Laona Rescue Unit was recently given a donation from the Forest County Potawatomi Community to purchase a Lifepack 15 monitor/defibrillator. The older Lifepack 12's that the squad has are not being supported by the manufacturer, and new monitors cost approximately \$40,000. Laona Rescue carries one of these monitors in each of its three new ambulances.

The monitor has cardiac monitoring capabilities, pulse oximetry, end-tidal CO2 monitoring, automated blood pressure, and the ability to transmit 12-lead EKG's to the hospital.

Since being put in service at the Wabeno station, this monitor has transmitted four "heart attacks" that needed immediate transport to the Cath Lab. Laona Rescue is extremely grateful to have recieved this generous donation from the Forest County Potawatomi Community.

Laona Rescue will be doing different fundraisers throughout the year to raise funds to purchase the additional two monitors that are needed for the other two squads. Any donations that are received throughout the year will go toward these monitors. Two current events are the gift wrapping that is going on now and Breakfast With Santa on December 23rd.



Every December 25th, the Sokaogon Chippewa Community celebrates the life of Chief Willard Ackley. The day is recognized as a National Holiday within the Tribe. It is said Chief Ackley was an expert in many Ojibwe customs, from the use of traditional plant medicines, to hunting and fishing, to the creation of birch bark crafts. He taught many in the ways of the natural laws. He was also an ambassador of goodwill and advocated for the advancement of Indian people into the 20th century. To this day, his legacy lives on among the people of Mole Lake.

The Treaty of 1854, also known as the second Treaty of LaPointe, established the various reservations of the Ojibwe. Although this was to include the Mole Lake and St. Croix Bands, both were left without a land base and placed the people of each Tribe in great peril. The Tribe, under the leadership of Chief Ackley, finally, and after a long struggle, received federal recognition and reservation status in 1937.

Chief Ackley met with many government officials to obtain federal recognition for the Sokaogon Chippewa. At a 1934 meeting in Ashland, Bureau of Indian Affairs Commissioner John Collier asked Chief Ackley where he wanted the reservation to be. Chief Ackley stated he wanted the reservation to be located at Rice Lake for the wild rice beds. The Chief took a handful of wild rice out of his pocket and stated, "This is the food of Indian people."

In 1962, with the help of his sister, Alice A. Randall, Chief Ackley was able to successfully apply for a Historical Marker retelling the story of the Battle of Mole Lake.

"Wisconsin should have never signed on to this lawsuit and Scott Walker has not only broken his promise to protect people with pre-existing conditions, he has now signed legislation preventing Governor-elect Evers from keeping his promise to take our state's good name off this attack on people's health care.

"This ruling is a threat because Walker's lawsuit would take away guaranteed health protections and raise costs for Wisconsinites with pre-existing conditions. But it is not the final word and we must do everything we can to stop this sabotage because if it succeeds, insurance companies will again be able to deny coverage or charge higher premiums for more than 2 million people in Wisconsin with a pre-existing condition."



Why is water so important?

More than one half of the adult human body is water. Water is the medium of all the fluids in our body. It brings nutrients to the cells in our body and removes the waste.

Fluids help to:

- Convert food into energy
- Regulate our body temperature
- · Keep us "regular"
- Protect and cushion our vital organs

Why is fluid intake a common concern for elders?

- Poor thirst recognition
- · Decreased ability to concentrate urine
- Self-imposed fluid restrictions

What happens if we don't drink enough fluids? One-third of healthy persons 65 years or older have mild dehydration. Low fluid intake of dehydration can cause:

- Difficulty swallowing
- Dry mouth due to less saliva production
- Headaches
- Fatigue
- · Loss of appetite
- Dry eyes
- Muscle cramps
- Kidney stones

How much fluid do we need?

Most elders need to drink about 6 to 8 cups of fluid a day. The amount needed depends on:

- Body weight
- Activity level
- Health condition
- The environment

Factors that increase fluid needs:

- Using products with added fiber
- Taking several medications, especially diuretics for high blood pressure

Speak with your health care provider about specific fluid requirements.

Walk with Ease program offered in Crandon

The Forest County Commission on Aging, in partnership with the Forest County Health Department, is offering a free Walk With Ease class starting January 7, 2019. Walk With Ease - a program from the Arthritis Foundation - is a structured walking program that teaches participants how to safely make physical activity part of their everyday life. The program is designed to help people living with arthritis better manage their pain and is also ideal for people without arthritis who want to make walking a daily habit.

Walk With Ease offers support, information and tools to help participants develop successful exercise routines. The nine-week group series is led by a certified instructor. During the program, participants learn proper stretching and pain management techniques; they also build stamina and walking pace. The program can even be modified to meet the needs of individual participants so that each person can develop an exercise routine that fits their unique goals.

Research shows that walking is not only good for joints, but also helps improve the health of the heart, lungs and bones. Walking can also help with weightmanagement which can reduce one's risk for arthritis in the knee, heart disease and diabetes. If you can be on your feet for 10 minutes without increased pain, you will most likely have success with Walk With Ease.

The information and strategies taught in the program are based on research and tested programs in exercise science, behavior change and arthritis management. Updated and evaluated by the Thurston Arthritis Research Center and the Institute on Aging of the University of North Carolina, Walk With Ease is shown to increase balance, strength and walking pace, as well as reduce the pain and discomfort of arthritis. The program is also shown to build participant confidence to be physically active and improve overall health.
