Crandon's slanted sidewalk: The debate goes on!

Another step was taken in Crandon's continuing Lake Avenue sidewalk controversy at the City Council meeting on Wednesday, August 7.

Trisha Novak, owner of Trisha's Treasures, and other business people had a lawyer present at this meeting. In addition, there were other citizens present to express support for the businesses and their use of the sidewalk to display their wares and in Trisha's case, a place to enjoy a sandwich and/or coffee on the sidewalk.

This situation with the sidewalks actually started back in 2002, when Lake Avenue, Crandon's main street, was redone by the Wisconsin Dept. of Transportation (DOT). The engineer at that time determined that the main street wasn't level, but higher on the west side. The street had been this way, probably, from the time that the town had been laid out, and it is likely that asphalt was laid by the Works Progress Administration (WPA) back in the mid 1930's. By putting the slant in the street, the curbs were kept at the same height on both sides of the street.

Rolling ahead to 2002, the now level street presented a problem to the DOT engineer. She discovered that the curb on the west side of the street had to be much higher. Car doors would have hit the curb, not allowing exit from the car. Her answer to the problem was to put a step in the sidewalk and another curb. This became a pedestrian problem when people standing on the street inadvertently moved over the second curb, almost falling. The metal, ornamental railing was constructed to prevent accidents, somewhat narrowing the sidewalk, which, however, was

The other problem with the new sidewalk was the inferior concrete formula used at that time by the DOT. The business owners found that the joints in the sidewalks deteriorated and became wider. People walking or standing on these new sidewalks were turning their ankles on the wide gaps. The business owners took on the expense of filling the gaps with better concrete, but the sidewalks then deteriorated next to the repairs.


The next step was the installation of new sidewalks in 2018. While the step was not liked by business owners or their customers, the DOT would not allow the street to be raised enough to keep the sidewalks level or the curb at the right height, in spite of the fact that the street had been higher on the west side for about 80


Crandon School Board approves **NEOLA** at August meeting

The Crandon School Board of Education met on Monday, August 12, in the auditorium. Cassidy Neilitz gave a presentation to the board on a farm-to-school project through the Forest County Potawatomi. The school board said that they will include Ms. Neilitz in their future meetings dealing with the meals provided in the

The board approved the finances presented by Bryan Schallock and John Doane presented a project with the baseball fields. The school needs to fix the floor on one of the dugouts and also fix a drainage problem. John also presented a new concessions stand and announcer perch. The building will be a two story building with the announcer on the top floor. The building will be built by the students in the shop class and will allow for netting to be placed behind the dugouts of the fields to protect the people enjoying the games. Superintendent Larry Palubicki stated that he wants the cement slab poured by the time the snow flies because our spring weather is not conducive to construction projects.







Senator Tiffany's Statement on Federal Forest Damage

MADISON, Wis. - State Senator Tom Tiffany (R-Minocqua) released this statement regarding the extensive damage in the federal forests:

"The recent storms in the Northwoods did extraordinary damage to personal property, infrastructure, and our forests. Among the lands hardest hit is a section of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest (CNNF) south of Wabeno.

"Initial estimates indicate damage to 23,000 acres of CNNF forests. There are millions of dollars of trees that are salvageable. I am urging the United States Forest Service (USFS) to expedite clean-up on the CNNF to salvage maximum value of the downed trees. The USFS should prioritize the high-value hardwoods first and do so immediately to capture the most value. Also, it is concerning that 5,000 acres of the blowdown cannot be touched due to the 2004 Forest Plan. If timber is not cleared promptly, it will lead to greater fire danger and disease infestations. Both can be deadly for neighboring forest owners.

"A few years ago the USFS was given enhanced authority to quickly react to disaster situations. I am urging the USFS to use that authority to set-up salvage sales immediately including on the 'no touch' 5,000 acres. State and local governments are prepared to act guickly. including using the Good Neighbor Authority, to assist the USFS."

NEOLA will also have all of the policies and procedures updated by the end of the year. The board approved NEOLA. The cost of NEOLA will be \$24,900, paid over 30 months. After the 30 months, a yearly fee of \$2,400 will be paid to keep our policies and procedures updated. The school will save money by using NEOLA. The school currently uses WASB and they do not update the policies and procedures. WASB, the Wisconsin Association of School Boards costs \$2,500 a year. So after the initial payment, the school will save money and will eventually get their initial investment back.

The school also signed an agreement on the copy machines in the school with Rhyme out of Wausau. The school currently has a deal with E.O. Johnson, but that will be ending this fall. Switching over to the Rhyme machines will save the school about \$1,000 a month.

The school board also announced that they have accepted the resignation of the High School Principal Jewel Mucklin. Ms. Mucklin accepted a position in Watoma. All of the teaching vacancies are filled with the exception of the band and choir teacher. They are in negotiations with a person, but at this time, have not reached an agreement.

Last week, crews worked to reopen popular areas such as the Bagley Rapids Campground and the Mountain Fire Tower. In addition, several dispersed camping areas such as Nelligan Lake, Mountain Lakes and Bear Paw are also open. "Our employees have been working hard to clear areas of the damage so that visitors can once again enjoy their favorite places on the National Forest," said Greyling Brandt, Recreation Program Manager for the Lakewood-Laona Ranger District, Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. "We appreciate everyone's patience and understanding as we work to reopen sites."

Visitors are reminded to check the website before visiting the Forest for the latest updates on what is open and closed. A closure order is in place for roads, trails and recreation sites that were damaged during the storm.

"There is still quite a list of closed recreation areas, trails and roads on the Forest. Folks are reminded to adhere to these closures for their safety," said Brandt. "In many places there are limbs caught up in the canopy or leaning trees that pose a significant safety risk."

In addition to the impacts to recreation areas. there is a significant amount of downed timber on the National Forest in Langlade and Oconto counties. The Forest has been working to size up the impacts to existing timber sales, timber stands that were being prepped for a sale, areas being considered for management and other places that were damaged on the Forest.

"We have already modified some existing timber sales to account for the downed timber from the storm," said Karl Welch, Timber Program Manager for the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. "Contractors are actively working to harvest the remaining standing timber as well as what was damaged during the storm as prescribed in the modification for some of our timber sales."

The Forest will continue to work on identifying the paths towards recovery and finding the most efficient ways to reopen recreation areas, roads and trails, utilize the downed timber, restore the Forest and reforest the damaged areas in the coming weeks, months and years.

Referral Procedure

The school district shall solicit and receive referrals of students with suspected educational needs from all persons who have responsible cause to believe that such needs exist. Specific state criteria shall be adhered to in determining eligibility for specific handicapping conditions. Referrals of suspected children with disability shall be referred to either of the people listed above.

IEP - Team Evaluation

Whenever a child is referred who is suspected of having an exceptional educational need, the school district shall establish an IEP Team. An appointment of this team shall be the responsibility of the Program Support Teacher. The Program Support Teacher shall approve the evaluation process and may request additional information.

Procedural safeguards for evaluation including the following:

The notice of intent to evaluate shall be sent to the parents that will include:

A full explanation of the due process/procedural safeguards;

A description of the evaluation proposed, an explanation of why the evaluation is proposed, any options that were considered, and the reasons why those options were rejected;

A description of each evaluation procedure used as a basis for the evaluation;

The type of professionals conducting the evaluation;

A description of any other relevant

Written parental consent shall be obtained when a child is being evaluated for the first time within the district. This consent form shall include:

A statement documenting that the parent understands the content of the notice;

Information on the general areas to be evaluated;

Information on the general types of procedures to be used.

Upon request, the School District of Crandon is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. Scoping Notice Blowdown Project (USFS) __ Lakewood-Laona Ranger District --

The intent of this project is to address the damage that occurred from the blowdown in a manner that will protect human communities and restore the affected areas to a productive forest. The actions included in this project are:-

- Conducting timber salvage to reduce the potential for insect and disease outbreaks and catastrophic wildfire. Harvesting includes trees that are down, root sprung, have a broken top or at least 10 percent lean. This could include all species and all sizes of dead and dying trees.
- -- Regenerating damaged sites after salvage using appropriate planting methods or natural regeneration.
- -- Constructing temporary roads and there may be many miles (back in spurs needed for safe decking).
- -- Incidental removal of live or dead trees for landings, skid trails, and road clearing.

- Removing biomass from the damaged areas
- -- Removal of hazardous fuels
- -- Removal of incidental green trees to address other issues, such as access
- -- Restoration/repair of other resources, such as recreation sites, stream crossings, etc.

The McKinney-Vento Act defines children and youth who are homeless (twenty-one years of age and younger) as:

- · Children and youth who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence, and includes children and youth who are:
- sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason (sometimes referred to as double-up);
- living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to lack of alternative adequate accommodations;
 - living emergency or transitional shelters;
 - abandoned in hospitals; or
 - awaiting foster care placement.
- Children and youth who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designated for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings.
- · Children and youth who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings.
- · Migratory children who qualify as homeless because they are living in circumstances described above.

If you are personally aware of or are acquainted with any children who may qualify according to the above criteria, the School District of Crandon provides the following assurances to parents of homeless children:

- The local district staff person (liaison) for homeless children is Heather Ostrowski, Pupil Services Administrator, 715-478-6183 and ostrohea@sdofcrandon.com.
- · There shall be immediate enrollment and school participation, even if educational and medical records and proof of residency are not available.
- All educational opportunities and related opportunities for homeless students (preschool to age 21), including unaccompanied youth, shall be the same as for the general student population.
- · Enrollment and transportation rights, including transportation to the school of origin. "School of origin" is defined as the school the child or youth attended when permanently housed or the school in which the child or youth was last enrolled.
- Written explanation of a child or youth's school placement, other than school of origin or the school requested by the parent, with the right to appeal within the local dispute resolution process.
- Meaningful opportunities for parents to participate in the education of their children. These shall include: special notices of events, parent-teacher conferences, newsletters, and access to student records.


