Conservation Corner Drain Campaign

It is that time of year when many fishermen travel to areas with open water to capture the spring runs of walleye. This traveling provides increased risk of transfer of invasive species to sites here in Forest County. This week I have tapped into the DNR for our article. The Wisconsin DNR promotes a project called the "Drain Campaign", but the practices during this campaign should be followed by fishermen year-round.

Draining live wells can stop invasive species and protect Wisconsin's waters

MADISON-Anglers will be reminded to drain live wells, bait buckets, motors and bilges before leaving a boat launch or fishing access during the statewide Drain Campaign on May 31-June 2, 2019. Water left in the boat and other equipment can transport fish diseases and aquatic invasive species between lakes, rivers and streams. For the second year, it's easier than ever to bring the message to new fishermen of all ages as the Drain Campaign coincides with Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' Free Fishing Weekend, June 1-2.

Clean Boats, Clean Waters boat inspectors made up of volunteers, regional aquatic invasive species partners and WDNR staff will talk with anglers and boaters at launches around the state. At many lakes and river accesses, they will also hand out free icepacks and other Stop Aquatic Hitchhikers! items while they remind people that icing is the best way to keep fish fresh.

"Ice is a great alternative to keep your fish fresh on the ride home," says Bob Wakeman, the statewide Aquatic Invasive Species Coordinator for the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, adding that ice is already preferred by many anglers, since it stops bacterial growth and helps to protect the flavor of your catch. "Anglers are passionate about protecting their lakes and know the right thing to do is to remove all plants and animals and drain water from their boats. That includes draining from live wells and buckets which helps keep microscopic invasive species and diseases from moving between lakes and rivers."

Goodman-Armstrong Creek School Referendum and Laona School Referendum both pass

The Goodman-Armstrong Creek School Referendum was passed by the voters by an unofficial count of 320 "yes" votes to a count of 217 "no" votes. The Laona School Referendum easily passed by a vote of 253 votes for and 124 against.

The Goodman-Armstrong Creek referendum was a hotly contested issue. Armstrong Creek voters only approved the referendum by five votes, with the bulk of the winning votes coming from the Goodman voters.

Forest County ranked 69 out of 72 counties for Health Outcomes

Forest County ranked 69 out of 72 for both health outcomes and health factors, according to the annual County Health Rankings that are released by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation and the University of Wisconsin Population Health Institute.

Health Outcomes looks at premature death rates and quality of life. Premature death rates contribute to 50% of the health outcomes ranking and is measured by the years of potential life lost before age 75. Forest County saw an increase in premature deaths in 2018. Quality of life contributes to the other 50% of the health outcomes ranking and takes into consideration percentages of people who report poor or fair health, poor physical and mental health days, and percentage of low birth weight babies born in our county. Quality of life has improved slightly compared to 2018 rankings.

There are four categories included in the Health Factors rankings: health behaviors, clinical care, social and economic factors, and physical environment.

Health Behaviors contribute to 30% of this ranking and include adult smoking, obesity, exercise, excessive drinking, alcohol-impaired driving death, sexually transmitted infections, and teen births. There were no significant improvements noted in these areas.

BJ enjoys woodworking projects, is a member of the USA Blind Sailing Team and a volunteer in his community. 



Those who use social media can also spread the word about the importance of draining livewells and other equipment by posting photos and messages using

The following steps are required by law to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species:

- attached aquatic plants or animals.
- REMOVE all attached aquatic plants and animals. DRAIN all water from boats, vehicles, and
- equipment, including livewells and buckets containing fish. NEVER MOVE plants or live fish away from a
- waterbody. DISPOSE of unwanted bait in the trash
- BUY minnows from a Wisconsin bait dealer.

Only use leftover minnows when either 1) fishing with them on the same body of water or 2) on other waters i no lake/river water or other fish have been added to the

container.







Medicare pays Medicare Advantage plans a payment each month for each beneficiary enrolled in the health plan. The Medicare Advantage plans use the payments to pay for all Medicare required care for an enrolled beneficiary. Yet the amount the Medicare Advantage plan receives is the same regardless of the amount of claims the plan covers for the beneficiary. Healthcare stakeholders have raised concerns that the payment model may incentivize Medicare Advantage plans to inappropriately deny claims and prior authorization requests to maximize their profits.

Medicare Advantage plans overturn 75% of their own claims Submitted by Kathy O'Melia

An Office of the Inspector General report raises questions about whether Medicare Advantage plans have inappropriately denied claims. The number of individuals with Medicare Advantage plans increased from 8 million individuals in 2007 to 21 million in 2018. Consequently, "even low rates of inappropriately denied services or payment can create significant problems for many Medicare beneficiaries and providers." These improper denials contribute to physical or financial harm and cause misuse of Medicare dollars, the report concluded.

The Office of Inspector General report found Medicare Advantage plans had "widespread and persistent" https://oig.hhs.gov/oei/reports/oei-09-16-00410.pdf. problems related to denials of care and payment." When beneficiaries and providers challenged these denials, Medicare Advantage plans overturned 75 percent of their own denials during 201416. During the same period, independent reviewers at higher levels of the appeals process overturned an additional 80,000 denials in favor of beneficiaries and providers.

The high rate of improper first level denials is particularly troublesome because beneficiaries and providers appealed only 1 percent of these denials. This creates a tremendous financial incentive for Medicare Advantage plans to continue to improperly deny claims. If beneficiaries never appeal these improper denials, the Medicare Advantage Plans have little incentive to stop denying coverage improperly.

A number of factors contribute to the low rate of appeals. For instance, "CMS also cited 45 percent of contracts
