



Staying Well: A Bunch of Fruit and Vegetable Ideas

Submitted by UW-Extension

- Start the day with 100 percent fruit or vegetable juice.
- Add blueberries, raspberries, raisins, sliced bananas or strawberries to cereal.
- At snack time, grab: an apple or orange; a ziplock bag filled with sweet cherries, grapes, dried dates, figs, prunes, raisins or apricots; carrot sticks, broccoli or some red, yellow and green pepper. Try dipping your vegetables in low-fat salad dressing or salsa.
- Pick fruits and vegetables that require little peeling or chopping, like baby carrots, cherry tomatoes, cauliflower, grapes, apples, broccoli spears, an apple, banana or a box of 100 percent fruit or vegetable juice.
- Buy low-fat yogurt, fruit juice and fruit to blend a quick fruit smoothie.
- Add an extra vegetable dish (like carrot, corn or green beans) at dinner.
- Make a side-dish by stir frying cut vegetables with vegetable oil and seasonings.
- Try something new. Have you ever tried papayas? How about eggplant?
- Combine fruits and vegetables of different flavors and color, like red grapes with pineapple chunks, or cucumbers and red peppers.
- Keep fruits and vegetables visible and easily accessible; store cut and cleaned produce at eye-level in the refrigerator, or keep a big bowl of fruit on the table.
- At restaurants, try veggie pizza, pasta with vegetables, fresh vegetable wraps, vegetable soup or a small salad (instead of fries).
- Buy ready-to-eat packages fresh vegetables that are already cleaned.
- In a hurry? Try prepared items like sliced melons, pineapple or salad mixes from the grocery store.
- Tasty additions to salads: Green or red pepper strips, broccoli florets, carrot slices or cucumber add crunch to you pasta or potato salad; baby carrots, shredded cabbage or spinach leaves to bring color to a green salad; apple chunks, pineapples and raisins to perk up coleslaw, chicken or tuna salads; oranges, grapefruit or nectarine slices add extra flavor to any salad; fruit juice, flavored vinegars or herbs make low-fat salad dressings flavorful without adding fat or salt; or add fresh fruit and vegetables to foods you already eat like berries to yogurt, vegetables to pasta and pizza, and lettuce, tomato and onion to sandwiches.
