussion for potential Interim District Administrator.

After a quorum was established and the agenda was approved, the floor was handed over to Chuck Simono. Chuck stated that the investigation was solely about any misconduct between Dr. Doug Kryder and McKinstry, a contractor, and if this investigation lead to any other criminal activity, they would follow that lead, but there were no leads to other criminal activity at this time.

The points that the District Attorney made were; Dr. Kryder's pre-existing relationship with employees at McKinstry based on e-mail communications McKinstry and Dr. Kryder, the relationships were not disclosed by Dr. Kryder to anyone on the existing school board at the time the McKinstry contract was being talked about and ultimately agreed upon. This is according to six interviews of school staff and board members, none of them were aware of a relationship between Dr. Kryder and McKinstry. Two people interviewed were aware of frequent golf trips

taught when you find yourself in a hole you stop digging. We can't expect to solve these problems with the thinking that got us here. There's a better way forward, and that's why I'm running." A major priority for Meier is economic development and job creation that is compatible with the 34th Assembly District's thriving tourism economy. "To support and grow our tourism industry, we need a Marshall Plan for robust, reliable, reasonably-priced broad-band, high-speed internet," he said.

Wisconsin native and 25-year resident of Vilas County, Meier is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. He was a classroom teacher in the Phelps School District for 16 years and is an Adjunct Instructor at Nicolet Technical College in Rhinelander. with an employee of McKinstry, but thought that it was through an annual school conference. One interview expressed concerns over the fact that Kryder had a personal relationship with Lee Pritzl, an employee of McKinstry, which included golfing together, drinks, joint vacations, invites for golf outings with McKinstry and according to interviews, Dr. Kryder recommended the Energy Exemption Contract with McKinstry without disclosing his relationship with Lee Pritzl nor any ongoing relationship with McKinstry. Chuck shared e-mails between Dr. Kryder and McKinstry explaining why he felt that an ethical violation took place. Simono stated that he feels that on completion of the investigation, the current evidence does not support the filing of criminal charges. He further states that if new evidence comes to light, that he will review the charging decision to see if charges would be warranted. Simono answered any concerns that the audience had. People asked about differences of ethical and criminal violations. People asked where to give any information they may have. Simono replied that Lincoln County or Forest County or the District Attorney Office are the places you can contact. People asked the board about what we as a district was going to do without a district administrator. After closed session, the board announced the hiring of a second grade teacher, Brady Saunders, Erica Neilitz for the Nursing Services and a support staff person was hired. The school board stated that there were no actions taken on the District Administrator, but they are working diligently to resolve the situation as quickly as they can.

To the Editor:

At this month's Forest County Board Meeting held Tuesday, August 21, a resolution was presented describing a referendum to appear on the fall ballot regarding the legalization of medical marijuana in the state of WI. The resolution presented to the county board looked for the support of the board to allow the referendum to be brought to a vote in the fall election. The resolution passed 16 to 4 with one supervisor absent.

I was one of the supervisors who voted against the referendum. I'd like to explain why I made that decision on behalf of my constituents.

Arguments can be made regarding the logistics of legalizing marijuana in Wisconsin. The Farm Bill of 2014 gave Wisconsin farmers the right to obtain licensing to grow hemp. Years ago, hemp was a booming crop harvested for many years in our state. Hemp was in later years banned because of it's look alike cannabis, marijuana. Hemp can be used for making rope, material, foods and many other things. CBD oil is an oil that has been claimed to successfully help people with various conditions as a topical ointment and another form is used to ease seizures in certain medical conditions. CBD oil lives in a gray area in Wisconsin. As long as this oil is produced properly, this oil has claimed to help many people in many ways, and can be produced with hemp. The hemp crops may help Wisconsin farmers fill a void with today's volatile markets. The CBD oil needs to have a THC level of less than .3% in order to be legal in Wisconsin. THC is the substance that creates the "high", "euphoria", or mind altering effect. It is highly improbable a CBD oil patient would get high on properly farmed hemp. The THC content is too low. A person will not receive a THC high from CBD oil created from hemp, but will receive the medicinal effects. The FDA has not approved, as of yet, CBD oil or marijuana for medicinal purposes. When they do, then, as any other prescription you have from your doctor, you will be able to go to Wolf River or Crandon Pharmacy and get it filled. Until then, IF medical marijuana is legalized in Wisconsin, marijuana products will be available from dispensaries, not our family druggist. Please read what Marinette County had to say about the problems they are having with the legalization of medical marijuana in the neighboring state. This is taken from an article written this spring by Sarah Thomsen, WBAY news in Green Bay: 'Local police say plenty of people are getting high in Michigan and driving into Wisconsin. Medical marijuana has been legal in Michigan since 2008.

"What we're seeing is it's all throughout the day. It's not just morning, not just night. It's whenever people self-medicate," says Deputy David Oginski, Marinette County Sheriff's Office.'

There are many other articles on the border issues.

Let's investigate all the possibilities of hemp. The hemp plant could provide all the medicinal qualities of marijuana, with less risk of foul play.

Do your own homework before you vote. Use trusted sources. Make an educated decision.

In closing, I would like to apologize for blanking out when I tried to speak at the board meeting. I have done all my homework, however, the talk of cancer runs in the background and pulls emotions and the memories are just very fresh at times. I appreciate your understanding.







Goodman-Armstrong Creek School District Annual Notice of Special Education Referral and Evaluation Procedures

Upon request, Goodman-Armstrong Creek School District is required to evaluate a student placed in the institution for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the student has a disability, and if the student needs special education services. A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a student residing in the institution, brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability, has a legal duty to refer the student to the facility in which the student resides. Before referring the student, the person making the referral must inform the student's parents that the referral will be made. Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a student residing in the institution is a child with a disability, may also refer the student to the facility in which the student resides. Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the student is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting the administration staff at Goodman-Armstrong Creek School District 715-336-2575 or by writing 1 Falcon Crest, Goodman, WI 54125.

NOTICE - GOODMAN-ARMSTRONG CREEK PARENTS/GUARDIANS.

Dear Parents & Guardians:

The purpose of this is to provide notice on issues as required by federal and/or state law in the matter of your child's education.

FERPA (Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act) & Student Privacy-We provide notice that you have the right to:

1. Inspect and review your son or daughter's education records. Requests for review of student records shall be made in writing to the school principal.

2. Seek amendment of the student's education records that you believe to be inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of your student's privacy rights.

3. Consent to disclosures of personally identifiable information contained in the student's education records, except to the extent that FERPA (and other federal and state laws) authorize disclosure without consent. As example, the District may disclose records to other school officials or to school officials that have requested the records of which the student seeks or intends to enroll in. These exceptions can be requested per Goodman-Armstrong Creek School District Board Policy 347, Wisconsin Statutes 118.25 and as defined by FERPA.

The professional qualifications of your child's teachers, including a)whether the teacher has met state licensing criteria for the grade level(s) and subject area(s) taught(b) whether the teacher is teaching under emergency or provisional status through which state licensing criteria have been waived; c) the undergraduate degree major of the teacher, and any graduate certification of degree held by the teacher, including the field of discipline of the certification of the degree.

2. The professional qualifications of paraprofessionals providing instructional-related services to your child.

**HUMAN GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT-No student is required to take instruction in human growth and development generally or in specified subjects within the program if the parent/guardian files a written request that the student be exempted. If a student is exempted, they will still receive instruction in the subjects under section 118.01(2)(d)2c of the state statutes (knowledge of physiology and hygiene, sanitation, the effects of controlled substances and alcohol upon the human system, symptoms of disease and the proper care of the body), unless exempted, and section 118.01(2)(d)8 of the state statutes (knowledge of effective means by which students may recogniz, avoid, prevent and halt physically or psychologically intrusive or abusive situations which may be harmful to students).

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Improvements Act defines children and youth who are homeless (twenty-one years of age and younger) as:

Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and 1. adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:

2 Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.

Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, 3. public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.

Migratory children who qualify as homeless 4. because they are living in circumstances described above.

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children who may qualify according to the above criteria, the Goodman-Armstrong Creek School District provides the following assurances to parents of homeless children:

There shall be immediate enrollment and school participation, even if educational and medical records and proof of residency are not available.

2. All educational opportunities and related opportunities for homeless students (preschool to age 21), including unaccompanied youth, shall be the same as for the general student population.

Enrollment and transportation rights, including transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" is defined as the school the child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled.

Written explanation of a child or youth's school 4. placement, other than school of origin or the school requested by the parent, with the right to appeal within the local dispute resolution process.

Meaningful opportunities for parents to participate in the education of their children. These shall include: special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.


