Forest County Board Update

This is a brief update on what the Forest County Board is doing to handle the people's business.

As reported in a previous issue, there has been a flap over replacing the emergency generator at the Law Enforcement Center (LEC). Supervisor Bunda didn't get the votes at the joint meeting of the Finance and Building Committees, but the full county board agreed that there should be more bidders for whatever is done to update the generator at the LEC. There were two bids. One bid was for \$299,000 and the other for \$219,000.

Since the full board meeting, there have been other ideas presented on the generator issue. A stress test on the existing generator was done last Tuesday. The generator and engine have a little less than 200 hours operating time over the last twenty-some years. The generator passed the stress test with flying colors. It is in very good operating condition, but is still too small to run the entire LEC during an emergency power outage.

Other ideas have come forward, one of which is to leave the current generator where it is and to add another generator that is smaller. The current generator is rated at 150 kilowatts, and it is thought that 200 kilowatts is needed. The idea that an additional generator of 50 or 75 kilowatts would solve the problem is being discussed. The cost savings to the taxpayer would obviously be significant. An electrical engineer has been hired to review the options so sealed bids can be used as per state statute to fix the generator problem.

Where the board will go on this hasn't been decided, but at the Building Committee meeting last Monday evening, a citizen stepped up and offered a free 50 kilowatt generator to the county that was removed from a building project. This generator has little time on it and runs on natural gas, but could easily be switched to propane fuel. During the discussion, the thought was brought forward to accept the gift generator and to think about mounting it on a trailer so it could be used on county structures wherever needed. **Continued on page 05**

Property owners, are you aware of the Forest County Cost-Share Program? This is a program administered by the Forest County Land and Water Conservation Department. The Grant money is provided by the Wisconsin Dept. of Agriculture, Trade, & Consumer Protection (DATCP) to fund the program.

Under the program, the landowner pays for all project costs and is reimbursed 50% & up to 70% for eligible practices. Standards of DATCP (Chapter ATCP 50) & the Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) must be followed.



Authorization to establish a different time and date for the 2020-21 annual meeting and budget hearing was given, as well as the authorization to dispose of textbooks and equipment that is no longer needed.

The people of the district also set the annual salary of the school board to \$267 a month and not to exceed \$3,150 a year. The board holds two meetings a month and spend time at conferences. The board also spends time at home preparing for the meetings and conferences. If a board member is absent, they will not receive payment for that meeting.

The people also authorized the board to borrow short term up to \$1,000,000 for current operational expenses or emergencies. The district will have to short term borrow because aid that the district used to receive in October, now does not get received until January or February. A payment plan will be in place to repay the loan.

The final decisions haven't been made, but this should be brought to a conclusion soon.

Architect Jeff Munson did a report on the old sheriff's residence as well as a possible addition to the LEC, which would house a new courtroom and all of the attendant offices and spaces, including judge's chamber and space for the District Attorney. He also discussed the possible remodeling of the old sheriff's residence/jail or the possibility of removing the structure and replacing with a new building. He said that a new building would be less expensive than a remodel, but board members spoke up and said that the public had made it clear that they like the old structure and didn't want it removed. He quoted the cost of a complete remodel as \$2,384,200 with the mention that the project could cost more if unforseen problems are found.

In some respects this presentation was a disappointment, as Munson used the drawings and plans the county paid for from the Wendell architectural firm and rejected along with signing another contract with that firm. It was thought by some attending, that there would be some new ideas that would be cost effective.

The discussion did move to an addition to the LEC. Wendell's plan called for attaching that addition to the east side of the old courthouse, but back then and now, this was considered too expensive and not necessary.

There are some decisions to be made by this board that will be difficult. Certainly, if the old sheriff's residence is to be saved, it will take some remodeling. What wasn't clear at the meeting is what county agency would be placed in the remodeled old structure, or if stabilizing it will provide a space for future use. This brings up the question of how much space is needed if an addition is made to the LEC and the old courtroom and attendant offices are available for other uses.

The county board does have some decisions to make. Overlaying all of this is the cost to the taxpayers and whether or not these proposals are urgently needed at this time, or if planning for the future is necessary.




