#### Blackwell Job Corps Center slated to close



The Blackwell Job Corps Center has been selected to close by year's end. The facility has been in operation for 54 years.

The center currently has 127 students, and has 49 federal employees plus seven contract employees. The center is estimated to have a \$5.2 million yearly impact on local communities.

The function of this educational center was and still is to train young people in job skills that can be used to make them a useful and taxpaying member of society. The curriculum includes training in construction crafts, health occupations, union carpentry, union masonry, welding, and wild land fire fighting. The fire fighting has been put to good use locally, when Job Corps students are used to fight local wild fires.

According to material provided by the center, the institution has trained 15,000 young people who are Wisconsin citizens, making them more productive members of society.

In addition to fulfilling the mission of educating young people, the center has been active in a great many local and statewide projects. There is a huge list of community involvements to lengthy to list here. Blackwell has received two letters of commendation from former governors of Wisconsin.

Senator Tammy Baldwin is opposing the closure of the Blackwell Center, and her response is inside this issue.



#LeadYourFSA and be the Voice of Farmers in Your Community WASHINGTON, June 3, 2019 USDA's Farm Service Agency (FSA) will begin accepting nominations for county committee members on Friday, June 14, 2019. Agricultural producers who participate or cooperate in an FSA program may be nominated for candidacy for the county committee. Individuals may nominate themselves or others as a candidate.

'I encourage America's farmers, ranchers, and forest stewards to nominate candidates to lead, serve, and represent their community on their county committee," FSA Administrator Richard Fordyce said. "There's an increasing need for diverse representation including underserved producers, which includes beginning, women and minority farmers and ranchers.'

Committees make important decisions about how federal farm programs are administered locally. Their input is vital on how FSA carries out disaster programs, as well as conservation, commodity and price support programs, county office employment and other agricultural issues.

Nationwide, more than 7,700 dedicated members of the agricultural community serving on FSA county committees. The committees are made of three to 11 members and typically meet once a month. Members serve three-year terms. Producers serving on our FSA county committees play a critical role in the day-to-day operations of the agency.

#### **Crandon Area Historical Society updates**


The Crandon Area Historical Society held its quarterly meeting on Thursday, June 6th and has the following updates to provide:



## THE SECRET IS OUT....









write about the Asian Long-horned Beetle.

The Asian Longhorned Beetle (Anoplophora glabripennis, or ALB) is a threat to America's hardwood trees currently infests areas in Massachusetts, New York and Ohio. Prior infestations, thought to be eradicated, were as close for Forest County as northeast Illinois and parts of northeast Ohio. It threatens recreation and forest resources valued at billions of dollars.

The importance of this threat should not be ignored. Up until now, most serious forest pest were opportunistic of species that had a small percentage of composition in the forest of Wisconsin. ALB, as compared to other pests, feeds on a variety of trees including ash, birch, elm, poplar, and maples including red, silver and sugar maple. ALB, if it becomes established in Wisconsin, has the potential of wiping out tree species that could compose 40%-60% of our forest.

In summer, the ALB lays its eggs in the bark of the tree. Adults range in size from  $\frac{3}{4}$ " to 1  $\frac{1}{2}$ " in length and are black and shiny with irregular white spots. They have black and white striped antennae that are 1 to 2 times the body length. Common, native longhorned beetles such as the pine sawyer beetle are often confused with ALB, due mostly to their size and similar characteristics. ALB, however has some pretty unique characteristics to watch for:

Bill's topic for discussion at WRISC was the Asian Longhorned Beetle (ALB). A major take-away of the session was Bill's statement that "Asian Longhorned Beetle damage, if it reaches its full potential, could dwarf the impacts of Dutch Elm Disease and Emerald Ash Borer combined". This reminded me of my intention, as identified in my April article about the value of sugar maple trees, to

First, ALB are the only large beetles with long black and white striped antennae.

Second, ALB are the only large beetles within Forest County which are found in hardwood trees as a host.

Third, exit holes in hardwood trees from ALB larvae are as large as a dime. In maple trees these exit holes are sometimes confused with tap holes but the larvae exits are higher up in the trees.

What can our readers do? If you are suspicious of a large beetle you have found, look for the black and white antennae. If unsure contact someone to check the specimen. Inspect your trees, especially hardwood trees, and if you see signs of symptoms of an infestation, report it to someone. Don't move firewood, nursery stock, or lumber from areas that may already be infested. With no current cure, early identification and eradication of ALB are critical to its control. Keeping ALB from the forest in Wisconsin is critical to our industry, our recreation and our way of life. If you love and respect the forest of Wisconsin please do your part!

uncharacteristic turkey breeding behavior this year, with toms being less responsive to calling in some of the early and middle time periods," said Mark Witecha, DNR upland wildlife ecologist. "Despite that, Wisconsin turkey hunters had another excellent year in the field."

A total of 213,078 harvest authorizations were issued in 2019, with 135,421 harvest authorizations awarded through the drawing and 77,657 sold over the counter. Harvest authorization sales were also virtually unchanged from 2018, when a total of 212,781 authorizations were sold.

Zone 1 produced the highest overall harvest, accounting for 10,334 birds, followed by Zones 3 and 2. Hunters registered 9,499 birds in Zone 3 and 9,321 birds in Zone 2. Overall statewide success rate was 18.1 percent compared to 18.3 percent in 2018.

The 2019 spring season started on April 13 with the Youth Hunt. The regular season began April 17 and ran through May 28, broken down into six separate time periods. Having separate time periods allows for maximum hunter opportunities and helps minimize interference rates. Recent surveys show over 75% of  $turkey \, hunters \, support \, the \, current \, season \, framework.$ DNR staff in Wisconsin closely monitor harvest, hunter interference rates, and hunter satisfaction along with other information to track turkey populations through time and maintain a successful, sustainable, and enjoyable spring turkey hunt. For the upcoming 2019 fall season: As in the 2018 season, the 2019 fall turkey drawing has been waived. A fall turkey harvest authorization will be issued with every fall turkey or conservation patron license purchase. Hunters will choose a zone at the time of purchase for which their harvest authorization will be valid. Bonus harvest authorizations, formerly known as leftover tags, will be available for purchase in select zones starting in August.

#### Wisconsin spring turkey harvest unchanged from 2018

MADISON - Preliminary totals show Wisconsin turkey hunters registered 38,556 birds during the 2019 spring turkey hunting season, virtually unchanged from the 38,885 birds registered in the spring 2018 season.

Although average temperatures were slightly below normal for the months of April and May, weather conditions were more favorable in 2019 than in 2018, specifically in the early and late seasons. This was especially apparent when comparing success rates during the Youth Hunts between 2018 and 2019. In 2018, a severe snowstorm covered much of the state and led to a below

The fall 2019 wild turkey season for Zones 1-5 is Sept. 14 - Jan. 5, 2020. For Zones 6 and 7, the season is Sept. 14 - Nov. 22.


