Conservation Corner

A Call for Action- USFS Recreation Program Public Input

Last week I was assigned to attend a stakeholders meeting with the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest regarding recreational facilities on the National Forest. CNNF staff has been working to develop a sustainable recreation program with specific focus on campgrounds, boat landings, trailheads, picnic areas and beaches. As per their staff and the website, the Forest can no longer afford to finance aging facilities, underused picnic area, campsites, and recreation areas. At the meeting USFS staff presented draft proposed management actions in which 45 sites would have no changes, 22 sites would be essentially eliminated by conversion to general forest area as infrastructure is removed and the remaining 126 sites would have varying proposed actions ranging from increased amenities to changes in the level of operation and maintenance. The comment period for this proposal is currently open.

This week I completed a review of the USFS proposed actions related to sites within Forest County or those in close proximity to our county line. Actions within these areas will have potential positive and negative impacts to our businesses, our residents and the visitors to our area.

To the benefit of Forest County businesses, residents, and visitors, improvements will be made at 8 campgrounds including those at Ada Lake, Anvil Lake, Bear Lake, Franklin Lake, Kentuck Lake, Laura Lake, Pine Lake and Richardson Lake. The people and businesses of Forest County must make their voices heard and show support for these improvements in USFS facilities, maintenance and improvement of facilities are critical to our county and our towns and our economy.

Negative impacts of the proposal to Forest County businesses, residents and visitors include elimination of 7 recreational sites by conversion to forest areas. The proposed elimination includes the Big Joe Canoe Access and Campground, the Brule River Campground and Canoe Landing, the Burnt Bridge Canoe Access, the Burton Wells



President Trump signs Buy America Reform into Law

WASHINGTON, D.C. - Today, President Trump signed into law bipartisan water infrastructure legislation that includes a requirement pushed by U.S. Senator Tammy Baldwin that federally funded water infrastructure projects use American-made iron and steel.

Senator Baldwin has long championed stronger Buy America standards and her Made in America Water Infrastructure Act requires that 100 percent Americanmade iron and steel is used in water infrastructure projects funded by the Drinking Water State Revolving Fund. The bipartisan Water Resources Development Act (WRDA) signed by President Trump includes a five-year extension of Buy America requirements for water infrastructure projects funded by the Drinking Water State Revolving

"A five-year Buy America standard is better than the status quo and President Trump has taken an important step forward on our shared goal of making sure taxpayer money is not spent supporting foreign workers," said Senator Baldwin. "I will continue fighting for a permanent Buy America commitment from Washington that rewards our Made in Wisconsin workers and manufacturers"

On April 18, 2017, while visiting Kenosha, local media asked President Trump if he supported Senator Baldwin's permanent Buy America standard. President Trump said "I do," and also said, "I agree with her 100 percent." The bipartisan WRDA legislation he signed today includes a Buy America requirement through at least





Senior Chatter

Quiz: How well do you know Social Security?

Question:

- 1. You can increase your monthly Social Security benefits by delaying receiving benefits until age 67.
 - 2. Children can receive Social Security benefits.
- 3. When a person claims spousal benefits, it causes their spouse or ex-spouse's Social Security benefit to be reduced.
- Government workers do not pay into Social Security.
- 5. A divorced spouse can only collect benefits on an ex-spouse's record if the former spouse has already claimed benefits.
- 6. You can collect two full checks at the same time a spousal benefit and a benefit based on your own work record.
- 7. An annual cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) is guaranteed.
- 8. Foreign citizens cannot collect Social Security benefits.
- 9. If I keep working while collecting benefits, my income will be subject to the payroll tax.
- 10. A couple must be married for at least 10 years before a person can collect spousal benefits on their partner's record.

Answers

- 1. True. For those born in 1960 or later, the full retirement age is 67. If you receive benefits before reaching that age, then your monthly benefits will be reduced, depending on how early you begin receiving them. (The earliest age you can begin receiving benefits is 62).

- 3. False. Spousal benefits do not cause the primary earner's benefit to be reduced, even if more than one person is claiming on that record.
- 4. False. Since 1984, all new federal government employees, including members of Congress, have been paying into social security and are eligible for full benefits.
- 5. False. Divorced spouses do not have to wait for their former spouse to claim benefits, but they do have to wait for their ex to turn 62 before they can claim on their record.
- 6. False. A person can collect on only one record at a time. However, in some cases it is possible to switch benefits to maximize your lifetime income.
- 7. False. COLA increases are based on inflation. If there is no inflation in a given year, benefits will remain the same in the following year.
- 8. False. As long as a person has paid into Social Security for 40 quarters (10 years), he or she will be eligible for Social Security benefits. Foreign citizens can also qualify for spousal benefits under certain circumstances.
- 9. True. Payroll taxes are deducted from almost all workers' paychecks, regardless of age. While you cannot avoid these taxes, it is possible that they can increase your monthly benefit in the future.
- 10. False. The 10-year rule only applies to divorced couples that are claiming on their former spouse's record. Newly married couples only have to wait one year before they become eligible for a spousal benefit.





elimination number to 9 sites. The people and businesses of Forest County must make their voices heard and provide negative comments for the elimination of these USFS facilities, it is critical to our county and our towns to maintain a maximum number of facilities for visitors and residents alike for our economy.

I would like to express my opinion on elimination of canoe accesses and river sites in the USFS proposal. During my lifetime in Forest County the canoe accesses had good usage approximately 15-20 years ago. At that time the USFS made efforts to cut trees across the river routes between landings annually, usually utilizing students from the Blackwell Job Corps. The practice of maintenance of the river routes has since ceased. The result is that the canoe landings have little use. At this point when kayak use is becoming very popular by residents and visitors, it is a very poor time to eliminate stream facilities that could ultimately benefit Forest County. I would recommend that users interested in canoeing and kayaking and businesses that benefit from these users comment on the online site or at the hearings.

One other item that I found to be a negative impact is proposed reduced maintenance on sites including snowplowing. The particular concern I have is elimination of snowplowing at Butternut Lake, Franklin Lake, Halsey Lake, Kentuck Lake, Laurel Lake, Lost Lake, Lower Nine Mile Lake, and Stevens Lake. This elimination of snowplowing will likely result in little or no access for ice fishermen on those lakes. I would recommend that ice fishermen comment on the online site or at the hearings.

We all understand the impacts of the National Forest on our property tax base. It is time for us as residents, business owners and users to promote and retain recreational facilities and maintenance that benefit our economy and our forest use.

Increased access by ATV's to sites was not addressed in this proposal, increased access to mountain bikes was not addressed in this proposal, increase access and maintenance of hunter walking trails was not addressed in this proposal.



Five Crandon Lions provided vision screening for first, third and fifth grades on Tuesday October 16th. 183 students were screened using LEA symbols on a chart at a distance of 10 feet. Both left and right eyes were screened. About nine percent of the students were identified with signs of possible eye trouble. Parents and guardians were mailed the results of their students screening. If a problem was detected, a professional eye examination is recommended. If a hardship is a factor in providing additional testing, please contact a Crandon Lions Club member. The club is always available to help.

Why is screening important? Vision problems affect one in every four school aged child and one in every twenty preschool aged child. Eighty percent of a child learning is related to sight.

Since Lions Club International was founded in 1917, Lions have worked on projects designed to prevent blindness, restore eyesight and improve eye health for hundreds of millions of people worldwide.

The Lions Club is always looking for new members. The Lions Club meets every third Monday of the month at Duck's Bar at 5:30 p.m. The meetings are open to the public. Well Woman program provides breast cancer screenings

October is National Breast Cancer Awareness Month and to raise awareness, the Forest County Health Department encourages annual well woman visits and breast cancer screening with mammograms. The benefit of having regular mammograms is finding breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat. Women age 40 and older should discuss when to begin breast cancer screening and how often to have a mammogram with their health care provider.

"Not all women have insurance to cover the cost of breast cancer screening", states WI Well Woman Program Northern Region Coordinator Nichole Peplinski, "and there is a state-wide program to help these women receive this service".

WI Well Woman Program provides FREE mammograms and other breast cancer screenings to eligible women ages 45-64, or ages 35-44 with breast symptoms or concerns. The program also provides cervical cancer screenings.

"Women with little or no health insurance that are in need a mammogram are encouraged to contact the WI Well Woman Program," states Peplinski.

Oneida County Health Department provides case management for women enrolled in WI Well Woman Program for nine counties in Northern Wisconsin: Oneida, Ashland, Bayfield, Florence, Forest, Iron, Price, Sawyer and Vilas.
