Conservation Corner



Forest County Stream Crossing Tour participants on site at Spencer Creek at Flanner Rd.- Town of Blackwell

The first of a series of stream crossing workshops was held on May 14 which turned out to be a beautiful day to be in the field. The workshop was sponsored by the Forest County Land Conservation LCC Department, the Wisconsin DNR, Trout Unlimited, the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection, the USDA Forest Service and Wisconsin Land and Water.

The initial workshop consisted of a field tour of stream crossings including 6 different sites. At each site there was discussion on culvert sizing and relation to watershed size and flood flows, culvert placement including height and alignment, water, debris and soil passage, soil erosion control, and fish and organism passage; in relation to water velocity. Each site had different characteristics and different levels of progress. Stops included sites on Round Creek at Bushaefer Rd. and N. Branch Ln. North Branch Oconto River Creek at N. Branch Ln., Mosquito Creek at Diamond Roof Rd., Spencer Creek at Flanner Rd., and Shopodock Creek at Goodman Park Rd.

If you ask Deward Ison how he got his start as an educator, he might tell you it all started the day his mother shut off his alarm clock

School in Antigo with them and join the basketball team.

He told them he had to get up very early in the morning to drive to Waukesha, but unknown to him, his mother told his friends to come back the next day. She turned off his alarm, says Ison.

Waking up the next morning too late to make it to the foundry, Ison decided to go and check out the Normal School after all. He ended up not only playing basketball, but went on to get his two-year degree from Antigo Normal. He also went on to get a Bachelor's Degree from UW-Oshkosh and a Master's Degree from UW-Superior. His career in education would span 36 years.

Ison began his teaching career at the rural Crestwood School in the fall of 1961, at age 20.

St. John Lutheran in Townsend Celebrates 100 Years!



As the Holt Lumber Company and others finished logging parts of Oconto County in the early 1900's, resilient farm families eagerly settled in the Townsend area, establishing a community, several small businesses and, in 1911, the first preaching station to help them celebrate the every day joys and endure the inevitable adversities. The number of steadfast believers grew and St. John Lutheran Church was formed in August, 1919.

They called Pastor John Henry Nau, a graduating seminary student from the Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, who responded to the urgent need to serve the rough wide geographical area along the railroad line from Suring and as far north as Popple River near the Michigan border and was stationed in Townsend. Pastor Nau was sure he was called to "the end of the world." The people of St. John and Pastor Nau not only built a parsonage and church in Townsend but also influenced the birth and development of a church in Suring and preaching stations in Holt Spur and Pine Stump between Mountain and Lakewood and to the north at Popple River.








Healthy and Safe Swimming Week

May 20-26, 2019 marks the 15th annual Healthy and Safe Swimming Week. During this week the Forest County Health Department wants you to know that there are many health benefits of doing activities on the water. Along with benefits we want you to understand how to reduce your risk for injury, or illness related to waterborne illnesses

In Wisconsin, Harmful Algae Bloom (HAB) season can begin as early as late May. There are many species of algae found in Wisconsin lakes and rivers. Algae acts like other plants and converts sunlight into energy, and forms the base of the lakes food chain. True algae are an important part of lake systems; however, bluegreen algae are not true algae. Blue-green algae are photosynthetic bacteria known as cyanobacteria, which can cause illness and death in humans and animals.

An algal bloom can occur when environmental conditions are right as in little wind, warm water, sunlight and plentiful nutrients-especially phosphorous. When it rains and water runs into the rivers and streams, there can be agricultural and residential fertilizers (which contain phosphorus) carried into the water. In Wisconsin, blooms typically occur during the warm weather months between June and September. Blue-green Algae will float to the surface and may look bubbly and frothy. It can also look like thick paint floating on the water, and it may smell very foul. If you see a bloom, do not swim or wade through it, do not let your pets drink the water or swim in it, don't fish or boat, water ski or jet ski through algal blooms. Always shower off with soap and water after swimming in a lake. Report any Algae related illness to the Wisconsin Harmful Algal Blooms Program by calling 608-266-1120 and to the Forest County Health Department at 715-478-3371.

The Forest County Health Department wants everyone to have a healthy, safe summer while using our lakes and streams. We will again be placing life jackets at the Life Jacket Loaner Stations at the City Beach and Veterans Memorial Park in Crandon on Lake Metonga, and at the Silver Lake Beach in Laona. These life jackets are for anyone to use while enjoying the lakes. After using the jackets please put them back on the loaner stations so someone else can use them. If you notice that jackets need to be replaced, please call the Forest County Health Department at 715-478-3371.

All total we had representatives from 2 native American tribes, 3 representatives from the US Forest Service, 2 representatives from the Wisconsin DNR, 6 different County Highway Departments, 4 County Land Conservation Departments, 6 Town Road Departments, 1 representative from Trout Unlimited and 2 independent consulting companies taking part of the tour. All total, there were 47 participants at the workshop. A great network of contacts was created with the workshop with all talking about how we as a combined community can work together to solve issues.

Participants had excellent discussions on design, operator issues, communication issues, and public issues that come about during stream crossing projects. Design issues related to location of utilities were a good part of discussions. There were also discussions on partners in planning and potential for cost share assistance from various sources. 

Sens. Testin & Nass, Reps. Pronschinske and Mursau introduce B.R.A.V.E. Act

Proposal Would Aid in Attraction and Retention of Volunteer Firefighters and Emergency Medical Personnel

On Tuesday, Legislators from all corners of Wisconsin came together to introduce the B.R.A.V.E. Act which stands for Beginning Retention and Attraction for Volunteer Emergency personnel. Senators Patrick Testin (Stevens Point) and Steve Nass (Whitewater) joined Representatives. Treig Pronschinske (Mondovi) and Jeff Mursau (Crivitz) to author the bill which creates three refundable tax credits to help attract and retain volunteer firefighters and emergency medical personnel.

"This bill is a combination of two bills one that was introduced by Rep. Mursau and I and another put forward by Rep. Pronschinske and Sen. Nass," said Sen. Testin. "By working together, we've created a stronger bill that will help bring in new volunteer firefighters and emergency personnel, while supporting those already serving the heroes next door."

According to recent statistics from the U.S. Fire Administration, 92.5% of Wisconsin's fire departments are either entirely volunteer or mostly volunteer. A significant amount of emergency medical personnel are volunteer as well.

"When we dial 911 we expect a response in minutes," said Rep. Pronschinske. "As a volunteer firefighter, I understand the role we play in providing a quick response while saving lives and property. Wisconsin cannot afford to ignore these contributions and sacrifices any longer."

The average age of volunteer firefighters has increased markedly over the past two decades, and departments are finding it difficult to recruit new volunteers. There are several reasons for this shift, including declining rural populations, increased training requirements, and more hours spent at full-time jobs.

"The communities in rural districts like the one that I represent have always counted on volunteers," said Rep. Mursau. "This bill will help ensure that talented men and women continue to serve their neighbors as firefighters or EMTs."

"As a conservative, I believe that the principal role of government is to ensure public safety," said Sen. Nass. "This bill works to make sure all communities have services they can count on when an emergency strikes."

The bill is currently circulating for cosponsorship.





#### Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE)

The term "ACE's" is an acronym for Adverse Childhood Experiences and originated in a 1995 study by the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the Kaiser Permanente health care organization. The study highlighted the effects of various forms of physical and emotional abuse, neglect, and household dysfunction. An ACE score is a tally of different types of abuse, neglect, and other hallmarks of a rough childhood exampled in the test below.

There is a powerful and persistent correlation between the more ACEs experienced and the greater the chance of poor outcomes later in life, including dramatically increased risk of heart disease, diabetes, obesity, depression, substance abuse, smoking, poor academic achievement, time out of work, and premature death.

The link between the toxic stress of these childhood experiences and the above listed poor outcomes is extensive. According to the Center on the developing Child at Harvard University, the stress of ACE's "gets under the skin" of the individual and causes excessive activation of the stress response in the person. When a child experiences multiple ACEs over timeespecially without a loving supportive adult as a buffer-the experiences will trigger an excessive and long-lasting stress response, which puts wear-and-tear effect on the body. Similar to revving a car engine for days or weeks at a time. Neither the car nor the child walk away without damage.

To take the ACE's test, and find out your score please visit <a href="https://www.stresshealth.org/ace-quiz/">https://www.stresshealth.org/ace-quiz/</a>. This test requires the taker to examine their childhood from a birds eye view to see what stressors were present and how it may affect adult life. The test examines physical and emotional abuse, abandonment and imprisonment, alcohol and drug abuse, and many other childhood stressors that could shape the adult personality.

The CDC and Kaiser Study advise that if the person taking the test has four or more "ACE's" that the person is at a high risk for issues later in life. ACE scores don't tally the positive life experiences in early life that can help build resilience and protect a child from the effects of trauma. The key to building resilience is having close relationships, Jack Shonkoff of the Center on the Developing Child at Harvard University states, "there are people with high ACE scores who do remarkably well." Childhood experiences have lasting, measurable consequences later in life; therefore, fostering emotional well-being from the earliest stages of life helps build a foundation for health.



#### Joint Library Task Force Information Meeting June 11 at 6 and June 17 at 2

Wisconsin State law stipulates that municipalities must either own and operate a public library or provide financial support to neighboring governmental bodies that do. In recent years, complicated provisions in state law required property taxpayers in the Towns of Doty, Riverview, and Townsend to help fund libraries located elsewhere, some hours away in neighboring counties. This resulted in an ever-increasing burden on their tax levy.

To find solutions, a Joint Library Task Force Committee (JLTFC) was formed. Committee members Don Bartels Jr. (Oconto County Supervisor), Ann Hogan (Riverview Chair), Dick Kendall (Doty Chair), Linda McKenna (Lakes Country Library Board President), Kathleen Marsh (Townsend Representative), Joanne Roy (Lakewood Chair), and Nicole Lowery (Lakes Country Library Director) began meeting in May 2018.

As the group methodically worked its way through a maze of local, county and state law, they remained deeply committed to securing the Lakes Country (Lakewood) Library's future while looking out for property taxpayer interests. Their final product, a Four Towns Joint Public Library Agreement, adheres to all existing legal requirements, recognizes Lakewood's role in keeping the library open all these years, and respects the contributions that the other towns have made in that regard. It is set to be ratified in July, with January 1, 2020 as its starting date.

Library Director Nicole Lowery and members of the JLTFC will be on hand during public information meetings to be held at the Lakes Country Library on Tuesday, June 11, at 6:00 p.m. and Monday, June 17, 2019 at 2:00 p.m. Please attend if you have questions regarding the new Agreement.




#### Laona students donate to NewCap
