

### Crandon Rocks to kick off 50th World Championship Races



KEITH PULVERMACHER: Music fans coming to Crandon Rocks will have an additional reason to kick-off Labor Day weekend thanks to the unique style of Keith Pulvermacher. The venue will begin its musical entertainment at 6 p.m. on Friday, August 30.

With just under two weeks to go before Crandon International Raceway opens its iconic gates to its first ever Labor Day weekend concert, event organizers of the first annual Crandon Rocks concert have released additional details about the upcoming show.

Held at the largest venue of its kind in the world, Crandon Rocks will be headlined by Kid Rock. The show will also feature Wisconsin's own Keith Pulvermacher, a highly talented musician who calls Milwaukee home, as well as another opening act.

In addition, Crandon Rocks has also announced that all ticket holders in the venue "Gold Circle" of reserved seats will also enjoy free food, free beer and soft drinks and half-priced cocktails, as well as a VIP entrance and private bathroom facilities. Limited to just 3,000 seats, Gold Circle tickets in the "white" and "blue" sections remain, although they are selling at a brisk pace.

Access for general admission seating are set to open at 2 p.m., with concert goers allowed to bring in their own folding lawn for pre-concert set-up. All general admission and Gold Circle ticket holders can exchange their printed tickets for concert wristbands at that time, which will also provide access to Friday afternoon's exciting Crandon off-road races. The exclusive Gold Circle entrance and hospitality tent will open at 6 p.m.

Music at Crandon Rocks will officially begin at 6: p.m., with Kid Rock taking the stage at approximately 9 p.m.

A Wisconsin native son, Pulvermacher was raised in the south eastern portion of the state in the town of Butler. His style of "reality songwriting" doesn't fall into a "genre." It isn't country, it isn't blues, it isn't folk and it isn't rock. After having a discussion with a good friend of his, they decided the best thing to do was to create a category they name "Midwestern" music. His music fits perfectly with what he represents, where he comes from, and in his creative spirit that shares an honest description completely true to him.

Kid Rock burst onto the music scene in 1998 with his Devil Without a Cause album and hasn't looked back. From hit singles like "Bawitdaba" and "Cowboy" to "Picture" and "All Summer Long," the recording artist has blazed his own trail in the music world, having sold over 26 million albums to date.

The full Forest County Board met last August 15 at the courthouse. With the resignation of board member Huettl, there was a vacancy, and a new member to represent District 5 stepped up and was sworn in. The new member is Sherry Pethers from Blackwell. We wish her luck in her new position!

There was a range of subjects covered, including a new vehicle to cover the needs of the Commission on Aging (COA) and a new concrete floor in the COA garage to prevent premature rusting of the new vehicle. There was also a purchase approved for a new vehicle for Emergency Management. There were also some minor changes made to the county handbook.

The major piece of legislation passed was to have a referendum on an increase to the county's statutory levy limit. The increase approved was 8.815% which will raise the levy by about \$450,000. That will change the levy from \$5,105,099 to \$5,555,099.

The referendum will be held on November 5,

**Need Help with your Medicare Costs?** Submitted by Kathy O'Melia

If you have Medicare and you're facing challenges with paying for health care, you may be eligible for programs that can help you save money on medical and drug costs.

People with limited income and resources may qualify for Medicaid - a joint federal and state program that helps with medical costs.

Even if you don't qualify for Medicaid, Medicare Savings Programs may be able to help you pay your Medicare premiums and other costs. If your monthly income is \$1,405 or less for an individual, or \$1,902 for a couple, and your resources are under \$7,730 for an individual or \$11,600 for a couple, you may already be eligible for one of these programs.

If you qualify for Medicaid or one of the Medicare Savings Programs, you'll automatically get Extra Help paying for your prescription drugs. Extra Help is a Medicare program that helps people with limited income and resources pay Medicare prescription drug costs, like premiums, deductibles and coinsurance.

If you don't automatically qualify for Extra Help, you may still be eligible if your income is \$1,561 or less for an individual, or \$2,113 for a couple, and your resources are under \$12,890 for an individual and \$25,720 for a couple. You can apply online for Extra Help with Social Security Administration at www.ssa.gov or by calling: 1-800-772-1213 (TTY 1-800-325-0778). Another program that can help with your prescription drug costs is SeniorCare, Wisconsin's prescription drug assistance program. This program is available to Wisconsin residents who are age 65 or older and are a U.S. citizen or have qualifying immigrant status. 

Some students like coming to class on specific days at specific times and being around others in their academic program, and they can do exactly that in Nicolet My Way programs," she said.

At Quick Start students will be able to complete many, if not all, of the steps necessary to enroll at Nicolet. These include:

- Meet with an Admissions Representative to discuss career options and the various academic paths available to train for a career.

 Talk with an Academic Advisor to register for classes and set up a class schedule that fits in with other responsibilities.
 Complete the Admission Application.

- Learn about financial aid and start the financial aid application process.

- Learn about payment plans the college has available.

Fall Semester classes start Wednesday, Sept. 4.

Individuals looking to enroll should also bring their high school or college transcripts, if available. Those needing help getting their transcripts before the event are encouraged to contact the Nicolet Welcome Center at (715) 365-4493 for assistance.

Nicolet staff will also be on hand at Quick Start to help students retrieve transcripts electronically. There's often a fee to do this, so a credit or debit card will be needed.

Nicolet academic programs currently offered in the flexible Nicolet My Way format include Welding, Information Technology, Administrative Professional, Accounting, and Business Management. More programs are expected to adopt the format in the future.

2019. The reason the taxpayers are being asked is to fund six new employees in the law enforcement center so that the jailer, who is responsible for the inmates, is not also the person manning the 911 dispatch center.

The problem that law enforcement and jail staff have is that if there is a problem with inmates and an emergency call comes in, it is impossible to take care of both situations. This means that somebody could be hurt and need attention in the jail, and that a car wreck out on the highway also needs attention and emergency care. Which situation does the jailer take care of first?

The citizens of Forest County will give their approval or not at the November 5th referendum.

Starting in September, the Office on Aging Nutrition Program will be seeing some changes. First change that we are making is adding an extra dining site day for Wabeno Meal site. Currently, we serve on Monday and Tuesday and the home delivered meals are served on Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursday.
