Wabeno Lions will be singing Christmas Carols (Rumored that Santa may show up!)



"A Lakeside Companion" What all lake lovers should know about

know about the lakes we enjoy and live with

Many of us live on or own property on one of our northern Wisconsin lakes. We may dearly love the waters that surround us in this water-rich environment, but do we understand our lakes and streams?

Ted Rulseh, the author of this informative book, lives on a lake west of Rhinelander. He has written a book that not only covers the science of our lakes, but has presented it in a manner that the average person can read and understand. It is a science work for the individual that will explain the things you see in and on the water when on your favorite lake, and cover the sights and changes to the lakes by the seasons of the year.

The reader will better understand the food chain of lakes, from the zooplankton that feeds the minnows that feed that big pike that broke your line last summer. Plant life, water clarity, types of lakes, the relationship to the groundwater, and even some advice on fishing make the book a good read and an important one as well.

The book is important because besides informing the reader of water quality, plant, animal and fish species in a lake and the science at work in our favorite waters, the author gives very good advice on how important water quality is and what can change a lake from a good fishery and swimming hole into something far less. This book should be required reading for members of lake associations and everybody else who uses and enjoys the public waters.

This book is available at Tricia's Treasures in Crandon, and, of course, on Amazon and Barnes & Noble. "A Lakeside Companion" will make a great Christmas gift, but is also a great reference for anybody's library who has a love for our northern Wisconsin waters.

SUPERINTENDENT'S CORNER

Christmas is fast approaching. The day carried the strong tradition of families gathering together to share in the love that signified Christ's birth. The memories we have and the memories we are building this Christmas will be precious to our families for a lifetime.

Sadly, each Christmas, the season can seem to be more commercialized, more stressful, more glitz and less of what we truly want. Several years ago, a study was conducted to determine order: 1) relaxed loving time with family; 2) realistic expectations about gifts; 3) an evenly paced holiday season; and 4) strong family traditions. 



Enhance funding and financial stability.

In addition to the open house, people can also comment on the plan through a public input form on the SCORP page of the DNR website. The form is intended to gather perspectives about the draft SCORP and ideas people may have to improve the document. 

Staying Well - Added Sugars

Submitted by UW-Extension

What are added sugars?

Added sugars are sugars, syrups and other caloric sweeteners that are added to foods or beverages when they are processed or prepared. Keep in mind added sugars do not include naturally occurring sugars, such as what is found in milk and fruit.

What foods provide the most added sugar?

Major sources of added sugars come from regular soft drinks and sugar sweetened drinks (sweet tea, coffee beverages, fruit drinks, etc). We also get added sugar from candy, desserts and many other processed foods, such as sandwich breads, crackers, soups, cereals, etc.

How do I know if sugar is added or natural?

The current nutrition facts label lists sugar under carbohydrates. This only tells you how much sugar is in the food you are consuming, not how much is added or natural. We hope to see changes to the label in July 2018. To determine if a sugar is added, check the ingredients list. The following is a list of ingredients that indicates that sugar has been added: Anhydrous dextrose, brown sugar, cane crystals, cane juice, cane sugar, confectioners powdered sugar, corn sweetener, corn syrup, corn syrup solids, crystal dextrose, crystalline fructose, dextrose, evaporated corn sweetener, evaporated can juice, fructose, fruit juice concentrate, fruit nectar, glucose, high-fructose corn syrup (HFCS), honey, inver sugar, lactose, liquid fructose, maltose, malt sugar, malt syrup, maple syrup, molasses, pancake syrup, raw sugar, sucrose, sugar, sugar cane juice, syrup and white granulated sugar.




