Crandon School Board finalizes hiring process for district administrator

On Wednesday, May 29, the Crandon School Board of Education met in the district office board room. The purpose of the meeting was to finalize and approve the hiring process of the district administrator. The board announced at the end of the meeting that Larry Palubicki is the new district administrator.

Larry has been the district administrator for the Laona School District for the past 3 years. Mr. Palubicki will start his new position on July 1, 2019.

Cash purse of \$100,000 announced for Crandon International's Forest County Potawatomi Brush Run



Scheduled for June 14-16, more than 200 Lucas Oil Pro and MORR Sportsman class racers are expected at the historic Crandon International Raceway for the 26th Brush Run weekend. Sponsored by the Forest County Potawatomi community, the Brush Run represents the first of a five-race series in the Lucas Oil Midwest Short Course League, a summer-long schedule of events that will conclude over Labor Day weekend at Crandon's historic 50th anniversary Off-Road World Championships®.

This announcement includes a comprehensive payout structure designed to offer cash payouts to Pro category racers deeper in the field, including the Pro 4, Pro 2, Pro Lite, Pro Modified SXS and Pro Stock SXS categories. The Pro cash purse combines the regular series' contribution plus the addition of nearly \$25,000 from Crandon International Raceway. Living up to its "Big House" nickname, the track is also support myriad of its grassroots Sportsman racers with another \$10,000 in cash support for their two days of competition around Crandon's famed 1.75-mile course.

The Brush Run's feature race will be Sunday afternoon's "Forest County Potawatomi Community Cup," which pits the high-horsepower, unlimited Pro 4 versus Pro 2 in an annual showdown that's always a fan favorite. In 2019, the Cup race offers a total cash prize package of \$28,000, with the winner picking up a healthy \$10,000 pay day plus valuable product bonuses. Second place will pay \$3,500, third place \$2,000 and fourth place earns \$1,500. For the second year in a row, racers coming home 5th through 15th will earn a guaranteed \$1,000 cash award for competing in the unique spectacle.

Wisconsin native Johnny Greaves has dominated the FCP Community Cup history books, with a total of six race victories, including back-to-back wins in 2017 and 2018.

"Crandon International is proud to support our racers and their efforts by adding cash to the overall purse for the upcoming Brush Run weekend," shared President Cliff Flannery. "Our fans deserve to have the very best show possible, and, let's face it, everyone runs just a bit harder when money is on the line. We are looking forward to a very competitive and fun weekend at the "Big House!"

The massive gates to "Camp Crandon" will open up at 12:00 on Thursday, June 13, with many of the groomed grass camping spots still available. Saturday night will feature a festival-style concert that is free for fans camping at Crandon for the weekend, or those attending Saturday's races. Crandon International will open its gates to the public all three days beginning at 8 a.m.

All racefans can enjoy watching practice on "Free Friday," which takes place June 14. Weekend admission is \$45 for adults, with children 12 and under and seniors 75 and older getting in free all three days. One-day admission is just \$25 for adults, with children under 12 and seniors 75 or older again enjoying complimentary entry.





Public information meeting for WIS 32 in Forest County

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) North Central Region is conducting a public involvement meeting to discuss proposed roadway and culvert improvements on WIS 32 between Crandon and Argonne in Forest County.

The meeting is scheduled for Thursday, June 13 from 5 p.m. to 6 p.m. at the Argonne Town Hall, 8842 Black Bear Ave, Argonne, Wisconsin. A brief presentation is scheduled to begin at 5:15 p.m. After the presentation, the meeting will follow an open-house format.

The objective of this meeting is to obtain input on the scope, schedule and detour route for the proposed improvements. Some of the needs identified along this section of WIS 32 include:

- -- A surface mill and overlay of the existing pavement
- --Replacement of identified culverts
- --Beam guard upgrades

The improvement project is currently scheduled to occur as early as 2020.

Adjacent property owners and businesses are encouraged to attend the meeting. The meeting facility is wheelchair accessible. Tammy Baldwin celebrates 100th Anniversary of the 19th Amendment Women gain the right to vote! WASHINGTON, D.C. - U.S. Senator Tammy

Baldwin today praised the unanimous Senate passage of the bipartisan resolution she cosponsored celebrating the 100th anniversary of the passage and ratification of the 19th Amendment, which granted American women the right to vote. The resolution, introduced by Senator Lisa Murkowski (R-AK), seeks to honor, reaffirm and preserve the historic precedent set by the ratification of the 19th Amendment in further promoting the core values of our democracy as promised by the U.S. Constitution.

"A century ago, after decades of struggle by brave women and men, our nation finally extended to women the most fundamental right in our democracy - the right to vote," said Senator Baldwin. "We still have more work to do, and more glass ceilings to break, but it is important to celebrate this monumental anniversary and all the progress that women have made in the last 100 years. This resolution recognizes and honors the struggle to secure the vote for American women and thereby taking a major step forward as a nation."

Senator Baldwin joined the 24 other women in the Senate for a bipartisan commemoration of the anniversary. Senators wore a yellow rose on their lapel throughout the day. The yellow rose, a symbol of the women's suffrage movement, evokes the historic debate by the Tennessee legislature prior to becoming the final state to ratify the 19th Amendment in 1920. Those who supported women's enfranchisement wore yellow roses, and anti-suffragists wore red roses. Senator Baldwin also wore a purple ribbon to acknowledge the invaluable contributions of women of color to the suffrage movement.

Senator Baldwin's Women's Suffrage Centennial Commission Act, which was enacted in 2017, created a commission charged with planning and executing programs, projects and activities to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the passage and ratification of the 19th Amendment.





Federal Trade Commission Consumer Information: Get a one-ring call? DON'T CALL BACK

A while back, we warned you about the "one ring" scam. That's when you get a phone call from a number you don't know, and the call stops after just one ring. These calls are coming at all times of the day and night and are being received in Oneida County. The scammer is hoping you'll call back, because it's really an international toll number and will appear as a charge on your phone bill with most of the money going to the scammer. Well, the scam is back with a vengeance, and the FCC just issued a new advisory about it. Read the FCC's advisory for more detail, but the advice from both agencies remains the same if you get one of these calls:

- Don't call back
- Report the robocall to the FTC at www.donotcall.gov and the FCC at https://consumercomplaints.fcc.gov
- Always check your phone bill for suspicious or unusual charges

Chairman of the Committee, county staff established a tour to show Mr. Krueger conservation related issues in Forest County including our increasing agriculture in maple syrup operations, shoreland restoration projects, some of our agricultural areas and also some of our forestry related issues. Part of the tour included a visit with Tim and Joan Ginter at their maple syrup operations at Ginter's Corner Tap and Sap in the Town of Crandon.

The Wisconsin Land and Water Conservation Association (WI Land+Water) is a 501 (c) 3 non-profit, membership organization that supports the efforts of around 450 Land Conservation Committee (LCC) supervisors and 400 conservation staff in 72 county Land Conservation Department (LCD) offices throughout Wisconsin. WI Land + Water provides training, develops conservation standards, promote youth education, issue grants, builds partnerships, and provide advocacy for conservation activities throughout Wisconsin.

The Mission of Wisconsin Land + Water is as follows: Wisconsin is its land, waters, and people. How Wisconsin citizens conserve and maintain the state's limited land base and soil productivity, as well as its lakes, streams, and groundwater, will determine the future of our economy and quality of life. #### Hunters and local businesses increase chronic wasting disease surveillance in the north during the 2018 deer season

About 1,500 deer were sampled and tested for chronic wasting disease in Lincoln, Langlade, Oneida, Forest and Vilas counties during the 2018 CWD surveillance year (Apr. 1, 2018 - Mar. 31, 2019). The Department of Natural Resources encouraged hunters to submit tissue samples from harvested adult deer in two surveillance areas near Rhinelander.

These targeted CWD surveillance efforts occurred in northeastern Lincoln, northwestern Langlade and southern Oneida counties following the detection of CWD in two wild deer along the Lincoln/Oneida County border. The first of these cases was detected in January 2018 and the second in April 2018. Surveillance efforts also included eastern Oneida, southern Vilas and western Forest counties as a result of CWD positive deer found on an Oneida County captive deer hunting ranch in 2015.

"Numerous hunters submitted deer heads for testing from these areas and beyond. We are very thankful to the hunters and cooperating private businesses that stepped up to help with this important sampling effort. With their assistance, we are better able to understand the geographic distribution and prevalence of the disease," said Janet Brehm, DNR wildlife biologist. "We couldn't have done this without them."

In addition to samples submitted from hunter harvested deer, this year the DNR offered free CWD surveillance permits to private landowners as well as to the public on select parcels of public land within these targeted surveillance areas. These permits were used to enhance CWD surveillance, and it was a requirement for all adult deer harvested under these permits to be CWD tested. The DNR had a projected sample goal of testing 450 deer from each area; the use of surveillance permits by hunters assisted greatly, accounting for about 25% of the total samples submitted.

In the 2017 Lincoln/Oneida county surveillance area and 2018 deer seasons combined, about 430 deer were submitted and tested for CWD.

A new CWD-positive wild deer was detected through the enhanced surveillance efforts in 2018. The sample was submitted voluntarily by a hunter during opening weekend of the gun deer season. This adult doe was harvested in south-central Oneida County in the town of Crescent, about 1.5 miles from the first wild CWD positive in Oneida and about 1.5 miles from the first wild positive in Lincoln County (town of Harrison).

In total, the three known wild positives are clustered in close proximity, along the Lincoln/Oneida County line.

#### Oneida County surveillance area

In the 2017 and 2018 deer seasons combined, 220 deer were submitted and tested for CWD.

No wild deer have tested positive for CWD. **Baiting and Feeding** 

As required by law, the CWD positive detection in the fall of 2018 in south-central Oneida County renewed the existing three-year baiting and feeding ban in Oneida County and the two-year baiting and feeding ban for Langlade County. Lincoln County is still within the threeyear baiting and feeding ban from the first CWD positive detection. Vilas and Forest counties still have baiting and feeding bans due to captive deer farm CWD positives.

"This additional positive CWD detection gives us a better understanding of where the disease is on the landscape and its prevalence in the local deer herd. During the 2019 deer season, hunters will again be encouraged to submit their adult deer for CWD sampling as we continue efforts in both surveillance areas, as well as throughout northern Wisconsin," said Brehm. "We also plan to offer hunters surveillance permits again to help with continued disease assessment in the two surveillance areas."

#### The DNR will continue to take the following steps:

Work with County Deer Advisory Council members from the counties impacted by these CWD positive detections

Perform surveillance activities to assess disease distribution and prevalence including:

Encourage reporting of sick deer

Sample vehicle-killed adult deer

Sample adult deer harvested under agricultural damage permits

Sample adult deer harvested under urban deer hunts in the area

Establish CWD sampling locations to be available during the 2019 deer hunting season.


Prevent the spread of CWD

There are recommended practices to reduce and prevent the spread of CWD that hunters, landowners, and any individual can assist with. Some of these actions include proper transportation, handling, and disposal of deer carcass waste, reporting sick deer, following baiting and feeding information, cleaning/decontamination of equipment, and following urine-based scent recommendations.

For more information regarding baiting and feeding regulations, ways to reduce the spread of CWD, and overall CWD information in Wisconsin, visit the DNR's website, dnr.wi.gov, and search "bait and feeding" and "CWD" respectively. To report a sick deer on the landscape, search keywords "sick deer" or contact a local wildlife biologist.


