ATV/UTV has become a popular sport in Wisconsin over the past few years. While a fun, popular sport, it can also be dangerous. It's important to take safety classes, know safety laws, and practice safety while

We want to remind everyone to stay safe while riding. On March 4, 2020 new laws went into effect for passenger requirements, headlamps, requirements and more.

Some of these new laws include:

- ATV operators cannot have a passenger riding in or on any part of an ATV that is not designed or intended to be used by passengers. Before March, this law only applied to roadways. After market seating does not comply with the law.
- All ATVs and UTVs must now have a lighted headlamp and tail lamp during operation- regardless of time of day and location.
- No person (except emergency services personal) may operate an ATV or UTV that is equipped with any of the
- 1.) A lamp that emits a color other than white or amber and that is visible from directly in front of the vehicle.
- 2.) A lamp that emits any color of light other than red, yellow, amber or white and that is visible from directly behind the ATV or UTV.
- 3.) A flashing, oscillating or rotating lamp that emits any color other than yellow or amber. In addition to the new laws changed in March, here are some additional safety tips while riding and operating ATV/UTV's.
- Never consume alcohol or drugs before or during ATV operation.
- Consuming alcohol or drugs is a factor in more than 40 percent of all ATV-related fatalities. Wear your helmet! It could save your life.
- Travel at a speed appropriate for the terrain, visibility conditions, and your experience.
- ATVs are designed for off-road use.
- Operate an ATV on designated trails which may include public roads. Be aware of the rules while riding public roads before you head out.
- Remember, anyone who operates an ATV on public riding areas - e.g. trails, frozen waters, routes, permitted county and/or forest lands - who is at least age 12 years of age and who was born on or after Jan. 1, 1988 must have completed a safety certification course. These ATV operators must carry their safety certification card and they must display it to law enforcement officers when requested.

School District of Crandon From District Administrator, Larry Palubicki

We recently just announced the initial reopening plans for the School District of Crandon. As we try to navigate through this unchartered territory, we have derived a plan that offers options to our families. This initial plan can be found on our district's webpage, www.sdofcrandon.com.

Learning Formats- We plan to reopen schools September 1, 2020 in a face to face format. For those that are not comfortable with this option, we have a virtual option available. We are currently reformatting our online registration to include the virtual option and will ask that parents fill this out as soon as possible, once it is live. Full virtual learning would only happen in the event of a state or district mandated closure.

Visitors- The amount of visitors will be limited. Vendors completing work or parents who have essential meetings scheduled will be allowed in and required to follow our safety measures. All other visitors will not be allowed in the building.

Safety- Our team has been working on rearranging classrooms and implementing safety measures so that we can maintain social distance to the best of our ability. There will be additional sanitization stations in classrooms and throughout the building. Face coverings are now mandatory and the expectation is to wear them while on the bus and in the classroom. We were able to acquire two cloth masks for each student in the district.

Please understand that this plan can change, based on local and state circumstances. Your patience and understanding during this process is appreciated. We appreciate our Cardinal Community for working with us to provide the best education for our students during this

Fifty-nine cases of Covid-19 confirmed in Forest County

Forest County Public Health officials have confirmed additional persons have been diagnosed with novel coronavirus infection (COVID-19) for a total of 59 cases in Forest County. The individuals are isolating at home. No further information will be released to protect the confidentiality of the individuals. County health officials and local partners are contacting others with whom the individuals who tested positive had close contact with. As of today, Forest County has 1,536 negative test results and 16 pending. There are currently 3 active cases, 52 released from isolation, and 4 deaths.

The Forest County Health Department encourages community members to minimize their contact with others by staying home when possible, practice physical distancing and good personal hygiene, wear a mask or cloth face covering, and stay alert for symptoms of COVID-19. If you are experiencing any symptoms or have been exposed to someone with COVID-19, please contact your health care provider and ask to be tested.

In an effort to keep our community members up to date on COVID-19, the Forest County Health Department will continue to update our Facebook page daily and local newspapers weekly with current COVID-19 case counts. This will include the number of negative and positive cases in Forest County. Please call our office at 715-478-3371 with any questions or concerns.

Covid-19 can limit your oxygen, not so for masks

In the last week's issue of this paper's Letters to the Editor a letter contained some misinformation about face masks limiting your oxygen supply. While this is a widely circulated posting on social media it has no basis in science.

A molecule of oxygen is 0.29 nm (nanometers) diameter (6/5/2018 Material Science). One inch equals 25,400,000 nm. Both oxygen and CO2 molecules are small enough to freely pass through a mask (WHO Mythbusters). However, the size of the droplets that transport the Covid-19 (SARS COV-2) virus ranges from 20,000 to 200,000 nm in size (June 26, Particle sizes for mask filtration).

This means there is an immense size difference between the droplet carrying the virus and a molecule of oxygen. This allows the mask to inhibit the passage of the droplet carrying a virus, but not molecules of oxygen. For decades face masks have been used in medical procedures with no reports of the wearer suffering oxygen deprivations. If you are really concerned about your body suffering from a lack of oxygen your concern should not be a face mask it should be contracting the Covid-19 virus.

In the six months we have been in this pandemic the medical professionals have gained significantly more insight into how to slow the spread of this disease.

An editorial in the July 14 issue of the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) reports there is increasing evidence that cloth face-covering helps prevent people who have Covid-19 from spreading the virus to others. The editorial cites actually case studies to support this recommendation. In the words of Dr. Robert Redfield CDC director "Cloth face coverings are one of the most powerful weapons we have to slow and stop the spread of the virus."

In this same period of time, researchers have found that asymptomatic and pre-asymptomatic carriers play a considerable role in spreading this disease. These people feel well and display no symptoms, but are infectious to others. Since these carriers are not readily known to others or themselves this makes the widespread use of face-covering an important means to stop the spread of the virus. As Dr. Redfield stated, "All Americans have a responsibility to protect themselves, their families, and their communities." This need to protect the well-being of other humans is a tenet of most religions and hopefully something we can still agree upon.

Bonus Antlerless Deer Harvest Authorizations On Sale In August

MADISON, Wis. - The Natural Resources Board Thursday approved the final 2020 deer season structure and antierless harvest authorization levels.

Deer hunting licenses are currently on sale for the 2020 deer seasons. One or more Farmland (Zone 2) antlerless deer harvest authorizations are included with the purchase of each deer hunting license and are available for selection through GoWild, the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources' license system.

Review the list of units with bonus antlerless harvest authorizations available for purchase here or visit dnr.wi.gov and search "bonus availability." These and all other deer hunting licenses and harvest authorizations are available online through the Go Wild website or at many authorized license sales locations. DNR customer service centers, including counter sales, remain closed.

Bonus antlerless harvest authorizations are available for purchase starting Monday, Aug. 17 at 10 a.m. through GoWild. The first three days of bonus sales are management zone-specific and will be available as follows:

Aug. 17, 10 a.m. - Northern and Central Forest (Zone 1);

Aug. 18, 10 a.m. - Central Farmland (Zone 2);

Aug. 19, 10 a.m. - Southern Farmland (Zone 2); and

Aug. 20, 10 a.m. - Remaining bonus harvest authorizations (all zones).

Due to the ongoing COVID-19 public health emergency, state office buildings are closed to the public until

purchase harvest authorizations online. DNR Customer Service Representatives are also available to assist you 7 a.m. - 10 p.m. daily by calling 1-888-936-7463.

Deer populations throughout Wisconsin are regulated based on a variable antierless harvest quota. In its simplest form, this means that as deer numbers increase, more antierless harvest authorizations are issued to help

further notice. As a result, counter service at all DNR service centers is unavailable. We strongly encourage you to

manage herd growth. In contrast, where populations are lower, fewer antierless deer need to be harvested to maintain or grow the population.

Bonus antierless harvest authorizations are available for purchase in all but three deer management units for

the 2020 season. The three DMUs without bonus harvest authorizations available are Forest County and the Forest Management Zone portions of Marinette and Oconto counties.

Bonus authorization are sold at a rate of one per person per day until sold out or until the 2020 deer hunting season ends. The cost is \$12 each for Wisconsin residents, \$20 each for non-residents and \$5 each for youth ages 11 and under.

To prepare for the sale, each day at 9:45 a.m., an online queuing system will be put in place to manage volume in the GoWild system. At 10 a.m. all online users that are on the site will be randomly assigned a number and staged into a virtual queue. There is no advantage for customers who enter the site before 9:45 a.m. Please note that customers who enter the site after the randomization that occurs at 10:00 a.m. will be added to the end of the virtual queue in the order in which they arrive. All visitors to the site during this time period will be entered into the queuing system.


When you access GoWild, follow the prompts until you reach your personalized dashboard. To purchase a bonus antlerless harvest authorization, click the "Buy Licenses" button from the dashboard to open the sales catalog. From there, you will find Bonus Antlerless Harvest Authorization at the very top of the list. If you haven't had the chance to get your license in advance, GoWild can help you purchase one after you select the Bonus Antlerless Harvest Authorization.

Hunters will need to know the deer management zone and unit in which they intend to hunt. They will also need to determine whether they will hunt on public or private land in order to make their purchase.

As a reminder, Farmland (Zone 2) antlerless harvest authorizations are now available for distribution. A Farmland (Zone 2) antlerless harvest authorization is included with the purchase of each deer hunting license in units that offer them. Some units will offer more than one antlerless deer harvest authorization with each deer license.

ANNUAL NOTICE OF SPECIAL EDUCATION REFERRAL AND EVALUATION PROCEDURES

Upon request, the School District of Wabeno Area is required to evaluate a child for eligibility for special education services. A request for an evaluation is known as a referral. When the district receives a referral, the district will appoint an Individualized Education Program (IEP) team to determine if the child has a disability, and if the child needs special education services. The district locates, identifies, and evaluates all children with disabilities who are enrolled by their parents in private (including religious) schools, elementary schools and secondary schools located in the school district.

A physician, nurse, psychologist, social worker, or administrator of a social agency who reasonably believes a child brought to him or her for services is a child with a disability has a legal duty to refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides. Before referring the child, the person making the referral must inform the child's parent that the referral will be made.

Others, including parents, who reasonably believe a child is a child with a disability may also refer the child, including a homeless child, to the school district in which the child resides.

Referrals must be in writing and include the reason why the person believes the child is a child with a disability. A referral may be made by contacting Robert Tucker, Director of Pupil Services, School District of Wabeno Area, at 715-473-2592, or by writing him at P.O. Box 460, Wabeno, WI 54566.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL NEEDS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This notice serves to inform parents and guardians of students with disabilities that the State of Wisconsin has established the Special Needs Scholarship Program. Under this scholarship program and as further specified in state law, a child with a disability who has been denied the opportunity to attend a nonresident school district under the full-time open enrollment program may be eligible to receive a scholarship from the Department of Public Instruction (DPI) that allows the child to attend an eligible private school that is participating in the Special Needs Scholarship Program.

This is a state-administered program. A parent or guardian who is interested in the Special Needs Scholarship Program should independently verify the participating private schools and the specific terms, eligibility criteria, and application procedures of the scholarship program with the DPI.

The Special Needs Scholarship Program is further defined under section 115.7915 of the state statutes. However, special eligibility requirements not found in that statute exist for program scholarships that are awarded for private school attendance that initially begins in the 2019-2020 school year. ACCESS TO PUBLIC RECORDS

The Board of the School District of Wabeno Area shall allow persons to have access to school district records in accordance with this policy and implementing procedures and in accordance with the law.

The District Administrator is designated as the legal custodian of records. The legal custodian shall safely keep and preserve records of the authority and shall have full legal power to render decisions and carry out duties related to those records maintained by any school district authority. The legal custodian may deny access to records only in accordance with the law.

Public records may be inspected, copied and/or abstracted at any time during the established district office hours, which are from 8:00 A.M. to 4:00 P.M., Monday through Friday. State Patrol August Law of the Month focuses on speeding

Excessive speed is a common factor behind many traffic-related crashes, injuries and deaths in Wisconsin. In 2019, there were 21,813 speed-related crashes in Wisconsin that resulted in 8,398 injuries and 163 deaths. The State Patrol Law of the Month for August highlights Wisconsin speed-related laws (346.57) and reminds drivers that speeding can result in a fine and higher insurance rates - or worse yet - can cost you or someone else their life.

"Drivers who disregard speed laws and limits endanger everyone along our roadways," said Wisconsin State Patrol Captain Travis Wanless with the State Patrol's North Central Region Post in Wausau. "Our message to drivers is simple - buckle up, phones down, slow down. We want everyone to reach their destinations safely."

Last year in Wisconsin, there were 156,242 traffic convictions for speed-related violations. Important things for drivers to keep in mind:

Posted speed limits apply when travel conditions are ideal. State law requires drivers to adjust their speed to what is "reasonable and prudent" based on specific driving conditions including weather and traffic volumes;

Traveling at an excessive speed greatly increases the chance of a driver losing control of their vehicle. Speeders also have less time to react should traffic ahead slow down or stop. Along with watching their speed, drivers should always scan the road ahead carefully for potential hazards, traffic incidents or stopped emergency vehicles.

"Virtually every day, we see the tragic outcomes associated with excessive speed," Captain Wanless said. "What's most tragic is such incidents are totally preventable."
