Conservation Corner

CITIZEN MONITORING NETWORK PROJECTS

Conservation Corner is a weekly article produced by the Forest County Land Conservation-Land Information Department. For more information, contact Al Murray, County Conservationist-Land Information/GIS Director, at 715-478-1387 or by e-mail at Icc@co.forest.wi.us.

Good news in the Land Conservation-Land Information Department: the full County Board has approved a technician level position to be hired to assist with our projects. This position will be supported through a combination of grants from various sources of which LCC has consistently applied for and received. The position should be officially posted to the County website by the time of this printing. Interested candidates are encouraged to apply.

Our department and the LCC-LI Committee recently completed a work plan required for our DATCP grant. This work plan includes new items that will be of interest to the readers of this article. In 2019 we will be creating a system for tracking conservation work and monitoring completed informally by many residents of Forest County. We will also be completing projects to expand this important work. At the state level this project is known as "The Citizen Monitoring Network." Two projects that we hope to work with are surface water quality monitoring and "Loon Watch."

Under surface water quality, we want to collect data related to water chemistry, water clarity, and ice on/ice off. There are many lake associations which do this work already. It is important for this data to be collected by the County to allow us to monitor changes and prioritize grant applications and projects to respond to changes. It is also important to expand this process to include more of the lakes and streams so we can establish baseline data for future observations.

"Loon Watch" is a project that is also already undertaken by many of our lakeside residents and is an official program of Lakeland College. Currently there is a 4-H project to establish this type of project at Silver Lake. The department hopes to gain grant funding to bring training to Forest County to establish additional "Loon Rangers" which collect data regarding loons and track loon success on our lakes. This data will also be collected and available on a county wide level.

If your or anyone you know collects data for projects above, please contact our office so we can include your efforts in the county wide effort. Also, we want to establish a listing of interested people as we move forward.

Spring seems to finally have arrived as provided by the following evidence: my dog has already started his spring hunt for baby rabbits that have been recently born, robins and other springtime birds have arrived and our swans, geese and ducks have started breeding and nesting rituals. I hope our readers have a Happy Easter, enjoy our spring. We deserve it following last winter.

The Lake Metonga 10 Year Management Plan

About every ten years the WDNR requires lakes requesting grants to complete a comprehensive planning document that current and future teams can reference and draw from in their decision making process.

For Lake Metonga, that year is 2019. The first step in the process is to develop a survey which will be sent to stakeholders owning property on or deeded access to the lake. A diverse group of eight volunteers answered the call to serve on the Survey Planning Committee.

That committee met a number of times in January to build that survey which was sent to WDNR for approval. After a few adjustments between the committee and WDNR, the survey is now ready to be sent to the stakeholders for completion, which they will receive the end of April. The survey is not a cookie cutter, but rather was prepared to address specific issues of Lake Metonga. The goal of the committee is to have 100% return, which will give them a better vision of stakeholders concerns and needs.

There will be two ways to complete the survey, online or a paper copy. The survey will be returned to a third party for analysis, which assures that the responses remain anonymous.

Please watch your mail for this survey and complete it ASAP, so not to forget as your opinion is very important for the future of Lake Metonga.



DHS Launches MyACCESS App By the GWAAR Legal Services Team (for reprint)

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) recently launched the MyACCESS mobile app. With the MyACCESS app, you can:

- · See the status of your benefits, including Medicaid and FoodShare.
- Be reminded of actions you need to take. You can sign up to get notifications on your phone.
- · Submit documents for your case. You can either take photos of the documents with the app or choose photos from your phone's gallery.
 - Track the status of documents in real time.

To use the app, you must have applied for or be enrolled in BadgerCare Plus, Medicaid, or FoodShare. You can also use the app for Wisconsin Shares Child Care Subsidy Program and/or Wisconsin Works (W-2).

The MyACCESS app does not replace the ACCESS website. At this time, you cannot use the MyACCESS app to apply for benefits. If you would like to apply for benefits, you can do so online through the ACCESS website, over the phone with your Income Maintenance agency, using a paper application, or in person at your agency. In addition, you will need to continue to do some things, like renewing your benefits and reporting changes, through the ACCESS website or over the phone or in person through your Income Maintenance agency. Your local ADRC can also help you apply for benefits, report changes, and renew your benefits.
